The following submitted for the information of the file to amplify information and teletype dictated 4/26/68, concerning investigation concerning the Atlanta apartment.

Re Dallas teletype to Atlanta, Mobile, and Jacksonville, 4/25/68.

The following investigation was conducted 4/26/68:

LARRY R. BURCH, Salesman, Independent Life and Accident Insurance Company, who resides at Graceville, Florida, and works out of the Marianna, Florida, Office, furnished the following information:

BURCH has lived in Graceville for the past four years and worked as an insurance salesman. During this time he has sold insurance to a number of waitresses and operators of beer joints in the area. He said that during the past few months he had called regularly at a place known as My Place which is a beer bar on Route 4, out of Graceville, which is on the Slocomb, Alabama, Highway. He said that during this time he has become casually acquainted with a man named BILLY JOE FAULKNER as well as a girl who worked at the place whose name is JACKIE He said he is certain of this name because he has sold her insurance in the past and knows that she is also known as JACKIE MOLINE. BURCH said that he was also on rather friendly terms with SUE KELLY who more or less ran the place although it was supposedly operated by BILLY JOE FAULKNER. He said that on several occasions when he stopped in to drink a beer, that SUE KELLY told him FAULKNER was not around at the time. He said he last saw BILLY JOE FAULKNER about four weeks before and after this determined that My Place had closed. 1/4/-

BURCH said that he had been personally impressed that FAULKNER from his mannerisms and attitude around other men is a homosexual and that he had seen him on several occasions in the presence of CLARENCE CHANCE who operates the florist business at Graceville and who is generally reported to be a homosexual. He said he had also seen JERRY NED MILLER, a young boy whose mother is Mrs. BYRD BATEMAN who lives in Holmes County, Florida, in FAULKNER's presence. BURCH said he was acquainted with MILLER because he had in the past sold Mrs. BYRD BATEMAN some insurance. BURCH said that on the day before ANN PIPPEN SHAW, who operates Pippen's Place on State Highway 2, had told him that JACKIE HALL and her husband BEN SHAW had left together and gone to Columbus, Georgia.

Mrs. LOIS SHUMAKER, Operator of R Club, corner of Slocomb Highway and Florida State Highway 2, advised that she had known BILLY JOE FAULKNER casually in operating a beer place called My Place down the highway from her place and that she knew that BILLY JOE FAULKNER and a girl named SUE, who he indicated to be his wife, had left the area the first week in April, 1968. She said that she recalled that they left on the first Monday in April.

B. S. GRANBERRY, who works at R Place advised that he had talked with BILLY JOE FAULKNER and a girl named SUE who FAULKNER indicated as his wife at My Place on several occasions. He said that he recalled on the night of April 2, 1968, FAULKNER indicated he was leaving the area at that time. GRANBERRY said there had been some fight or altercation at My Place which he did not know any details about and FAULKNER and SUE were leaving together and did not indicate where they were going.

OPAL SHIRLEY, who now works at R Place as a barmaid, advised that on Wednesday night, April 4, 1968, she went to take over My Place, a beer joint formerly operated by BILLY JOE FAULKNER. She said that she had not frequented this place before this and had been employed by Mr. ARNOLD who lives in the Bonifay, Florida, area and owns a place to operate it. She said that she took inventory of the place that night and when she opened the

next day a beverage agent told her she was in violation of Beverage Laws and she had closed the place and it had not been reopened.

OPAL SHIRLEY said that she understood from several persons who came by My Place that BILLY JOE FAULKNER and his girlfriend SUE had left on either April 2 or April 3, and were no longer in the area.

ANN PIPPEN SHAW, the wife of BEN HUGHES SHAW, advised that BILLY JOE FAULKNER had stopped in her beer place which is known as Pippen's Place at the intersection of State Highway 2 and the Slocomb Highway, and that he always drank Mustang Beer and she recalled that he had been in her place on a night which she thought was a Friday night of the first week of April and had drank three or four beers and then left.

She said that she had not seen him since that time and has no idea where he is.

She said that JACKIE HALL, who formerly worked at My Place and whom she knows as a prostitute, had been staying with BEN HUGHES SHAW, and that they had left on the early morning of April 25, 1968, with HUBERT HOLEMAN to go to Columbus, Georgia, together. She said that NORMAN HOLEMAN or his wife who live of RFD, Bonifay, Florida, might know someone in Columbus, Georgia, who would know where they might be located.

Mrs. NORMAN HOLEMAN was located and advised that she did not know that HUBERT HOLEMAN had left the area and pointed out his house. She said that she was not personally acquainted with BEN SHAW or JACKIE HALL and could suggest no place where they might have been at Columbus, Georgia. She said that HUBERT HOLEMAN formerly lived at Columbus and was her husband's nephew.

It was observed that the house indicated as occupied by HUBERT HOLEMAN is not now occupied and inquiry in the immediate neighborhood failed to reveal anyone who might know his whereabouts.

CLARENCE CHANCE, owner Chance Florist, Graceville, Florida, advised that BILLY JOE FAULKNER has been an acquaintance for the past ten or twelve years. He said he formerly knew FAULKNER at places on the beach near Panama City, Florida, and that some several weeks before a friend had told him that FAULKNER had sent word that he was in town. He said after this he stopped by My Place, a beer joint, and drank beer and visited with FAULKNER on several occasions. He said that he learned some two or three weeks before that My Place had closed and that FAULKNER had left the area. CHANCE denied any knowledge of any of FAULKNER's activities and denied that they were close friends.

Each of the above individuals was shown a copy of I. O. # 4182 on JAMES EARL RAY and none could identify this individual as anyone who they had seen with FAULKNER or who they had ever seen before.

On 4/23/68, MARY ALICE HICKEY, Clerk, ABC Liquor Store, U. S. 27, North, Tallahassee, Fla., advised that an individual had been in that store at approximately 10:15 AM on that date which resembled JAMES EARL RAY. Miss HICKEY was exhibited WF 442-A and advised that she had previously seen a photograph of RAY in the local newspaper and is of the opinion that the individual who entered the store earlier was identical to RAY. She advised she did not observe the individual until he had entered the door of the store, but immediately upon looking up and seeing him, she in her own mind recognized him as being identical to the photograph of RAY which had previously appeared in the local newspaper. She advised that he asked for one-half pint of Smirnoff Vodka and she inquired as to whether he wanted the 80 or 100 proof, and he stated he wanted 100 proof. She advised that she went to the cash register and he paid for the Vodka with two one dollar bills and she gave him his change after which time he asked if she had any orange juice and she gave him a ten cent can of orange juice for which he gave her a He also asked for and received a cup from her. She advised that he then departed from the store and left in a track which had been parked over to the north side of the store which she described as a red GMC truck larger than a pickup, with a rail around the bed of the truck. She advised this truck had an Alabama license and had writing on the door which was AAA, believed to be steel company, Gadsden, Ala. She advised she attempted to obtain the license number, but could not be positive of this number, but believed it to be Ala. license 12-12397.

Mrs. HICKEY described the individual she believed identical to RAY as speaking with a country accent, wearing a short sleeve shirt, work clothes type, was alone when

in the store and departing in the truck, and had a scar on his left forehead above his eye, approximately one to one and one-half inches long. She advised when the individual left the score he appeared nervous and looked around in all directions which she thought appeared to be an attempt to see if anyone was observing him. She advised that she has read in the local newspaper of the fact that RAY or an individual previously appearing in the newspaper under the name of GALT, preferred Vodka and spoke in a country She also had seen the description of RAY and under the name of GALT in the local newspaper and felt this individual fit that description, as being age 35-40, 5'10", 170 pounds, brown hair. She advised she could furnish nothing additional concerning this individual and stated that the only attention which really drew her to him was the fact that when he entered the store at her first glance she immediately in her own mind recognized him as being identical to the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY which had previously appeared in a local newspaper.

This information was sent by teletype for check on the above license to Mobile and to Birmingham for a check in the Gadsden, Ala., area concerning this vehicle. A reply was received in the negative from Mobile concerning the license as stated in Mobile tel to Birmingham and Jacksonville dated 4723/68, (Ser. 203).

On 4/26/68, MARY ALICE HICKEY was recontacted at the ABC Liquor Store, and advised she had not observed this individual since and could furnish no additional information other than that previously furnished concerning this matter.

Ray Trailed To Houston

Third of a series of special reports by a reporter who is conducting his own hunt for the King assassin.

HOUSTON — Additional evidence and conversations with people who knew James Earl Ray, the alleged slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King, establish that Ray met with an important industrialist on the afternoon of Dec. 17, 1967, either inside or near the International Trade Mart in New Orleans. The meeting occurred between 2:30 and 4 p.m.

That the meeting took place was established by reconstructing the timetable followed by Ray and Charles Stein, the Hollywood songwriter who motored with Ray from Los Angeles to New Orleans beginning on Dec. 15. This reporter is now retrayeling that route with Stein.

Stein met Ray in a Hollywood bar and indicated that he, Stein, wanted to go to New Orleans to get his nieces, both small children. Ray replied he was making a round trip to New Orleans to "meet some important people" and that he would give Stein a free ride if Stein would agree to sign the petition to place former Alabama Gov. Wallace on the California ballot. Stein agreed and the trip was begun around noon on Friday, Dec. 15.

Traveling in the now fainsus white Mustang, Ray
and Stein took turns driving
and, without stopping to sleep,
arrived in New Orleans at apgroximately noon on Dec. 17.
Hay checked into the Provincial Hotel, but before parting
from Stein said he had to
meet with a New Orleans
man who was — and presumably is — "an engineer or
contractor."

At approximately 3:30 that afternoon, "Tommie," a close friend of Ray's, was in the International Trade Mart. That evening Ray visited Tommie and told him that he saw him the trade mart. When Tommie asked why Ray did not approach him in the mart, Ray replied, "I was busy."

That the meeting did indeed occur is given further credence by the fact that late on the night of Dec. 17, Ray visited Stein and said his business had been completed, that he was ready to return to Los Angeles.

Stein, a native of New Orleans who wished to spend an additional period of time withhis relatives, insisted that they "rest up" in New Orleans for a "couple of days" before undertaking the returndrive. The two men and the children left New Orleans on Dec. 19 and arrived back in Los Angeles on Dec. 21. The key to whom Ray met with in New Orleans seems to lie in two long distance phone calls Ray made during the trip to New Orleans. After the first phone call Ray indicated to Stein that his party was not in, but would be available at approximately "9 o'clock" that evening, Dec. 16. After driving about an hour Ray left the freeway to make his "9 o'clock" call. The contact was made and Ray talked for some 15 minutes while Stein drank coffee and munched candy.

Stein and this reporter are now in the Houston area from which the calls were made. A search of the area has considerably jogged Stein's memory for specific details and the search has been narrowed down to a 200-mile stretch of highway between San Antonio and Houston.

There was yet another development in the story. It has already been established that Ray returned to New Orleans at the end of March and delivered a package to the mother of a Los Angeles friend.

It now appears that while in New Orleans on the last trip, a scant five days before King was murdered, Ray may have spent time with a New Orleans girl whom he is known to have admired. If true, (and her name is known) she may provide new information as to Ray's movements and activities just a few days prior to the assassination.

Meanwhile an intensive record search is on in Los Angeles to trace calls made from a phone booth in the St. Francis Hotel as disclosed by this reporter. Dyrell Dennis, the "Hollywood blonde" who was close to Ray and then vanished from a Milwaukee hotel after being located by this reporter, has been located by a Milwaukee Journal reporter based on my leads provided last week.



At 7:42 pm, 5/1/68, at my residence, I received a call from HUNTER HELGESON, duty Agent, Mr. ROSEN's Office, who advised he had received a phone call from Secret Service to the effect that a BAILEY MANN SANDLIN had called from Mount Dora Motel, Mount Dora, Fla., Room 8, advising that he had seen a man he believed the subject, pulled a gun on him in his carport in Orlando, and that this had already been reported to the FBI. BAILEY had called again, was still in Room 8 of this motel at Mount Dora, and reported having seen the car again. Mr. HELGESON asked if we had known of this and what action had been taken.

I advised him that if I recalled correctly from home without benefit of the file we had contacted SANDLIN, confirmed that he had reported the matter to the FBI in Orlando, and that Tampa had received a complaint and investigated with negative results. I told Mr. HELGESON I would review the file and confirm this by return call. I proceeded to the Office, reviewed the file, noting Serial 276, which confirmed the earlier information which I had given Mr. HELGESON.

I contacted SA TED R. TUCKER, confirmed that he had talked to SANDLIN and observed that SANDLIN could not carry on a coherent conversation.

I then contacted by phone Supervisor LEE BALLANGER, Tampa Division, adivsed him of the Bureau's inquiry. Supervisor BALLANGER advised he had received a memo that day on his desk concerning this, was not completely conversant with all the facts of results of the investigation but recalled that the complainant was a drunkard and irresponsible. He advised that he was already in touch with his Orlando Resident Agent for the complete story, and that he would call Mr. ROSEN's Office, Duty Agent HELGESON, and report the results of that contact.
