On 5-17-68 Mr. HARVEY COBB, Owner, L & M Cylinders, 2078 Lane Avenue North, Jacksonville, Florida, was contacted and interviewed regarding two possible past employees of L & M Cylinder known as "RED" (LNU) and (FNU) FOLKS.

Mr. COBB advised that "RED'S" real name is CHARLES EDWARD UNDERHILL, 2606 Orchard Street, Jacksonville, Florida. UNDERHILL was employed at L & M Cylinders from June until August, 1966, and it was obvious to Mr. COBB that UNDERHILL was a militant hater of the Negro race. Mr. COBB further advised that he had no record for a past employee having the last name FOLKS and feels sure he has never hired anyone by that name.

Mr. COBB stated that a close friend of "RED" (UNDERHILL's) at the time they were working for him was PAUL BRADY DYAL, 275 Willowbranch Street, Jacksonville, Florida. DYAL worked for L & M Cylinders from May until August, 1966, and was also quite adamant for his hatred for the Negro race.

Mr. COBB was shown several photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated definitely that neither Mr. UNDERHILL nor Mr. DYAL in any way resembled RAY.

It is felt that (FNU) FOLKS, the name mentioned by CLARENCE BASHAM in referenced airtel, in undoubtedly WARREN FOLKS, a well-known and outspoken segregationist and former member of the Ku Klux Klan in the Jacksonville area. Mr. FOLKS' activities have been closely followed by the Jacksonville Office for many months and his whereabouts on the evening that MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot have been established. Furthermore, Mr. FOLKS in no way resembles various photographs of suspect, JAMES EARL RAY.

On 4/30/68, a thorough review of all ITSMV cases opened in the Jacksonville Division since 4/4/68 was conducted. It was determined that two cases, #26-19188 and 26-19251, involved vehicles stolen in the state of Georgia.

The subjects of the above two cases have been eliminated as JAMES EARL RAY due to discrepancies in vehicle description.

On 4/30/68, Mr. JACK OCH, Auto Theft, Duval County SO, and Detective Sergeant WADE TAYLOR, Auto Theft, Jacksonville PD, advised that their respective departments have reported to the FBI all abandoned Georgia vehicles located in Duval County, Florida, since 4/4/68.

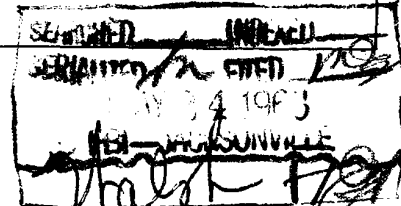

Subject as James Earl Ray and his associate Walter Terry Rife were arrested on March 23, 1965, by the Missouri State Highway Patrol at Hannibal, Missouri, and were charged with cashing stolen U. S. Postal Money Orders. Ray and Rife were subsequently incarcerated at the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas on these charges.

Review of these money orders indicates they were all cashed during the month of March, 1955, and included in the cities where they were cashed are Hot Springs, Arkansas; St. Petersburg, Daytona Beach, Tampa and Tallahassee, Florida.

The Little Rock Office at Hot Springs; the Tampa Office at St. Petersburg and Tampa; and Jacksonville Office at Daytona Beach and Tallahassee bear in mind that subject, as a result of cashing these stolen U. S. Postal Money Orders, is somewhat acquainted with these places and it is possible that subject could return to same.

TONY ENGLE, Baggage Room, Greyhound Bus Station, was contacted at approximately 2:00 am, 5/24/68. He had previously contacted the Jacksonville Office and advised an individual similar in appearance to JAMES EARL RAY was observed by him in the Posthouse Restaurant, located in the bus station. The photograph he had which he believed the individual was somewhat similar in appearance to was the photograph of RAY taken in 1960 and on the Identification Order. He described the man as being in his late 20's, very short cut hair, but was not as certain this individual resembled recent pictures exhibited to him.

WILLIE WESTON, Detective, Duval County SO, advised he believes he recalled the individual referred to by ENGLE sitting with another youth in the Posthouse Restaurant and said these two youths were in their early 20's. He did not believe either was similar in appearance to RAY.

JOAN WALLACE, waitress, Posthouse Restaurant, advised she had waited on the individual referred to by ENGLE. She said he and another youth were drinking orange juice. She described both as being in their early 20's and did not believe either was identical to RAY.

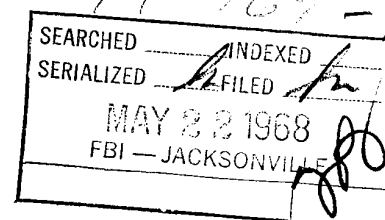

Major C. W. KEITH, Department of Public Safety (DPS), Fla. Highway Patrol, Tallahassee, Fla., advised on 5/23/68 that approximately nine hundred thousand new Florida drivers licenses were issued in the State each year. For the months of April and May there would be approximately 150 thousand new drivers licenses issued.

The following is the procedure for the issuance of new drivers licenses in the State of Fla.:

There are 110 examining points in the State. After an applicant has successfully passed his tests, the application and the fee go to the County Judge's Office. At The County Judge's Office, the Florida drivers license is issued, the original and two copies. The applicant receives the original and a copy with the application is forwarded to the DPS at Tallahassee, and the 3rd copy is filed at the County Judge's Office.

The county Judge's Office forwards the copy of the license and application about every 30 days; some of the larger counties are more prompt, others go as long as two months before forwarding same. The licenses at the County Judge's Office, as are those at the DPS in Tallahassee, are filed alphabetically and there is no numerical order of the record. The Department of Public Safety Examining Points file once a month, usually on the 5th, Form DL 16, which report lists the name of the applicants for drivers licenses for the previous month and if the fee has been paid. There is no other information on this DL 16, a copy of which remains at the examining point. At this point, the only possible reasonable check that could be made would be as follows:

1. Contact made with the senior examiner, who is an employee of the DPS, at the 110 examining points throughout the State of Fla.

2. With the senior examiner, go to the County Judge's Office and examine all Fla. drivers licenses that they have not as yet forwarded to Tallahassee.

3. With a copy of the DL 16 kept on file at the examining point, check the names alphabetically with the drivers licenses on file at the County Judge's Office. For the month of April the DL 16 would be complete, while the month of May would only be partially completed and not complete until around 6/5/68.

Each FBI Field Division, if the above system is practical, could cover their own leads after checking out the drivers licenses, which would save considerable paper work by one Division.

The above procedure is the only way that a complete search could be made, as it will be the end of June or the middle of July before such a search can be made at the DPS at Tallahassee.

In addition, it is to be pointed out that a search of the names on the DL 16 in the County Judge's Office would be much faster than a search at DPS, Tallahassee, as it would mean fewer licenses to be checked.

It should be noted that ~~not~~ not all the names on the DL 16 will be found to have drivers licenses as many applicants file and don't return, while others fail to pass.

Maj. KEITH advises the following counties have not forwarded their license returns for April:

Bradford, Citrus, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas and Taylor.

The following counties have already made returns through 5/13/68: Broward, Dade and St. Johns.

Maj KEITH advised because of the present work load at the drivers license division of the DPS it would be impossible for them to pull that many files during the regular work day. The Major explained that their personnel would have to be the ones to pull the files because of their new mechanical and electrical filing system although the FBI personnel could review the license.

The Major explained that some plan would have to be worked out to have their personnel work nights, which would mean time and half or double time, as far as pay is concerned.

Maj. KEITH advised he now has his personnel attempting to come up with some figure as to how long it would take and how much personnel it would take to review the estimated number of Fla. drivers licenses.

Major C. W. KEITH, Department of Public Safety
(DPS), Florida Highway Patrol, Tallahassee, Florida,
advised on 5/23/68 that approximately nine hundred thousand
new Florida drivers licenses were issued in the State each
year. For the months of April and May there would be
approximately 150 thousand new drivers licenses issued.

The following is the procedure for the issuance
of new drivers licenses in the State of Florida:

There are 110 examining points in the State. An
applicant appears at one of these examining points and
is furnished an application, a xerox copy of which is
attached. After an applicant has successfully passed
his tests, the application and the fee go to the County
Judge's Office. At the County Judge's Office, the
Florida drivers license is issued. There is an original
and two copies of this license. The applicant receives
the original and a copy with the application is forwarded
to the DPS at Tallahassee. The third copy is filed at
the County Judge's Office.

The County Judge's Office forwards the copy of the license and application about every thirty days; some of the larger counties are more prompt, others go as long as two months before forwarding same. The licenses at the County Judge's Office, as are those at the DPS in Tallahassee, are filed alphabetically and there is no numerical order of the record. The Department of Public Safety examining points file once a month, usually on the 5th, Form DL 16, which report lists the name of the applicants for drivers licenses for the previous month and if the fee has been paid. There is no other information on this DL 16. A copy of this form remains at the examining point. At this time, the only possible reasonable check that could be made would be as follows:

1. Contact made with the senior examiner, who is an employee of the DPS, at the 110 examining points throughout the State of Florida.
2. With the senior examiner, go to the County Judge's Office and examine all Florida drivers licenses that they have not as yet forwarded to Tallahassee.
3. With a copy of the DL 16 kept on file at the examining point, check the names alphabetically with the drivers licenses on file at the County Judge's Office. For the month of April the DL 16 would be complete, while the month of May would only be partially completed and not complete until around 6/5/68.

Each FBI Field Division in Florida, if the above system is practical, could cover their own leads after checking out the drivers licenses, which would save considerable paper work by one Division.

The above procedure is the only way that a complete search could be made at this time since it will be the end of June or the middle of July before such a search can be made at the DPS at Tallahassee.

In addition, it is to be pointed out that a search of the names of the DL 16 in the County Judge's Office would be much faster than a search at DPS, Tallahassee, as it would mean fewer licenses to be checked.

It should be noted that not all the names on the DL 16 will be found to have drivers licenses as many applicants file and don't return, while others fail to pass.

Major KEITH advises the following counties have not forwarded their license returns for April:

Bradford, Citrus, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas and Taylor.

The following counties have already made returns through 5/13/68:

Broward, Dade and St. Johns

Major KEITH advised because of the present work load at the drivers license division of the DPS, it would be impossible for them to pull that many files during the regular work day. The Major explained that their personnel would have to be the ones to pull the files because of their new mechanical and electrical filing system although the PSI personnel could review the licenses.

The Major explained that some plan would have to be worked out to have their personnel work nights, which would mean time and a half or double time, as far as pay is concerned.

He was unable to estimate the length of time, the number of personnel, or cost involved to review these licenses.

Due to the above, and since most counties still have their applications for May, it is suggested that necessary

information be obtained through examining points and County Judge's Offices rather than attempt to handle the review at the State Capitol, Tallahassee.

For the Bureau's information, both Major KEITH and HOMER SMOTHERMAN, Senior Drivers License Examiner, Jacksonville, Florida, have advised no identification is necessary to obtain a license and therefore a great number of licenses are issued using false names and addresses for faulty identification purposes. Duval County alone had between 3,000 and 5,000 applications submitted for the month of April according to Mr. SMOTHERMAN.

MARGIE CURTIS, 1838 Dunlap Avenue, East Point, Georgia, employed by National Car Rental, Atlanta, Georgia, advised on 5/17/68, she was the individual who rented the 1968 Dodge Dart to S. M. SCHNEIDERMAN on 4/2/68. She described SCHNEIDERMAN as being in his late 30s or early 40s, approximately 5' 7' 8" tall, of small build, weighing approximately 140-145, with dark hair, possibly black. She viewed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, and stated from her recollection, did not believe RAY identical to SCHNEIDERMAN, however, photograph of RAY, particularly the hair, did resemble SCHNEIDERMAN.

SCHNEIDERMAN appeared at the National Car Rental Office at the Atlanta Airport at approximately 9:42 am, wearing a business suit and presented 3 Millionaire Club credit cards, 2 in plastic covering, and 1 plain paper card, all in the name of S. SCHNEIDERMAN. She could not recall if SCHNEIDERMAN had luggage, and stated she was sure that he was not accompanied by anyone. She stated she obtained the DL # from SCHNEIDERMAN's Illinois DL, and also listed the Holiday Inn at the Atlanta Airport as SCHNEIDERMAN's place of contact.

DAVE ROGERS, National Car Rental, Atlanta, Georgia Airport, produced National Car Rental System Rental Agreement # 7044348 for this company, Station 070-2, dated 4/2/68, at 9:42 am, indicating one S. M. SCHNEIDERMAN rented car # 701371 with Georgia license 1D98283, which is a Dodge Dart, which rental agreement reflects an address of 6535 North Richmond, Illinois. Also listed on this agreement, DL # W5-570-018, from the state of Illinois. The agreement reflects the car will be returned on 5/1/68, and indicates a credit card was used from the Millionaire Club National Limited, Chicago, Illinois, # 96968.

ROGERS stated that a 20% cash discount was given to SCHNEIDERMAN and stated that according to records of this office, their vehicle 701371 is a 1968 Dodge Dart, VIN LH41D8B323249, bearing 1968 Georgia license 1D48283.

ROGERS stated that SCHNEIDERMAN apparently, after obtaining this automobile, later went to the Tallahassee, Florida area, and was staying at the Holiday Inn in Tallahassee, inasmuch as he, ROGERS, had received an inquiry from a Lt. DAVIS of the Tallahassee, Florida PD, who was checking on SCHNEIDERMAN through the Georgia license plate on his car. ROGERS also stated that he later received information that SCHNEIDERMAN was locked out of his room by the Holiday Inn # 2, Knoxville, Tennessee.
