On May 17, 1968 Mrs. C. S. SEPTOR, Bookkeeper, Martines Restaurant advised that ~~WILLIAM~~ WOODFORD WILLIAM MILLER, Soc. Sec. No. [redacted] was employed by the restaurant for 4 weeks and 4 days, leaving there on May 7, 1968. She stated that MILLER had seven dependents, lived at 207 Fairfac Rd., Pensacola and was formerly employed, Cape Kennedy, Fla. She observed photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and stated he did not look anything like MILLER.

On May 17, 1968 Mrs. LILBURN J. NENNILEE 209 Fairfax Dr., Pensacola, stated that a Mr. MILLER had lived next door to them for about two months. She related that he is married and living with his wife and five children at 207 Fairfax Dr. He was employed for some construction company doing work at Cape Kennedy, Florida prior to coming to Pensacola. When first came to Pensacola he worked at Martines Restaurant for about five or six weeks and is presently looking for work. Mrs. NENNILEE observed photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and stated that Mr. MILLER does not look like this photograph in any way. She noted that Mr. MILLER has a large scar on his chin and had one eye that is cocked out.

On May 17, 1968 WOODFORD WILLIAM MILLER 207 Fairfax Dr., was contacted any shown photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and asked if he had ever seen this person around Martines Restaurant. He advised that he had not. It was noted that MILLER has an old about 4 inch scar on point of chin and that his right eye is badly cocked to the outside and will not focus when he looks at anything. It was further noted that he did not resemble RAY in appearance and remarked that he had been in Pensacola, Florida for only two months as had been working at Cape Kennedy, Florida. It was noted that in the house were five children, three boys and two girls ranging in age from about 14 down to about four years. They referred to Mr. MILLER as "daddy" and all looked at photograph and stated they did not know this person but had seen the picture in the paper.

RAY has also been known to consort with prostitutes and "street bums". This should also be borne in mind in your daily contacts with informants, officers of vice squads, and prostitutes in covering leads in connection with this and other cases.

The Bureau has directed that all offices furnish a copy of Identification Order regarding RAY to Salvation Army and other charitable type missions inasmuch as RAY is known to stay at "flop houses" and lower class rooming houses.



RAY stated that he thought this person with whom he talked was named McLAMB. RAY continued that he did not know whether or not there was any group behind any of the "talk" with which he had been confronted, adding that any discussion he may have had with this individual had been very brief.

RAY said that about the only thing he does for money these days is shoplifting which provides him with enough money for his daily liquor.

On 5/20/68, Detective C.W. WILLITS, Daytona Beach PD, advised that although he did not know the exact present location of JACK MAYNARD RAY, he was fairly well acquainted with him. WILLITS stated that RAY is an alcoholic and was prone to fabricate tales to make himself sound important.

At that time CARAWAY's informant, the unknown man, and TURNTIDE were working on the construction of a Holiday Inn motel in San Antonio, Texas.

TURNTIDE, according to the informant, is presently employed in the construction of a Holiday Inn motel in Chicago, Ill.

William Bradford Huie has written a third article for "Look" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1969, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1969. A review of the article reveals that James Earl Ray allegedly registered at the Travelodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1968; at a motel near Florence, Alabama, on April 1, 1968; and at a motel near Corinth, Mississippi, on April 2, 1968. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Harvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1968. On April 3, 1968, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Memphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Ray.

Birmingham and Jackson Offices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period March 29 to April 3, 1968. Efforts should be made to identify all individuals listed, as well as
