

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

This is a petition for a writ of habeas corpus, sought to be filed in forma pauperis by an inmate in the Missouri State Penitentiary and directed against the warden of that institution.

Petitioner was apparently convicted of the crime of armed robbery on December 17, 1959 in the Circuit Court of the city of St. Louis, Missouri, and was sentenced to twenty years upon that conviction.

Petitioner now raises three principal issues:


1. That an illegal search and seizure, not incident to a lawful arrest, was conducted by agents of the State, and evidence which was the fruit of this search was used against defendant at his trial;
2. That, after his arrest, petitioner was held incommunicado by the police for a period of approximately 9 days during which time, a statement or confession was obtained from him which was the result of threat and duress, and that this statement or confession was used in evidence against him at the trial;
3. That false and perjured testimony was elicited at his trial.

It would appear that petitioner has exhausted his state remedies as required by §2254, Title 28, U. S. C., although this issue is not foreclosed, as it appears that the Missouri Supreme Court did not

pass on the merits of certain issues raised by petitioner on appeal, as these matters were not preserved for appeal, although they seem to have been presented to the United States Supreme Court in petitioner's application for certiorari there, which was refused by that court.

In view of the seriousness of the accusations made by petitioner,
respondent is hereby ordered to show cause, within 20 days of this
date, why the petition should not be granted.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

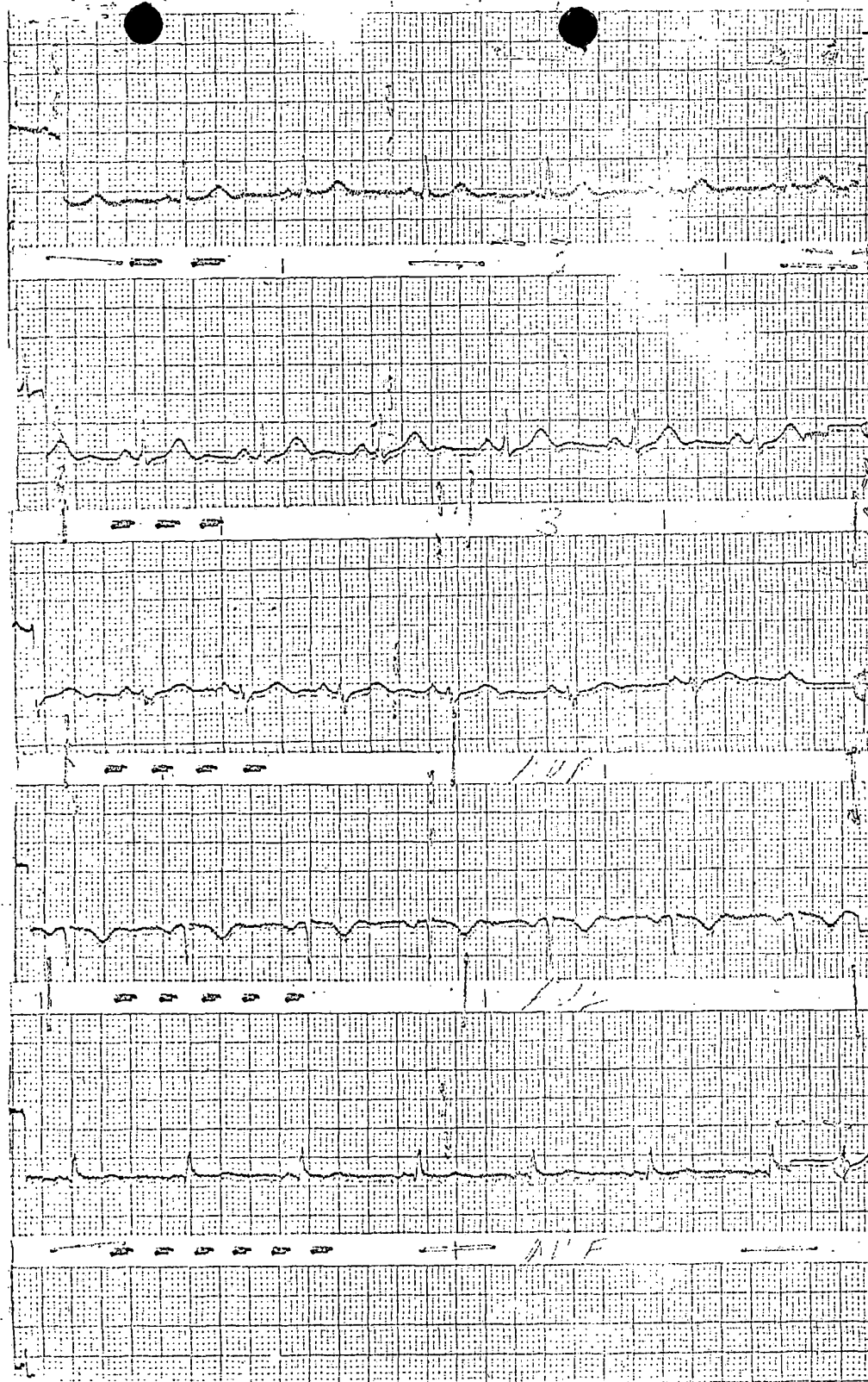



X-Ray Number

Opinion and Recommendation Bi-plane views of the right elbow fail to reveal any evidence of fracture, dislocation, or other bony abnormality. Soft-tissue swelling is seen in and about the proximal portion of the forearm.

At this time, there is no evidence of periosteal elevation, sequestration, or inflammatory bony process.

Conclusion: Right elbow negative for evidence of bony abnormality.

Diagonal Line. A straight line with a sedimentation index beyond normal limits.

Diagonal Curve. A curve of gradual descent with a sedimentation index beyond normal limits and a sedimentation time of 35 to 60 minutes.

Vertical Curve. A curve of sharp descent with a sedimentation index beyond normal limits and a sedimentation time of 30 minutes or less.
