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

The purpose of this memorandum is to advise that Ladislas Farago, who is completing a detailed biography of J. Edgar Hoover, has requested copies of the recently released pages from the FBI's investigation of the murder of Martin Luther King for a book he plans to write lauding the Bureau's investigation of that case.

DETAILS: Captioned individual visited the Bureau today to tie together the few loose ends which remain in the research and writing of his forthcoming detailed biography regarding J. Edgar Hoover. He stated that his manuscript will be in the hands of his publisher by next month and that the book will be published next spring.

During his visit, Farago made reference to recent newspaper articles that are based upon the 442 pages from the FBI's investigation of the murder of Martin Luther King which have been released under the Freedom of Information Act.

He requested -- and was afforded the opportunity -to peruse this material, after which he submitted a formal request, together with a check for \$44.20, for copies of the 442 pages.

Mr. Farago said that his perusal of these pages convinces him they contain sufficient detailed material upon which a comparatively short book laudatory of the FBY's investigation of this murder can be written. He plans to write such a book and have it published so that it will be on the book stands by late winter or early spring of 1877
