



On July 13, 1967, two unknown males, wearing stocking masks, robbed The Bank of Alton, Alton, Illinois, at gunpoint and obtained over \$27,000. Investigation of this crime led to the recovery of a white Van Heusen Vangard shirt and a pair of tan trousers among other items.

The shirt bears laundry marks and the trousers dry cleaning symbols, facsimiles of which appear below. The laundry marks appear on the shirt collar, and dry cleaning symbols appear on the front and rear pockets on the right side of the trousers.

"Not guilty plea" entered by Jas. Ray

MEMPHIS, Tenn.,—Appearing before Judge Preston Battle on Monday of this week, James Earl Ray through his counsel entered a plea of "not guilty" to the charge of slaying the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., on Thursday evening April 4.

Ray was flanked by his lawyers, Arthur Hanes, former Mayor of Birmingham and Hanes' son, Arthur Jr., at the counsel table. District Attorney General Phil Canale and two of his aids. Sheriff William N. Morris Jr., sat behind Ray.

Morris Jr., sat behind Ray. Following preliminary procedures Judge Battle advised counsel for Ray that he(Ray) did not have to enter a plea

at this time."

Mr. Hanes replied, "The defendant wants to enter a plea of not guilty." Ray was never called by name by his attorney. Following the reading of each indictment one charging murder and the other carrying a dangerous weapon. Hanes. said:". The defendant wants to enter a plea of not guilty.."

However, it appears that later Hanes admitted to newsmen that James Earl Ray is his client's real name, He (Ray) was using the name "Sneyd) when arrested in London and seemingly as late as last week, He was arrested in London July 8.

Late Monday afternoon District Attorney General Canake noted that Charles Q. Stephens age 46, is held in jail as a material witness in the case under \$100,000 bond.

Ray dressed neatly in a darky blue suit sat silently through the court procedure, Judge Battle set the trial date for Nov. 12. The widely-heralded theory of a conspiracy attending the slaying of Dr. King may or may not crop up on or after Nov. 12. But seemingly the FBI has discarded such a theory of the slaying.

Attending Ray's escapades he escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967. He has not been known to have worked anywhere since that

In keeping with the wide spread rumors he had boasted while in prison that he intended when on the outside to pick up a "bundle" Again he might try to collect a \$1 million bundle offered for the death of Dr. King supposedly by a business group.

How, or where Ray obtained money for, a \$2,000 car, travel to Mexico, across this country and to Canada may never be revealed. Yet during the time he never held a job and engaged in "play boy spending."

One supposition heretofore explored by the FBI was that he might have been a party to a bank robbery on July 13 last year at Alton, III., in which it has been reported more than \$20,000 was seized. The bank robbery followed by something like three months Ray's escape from prison in Missouri on the westside of the "bus river." The FBI has ventured that Ray might have been one of the two men who made the haul on the Alton Bank. But the supposition has never been clinched.

Seemingly, the FBI has abandoned the idea that a conspiracy obtained in the slaying of Dr. King. However, the rumor still prevails in some circles, low or high, that Ray's operations or activities would have been impossible without help from others who entertained ideas of slaying Dr. King.-



Donald James Nissen was contacted at the United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, on September 12, 1968, and furnished the following information in a signed statement:

"September 12, 1968
"Terre Haute, Indiana

"I, Donald James Nissen, am presently confined at the United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana. I am giving this statement of my own free will and no promises or threats have been made to me. I am willing to testify to the following information before any Security Hearing Board and in the presence of any persons I make allegations against as well as their attorneys knowing I would be subject to cross-examination.

"I know of no connection between John C. Carbo, Jr., who is the Chief Probation Officer for the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta, Georgia, and the K.K.K. or any similar group. I never meant to infer this, but there may have been a misunder-standing when I made a statement that I was afraid to talk to Mr. Carbo, however I meant that he might feel that I was under great pressure and strain from the K.K.K. and might jump probation. I feared that if he felt I was about to violate my probation earlier this year, he might have my probation revoked.

"During February or March, 1967, I was confined at the U.S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, and I talked with a fellow inmate, Leroy McMenaman. He told me that there was a \$100,000 reward for the person who killed Martin Luther King, who was still alive at that McMenaman asked me at first if I would set it up for him, by finding out such things as King's whereabouts, and daily schedule. Just before my release from prison in April, 1967, McMenaman told me that it was all right for me to do the entire job including the assassination of King. He told me that in order to collect the \$100,000 I should contact Mrs. Eurie, owner of Eurie Real Estate Company, Jackson, Mississippi. Mrs. Eurie would then put me in contact with the pay-off man who was a K.K.K. member and also the newest Deputy United States Marshal, at Jackson, Mississippi. I was never told the name of this Deputy United States Marshal, however he was in April, 1967, the newest man in that office. He was also supposedly a member of the Council for the White Knights at Jackson. I don't have any further information about this Deputy Marshal and I never contacted Mrs. Eurie. I do believe that McMenaman was telling me the truth.

"I have read this statement consisting of this and one other page and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I have made this statement to John D. Burroughs, Jr., who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

A review of the Inmate File pertaining to DONALD JAMES NISSEN at the U.S. Penitentiary, Terre Haute, revealed that he is a white male American, born 5'10", 130, brown hair, blue eyes, and assigned number 26055TH. On 12/14/64, he received five years probation for Dyer Act and on 7/19/65, his probation was revoked and on 8/14/65, he was recommitted for five years on the probation violation and Dyer Act in U.S. District Court at Tucson, Arizona.

Mr. WILLIAM BARBER, NISSEN's case worker, at the U.S. Penitentiary, Terre Haute, advised that NISSEN is not under psychiatric care and further there is no psychiatrist at the U.S. Penitentiary, Tore Haute, Indiana. He stated that NISSEN only recently was transferred into the U.S. Penitentiary, Terre Haute, and he knows very little if anything about him.

During interview of NISSEN, on 9/12/68, he very emphatically attempted to make it clear that there was a misinterpretation of his statements regarding JOHN C. CARBO, Jr., the Chief Probation Officer at Atlanta. Georgia, and that he never meant to infer that CARBO was in any way connected with the KKK. He further advised that the Deputy United States Marshal he was referring to was not stationed in Atlanta, Georgia, but rather was assigned to Jackson, Mississippi. He said that even though he would be willing to testify before a Security Hearing Board that he wanted to limit his information in this matter as he felt that while he was confined at the institution chances of retaliation against him would be great. He further stated that he had given much of this information to the FBI previously and that he was under the opinion that Mrs. EURIE of Jackson, Mississippi, had previously been interviewed by the FBI as a result of information furnished by him.

Information copy to Memphis as LHM contains information concerning identity of individuals who supposedly were putting up money for the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

As NISSEN could not identify the Klan he was referring to, no characterization of KKK is attached. The Indianapolis Office is not in possession of a characterization of the Council for the White Knights.





On 10/16/68, ROHERT H. STRADER, 122 William Drive, Apartment J. Brownsburg, Indiana, telephonically contacted this office advising that he wished to speak to an agent in regard to captioned subject. Arrangements were made to meet him at which time he furnished information substantially the same as was furnished by his wife, MARGARET CARMICHAEL STRADER, in referenced airtel. The only discrepancy with information furnished previously by his wife was that he compared photographs that were published of JAMES EARL RAY to the persons that he remembered having overheard at the Gulf Truck Stop, Lebanon, Tennessee, in late March, 1968. After comparison he advised that none of the five men he overheard at the truck step were identical to JAMES EARL RAY. His wife had previously stated in referenced airted that one of those persons had been RAY.

STRADER advised that after hearing this conversation with the five men in the restroom at the truck stop on or about the last day of March, 1968, that he and his wife turned around and traveled back to Memphis, a distance of about 65 miles, to report what he had overheard. When they returned to Memphis, however, he got scared, did not want to get involved and did not report what he had heard to anyone. They left Memphis and traveled East in the direction they had been traveling before returning to Memphis. Mrs. STRADER, in referenced airtel, advised to the contrary that he did not mention hearing of the plan to kill Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING that day, and she did not advise of having returned to Memphis to report such information.

In addition to the above information, STRADER advised that he was approached by a man on the night of 10/13/68. at the bar of Howard Johnson's, located at I-465 and Indiana State Highway 136, in Indianapolis. This man, according to STRADER, knew all about STRADER and was aware of his poor financial statum. This was followed him to the car and told STRADER that he could make \$100,000 if he would testify to what he heard in the restroom in Lebanon, Tounessee, in late March. The man did not tell him who would pay the money, but told STRADER that if he was interested he was to be in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, at the airport at 3:00 AM, on Saturday, 10/19/68. The man also told STHADER that if he did not believe him, to go to the Holiday Inn bar, at the Indianapolis airport at 5:00 PH the next evening. STRADER advised that he did, in fact, go the next evening to the Holiday Inn bar, which was on 10/14/68, but he was not approached by anyone. On the morning of 10/15/68, at approximately 5:30 AM, STRADER heard a noise at his apartment door, and found a note which stated, "Sat. 3:00 AM, OKLA. City. How much money". STRADER stated that he became very worried and finally on 10/16/68 made a telephone call to ARTHUR HAYNES, attorney for JAMES EARL RAY, in Birmingham, Alabama, attempting to find out if HAYNES was responsible for the offer of \$100,000 for STRADER to testify. He talked to HAYNES, at which time HATHES mentioned to STRADER that he had received a mysterious phone call several days before, advising that he should get in touch with a ROBERT STRADER, however, HAYNES had taken it as a prank call. HAYNES knew of no offer of money to STRADER if he would testify, but did take STRADER's address and phone number.

After talking to HAYNES, STRADER immediately called the Indianapolis office and requested to talk to an Agent. STRADER gave as his reason for not contacting the FBI previously, that he was an ex-con and was not fond of dealing with police in any manner, however, he was acted and felt that he must make known the above information. STRADER furnished both notes he had received to interviewing Agents.

IP 44-563

Indianapolis Office is retaining these notes at this time and has instructed STRADER to promptly advise if he is recontacted in the future by anyone concerning this matter. As the substance of this interview with STRADER has previously been furnished to the Bureau and Memphis, it does not appear further investigation is necessary. The Indianapolis Office will keep the Bureau and Memphis advised of any further developments.

It should be noted that in referenced airtel, mention is made of the fact that STRADER was a patient twice at Patton State Hospital, Sacramento, California, and once at Atascadero State Hospital in California.

On December 5 and 6, 1968, PAUL HOWARD, temporarily residing Room 224, Rogers Hotel, Bloomington, Illinois, an unsavory individual with alleged underworld connections, contacted a representative of the Springfield Office.

HOWARD advised that since casually meeting ROBERT HOOD STRADER in a bar he has associated with him constantly from November 26, 1968, to the present. He identified STRADER as the owner of the Prototype Specialty Company, 2745 South Holt Road, P. O. Box 41004, Indianapolis, Indiana, whose wife, MARGARET STRADER, was currently confined to St. Joseph Hospital, Bloomington, Illinois, where she has given birth to a child.

As noted in referenced communications, STRADER, who apparently has a history of mental illness, has alleged he had information concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HOWARD related the story as furnished him by STRADER with events in the order as set forth in referenced airtels. STRADER alleged to HOWARD that the FBI was fully familiar with his story; that he is well acquainted with numerous agents throughout the United States and that "federal agents" were protecting him and are constantly alert to his whereabouts. HOWARD, STRADER continually discusses the MARTIN LUTHER KING killing and has furnished so much alleged detail in this matter that he has HOWARD thoroughly confused. STRADER allegedly is in the process of selling his story concerning the KING slaying to the "Chicago Daily News" for \$2,500,000 and he has an appointment with JOHN LINDSTROM on December 7, 1968, at a motel in Lafayette, Indiana, concerning his story. STRADER allegedly stated whoever will pay the most for his story will get it.

HOWARD advised he and STRADER travelled to the office of STRADER's attorney, DONALD FOLEY, of the Merchants Bank Building, Indianapolis, Indiana, where between 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., December 5, 1968, STRADER made four or five disk recordings utilizing both sides of the recording disks in which he related all of his alleged facts concerning the KING slaying. FOLEY then allegedly contacted or was to contact an agent of the Indianapolis Office.

Incidental to their trip to Indianapolis, Indiana, STRADER and HOWARD travelled to the Veterans Administration Hospital, Danville, Illinois, where STRADER is allegedly a patient on temporary leave due to report back on December 26, 1968. The purpose of the visit was to pick up checks mailed to STRADER at the hospital but after entering the hospital STRADER returned to HOWARD and stated the checks had not come.

In view of past information concerning STRADER, no action is recommended. Additional information furnished by HOWARD in this matter will be furnished the Bureau and interested offices upon its receipt.

He advised he is a member of the law firm - Stewart, Irwin, Gilliom, Fuller and Meyer, Suite 1200 at above address. He stated their legal practice is practically entirely civil. Mr. FOLEY advised he is presently representing ROBERT STRATER for the purpose of drafting a contract with representatives of the Chicago Daily News, newspaper, published in Chicago, Illinois.

He stated that he first met STRATER some time ago when he was referred to FOLEY to handle some legal matters, and as a result of that relationship he was approached with respect to the contract drafting. Mr. FOLEY advised that this past Thursday STRATER talked to him and indicated that he had not told all the facts he had relative to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING to the FBI in previous contacts with the FBI. FOLEY stated that last Thursday his client "gave him the full story" of what he allegedly knew of this FOLEY advised that at that time he told STRATER he would not assist in drafting any contract with the Chicago Daily News unless STRATER cooperated fully with the FBI. According to FOLEY, STRATER professes to be willing to take a polygraph test to prove he is now or will be now telling the truth. FOLEY said that he feels it is his responsibility to advise the FBI and in calling he was fulfilling this responsibility. He said he would make available any information or physical evidence such as credit cards charges for gasoline, etc., that his client, STRATER, furnished him if STRATER is agreeable to this. This is due according to FOLEY because of the lawyer-client relationship.

FOLEY stated that his client, STRATER, professed to be in fear of his life, professed to want to talk to the FBI and professed to be willing to set up an appointment and meet with them. FOLEY advised that several weeks ago he spoke to SA RICHARD H. GRABHAM of this office telephonically to call our attention to STRATER and the fact that STRATER said he had been interviewed by the FBI and had additional information.

FOLEY advised that there was to be a meeting with representatives of the Chicago Daily News at a motel in Lafayette, Indiana on either 12/6 or 7/68, which meeting was canceled by the newspaper representatives. He said the meeting has been re-scheduled for next Friday night, 12/13/68 at 7:00 PM. FOLEY did not say whether he dealt with the newspaper representatives or whether this information came to him through his client, STRATER.

He stated that STRATER professed to be scared and in addition to be willing to submit to a polygraph test, wanted to have the FBI "bug" his automobile. He said his client in the past has alleged that he has been shot at, received threatening notes, has been living in fear, has gone to various cities, etc. He said STRATER presently is living at the Rogers Hotel in Danville, Illinois. He will be there until Christmas Day, 1968. He is on leave from the VA Hospital at Danville, Illinois, where he is receiving mental treatment. STRATER has a wife and young child. They are living with her folks at Lexington, Illinois. He said STRATER alleges he has previously contacted the FBI at Bloomington, Illinois, and at Indianapolis, Indiana.

FOLEY stated that STRATER also advised him (no dates) that an unknown man approached him at the Howard Johnson Motel on West 16th Street in Indianapolis to testify in a certain way at the RAY trial. He also told FOLEY that he was in contact with two men at the Holiday Inn at the Indianapolis Airport. Or, at least there were two men whom he thought were trying to make contact with him there.

FOLEY said STRATER's wife had recited the story of STRATER's alleged involvement in matters relating to the KING murder. FOLEY said his client has a record of previous psychiatric treatment.

The writer pointed out to FOLEY that independetly of the attorney or the FBI, medical people had objectively determined STRATER required psychiatric care as FOLEY said he did. The writer advised attorney DONAED F. FOLEY that the proper official of the FBI conversant with matters of interest to the FBI in the investigation of Reverend KING's murder would be apprised of the above.

Re Kansas City letter to Memphis, 10/4/68, captioned as above, and Kansas City report of SA WEETER S. POND, 2/10/69, captioned "FRED ALEXANDER MICHAELSON, aka; ITSP."

For information of Memphis, MICHAELSON was transported 2/27/69 to the U.S. Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana.

For information of Indianapolis, MICHAELSON as FRED ALEXANDER MICHELSON appeared in U. S. District Court, Kansas City, Ks., on 1/31/69 and was sentenced to serve six years custody of the Attorney General on each of three counts of an indictment charging violations Section 2314, Title 18, U. S. Code. The sentences are concurrent.

He was confined in the Clay County Jail, Liberty, Missouri, since 7/27/67, on local charges inasmuch as his trial had been continued on several occasions because of his insistence in changing lawyers. He was removed by writ for the Federal charges, and subsequently the local charges were dismissed in view of the Federal sentence.

MICHAELSON was interviewed in jail at Liberty, Mo., on 10/2/68, upon his request, and stated he had written several letters to the Case Agent, but they had been returned because of improper addresses. He claimed to have vital information concerning the assassinations of JOHN F. KENNEDY on 11/22/63; MARTIN LUTHER KING on 4/3/68, and ROBERT KENNEDY. His information would go "to the scale of great national importance." He realized the information had been held much too long, but he refused

to discuss it in jail. He denied using this as an attempt to get out of the jail, and added that he would definitely make a full disclosure if and when he is incarcerated in a penitentiary or hospital where he could obtain treatment for his nervous stomach.

Information had been previously furnished by the jailer that several prisoners had commented that MICHAELSON had claimed to be psychic in making predictions of such things as aircraft disasters. It had been claimed that such predictions could not be made unless he had the use of a ballpoint pen, and such pens were not available to him while in jail.

It is noted MICHAELSON was incarcerated in the Missouri State Penitentiary from about 6/25/65 to about 8/26/66 and both MICHAELSON and JAMES EARL RAY were there at the same time.

In view of the above information and the fact MICHAELSON desired to enter guilty pleas to Federal charges, the AUSA, District of Kansas, issued a writ and had MICHAELSON removed to Federal custody for sentencing as stated above. Prior to sentencing, MICHAELSON was found by the court to be mentally competent.
