



WOLKERSTORFER advised that he stayed at the American Motor Hotel in Atlanta on 4/6 and 7/68 and then moved to the Sky Host Inn and stayed there until 4/9/68, when he checked out and flew back to Chicago.

WOLKERSTORFER advised that he did not see or hear anything concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING other than that which was published in the newspapers.

On 5/10/68 JOHN C. TWOHEY advised SA JOSEPH J. REILLY that he did travel to Atlanta with WOLKERSTORFER in order to gather material for an article on the life and death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, which was to appear in "Ave Maria" magazine. Mr. TWOHEY advised that he did not see or hear anything that would be of value to the FBI concerning the death of Mr. KING while he was traveling through the South.




