YINGER provided a telegram received from her husband RON YINGER, addressed to herself at 1115 Highland Sport (Court), Shreveport, Louisiana, which stated in part: "It's too hot to go fishing in Shreveport, suggest you catch a bus to Indianapolis."

YINGER gave an address of 740 Spruce Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, where she would be reached. VOWELS stated that he became suspicious of YINGER, as she was obviously lying, and he would not give her the money for the bus fare. He stated the more he thought about the telegram that YINGER showed him the more suspicious he became and thought there possibly might be some link between this telegram and the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. VOWELS stated that he did not know what the telegram meant but felt that it might be some sort of code or something. VOWELS stated he was making this information available to the FBI for whatever use they deemed appropriate.



At that time she observed a man registering at the Cascade Motel whom she feels appears similar in appearance to ERIC STARVO GALT, whose photo she has seen in the newspapers and on TV. This man is described by Mrs. Kurtz as white, male, tall, thin, drark brown bushy hair, 30 years, dressed in tan jacket, dark pants, plaid shirt. The man told the room-clerk at the Cascade Motel that he would return the following Saturday to stay there again.

Except for the resemblence in appearance, Mrs. Kurtz knew of nothing to associate this individual with MURKIN.

In view of the assumption that there should be better leads available to locate ERIC STARVO GALT, alias RAY, no action is recommended on the basis of the above information.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — The mysterious Eric Starvo Galt has been charged with conspiracy and murder in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. 12

The FBI said in a fugitive warrant issued last night in Birmingham that Galt, 36, conspired with a man "whom he alleged to be his brother" to violate King's civil rights.

degree murder was filed against Galt in Memphis where King, 39, Nobel Prizewinning civil rights leader, was shot to death on a motel balcony April 4 by a sniper with fled from a rooming thouse.

First-degree murder in Tennessee carries the death penalty although the electric chair has not been used in the state since 1960.

The maximum penalty under the Federal charge of conspiracy to violate a person's civil rights is a \$5,000 fine and 10-year prison sentence.

There was no further mention in the FBI statement about the alleged brother and no charge was filed against him.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover announced in Wash-fington that the conspiracy to "injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate" King began "on on about March 30" in Birmingham.

The FBI statement said a .30-.06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight, found near the rooming house shortly after King was slain, was bought March 30 in Birmingham.

The statement did not connect Galt directly with the rifle.

The FBI released a photosigraph of Galt and solicited public aid in finding him. Whether this appeal meant the trail had become cold was unclear, but U.S. Atty. Genkamsey Clark told a reported in Washington he felt this was not the situation.

The FBI started hunting Galt a week ago. Agents even

contacted persons named Galt in several states in an attempt to find him.

The picture — which had to have the eyes "opened" by an artist — brought uncertain responses from witnesses who were acquainted with Galt or saw the fleeing sniper.

"Unless he was wearing a wig or had had a face-lift or something, it's not the man I saw," said Charles Q. Stevens, who lives at the Main Street rooming house from which the fatal shot apparently was fired.

"The hair is too full and the face is too young," he said. But Stevens said he only got a side view of the fleeing figure.

A source in Birmingham said the photograph was taken within the past three months, although the FBI did not specify when it was made. The photo has sharp contrast, making hair and features very dark.

"It's very near, but I'm not sure," was the reaction of Peter Cherpes, owner of a Birmingham boarding house where an Eric Galt stayed from Aug. 26 to Oct. 7 last year.

"I don't really know,"
(Cherpes said. "It's so hard to
tell. His hair seemed to be
lighter."

The FBI, relying on witnesses apparently, said the fugitive had been described as a white man, 5-8 to 5-11, weighing 160 to 175 pounds, with brown hair in a brush cut, blue eyes, straight nose.

EAR PROTRUDES FARTHER FROM HEAD

Persons who have met Galt, the FBI reported, described him as a loner with a "rural" speech and little schooling, fond of vodka, beer and hillbilly music.

The FBI statement also said, "The fugitive is said to have a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an ear lobe with his left hand, His left ear protrudes further from his head than his right ear."

Galt has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Lowmeyer, the FBI said. The assassin registered at the Memphis rooming house under the name of John Willard.

Galt, the FBI said, is the owner of a 1966 white Mustang with Alabama license plates abandoned in Atlanta the day after King was shot to death. The vehicle was left in the parking lot of an apartment project near the Georgia Capitol.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifie. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 4221 South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 4223 South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993.

Investigation at Birmngham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as his height as 5'll", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a,m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

Prints Matched By FBI

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI today identified Eric Starvo Galt, sought in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King, as James Earl Ray, an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary.

A warrant was issued Wednesday for a man identified as Galt in the April 4 sniper slaying of King in Memphis.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said a systematic search of latent fingerprints uncovered in the case against the prints of more than 53,000 persons led to the determination "that Galt and Ray are identical."

Hoover said Ray, 40, was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City April 23, 1967. He had been serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery.

As Galt, Ray has been the object of a cross-country search which extended into Mexico. He is accused of conspiracy and murder in the assassination of King.

The FBI, in a warrant issued earlier this week, charged Galt and an "alleged brother" with conspiracy in King's slaying.

The FBI released two front and side view photos of Ray apparently taken at the Missouri prison, where he had been an inmate since 1960. It said the photograph had been taken in 1960.

The photograph was identified as that of Ray, also k nown as Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

John Willard was the name used by the man who checked into a Memphis rooming house from which the shot that killed King apparently was fired.

Hoover said Ray had a known arrest record dating back to 1949. Befor his 1960 conviction in St. Louis, Ray was convicted of burglary in Los Angeles, 1949; armed robbery in Chicago, 1952; and forging United States postal money orders in Missouri in 1955.

Ray claims to have been born in Illinois—but the FBI did not say where. He is about 5-feet-10, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair and two scars: A small one on the center of his forehead and another on the palm of his right hand.

But the announcement raised some perplexing questions. On Wednesday, when Hoover identified Galt as the man sought for conspiracy in the slaying, he said that Galt had taken dancing lessons in ew Orleans in 1964 and 65. But yesterday's FBI

The discrepancy, Federal sources said, arose from an error into the investigation of the background of "Galt."

Ray was sentenced to 20 FBI Director J. Edgar years on Dec. 18, 1959, on a charge of armed robbery in St. Louis Circuit Court. He and another ex-convict, James Owens, were convicted of robbing a St. Louis supermarket of \$190.

The FBI handed out two lictures of Ray taken in 1960. n several ways, they matched pictures of Galt taken in 1968

In its announcement Wednesday the FBI said a warrant had been filed charging that Galt entered into a conspiracy with "an individual whom he alleged to be his brother." It said the conspiracy "continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate Martin Luther King Jr."

KING WAS slain on the porch of a motel in Memphis on April 4. He was shot from ambush by a man in a rundown rooming house across the street. The man escaped in a white Mustang, later found abandoned in Atlanta.

No mention of the alleged brother was made in the new announcement. It was reported Thursday that an informer, co-operating with the FBI led to a belief that King's slayer was in California.

A reliable source told UPL that FBI agents were in communication with Galt's "alleged brother."


