JAMES EARL RAY;
DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. - VICTIM
CIVIL RIGHTS - CONSPIRACY

On January 28, 1977, Dr. EUGENE V. GRACE, Eye Surgeon, 911 North Broad Street, Durham, North Carolina, who also operates Moore Publishing Company, 907 North Broad Street, reported receipt of a telephone contact on January 27, 1977, from OTIS MOORE, Lomas Verdes Number 40, San Juan, Puerto Rico, telephone number 780-4533, offering GRACE an opportunity to publish a book by MOORE. MOORE identified himself as a retired United States Army Master Sergeant. He stated in his book, he identified the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING and implied this assassin had first sought to hire MOORE for the assassination. MOORE, during his telephone call, claimed to have previously reported this information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and said KELLEY had assigned him a file number. MOORE stated he was in contact with other prospective publishers. He also claimed correspondence with United States Senators FRANK CHURCH and EDWARD KENNEDY. During his call, MOORE said he felt his life was in danger.

GRACE indicated there was a possibility he would be back in contact with OTIS MOORE about January 30, 1977, concerning publication of the book referred to by MOORE.

On March 17, 1977, Dr. GRACE advised he had not had any contact with OTIS MOORE during the latter part of January or early February, as previously proposed. However, since GRACE had returned to Durham, North Carolina, in mid-February, 1977, MOORE had contacted GRACE's residence at Durham, North Carolina, on two occasions. During one of these calls during the latter part of February, 1977, MOORE told GRACE's wife he was staying in Alexandria, Virginia, and was trying to arrange for an appearance before the United States House Committee conducting investigation into the death of

MARTIN LUTHER KING. He indicated his intention to stay in the Washington area until someone heard his story. He left a telephone number for GRACE to reach him in Alexandria, but later when GRACE called this number, he determined that the number was to a pay telephone and that MOORE was not available there. During the other telephone contact at about the same time, MOORE stated that he was currently preparing the manuscript for his book. GRACE indicated a desire to see this manuscript when it was completed. Since that call, GRACE has written to MOORE in Puerto Rico to indicate again an interest in seeing the completed manuscript. MOORE, in his conversations, again indicated he had corresponded with Senator FRANK CHURCH and Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. GRACE stated since that time he has had no additional contact with MOORE, and noted that he had never had any personal contact with MOORE, nor had MOORE indicated any intention of visiting GRACE in Durham, North Carolina.

Dr. GRACE did not know if MOORE appeared before the House Committee in 1977.

On 3/30/77, Major EMMETT DIXON, Alabama Highway Patrol (AHP), Montgomery, Alabama, advised that an AHP trooper had an informant who had been in contact with a MORRIS DAVIS, Birmingham, Alabama. DAVIS related information to the informant concerning a conspiracy to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING which involved FRANK LIBERTO and DR. GUS PROSCH. DAVIS indicated to the trooper's informant that the information had been related to the FBI, but apparently no action was taken.

Major DIXON was advised that the Birmingham Office had been in contact with MORRIS DAVIS on several occasions, had taken all information in the possession of DAVIS, and had furnished this information to FBIHQ and interested offices. DIXON was advised that Birmingham is positive that the FBIHQ had furnished DAVIS' information to interested congressional committees, as DAVIS had stated that a representative of the House of Representatives Committee had been in contact with him.

The above is set forth for information of FBIHQ and Mobile. As Birmingham has had numerous contacts with DAVIS, he will not be contacted at this time; however, Birmingham will continue to disseminate any pertinent information volunteered by DAVIS.

It is noted that Louisville Division indices contain only single reference to "CLIFTON EUGENE BAIRD, Officer, Louisville Police Department" (LS 44-474), which file was destroyed on 2/28/77. No information is contained in Louisville Division files substantiating BAIRD's allegation on 3/29/77 that he has received numerous threats from the FBI over the last ten years.

SUTEL RESULTS FOLLOWED BY LHM.

NOTE: Congressman M. G. Snyder Kentucky, recently revealed he had received letter from an unnamed police officer who made allegation he had received offer from FBI Agents and police officers to kill King. The unnamed police officer reportedly made tapes of offer, one of which was stolen, and the other turned over to the House Select Committee on Assassinations. Subsequent newspaper accounts identified unnamed officer as Clifton E. Baird.

Legal Counsel Division requested authority from Department to interview Baird.

On 3/25/77, at about 4:30 p.m. Mr. Keuch of the Department, mentioned above, telephonically advised SA Paul Daly of the Legal Counsel Division that the Attorney General authorized the FBI to interview Baird in the presence of an AUSA. SAC, Louisville telephonically advised 3/25/77.

Inmate Tells of FBI, CIA Offer in King's Death

COLUMBUS (UPI) — An inmate at the Ohio Penitentiary Reception and Treatment Center here said the FBI and CIA agents offered former Mafia kingpin Carlo Gambino \$1 million to kill Martin Luther King Jr. in 1968, but Gambino rejected the offer, it was reported yesterday.

Scripps-Howard Newspapers, in a copyrighted story by William Pillar, said Myron Billett, 52, will be questioned by Ed Evans, chief investigator for the House assassinations committee in Washington.

The newspapers said Billett, alias Paul Buccilli, set up a secret meeting in January 1968 at a hideaway motel in Apalachin, N.Y., between the FBI

and CIA agents and Gambino, who has since died.

Gambino rejected the offer and later passed the word that no Mafia family would accept the offer to kill King, Billett said.

Rep. Louis Stokes, D-Ohio, chairman of the assassinations committee, said he ordered Evans to investigate the allegations after Scripps-Howard newspapers asked Stokes if a letter sent by Billett to House Speaker Thomas O'Neill had been turned over to the committee.

O'Neill's office told the newspapers that the letter had not been located.

"We will be in touch with Billett to check out his story," said Evans.

WASTED YEAR — An Autobiography of Crime

Within this book, I will attempt to explain what makes a man waste away his life in crime. I will recount the big double-cross that got racketeer Bugsy Segal killed; all that was behind the scene of his murder and why Bugsy took \$600,000 from outside the mob and allowed narcotics racketeers to move into L.A. and the West Coast in general—and who ordered him "hit".

I will present another story yet untold of Carl Chessman, of his long stay on death row fighting to evade execution as the Red Light Bandit, and how Chessman was framed by the Mob and of Frank Buccilli's connection to all this.

I will tell you of the two coldest criminals I have ever known, Hitchcock and Smith, whose crimes and executions were written about by Truman Capote in his "fact-fiction" *IN COLD BLOOD*, and how Smith and Hitchcock actually laughed at the gallery.

Too, I will detail the death of a 17-year-old boy who hanged himself at Soledad prison rather than again submit himself to forced acts of homosexuality.

I will reveal the inside story of how the Syndicate moved into Denver and corrupted thirty-four policemen, the county sheriff and other members of the city's administration.

Herein, too, you will find accounts of my thirty years as a criminal; my eleven years of imprisonment in four of the most notorious joints in the country—Walla Walla, Washington; Carson City, Nevada; SanQuentin, California; and Lansing, Kansas prison. There will also be highlights of association with Warden Clinton Duffy of Quentin.

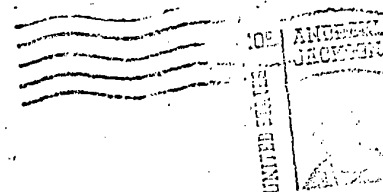

Ex-cop tells of FBI threats

WASHINGTON: Clifton E. Baird, the retired Louisville policeman who claims he was asked to kill Dr. Martin Luther King jr. in the mid-1960s, says he was threatened by FBI agents and others he did not know.

His charge is contained in a letter to Rep. M. Gene Snyder, R-Ky., who read Baird's account of the alleged conspiracy on the House floor, Wednesday.

The letter Snyder read from had 18 blank spaces, including the identity of Baird, the police department he once worked for, the names of three FBI agents and six Louisville policeman and information relating to an investigation of Baird in Owensboro, his hometown.

The House later voted 230 to 181, with Snyder's support, to permit the House Assassination Committee to continue its investigation of the assassinations of King and former President John F. Kennedy.

Snyder said several members credited his reading of the letter with helping the committee remain in existence. Snyder himself had voted against the committee in February, before he received the letter from Baird.

There was scattered applause for Snyder when he finished his statement by saying if the allegations were true they should be investigated and if they're not true the FBI and other law enforcement agencies accused should be exonerated.

Delegate Walter Fauntroy, D-D.C., a member of the committee, characterized the letter as on of "several leads were

we're pursuing that suggest there was a plot or plots to assassinate Martin Luther King prior to April 1968."

Baird said in the letter he was "threatened" on three different occasions by FBI agents and a month before the King killing "I was threatened seven or eight times by people I did not know."

Baird's letter also suggests there were more than three FBI agents allegedly involved in the \$500,000 offer to Baird to kill the civil rights leader.

Baird listed three FBI agents by name but he said there were "others that I did not know." He also identified six members of the Louisville police department, the force he served on for 27 years.

Snyder did not identify the policemen but he did read Baird's description of the rank or position they held in the department: chief of detectives, captain, lieutenant, officer, lieutenant in the homicide bureau and the president of the Fraternal Order of Police.

Four of the six policemen contacted by Scripps Howard Newspapers denied any knowledge of a plot to kill King.

Baird said the offer, which he recorded on tape, came at a time when he was under "intense investigation" by police and the FBI. Scripps-Howard Newspapers quoted sources close to the committee as saying the alleged conspirators were trying to blackmail Baird into participating because he was suspected of being involved in a dynamite ring in Owensboro, his hometown.

Baird said in the letter that when he

left the force he went to a reporter for United Press International. He said the reporter did not keep the appointment to hear the tapes. He said he next contacted James Earl Ray's attorneys, who referred him to their investigator in Frederick, Md. Ray pleaded guilty to killing King and is serving a 99-year prison sentence.

The investigator, Baird said, wanted to know "what business it was of mine and where I was going to hide if I tried to do anything with the tapes."

Snyder told his colleagues on the floor he normally doesn't discuss his mail with anyone. But he said he met with the letter writer and got his approval to use the letter with the deletions.

"I was not and am not an admirer of Dr. Martin Luther King's tactics or philosophy," said Snyder. But he said the allegations should be investigated.

Prior to the final vote, the House defeated an amendment that would have taken the body into secret session to hear in detail what the committee had come up with.

Snyder voted for the secret session but said he would not have "filled in" the blanks in the letter even in secret sessions. He said that would be up to the committee, which has a copy of the letter without blanks, to decide.

The committee also has Baird's tape. And Snyder said he understood the age of the tape had been verified as being made in about 1965 when the conversation allegedly occurred.

Man Claiming Knowledge Of King Plot Questioned

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) —Rep. Gene Snyder, R-Ky., says the House assassinations committee has "interrogated" for a second time a man who claims knowledge of an alleged plot by Louisville police and FBI agents to assassinate Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Committee investigators questioned the man "in the past day or two" for nearly three hours, the congressman said Tuesday.

Snyder said he was told by committee investigators that the man "didn't break down" during the interrogation and "they are taking the report seriously — that's what they tell me."

Since he first disclosed two weeks ago that he had been approached by the retired police officer, Snyder has refused to identify him.

However, Mary Baird, 44, of Louisville, confirmed that it was her husband, Clifton Baird, 50, who told Snyder of the alleged plot. She confirmed it was her husband after The Kentucky Post, quoting unnamed sources, identified him.

Mrs. Baird has refused to talk to reporters for a week. Baird himself has been unavailable for comment.

Snyder has refused to confirm the Louisville police department was the one named by Baird. However, Snyder quoted a letter from the man as saying the allegations involved a police department from which he retired several years ago. Baird retired from the Louisville Police Department in 1975 after 27 years service.

Snyder said "several prominent members" of the police department implicated by Baird were named in the allegation.

"I determined in my mind that he was not a kook and that he was a legitimate type citizen," Snyder said. "I have talked to some members of the committee and some of the staff people who have talked to him in the past day or two."

He said he has no idea where Baird is or whether he has been told not to talk with reporters.

U. S. Atty. George Long has told the Justice Department about the allegations, but no federal investigation has been ordered.

Snyder said he was contacted in late February by a man who claimed that at least six police officers and several FBI agents were involved in the alleged plot. Snyder said he listened to a copy of a tape recording the man said he made when he allegedly was offered \$500,000 while sitting in a car to kill the late Dr. King.

King was assassinated in Memphis, Tenn., in 1968, and James Earl Ray is serving 99 years in prison for the murder.

Snyder said a letter from the man along with the tape recording are in the hands of the committee.

"It was pretty much inaudible," Snyder said of the copy of the tape he heard. "I heard some talk about King and money, enough to make me think that it needs to be looked into, that's all."

Snyder was against extending financing for the House Select Committee on Assassinations before the man told him of the alleged plot. But the congressman says he has changed his mind and wants the committee funded for two more years.

Mrs. Baird told The Associated Press last week that her husband told Snyder of the alleged plot because he "wanted to know why someone asked him" to kill the civil rights leader. She said it had been "bothering him."

Probers dub Ray's brother accomplice in King slaying

WASHINGTON (UPI) — James Earl Ray's younger brother, Jerry, actually is the mysterious "Raoul" whom Ray has blamed for the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr., according to two independent investigators.

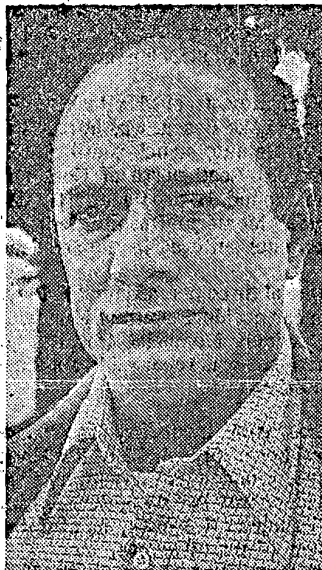
Ray is serving a 99-year sentence in a Tennessee prison after pleading guilty to the 1968 murder of King in Memphis. He later changed his story and asked for a new trial, saying he was the fall guy for a man identified only as Raoul, a Canadian who allegedly aided and financed him.

Jerry Ray, who works as a country club grounds keeper, has steadfastly maintained his brother is innocent. Jerry is alleged in some accounts of the killing to have had prior knowledge James was going to kill King. This too, the Lake Zurich resident has denied.

Jerry said James pleaded guilty to the murder charge because he was unhappy with his legal counsel. After having fired one lawyer and being faced with the prospect of being defended by a public defender, he felt the best way out was to plead guilty and ask for a new trial, Jerry said.

Ray has yet to get his new trial.

David S. Lifton and Jeff Cohen claim in an article in the April edition of New Times magazine that in his testimony

Ray substituted the non-existent "Raoul" for his brother, Jerry.

The investigators' report comes just weeks before funds expire for the House Assassinations Committee.

Chief committee counsel Richard Sprague will interview Ray at Brushy Mountain Park prison this week.

Investigators have asked why Ray would not identify Raoul.

The authors say it was because Raoul actually was Jerry Ray, one of James Earl Ray's two brothers, who was in 1968 "a devoted lieutenant of Georgia lawyer Jesse B. Stoner, leader of the racist National States Rights Party."

A recent Justice Department investigation concluded James Earl Ray alone killed King, but noted Jerry Ray aided and abetted his brother after his escape from a Missouri prison, lied to the FBI about the extent and nature of his contacts with his brother and would, had the statute of limitations not expired, have been liable to prosecution.

In a related development, Rep. Gene Snyder, R-Ky., who initially opposed establishment of the committee, says evidence he has received prompts a change of mind.

Snyder said over the weekend he relayed information to the committee about an alleged assassination conspiracy to kill King involving three FBI agents and "three or four police officers."

Snyder said a retired police officer wrote him last month outlining the alleged conspiracy and saying he was offered \$500,000 to commit the murder.
