

S. Post Office Department Honey Under No. 7-12,237,597. On this semo date a companion, Valter Terry Rife, entered a ples of guilty in Decimb No. 19119 to an Information in one count charging him with the longery on Narrh' 21, 1955 of postal money order No. 7-h2,239,568. Imposition of sentence as to deformant and his companion was deferred and this presentance investigation was ordered.

The facts of the case are as follows: In March 7, 1955 the U. J. . ost Office st del'erville, illinois was burglarized and sixty-six blank V. S. Postal Konny Crears, Serial Wos. 7-62,237,535 to 7-62,239,600 inclusive, and the office validating stamp were stolen. On Harch 8, 1955 at Alton, Illinois an unsuccessful attempt was made to each one of these stolen money orders. On March 21, 1955 one of the stolen money orders, order No. 7-12,237,577, was presented to Askin's Clothing Company, 1206 Grand Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, by an unknown rerson in payment for a suit of clothes which was never licked up after alterations had been made. This money order, which was in the amount of \$75.00, was tade tayable to villard i. McBrido with the purchaser being shown as Vernon 'c ride. Un this same date on unknown person prosented stolen money order No. 7-12,237,568 to the Chaffer Office Machine Company, 1h1) Grand Avenue, fighens City, "issouri, in payment for a used portable Remington typesmiter. This with the purchaser being shown as Vorgon McBride. The manager of thus firm, being suspicious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the custim The employee noted the model and make of the automobile entered by the customer and the license number of the car. Later when this money order was assertained

to have been stolen a description of the customer and his automobile was given to post office inspectors who alorted the Missouri State Highway Fatrel. A highway natrolean on March 23, 1755 at Mannibal, Miscouri arrested in this automobile Walter Terry Mife, Jemes Marl May, and a woman companion who had been released. Thirty-four of the money orders stolen from the Wellery Mae, I incis fost office were found hidden under the dean above the glove compartment in this automobile. All of them had been stamped with the validating stamp. Some were made out ready for cashing while others were not.

On March Ch, 1955 Rife executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he adultied he had prepared, forged and uttered the postal money order presented to the Chaffee Office Supply Company in Mancas City. He adultted prescring the cone, order which was attered on forgod endorsement at askin's allothing Gompany, . andar Olty, Missouri. He admitted that he mad prepared the race of the money orders made ready for cashing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other noney orders on forged andorsements in the states of Florida, Louisiana, Frances, and Fiscouri, He recalled unsuccessfully attempting to each the money order at Alto, Illinois on Yarch 4, 1955. In his statement he edults that he purchased in Cuincy, Illinois the stolen soncy orders. They were cold to him by an unidentified man for \$20. On March 21, 1955 Ray, deals into execute statement for restal inspectors, did verbally state that he had particleated with 'die in the eaching of the stolen coney orders in the various states. He donied actually knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he shalltedly presumed that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for 1231 to admitted that it was be who forged and aftered the soney order presented it Askin's Clothing Company in Kansas City, Hissouri. He stated that he curchess! for /l in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willard J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two sorrey orders uttered by Rife and Ray in Kanses City, Pleasuri and so well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illinois have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the money orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 15, 1955 when reinterviewed by postal inspectors hife and Ray gave particulars relating to the cashing of twenty-seven additional stolen mensy orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. The particulars are as set out in the following table:

Two of the stolen money orders have not yet been resovered. They, however, are atcounted for as Ray has edulated eaching one of them at a luggage store in Manage of City, Meneas and Rife admits cashing one of them at Michi Beach, Florida.

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rice and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the ream which they accupied a quantity of merchandles they had acquired by passing the stolen mency exters. Found in their room ways a typewriter, several pieces of luggage, a redic, a comera, a wristwatch, a considerable quantity of new searing appared for man, and other items. They have authorized the postal inspectors to return this merchandles to the stores or individuals from them it was obtained.

VIII. HEALTH:

Beforement is 5° 10g" tell, veighe 170 lbs., has a ruldy emplement, blue eyes, and brown hair. There are no apparent marks or scars of identification. He apparently is in good health. He states that before becoming involved in the instant offense he was in the process of politicaling for admittance to a Veigrans Hospital in Illinois for a general physical chackup. He denies a history of surgery other than a tennillectory in Chicago in 1952. He denies a history of veneral disease or the use of nercetics. He states that he is a "maderate drinker."

#### IX. EMPLOYEMIT AND MILITARY HISTORY

He claims that from August 1951 to May 1952 ha was employed by the Borg Erick-son Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. This employees was terminated when he was arrested for robbery, which eventually resulted in a positiontlary contents.

He states that from July of 1950 to June 1951 he was employed by the Arboy Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. He was discharged from this employment for absenteeism caused by his arrest in Alton, Illinois for vagrancy then visiting in that city.

He claims that from April 1950 to July of 1950 he was employed as a laborar change of 90% per hour by the Noe Produce Company, Chicago, Illinois. Es claim to have left this employment to accept nore lucrative employment.

From July 19h9 to September 19h9 defendant states he was employed as a laborer at a wage of \$1.10 per hour by the Dryden Rubber Company, Chicago, Illinois. He quit this job to move to California.

He purports that from May 19kk to Describer of Lyks he was employed at a wage of 65¢ per hour by the International Shoe Company, Hartford, Illinois. Es indicates he was laid off by this employer in a general reduction of ferces and that he then entered the evay.

Fost Office, Kellerville, Illinois on March 7, 1955. Defendant capatically denies the burglary of the post office. He states that his companion in the instant offense, Valter T. Rife, when he not at a bar in Quincy, Illinois suggested that he accompany Rife and cash the messey orders which Rife rejertibly had purchased from an unknown person. Defendant states that he purchased for \$1 the identification he and Rife west in uttering these stolen orders in various states. When arrested for the instant offense defendant was in possession of thirty-four energy orders which had been stolen from the Kellerville, Illinois Post Office. He samits the forgery and uttering of fourteen money orders. His companion, Rife, has admitted the forgery and uttering or attempting to utter eighteen of the stolen money orders.

Approximately one year before becoming involved in the instant office defendant was released from service of a scattere of one to the years for armed redecry in the Illinois State Fenitantiary. In August of 195h he burglerized a cleaning establishment in East Alten, Illinois. Although he canditually are charged with burglery he apparently has never been before the appropriate court and apparently is not presently wanted on this charge. In 1969 in les Angeles, California he was serviced of burgler, and see most to light nevers in the causty jail. After serving ninesy days of this as wence he was released on probables for a paried of two years.

Defondant shows absolutely no removes at this time. He enticipates receiving a substantial contance for the inquent offence. In uniter's crimion he is a confirmed criminal and a mensoe to acciety when in the free world.



Dear Sir:

As yet you have not located the killer of Martin Luther King, jr. The following may have no relationship to it what-so-ever; on the other hand, it may be a one in a million clue.

I have a neighbor who formerly was a tile salesman, head-quarters, Alabama. While a salesman he travelled the U. S.. He is, in my opinion, an intense racist, has written frequently in the newspaper expressing his views, and his son in turn brought to another neighbor racist newspapers from Mississippi. When his son returned from service in Germany, he had praise for Hitler.

The neighbor evidentally began a floor-tile laying business two or three years ago, for a volks-type truck has frequently been at his house, cans debris indicate this, and very frequently, he receives packages via truck delivery. He leaves his home frequently and returns, frequently carrying packages into the house. I have heard the rumor that he obtained a rifle of special quality for his next door neighbor.

The man's son owns a white mustang Ford, and the last I knew, the son was working in Miami with an airline company.

As I said, typically a volks-type delivery truck comes to the house, and it has not been there for some time. In the two weeks beginning the Sundays of the 17th and the 24, there was an unusual flurry of activity around the house--accross the street. A passenger car volkswagon appeared with young man, wife, and child and the rear apparently loaded with clothes. The young lady showed her face, and she may be a relative. The young man however during the several days he was here did not "show himself." Too, as I recall he had been at the house before, he or someone his age, -- and again had not shown himself. As I recall, the Volks passenger car reappeared for a second time with the family and again loaded with clothing around the 19-23 of March. During this latter period a delivery truck--not the Volks, but an open one, appeared apparently loaded with square gallon or square five gallon cans. Nightly both the delivery truck and the volks backed into the neighbor's drive, the volks last.

Sometime around the 24, the neighbor's two cars, the Volks passenger, the delivery truck, all disappeared. The enclosed Volks tit floor-tile truck did not show up during this particle 1958 My wife and I went to Atlanta to a conference this same week
