SUBJECT: NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE ASSASSINATIONS

SYNOPSIS:

UPI release of 1-3-69 announced the formation of National Committee to Investigate Assassinations. Board members of the committee include Bernard Fensterwald; Jim Garrison, New Orleans District Attorney; William Turner, former FBI Agent; Fred J. Cook, author; Richard Sprague, a computer expert; Lloyd Tupling, Washington, D. C.; and Paris Flammonde, author of a book on assassinations, soon to be released. The Director has asked for a memorandum on Fensterwald, Sprague, Tupling and Flammonde.

Fensterwald, former Chief Counsel to Senator Long's committee on wiretapping was subject of applicant-type inquiries conducted by Bureau in 1949 and 1959. The names of Fensterwald's mother and sister appeared on a list of delegates and members in 1942 of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. While employed by the State Department in 1956, Fensterwald and his mother traveled to the Soviet Union.

We have had considerable contact with Fensterwald over the past four years as Chief Counsel of the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary; Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure (the Long committee). In these contacts Fensterwald has clearly shown he is unscrupulous, untrustworthy and anti-FBI. He frequently sought to involve the FBI in wiretapping probes by Long's committee and in January, 1966, in connection with hearings in San Francisco Fensterwald indicated that ex-Agent William Turner would be one of the witnesses he intended to call in connection with FBI wiretapping. Mr. DeLoach briefed Fensterwald and Senator Long as to Turner's unsavory background. Turner is another board member of the assassination committee.

In December, 1965, it was obvious that Fensterwald had sent information to Fred Cook, longtime FBI critic, for article in "The Nation" by Cook dealing with wiretapping by Government agencies. Cook quoted Fensterwald as stating, "The thing that has impressed me most is the ease with which Federal agents can lie under oath."

Mr. DeLoach maintained close personal liaison with Senator Long regarding his committee hearings and it was necessary on occasion to contact him regarding letters written over Long's signature to the Bureau requesting certain information. One such instance was in December, 1967, regarding FBI contacts with credit unions. Long stated we should ignore the letter and he would instruct Fensterwald to "keep hands off" the FBI. On same occasion Senator Long advised Mr. DeLoach that Fensterwald had "shot off his mouth too much" in connection with two articles in "Life" magazine dealing with Senator Long which allegedly had been "planted" by Bobby Kennedy.

Fensterwald, who will be Executive Director of assassination committee, left his post as Chief Counsel for the Long committee last month, apparently when Long resigned as Senator in order to give his successor seniority when the present Senate went into session.

No information in Bufiles concerning Paris Flammonde.

No pertinent information in Bufiles concerning Lloyd Tupling who may be identical with individual who was on staff of Senator Richard L. Neuberger in 1954.

Richard Sprague may be identical with individual who contacted Senator Robert F. Kennedy's office in early 1968 regarding his theory that more than one individual had fired shots at President Kennedy when he was assassinated. Sprague had reportedly assisted other individuals who share his views and who were otherwise critical of the Warren Commission findings.

From the above lineup, including Garrison and Turner, it is obvious that we can expect anti-FBI sentiments from such a group.

### DETAILS:

A UPI release on January 3, 1969, announced the formation of a new National Committee to Investigate Assassinations. According to Bernard Fensterwald, 47, of Arlington, Virginia, a board member, the committee's purpose is "to embarrass or force the Government to make investigations they have been putting off since November 22, 1963." According to Fensterwald, the committee will concentrate on the assassinations of President Kennedy, Senator Robert Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King. In addition to Fensterwald, other members were identified as Jim Garrison, New Orleans District Attorney; William Turner, former FBI Agent; Fred J. Cook, author; Richard Sprague, Hartsdale, New York, a computer expert; Lloyd Tupling, associated with the Sierra Club, Washington, D. C.; and Paris Flammonde, a New York writer who is the author of a book on assassinations, which is soon to be released.

The Director has asked for a memorandum on Fensterwald, Sprague, Tupling and Flammonde.

Bernard Fensterwald: Fensterwald was born on \_\_\_\_\_\_, at Nashville, Tennessee. He received the B.S. degree from Harvard College in 1942 and the LL.B. degree from Harvard Law School in 1949. He received the M.A. degree in 1950 from the School of Advanced International Studies, Washington, D. C.

Fensterwald was the subject of applicant-type inquiries conducted by the Bureau in 1949 and 1959. While generally favorable, the names of Mr. Fensterwald's mother and sister appeared on a list of delegates and members of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, at a meeting held on April 19-21, 1942, at Nashville, Tennessee. Fensterwald and his mother traveled to the Soviet Union in June, 1956, for a three-week vacation visit. At that time, Fensterwald was employed as a lawyer by the United States Department of State.

Fensterwald has been employed on the staffs of a number of Senate committees. In 1953 Fensterwald was employed by the Senate Subcommittee on Constitutional Rights (Henning Committee) and was involved in

a request to the Bureau from this subcommittee for a list of instances wherein we had furnished information to members of Congress. Senator Henning subsequently advised the Bureau that Fensterwald's requests to the Bureau had been improper. Over the past four years we have had considerable contact with Bernard Fensterwald as Chief Counsel of the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary; Subcommittee on Administrative Practice and Procedure (the Long Committee). In these contacts with Fensterwald it was clearly evident he was unscrupulous, untrustworthy and anti-FBI. He frequently endeavored to draw the FBI into conflicts around the country by his requests of various telephone companies and other sources who might possibly have information of wiretaps and other technical surveillances by the FBI. In January, 1966, in connection with Fensterwald's hearings in San Francisco he indicated that ex-Agent William Turner would be one of the witnesses he intended to call in connection with the extent of FBI wiretapping. Mr. DeLoach briefed Fensterwald and Senator Long who was present at the time of the discussion with Fensterwald as to Turner's unsavory background. Fensterwald indicated he would take a second look at Turner in view of the information furnished by Mr. DeLoach. (Turner is reportedly another board member of the assassination committee)

"The Nation" magazine in December, 1965, carried an article by Fred J. Cook dealing with wiretapping by Government agencies, including the FBI. It was obvious Cook, a longtime FBI critic, had obtained the information for his article from Fensterwald whom he quoted several times. Typical of many of Fensterwald's utterances in connection with his assignment as Chief Counsel of Senator Long's committee was the statement, in "The Nation" magazine article, "The thing that has impressed me most is the ease with which Federal agents can lie under oath."

Mr. DeLoach maintained close personal liaison with Senator Long concerning the work of the FBI as it might pertain to inquiries conducted by his committee. On occasions letters directed to the FBI requesting certain information were handled orally by Mr. DeLoach with Senator Long who indicated that Fensterwald had prepared the letters. One such instance was in December, 1967, in connection with FBI contacts with credit unions. On that occasion, Senator Long stated we should ignore the letter and he would instruct Fensterwald to "keep hands off" the FBI. On the same occasion

Senator Long told Mr. DeLoach that Fensterwald has "shot off his mouth too much" in connection with two articles in "Life" magazine dealing with Senator Long which allegedly had been "planted" by Bobby Kennedy. According to the "Washington Post" of 1-3-69, Fensterwald will be the Executive Director of captioned committee. It is noted he left his post as Chief Counsel for the Long committee approximately a week ago, apparently when Long resigned as Senator in order to give his successor seniority when the present Senate went into session. (77-44206)

Paris Flammonde: Bureau files contain no information identifiable with Paris Flammonde.

Lloyd Tupling: During 1954, W. Lloyd Tupling was appointed the Information Officer of the staff of Richard L. Neuberger, Democratic Senator of Oregon. One Lloyd Tupling, University News Bureau, Eugene, Oregon, was listed as a member of the "Society of America's Friends of the Mexican People" as of 8-13-38. This group is no longer in existence and was not investigated by the FBI, although indications were that the group was sympathetic to the communist cause. During May, 1950, one Lloyd Tupling was the publisher of "The State-Wide Newspaper," a weekly published in Boise, Idaho. (100-179915-23)

Richard Sprague: In a Rosen to Mr. DeLoach memo dated 3-26-63, captioned "Assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 11-23-63, Dallas, Texas," it was noted that Richard E. Sprague had written to Joseph F. Dolan, Administrative Assistant to Senator Robert F. Kennedy, enclosing a number of photographs taken at the assassination site, and also stating that he was a proponent of the theory that more than one individual was firing shots at President Kennedy when he was assassinated. Bureau, Dallas and New York files contained no information on Sprague at that time, and New York was instructed to conduct a credit and criminal inquiry on him in an attempt to identify him, and these checks were negative.

A review was made of books written by critics of the Warren Commission to determine if Sprague might have collaborated with them. In Josiah Thompson's book, "Six Seconds in Dallas," he acknowledges assistance from one "Richard Sprague" not further identified. Sylvia Leagher, author of "Accessories After the Fact," a severe critique of the Warren Commission,

FBI, CIA, Secret Service, and Dallas Police Department, acknowledges the assistance of Richard E. Sprague stating, "I am grateful to Richard E. Sprague for making available a list compiled by him of photographs and films which seem to have been overlooked entirely by the Warren Commission and these investigative agencies."

Sprague wrote us on 7-9-68 along the same vein he had written Mr. Dolan, indicating he had important photographs of the assassination which should be reviewed by us, and also enclosed a research monograph relating to the assassination of President Kennedy. By letter of 7-18-68, we advised Mr. Sprague that the information in his monograph, as well as the photographs, were previously furnished the Bureau by the office of former Senator Robert F. Kennedy. Our files reveal no additional pertinent data concerning Sprague. (62-109060-6520)

PRESTON BATTLE, Memphis, Tennessee. The results of these are as follows: MOTION TO REQUIRE THE RETURN OF A STATE'S SUBPOENA TO THE CLERK OF THE CRIMINAL COURT his motion pertains to the fact that subpoenas for witnesses who had been subpoenaed to testify in the trial that was to start on 11/12/68 have not been returned to the clerk of the court. These are being held by the District Attorney General's Office and it is the contention of the defense that these executed subpoenas are a matter of public record and the names of the witnesses should, therefore, be available to the defense. The defense has previously been furnished a list of persons who might be called in this case; however, this list for exceeds the number of persons for whom subpoenas were actually issued. Judge BATTLE has reserved decision in this matter until such time as he has had an opportunity to fully research Airtel law on what disposition is to be made of these subpoenas. # 2. MOTION TO PERMIT A CONFERENCE WITH WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE

Defense attorney PERCY FOREMAN argued that subject RAY has entered into certain contractural agreements with HUIE prior to the time that FOREMAN became RAY's lawyer. He now feels it is necessary for him to advise RAY regarding his dealings with HUIE and he states this can only be done if HUIE is allowed to accompany FOREMAN while he visits RAY in his cell. Judge BATTLE denied permission for this conference stating that he does not trust HUIE to follow the orders of the court regarding publicity in this case.

# 3. MOTION TO PERMIT THE TAKING OF EXCLUSIVE PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE DEFENDANT

The defense has argued that they have been offered \$3,000 to \$5,000 for a series of exclusive photos of subject RAY. The defense contends that this sum of money is necessary to the subject's defense and have requested that a photographer of their choosing be allowed to take photos of RAY which would in turn be sold by defense counsel. Judge BATTLE denied this motion stating the court would not let itself be drawn into any scheme whereby RAY might be photographed for personal gain. He offered, however, to allow the sheriff's photographer to take photos of RAY which with the court's approval could be distributed to all news media desiring same. These photos are to be made only if defense cousel is agreeable.

# 4. PETITION TO AUTHORIZE DEFENDANT TO TAKE DEPOSITIONS OUT OF STATE

The defense has argued that they have no funds with which to arrange for the interviews of out-of-state witnesses and they request that the state make funds available for this purpose. The defense has indicated they desire SAC FRANK HITT of the Atlanta Division and Mr. J. D. GARNER, 107 14th Street, Northeast, Atlanta, Georgia, be interviewed

regarding the admissibility of evidence. It is pointed out that GARNER is the operator of the rooming house where RAY resided in Atlanta. Judge BATTLE revused to allow depositions to be taken from HITT and GARNER but stated he was agreeable to having HITT and GARNER appear in his court for a pre-trial suppression hearing. The date of this is to be decided by the defense counsel and the prosecution.

Executive Assistant Attorney General ROBERT DWYER has stated he has no reason to believe the search conducted at GARNER's rooming house was illegal and he does not feel that the motion to suppress will be granted.

Judge BATTLE also denied depositions from U. L. BAKER, PETER CHERPES, CLYDE R. MANASCO, Reverend ANDREW J. YOUNG, and GEORGE BONEBREAK as these are all persons who have been subpoensed by the prosecution and whom defense counsel will ultimately have an opportunity to cross examine. Regarding the other persons named in this petition, Judge BATTLE has stated he will rule on each individual name after having been given in writing an affidavit explaining fully why defense counsel desires such a deposition. At the urging of Mr. FOREMAN, it was also ruled that these affidavits shall not be made available to the prosecution.

Mr. ROBERT DWYER advised that his secretary is making a transcript of WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE's testimony before the Shelby County Grand Jury and that this testimony will be made available to this office on a highly confidential basis. He said that in a conversation with HUIE, HUIE volunteered certain additional information that was not given to the Grand Jury. This is as follows:

Mr. DWYER has stated he has no particular interest in further investigation of these facts except for the statements made by RAY to the woman in Canada. He has stated it would greatly aid his case in proving a motive if this woman could be prevailed upon to come to Memphis and testify to the statements made by RAY. He has requested that we determine if possible what statements RAY made that she could testify to and also determine her willingness to testify.

In your referenced communication you advised that in state court on February 7, 1969, before Judge W. Preston Battle, a petition to authorize defendant to take depositions out of state was argued. The defense, during this argument, indicated that they desired SAC Hitt, Atlanta Office, and J. D. Garner (operator of rooming house where Ray resided Atlanta, Georgia) be interviewed regarding the admissibility of evidence. During this argument, Judge Battle refused to allow depositions be taken from SAC Hitt and J. D. Garner, but the Judge stated he was agreeable to have SAC Hitt and J. D. Garner appear in his court for a pretrial suppression hearing. You advised on February 11, 1969, no motion has been filed to suppress the evidence obtained from this rooming house by our Agents.

If and when such motion to suppress is filed, you should obtain a copy of same and immediately forward it to the Bureau for review. You should also furnish a copy of the motion to the Atlanta Office for their review.

#### SYNOPSIS:

Motions filed by attorneys for James Earl Ray in state court were acted upon by Judge W. Preston Battle on February 7, 1969. He has reserved decision to require the return of a states' subpoena to the Clerk of the Criminal Court; he denied motion to permit conference between William Bradford Huie and Ray and denied motion to permit the taking of exclusive photographs of the defendant; and denied depositions to be taken out of state from some individuals, however, he is agreeable to having SAC Hitt of Atlanta and Atlanta rooming house operator appear in a pretrial suppression hearing. (Ray stayed in Garner's rooming house in Atlanta, and search was conducted by consent of Garner.) No motion to suppress has been filed to date. Huie's testimony before Shelby County Grand Jury will be made available to us on a confidential basis. We received additional information from local prosecutor, who learned it from Huie, concerning Ray's alleged treatment by a Doctor Schwartz in Birmingham and his dealing in marijuana in Mexico. Memphis authorities desire female employee of Canadian Government interviewed concerning Ray's statements regarding Negroes in an effort to establish his anti-Negro sentiments and her willingness to testify,

ACTION: If approved,

1. We will instruct Memphis that if and when such motion to suppress is filed, a copy should be obtained and the Atlanta Office will be instructed to Turnish full details covering all points set out in motion to suppress;

The Birmingham Office will be instructed to conduct appropriate investigation regarding Doctor Schwartz;

3. Legat Mexico will be instructed to request the appropriate authorities to determine if Ray was dealing in marijuana in Mexico; and

Legat Ottawa will be instructed to request the Royal Canadian Mounted Police to interview female employee of the Canadian Government regarding Ray's statements to her and determine her willingness to come to Memphis and testify.

### DETAILS:

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

Attorneys for James Earl Ray argued motions in the court of Judge W. Preston Battle, Memphis, Tennessee, on February 7, 1969. The motions and the results thereof are as follows:

- 1. Motion to require the return of state's subpoena to the Clerk of the Criminal Court: It is noted that subpoenas for witnesses who had been requested to testify in the state trial previously scheduled for November 12, 1968, were not returned to the clerk of the court, but were being held in State Attorney General's office. Judge Battle reserved decision until such time as he has an opportunity to fully research the law.
- 2. Motion to permit a conference with William Bradford Huie: Judge Battle denied permission for the conference of James Earl Ray and William Bradford Huie, stating he does not trust Huie to follow the orders of the court regarding publicity in this case.
- 3. Motion to permit the taking of exclusive photographs of the defendant: It is noted that the defense has been offered \$3,000 to \$5,000 for a series of exclusive photographs of Ray. The Judge denied this motion stating the court would not let itself be drawn into any scheme; however, he offered to allow the sheriff's photographer to take photographs of Ray, which with the court's approval, could be distributed to all news media desiring same.
- 4. Petition to authorize defendant to take deposition out of state: It is noted that a listing of various individuals is made. Included in this listing is SAC Frank Hitt of Atlanta, and Latent Fingerprint examiner George Bonebrake assigned to Washington, D. C. Judge Battle denied deposition from fingerprint examiner George Bonebrake and a few other individuals and stated he would rule on the other remaining individuals after having been given in writing an affidavit explaining fully why the defense counsel requires depositions.

During this argument, the defense indicated they desired that SAC, Frank Hitt, Atlanta Office, and Mr. J D. Garner (operator of rooming house where Ray resided in Atlanta, Georgia) be interviewed regarding the admissibility of evidence. Judge Battle refused to allow depositions be taken from SAC Hitt and Garner, but stated he was agreeable to have Hitt and Garner

Mr. Robert Dwyer, Executive Assistant to the State Attorney
General, Shelby County, stated he has no reason to believe

been filed to suppress the evidence obtained from this rooming

Mr. Dwyer stated that in a conversation with Mr. Huie, Huie claims he was told by Ray that a Doctor Schwartz treated Ray while Ray was in Birmingham, Alabama; Ray and a "fat" bartender in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, were dealing in marijuana and Ray brought a sizeable quantity of marijuana with him to California; and Ray spent the night of April 2, 1968, in a motel somewhere in Mississippi.

Dwyer also stated that a female employee of the Canadian Government, with whom Ray was intimate, told Huie that Ray was very outspoken in his dislike for Negroes and made various remarks in this regard. It is noted that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police interviewed this female employee of the Canadian Government; however, no mention was made of Ray's dislike of Negroes. Mr. Dwyer requested that we have the female employee of the Canadian Government contacted to determine if Ray actually made anti-Negro statements to her, and determine her willingness to come to Memphis and testify.

Rev. JAMES M. LAWSON, JR., Pastor, Centenary Methodist Church, 584 East McLemore Avenue, Memphs, Tennessee, advised that he has no actual evidence of a conspiracy in the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING; however, he feels that certain occurrences around the time of the murder may have some significance.

Rev. LAWSON said that on about April 2 or April 3, 1968, a Negro fireman, FLOYD E. NEWSUM, was transferred from the firestation near the Lorraine Motel to another station that was already fully manned. He also said that another Negro fireman, name unknown, was transferred from that same station to another station on either Tuesday or Wednesday night before KING was murdered on Thursday afternoon. He said this second fireman was transferred in the middle of his shift and was transferred "out of rotation".

Rev. LAWSON explained "out of rotation" as follows:

Rev. JAMES M. LAWSON, JR., Pastor, Centenary Methodist Church, 584 East McLemore Avenue, Memphs, Tennessee, advised that he has no actual evidence of a conspiracy in the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING; however, he feels that certain occurrences around the time of the murder may have some significance.

Rev. LAWSON said that on about April 2 or April 3, 1968, a Megro fireman, FLOYD E. NEWSUM, was transferred from the firestation near the Lorraine Motel to another station that was already fully manned. He also said that another Negro fireman, name unknown, was transferred from that same station to another station on either Tuesday or Wednesday night before KING was murdered on Thursday afternoon. He said this second fireman was transferred in the middle of his shift and was transferred "out of rotation".

Rev. LAWSON explained "out of rotation" as follows:

When a fireman is assigned to a piece of equipment he remains in that assignment until all the man already assigned to it have been transferred. In other words, the last man assigned is the last man transferred.
