HARRISON INDICATED THAT JOHN CAMPBELL, CHIEF OF POLICE, GRANDVIEW, MISSOURI, AND SAM LICKTEIG, REAL ESTATE APPRAISER, GRANDVIEW, MISSOURI, TELEPHONE 765-1991, WILL HAVE MORE INFORMATION.

CAMPBELL DESCRIBED WILSON AS BEING A CON-MAN AND ALSO AS A HEAVY DR INKER.

CAMPBELL SAID HE IS AWARE THAT WILSON HAD A JEWELRY STORE, BUT CANNOT REMEMBER THE NAME OR LOCATION. CAMPBELL SAID THAT BEFORE WILSON LEFT GRANDVIEW, DOES NOT REMEMBER THE DATE, THAT WILSON GOT VERY PARANOID ABOUT SOMETHING. WILSON HIRED OFF DUTY POLICEMAN TO GUARD THE INVENTORY OF WILSON'S JEWELRY STORE. SUBSEQUENTLY WILSON AUCTIONED OFF ALL HIS INVENTORY. THE AUCTIONEER WAS TOMMY COMPTON, TELEPHONE 761-2277.

CAMPBELL HEARD THAT BEFORE WILSON CAME TO GRANDVIEW

HE WAS IN SOME TYPE OF BUSINESS WITH LOU CREWS OF CREWS

JEWELRY STORE, BUT DOES NOT REMEMBER THE NAME OF THE BUSINESS.

WHEN WILSON CAME TO GRANDVIEW, HE SPLIT WITH CREWS AND LEASED
A COUNTER FROM KATZ DRUG STORE, TRUMAN CORNERS SHOPPING
CENTER, GRANDVIEW, MISSOUR I. WHEN WILSON SPLIT, CREWS WAS
REAL MAD BECAUSE HE, CREWS, GOT CHEATED OUT OF SEVERAL THOUSAND

CAMPBELL WAS ASKED IF WILSON WAS CAPABLE OF KILLING SOMEONE, AND HE REPLIED THAT WILSON WAS VERY CAPABLE BECAUSE OF HIS TYPE OF CHARACTER.

CAMPBELL SAID THAT LOU CREWS DIED ON AUGUST 22, 1978

OF CANCER, AND THAT A SAM KAPPERA, OFFICER, GRANDVIEW POLICE

DEPARTMENT, A REAL CLOSE FRIEND OF CREWS, MIGHT BE ABLE

TO PROVIDE MORE INFORMATION ON THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN

CREWS AND WILSON.

SAM LICKTEIG INDICATED THAT HE WAS ON THE CITY COUNCIL
WHEN WILSON WAS A CAND DATE FOR MAYOR IN 1969. HE SAID THAT
ARNOLD HOLTON RAN AGAINST WILSON AND HOLTON WON THE ELECTION.

LICKTEIG FEELS THAT WILSON WAS VERY STRANGE. HE HEARD
THAT WILSON KEPT A CONSIGNMENT OF DIAMONDS IN HIS HOUSE,
AND THAT HE WAS BURGLARIZED ON WHAT SEEMED TO BE A REGULAR

LICKTEIG SAID THAT ONE OF WILSON'S CAMPAIGN STANDS WAS AS FOLLOWS: "TO OPPOSE SCHOOL DISTRICT CONSOLIDATION, CONSOLIDATION WOULD MEAN OUR CHILDREN COULD AND WOULD BE TRANSPORTED TO OTHER SCHOOLS 10 TO 15 MILES AWAY, AND OTHER CHILDREN FROM KANSAS CITY TRANSPORTED TO OUR SCHOOLS".

LICKTEIG SAID THAT WILSON ATTENDED THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE. HE ALSO SAID THAT WILSON WAS A MEMBER OF THE KANSAS CITY MASONIC LODGE. PAGE FIVE KC 44-760 UNCLAS E F T O

DEBRA ANN JONES, Belvidere, Illinois, daughter of BURGESS AUDIE WILSON, advised she and her mother were in Memphis during the KING assassination and her father remained in Kansas City, Missouri. Her mother called her father in Kansas City at least twice from Memphis. WILSON was arrested in Brownsville, Texas, about four and one-half years ago and allegedly had a rifle in his car. She said he definitely has mental problems, is intoxicated most of the time and feels he badly needs psychiatric treatment.

This investigation was predicated upon receipt of Memphis teletype to the Bureau dated August 19, 1978, requesting that DEBRA ANN JONES be interviewed.

DEBRA ANN JONES, Lot 106, 2628 Newburg Road, Belvidere, Illinois, advised she is the daughter of BURGESS AUDIE WILSON and that they lived in Kansas City, Missouri, from 1964 to September of 1968. She advised she was a senior in high school in 1968 and received a 1965 white Mustang from her father as a graduation present. JONES stated she was in Memphis, Tennessee, with her mother visiting her maternal grandfather, who was in a Baptist hospital after suffering a heart attack, at the time of the KING murder. She and her mother flew from Kansas City to Memphis on an unrecalled airline and stayed three or four days. She recalled there were curfew restrictions while they were in Memphis. She advised that her father, who was a flight engineer on a C-124 and stationed at Richard's Gabour Air Force Base, remained in Kansas City with her two brothers, STEPHEN and MARK WILSON, who were ages 14 and 10.

JONES stated she definitely did not travel to Memphis in the Mustang and she never made any trips in it with her father. She stated the car was in very poor condition and could not make it to Memphis.

She recalled that while they were in Memphis her mother called Kansas City at least twice and talked to her father.

Further, she stated she has not seen her father in five years but that he calls her frequently. She advised she received a call last Saturday morning at which time he sounded sober. On this occasion they had a general conversation. JONES advised he called her again on Thursday night and was obviously intoxicated. On this occasion her father told her the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) was going to put him in jail for the murder of KING. In addition, he told her the FBI had given him a polygraph test. He told her she would be contacted by the FBI and that she was to tell the FBI nothing.

She stated her father is intoxicated most of the

times he calls her and she feels he definitely has mental problems. She knew of no psychiatric treatment, but she felt he needed it badly.

She stated her mother, BETTY L. (Mrs. KEITH W.D.) WADE, resides at 233 Smith Street, Barlesen, Texas, and has telephone 817-295-2200. Her two brothers live in the same area. JONES advised that her father has a sister, LEIDA MC GAHEY, 2002 East Eighth Street, Columbus, Mississippi, telephone 601-327-1141, who usually knows his whereabouts.

JONES advised her father never indicates where he is calling from and has moved around a great deal since his divorce four and one-half years ago at Ft. Worth, Texas. She stated he was arrested around that time at Brownsville, Texas, while intoxicated in a bar and after making threats to kill his wife. She advised the police found a rifle in his car.

Further, she stated her father was congenial when sober, but when he drank he was mean and often hit his wife. She advised that although he was bigoted she is sure he did not kill KING and that he was not in Memphis at the time KING was murdered.

DEBRA ANN JONES, Belvidere, Illinois, who is the daughter of BURGESS AUDIE WILSON, advised that she does not recall exactly when her father purchased the 1965 Mustang. She recalled driving it to school for a couple of months prior to her graduation and advised they definitely had this vehicle during early April, 1968. She stated her father purchased the car from an unknown dealership near Kansas City.

believe that the two shared a cell together for over two years and RAY never expressed a dislike for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., even though STEWART said RAY disliked blacks and Dr. KING was the leading Civil Rights Activist at that time.

In view of STEWART'S belief that RAY is innocent, it is highly unlikely, he would tend to incriminate RAY in further interview, say with the House Select Committee on Assassinations, and he did not indicate that he knew who might be responsible, if in fact anyone, in aiding RAY in his escape or who might actually have assassinated Dr. KING.

STEWART indicated a willingness to talk to the House Select Committee on Assassinations, however, he probably wants to work some sort of deal with them and they should be so advised before initiating any talks with him. At best, STEWART may be able to provide insights into RAY'S thinking and logic, since the two spent two years together, but it is doubtful that he can provide any concrete information of value to the Bureau.

JERRY WAYNE STEWART, inmate registration number 02492-135, was interviewed at the U.S. Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia (USP-A), where he is presently incarcerated. STEWART was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and of the nature of the investigation being conducted. He was advised any information furnished may be used in a court of law. He was also advised that any information furnished

will be furnished to the U.S. Department of Justice and the

House Select Committee on Assassinations.

STEWART at the outset, advised he did not wish to provide the Government with any information if the Government could not help him be relocated at the Federal Correctional Institute in Memphis, Tennessee. STEWART advised that he had recently been turned down by the Bureau of Prisons in his request for transfer to Memphis. After it was explained to him that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) was not in a position to authorize and promise such transfer, he hesitatingly agreed to answer some questions.

STEWART advised that he and JAMES EARL RAY, convicted assassin of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., were cellmates together at the Missouri State Prison, Jefferson City, Missouri. STEWART said he and RAY were at the Missouri Prison together from 1964 until October, 1967 when RAY escaped. He said he and RAY became pretty close friends, the two working in the kitchen together at the Penitentiary in addition to sharing the same cell. STEWART said he and RAY used to talk quite a bit about escaping. RAY was interested in obtaining false identification and documents to facilitate his getaway once he escaped from prison. STEWART said he gave RAY advice on how to obtain these documents. RAY never indicated to STEWART that he had any outside help in his escape, but STEWART surmised that he did. STEWART did not know who this help might come from but was certain it was not RAY's brothers.

STEWART said that both he and RAY expressed a strong dislike for blacks. RAY never said he disliked Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and never talked about killing

Dr. KING. RAY also never indicated he had anyone on the outside for whom he was going to kill Dr. KING, and his sole reason for escaping from Missouri Prison was to "get out and get free".

STEWART said he is certain that RAY did not kill Dr. KING. He said RAY is a publicity hound and is probably being used by someone but he did not know who he is being used by. Although STEWART is convinced RAY is innocent, he could provide no concrete information to substantiate his belief. He said he had not seen or heard from RAY since he escaped from the Missouri Prison in October, 1967. STEWART said he himself was in the Tennessee State Prison at Nashville when Dr. KING was killed.

STEWART said he would be willing to talk to the House Selects: Committee on Assassinations about his association with JAMES EARL RAY.

STEWART was observed to be a white male.

Synopsis: Investigation at Liberty County, Texas, negative regarding any information concerning a non-child support warrant issued at Cleveland, Texas. BOB SORRELL, former employee, Hagler Aero Service, Charles W. Baker Airport, Millington, Tennessee, interviewed and recalled that BILL WILSON flew into the airport on two occasions, perhaps in 1968 or 1969. Full scope of interview included in details.

DETAILS:

Investigation in this case was predicated upon receipt of a communication from the Jackson Office of the FBI requesting investigation at Cleveland, Texas, for full details concerning a non child support warrant issued against BURGESS AUDIE WILSON, JR., also known as BILL.

On August 19, 1978, LARRY ALLEN, Patrolman, Cleveland Texas Police Department, reviewed the files of the Cleveland Police Department, but could locate no record identifiable with BURGESS AUDIE WILSON, JR., Date of Birth ALLEN advised that if a non child support warrant were issued in Cleveland, it was probably filed through the Cleveland City Court and warrant issued by Judge GLEN JONES, City Judge.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

The records of the City Court are not available for review until 9 A.M. on August 21, 1978, and Judge GLEN JONES is currently unavailable.

BOB SORRELL, Route 1, Box 260, (Beaumont Colony), Kountze, Texas, was contacted at his residence where he was advised of the identity of Special Agent RUSSELL E. KALIHER, JR. who identified himself as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was advised that any information he furnished could possibly be used in a court of law. SORRELL was observed to be a white male, age 46, who exhibited no physical or mental impairments which would prevent his testifying in a court of law. SORRELL advised he preferred not to furnish a signed statement but did furnish the following oral information:

SORRELL became personally acquainted with BILL WILSON, through his, SORRELL's attendance at the Hollywood Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee, which was pastored by Brother WILSON, father of BILL WILSON. SORRELL had no other association with BILL WILSON except through contact at church. SORRELL attended that church as a youngster and continued until approximately 1958, when his family moved from the neighborhood and his attendance stopped.

He, SORRELL, had no other contact with BILL WILSON until after 1967 when SORRELL became employed at Hagler Aero Service, Charles W. Baker Airport, Millington, Tennessee, telephone number 872-2261. SORRELL was employed part-time at Hagler until October or November, 1967 when he became a full-time employee functioning as a lineman.

SORRELL recalled that sometime after becomeing a full-time employee that BILL WILSON flew into the airport, exact date unrecalled, in a twin Beechcraft (D-18) believed to be red and white in color with possibly a blue stripe.

SORRELL recalled that he, SORRELL, refueled this airplane, but he cannot recall the time of day that WILSON arrived at the airport. As best recalled by SORRELL, WILSON was wearing civilian clothing and paid cash for the fuel purchase. SORRELL and WILSON had little conversation other than a routine greeting. As best recalled by SORRELL, WILSON stayed overnight and left the following day, time unknown. SORRELL does not know how WILSON was transported from and to the airport.

Within two or three months, WILSON made a second visit to Hagler in the same aircraft where he received gas, paid each and laid over for two or three days. Again, SURRELL has no idea as to the transportation from and to the airport. SURRELL has no information as to where he came in from or his destination upon departure from the airport. SURRELL could supply no information about a 1965 white Mustang and did not know that WILSON had a daughter, DEBORAH.

SORRELL has not seen nor heard from WILSON since WILSON's last visit to Hagler.

SORRELL terminated his employment at Hagler in October, 1976. SORRELL cannot recall the exact time of arrival or departure of WILSON, but does believe that both visits occurred in either 1968 or 1969. SORRELL advised that fuel receipts are broken down by single engine or multi-engine aircraft and are maintained on a monthly basis. He said that a GLENN MITCHELL, Maintenance Supervisor, Hagler Aero Service, could assist if a review of the gas receipts became necessary to determine the exact date of arrival of WILSON.

SCRRELL had no information as to how WILSON came into possession of the aircraft and does not know whether it was leased or owned by him. In recalling the two visits by WILSON, SORRELL has a "gut feeling" that someone may have been with him on each occasion, but this is just a feeling on his part and he can supply no information to confirm this feeling. SORRELL had no information about an airport in Olatha, Kansas, where WILSON allegedly landed after departure from Memphis.

As further background information, SORRELL recalled that during his attendance at the Hollywood Baptist Church he got the impression that WILSON was "in and out of trouble" although he does not know the type. He may have received this information from one of WILSON's sisters, names unrecalled. Through contact with WILSON at church, WILSON impressed SORRELL as the type of guy who always had a "big deal", "kind of a con man personality". Again, and it may have been one of WILSON's sisters who mentioned it, SORRELL got the impression that WILSON had been arrested and received time for an unknown offense. SORRELL advised that contact with WILSON's sisters was always at church. He again stated that he has a "gut feeling" that one

of them may have been at the airport on one of the two occasions of WILSON's arrival.

SORRELL did not know for certain that WILSON served in the U. S. Air Force, but recalled that WILSON wore a uniform to church on occasions. SORRELL was not aware that WILSON was employed at Prudential Insurance Company, but does recall his marriage to BETTY LOU (Maiden name unknown), because BETTY lived in the same neighborhood. SORRELL had no information about WILSON's cleaning business or time spent in the Tennessee National Guard or that WILSON ever left the Memphis area.

Synopsis:

On August 18, 1978, BURGESS AUDIE WILSON turned himself over to FBI Agents of the Jackson, Mississippi, Office. WILSON alleged that he murdered MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. At the time of KING's death, WILSON resided at 13125 Herrick Avenue, Grandview, Missouri. During the same period of time, WILSON owned a jewelry store in Belton, Missouri, called Wilburs Jewelry Store. As a result of doing business as a jeweler, he met MITCH ZAMMAR who he ableges gave him a Japanese Sniper Rifle with which he killed KING. ZAMMAR admitted knowing who WILSON was, however, he said he does not know anything about WILSON's involvement with the assassination of KING. ZAMMAR only met WILSON once as a result of selling WILSON ZAMMAR said that he had five brothers a diamond ring. who are now all deceased. He said that his brother, JIM, had a scar on his face as a result of an injury sustained as a infant. WILSON also alleges that a LOU CREWS of Crews Jewelry Store, Grandview, Missouri, engineered the assassination of KING. CREWS died of cancer on August 22, 1978, before he could be interviewed. According to EAA records, WILSON purchased a Bonanza Airplane #4434L from FISHER Sales and Services on June 6, 1968. DON FISHER, of Fisher Sales and Services, purchased this plane on May 27, 1968, from a CORNIE C. MILLER, 9618 Sagamore, Kansas City, Missouri. WILSON alleges he used this plane to fly from Kansas City to Memphis. FISHER said that prior to the time that WILSON purchased the plane from him, WILSON rented the plane from him on numerous occasions. FISHER said that MILLER, the previous owner, never rented the plane to anyone while he was the owner.

MILLER indicated he never rented or leased the plane to anyone while he was the owner of Bonanza Plane #4434L. WILSON also alleges that he drove to the airport in a Thunderbird owned by him, however, the records of the Johnson County Bank, Kansas, show that the car was not purchased until October 9, 1968. WILSON has been described as a con man and a heavy drinker.

DETAILS:

Investigation was initiated on August 21, 1978, upon receipt of an immediate teletype from Memphis, indicating that BURGESS AUDIE WILSON surrendered to FBI Agents of the Jackson Office. WILSON, at that time, alleged that he assassinated MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, DON FISHER, Fisher Sales and Services, State Line Airport, Leawood, Kansas, telephone 681-2496, provided the following information:

FISHER purchased State Line Airport in 1964. He remembered the sale of a Model G #56 Bonanza to WILSON. He said he does not remember the exact date, however. He said he remembers the sale of the plane to WILSON because FISHER originally purchased the plane from C. C. MILLER, a retired executive for Western Auto Supply Co. FISHER indicated that MILLER based the plane at State Line Airport from the time MILLER purchased the plane until FISHER bought it from him. FISHER indicated that all the records pertaining to the sale of the aircraft to WILSON were destroyed in a fire at the airport last year.

FISHER thinks that WILSON financed the plane with the Johnson County Bank in Kansas and thinks that WILSON had a partner named LOU CREWS, who owns Crews Jewelers, Grandview, Missouri.

FISHER indicated that he thinks WILSON was a Shriner and also that WILSON drank a lot. FISHER said he thinks WILSON was a jeweler in Grandview, Missouri. He could not recall whether he owned the jewelry store or if he worked for another company.

FISHER indicated that the airport keeps no records of landings or takeoffs.

FISHER said that if he cannot be contacted at State Line Airport, he will be at the Lake of the Ozarks, telephone 314/873-5166.

EDWARD BUSH, person in charge of airplane loans, Johnson County Bank, Kansas, telephone 362-7000, after being advised of the identity of interviewing Agent, provided the following information:

BUSH said he searched his files regarding the financing of a Bonanza plane purchased from a DON FISHER. BUSH indicated that a BURGESS: AUDIE WILSON did finance a plane purchased from FISHER in 1968. He indicated that his records show that a Credit Bureau check was made on June 5, 1968. He also indicated that the bill of sale was dated June 6, 1968.

BUSH said that WILSON's applicant for the loan listed his residence as 13125 Herrick, Grandview, Missouri. It listed his employment as owner of Wilbur Wholesale Jewelry, telephone 331-2500. BUSH indicated that there was no date on the application.

BUSH indicated that WILSON signed a security agreement on June 6, 1968, along with LOU CREWS. He said on June 6, 1968, the plane was registered listing both EREWS and WILSON as partners. The address of the registration of the plane was 553 North Scott, Belton, Missouri.

BUSH said that CREWS* application showed his residence as Hickman Mils Drive, Old 71 Highway. His employment was listed as Chipper Manufacturing. BUSH also indicated that there was no date on the application, nor was there an address or telephone number for Clipper Manufacturing,

BUSH indicated that there is a letter in the file dated November 22, 1968, stating that WILSON and CREWS transferred all rights in the Bonanza #4434U back to DON FISHER.

BUSH indicated that WILSON, on October 9, 1968, purchased a 1968 Thunderbird from Paul Ford Sales, Inc., Kansas City, Missouui, VIN 8Y83N138079. BUSH indicated that the date of loan was October 8, 1968. He indicated that the bank repossessed the car and disposed of it on July 10, 1970.

After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent, SAM LICKTEIG, telephone 765-1991, provided the following information.

LICKTEIG indicated that he was on the City Council when WILSON was a candidate for Mayor in 1969. He said that ARNOLD HOLTON ran against WILSON and HOLTON won the election by a landslide.

LICKTEIG feels that WILSON was very strange. He said that WILSON kept a consignment of diamonds in his house, and that he was burglarized on what seeemed to be a regular basis. LICKTEIG stated he does not know how he stayed in business with all his burglaries. He also said that WILSON appeared to be having family problems.

LICKTEIG said that WILSON lost the Mayor election by a large volume and does not know if anyone backed him up. He does not know if LOU CREWS was involved with the election. LICKTEIG said that one of WILSON's campaign stands was as follows:

"To oppose school district consolidation, consolidation would mean our children could and would be transported to other schools 10 to 15 miles away, and other children from Kansas City transported to our schools."

LICKTEIG said that WILSON attended University of Tennessee. He also said that WILSON was a member of the Kansas City Masonic Lodge.
