AT TOPEKA, KANSAS

On 4/14/69, Mr. VERGIL CROW, Chief of Medical Records, Topeka State Hospital, advised that according to the Topeka State Hospital records, MORRIS R. MC CARVER was a voluntary committed patient at the Topeka State Hospital on 4/8/68. He indicated at that time that he was a resident of Harvey County, Kansas, and stated that his cousin was CARL PORTER of RR #1, Box 25, Sedgwick, Kansas.

The records further reflect that MORRIS R. MC CARVER went AWOL from the hospital and was discharged from the hospital as AWOL on 6/1/68.

Mr. CROW advised that according to hospital regulations no further information concerning this patient may be disclosed without the written consent of the patient himself. He said the hospital is not able to disclose the reason for this patient's commitment without a written consent from the patient authorizing the hospital to release such information.

In view of the above information no further information can be obtained from the hospital records at this time without the written consent of MC CARVER. Memphis and Butte will note, however, that MC CARVER was not committed to the Topeka State Hospital until 4/8/68.

On 4/22/69, Mr. ~~KARL~~ RAPP was interviewed at his office, 208 Nichols Road, Kansas City, Missouri. RAPP advised he had just returned from a vacation in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, and is now residing at 103rd and Mores Road, Overland Park, Kansas.

RAPP advised that he could furnish no information regarding JAMES EARL RAY, or any conspiracy against MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.; however, he did furnish the following information regarding ~~HEINZ~~ MANGER whom he met in Puerto Vallarta during 1965. RAPP advised that he and his family were vacationing there and they met MANGER at the Hotel Coronada in Puerto Vallarta. They became friendly and had dinner and drinks together on several occasions. MANGER advised them that he had been a former Colonel in the German Army and served under General ROMMEL in the desert of North Africa.

RAPP remembered one incident that took place down there; they bought a painting from a local artist and MANGER wrote on back of the canvas, "To my good friends from HEINZ MANGER." RAPP advised that his wife showed this painting to a Reverend DALE POLLOCK, Kansas City, Missouri, and POLLOCK reportedly determined from a handwriting comparison that HEINZ MANGER was a former SS General by the name of ~~HEINZ~~ MUELLER. RAPP could not elaborate on this.

RAPP further advised that when he left Mexico in 1965, he was contemplating purchasing some property in the area of Puerto Vallarta, and for this reason, maintained correspondence with a ~~JOHN~~ MATHIESON, a retired American living in the area. MATHIESON was in his 70's but periodically wrote letters to RAPP. RAPP stated that in a letter written January, 1967, MATHIESON stated that HEINZ MANGER had left Puerto Vallarta and was no longer living in the area. A subsequent letter determined that he had moved to Guadalajara.

CAROL PEPPER advised SA HOWARD C. KENNEDY, 4/30/69, she had not heard from JERRY RAY since he left early in month; that he had promised to phone her but had not done so; that she had no knowledge or information as to his whereabouts; and no reason to believe her brother JOHN knew. Denied knowledge of any information upon which statements to press by JERRY RAY regarding existence of conspiracy based. Agreed FBI would be proper agency to investigate any conspiracy, and promised to promptly report to FBI any information as to conspiracy or whereabouts of JERRY RAY coming to her attention.

JOHN RAY advised SA PATRICK W. BRADLEY, 5/1/69, JERRY RAY is traveling with family's civil attorney J. B. STONER of Savannah, Ga.; that he filled speaking engagement at Jacksonville, Fla., night of 4/30/69 and left for short visit in Memphis, after which he will reside with STONER at Savannah, and will travel between Savannah and Memphis periodically.

JOHN had no opinion as to existence of conspiracy, denied JERRY had ever told him of same, and stated if JERRY made statements regarding same, they were probably based on information received from subject.

PH 897-R and TRAVIS, who is a former staff member for Philadelphia Branch SCLC, went to the address to talk to BEVEL. They had been instructed to invite BEVEL to speak at a meeting of "The Resistance" to be held May 1 in downtown Philadelphia. The second purpose for their visit was to determine if they could help in any plans being made by SCLC in connection with the recent arrest of RALPH ABERNATHY in Charleston, S.C. ~~X~~

RAYMOND (LNU), who is currently residing on the second floor of 919 North 18th Street, Philadelphia, advised that BEVEL was in New York and has been in New York for three weeks. He also stated that it would be impossible for informant and TRAVIS to contact him at this time.

With regard to activity of SCLC in Charleston, S.C., RAYMOND stated that no plans have been made by SCLC in Philadelphia and that he did not know what was being done nationally.

Informant advised that after he and TRAVIS left BEVEL's address, TRAVIS made the statement that SCLC was "apparently falling apart in Philadelphia." ~~X~~

The above is furnished for information and was not put into an LHM because it would immediately identify an informant of continuing value.

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

William Bradford Huie, author, has written three articles for "Look" magazine and is currently writing a book entitled, "He Slew The Dreamer." These articles and book are based on the life of James Earl Ray and the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. We previously analyzed the three articles appearing in "Look" magazine and have written memoranda on these articles.

On April 18, 1969, William Bradford Huie was interviewed by Betty Groebli on WRC (NBC Radio), Washington, D. C. We have recorded this interview and have analyzed it. The interview consists primarily of the same data recorded in his latest writing appearing in "Look" magazine. In essence William Bradford Huie claims that James Earl Ray and Ray alone murdered Martin Luther King, Jr., and he murdered him for recognition purposes.

ACTION:

Attached for approval is a communication to Memphis enclosing a copy of the tape (we are retaining a copy of the tape at the Bureau) instructing them to:

1. Review the tape containing the interview of William Bradford Huie by Betty Groebli and determine if any information is recorded thereon pertinent to this case.

BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO DISMISS

The venue of this action is not in the Middle District of Tennessee under Title 28 U.S.C., Section 1391(a), which provides:

"The civil action wherein jurisdiction is founded only on diversity of citizenship may, except as otherwise provided by law, be brought only in the judicial district where all plaintiffs or all defendants reside, or in which the claim arose."

According to the averments of the complaint and the amended complaint the claim arose, if the plaintiff has a claim, in the Western District of Tennessee at Memphis.

The plaintiff's incarceration in the penitentiary at Nashville does not make him a resident of this judicial district for venue purposes.

A confidential source, who has furnished insufficient information to determine reliability, but who has an arrest record dating back to 1951, advised that in about February, 1968, GERDON WHITNER (Phonetic), who resided in the Eureka Springs, Arkansas, area, and who had been for sometime a "political hack" in Northwest Arkansas, attempted to solicit the services of different individuals in the Eureka Springs, Arkansas, area to eliminate MARTIN LUTHER KING. WHITNER was not successful in his efforts with these individuals, but indicated that KING would die.

The source advised that WHITNER has a strong dislike for Negroes and indicated it would be a service to the community to eliminate KING.

MURDER OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

On May 2, 1969, Mr. J. GURDON WHITENER, Busch, Arkansas (located about 10 miles west of Eureka Springs, Arkansas), was located at the Hillbilly Gift Shop in Eureka Springs, Arkansas, which is owned and operated by Mr. WHITENER and his wife, LU RENE WHITENER.

Mr. WHITENER advised that he did at one time work as a guard during the construction of Beaver Dam on the White River near Busch, Arkansas, which was constructed between the years 1961 and 1965, and he said that he worked there from 1963 to 1964. He advised further that an individual named MORRIS MC CARVER is the son of a sister of his mother, and that MC CARVER and his parents, many years ago, lived near Hindsville, Arkansas. MC CARVER's parents have been dead for many years and he, WHITENER, had had no contact with MORRIS MC CARVER for over twenty years when suddenly, possibly a year or year and a half ago, MC CARVER appeared at WHITENER's home at Busch, Arkansas, sometime after dark. Mr. WHITENER said that it is possible that this did take place possibly in November or December of 1967, but he has no way of knowing exactly when it occurred. MC CARVER was alone, and on foot, and had been drinking, and he stayed at the WHITENER home the entire evening with WHITENER and his wife, and no one else was present, and they did not leave the house. They did no drinking while at the house, but MC CARVER definitely had the appearance of having been drinking when he arrived.

MC CARVER allegedly slept rather late the next day and sometime, possibly prior to noon, Mr. and Mrs. WHITENER drove MC CARVER into Eureka Springs, Arkansas in their car and dropped him off because Mrs. WHITENER did not desire to have MC CARVER around the house any longer and definitely did not want him to remain for another night.

Mr. WHITENER advised that he recalls MC CARVER was short of money, so he, WHITENER, cashed a \$15 check for him, and MC CARVER said that this would be enough to get him by. The check later bounced. Mr. WHITENER was unable to recall the details of the check or upon which bank it had been drawn.

Mr. WHITENER advised that at no time did he ever make any statements to MC CARVER or anyone else concerning Governor ORVAL FAUBUS of the State of Arkansas or concerning MARTIN LUTHER KING or his activities. Mr. WHITENER denied that he had ever been on a drinking spree of any kind with MC CARVER or anyone else and stated that this one short overnight visit which MC CARVER paid to WHITENER, possibly in December of 1967, is the only time he has seen or heard from MC CARVER in more than twenty years.

Mr. WHITENER advised that he is not certain that MC CARVER left the Eureka Springs area after he and his wife dropped MC CARVER off in Eureka Springs because he had heard later from an unrecalled source that MC CARVER had been somewhere in the area of Eureka Springs and had been drinking. He said he knew none of the details of this and was not interested. He said further that he knows nothing of the personal habits of MC CARVER or where he lives, but he categorically denied information furnished by MC CARVER, stating that it definitely is not true. In addition, he stated that his wife could certainly vouch for the fact that he and MC CARVER never

left the house the night MC CARVER was there and that they were not drinking. Mr. WHITENER continued that he felt he was doing MC CARVER a favor by cashing his check, that they had never had any falling out, and actually had never had any close association with each other, there had never been any trouble between them, and he is at a complete loss to understand statements made by MC CARVER.

Mr. WHITENER advised that he recalls MC CARVER did have a younger sister who was mentally retarded and who died when she was about twelve or fourteen years of age. He said that after the check bounced, he and his wife talked this matter over, and they decided between themselves that the bad check was worth it if it would keep MC CARVER from ever returning to their home.

As a matter of background information, Mr. WHITENER advised that he was born [redacted] at Mayfield, Arkansas, and that he and his family moved to the Busch, Arkansas area in 1916. A number of years ago his wife died, and he remarried less than four years ago, and he and his wife have been operating the Hillbilly Gift Shop in Eureka Springs.

LU RENE (Mrs. J. GURDON) WHITENER advised on May 2, 1969, that she recalls MORRIS MC CARVER appeared at her home near Busch, Arkansas at least a year ago and possibly a year and a half ago. He stayed over one night, but he had been drinking, so she and her husband brought him into Eureka Springs the next day and dropped him off as she did not want him to stay another night. She said her husband cashed a small check for MC CARVER which check later bounced.

Mrs. WHITENER advised that MC CARVER and her husband remained at her home the entire time he was there, and her husband did not go out drinking with MC CARVER at any time.
