LANE stated HAVNER's description is similar to the published description of "JOHN WILLARD", who was registered at Brewer's Rooming House, Memphis, Tenn. He also stated HAVNER purchased a rifle recently.

LANE advised WACO HAVNER was born to 5'10", weight 133 pounds, brown hair, brown eyes. He ed HAVNER has been employed for Hallmark Cards for approximately fifteen years and has a part-time job at Fowler Envelope Company.

On April 24, 1968, LEE CHAPMAN, Clerk, Records Bureau, Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, advised he could locate no record concerning WACO HAVNER.

On April 24, 1968, KEITH BRADLEY, Personnel Office, Hallmark Cards, Kansas City, Missouri, advised that WACO HAVNER has been employed in the Warehouse Division since about 1951. BRADLEY stated he had checked with HAVNER's foreman and that HAVNER has not been off any days during March and April of 1968.

EVANS, employee of Arkansas Best Freight Lines, HOWARD HAGGER, Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department Patrolman, and his employer, CLIFF FORCUM, at Fowler Envelope Company, 5th and Central, Kansas City, Missouri. To his knowledge HAVNER has no associates outside the Kansas City area. LANE did not desire that HAVNER, his wife, or associates, be interviewed at this time since they would have a good idea who furnished information to the FBI. LANE was advised that it did not appear that the FBI has any interest in HAVNER since the murderer of KING has been identified, and also because there is no indication that HAVNER has been out of the Kansas City area.

Witness in Ray Case. Wants His Freedom:

Memphis (AP)—Charles Quitman Stephens has an air-conditioned private room, three meals a day, a television, radio and telephone/and plenty of newspapers, books and magazines.

But the 57-year-old World War II veteran says he is un-

happy.

So unhappy, in fact, that he has fired his public defender and hired two lawyers in an attempt to gain his release from the Shelby County penal farm.

Stephens was not sent to the farm because he committed a crime. He is being held in place of \$10,000 bond as a material witness in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King,

Harvey L. Gibson and Jay Fred Friedman, Stephens's new attorneys, consider themselves bound to silence under a court order issued by Judge Preston Battle, the jurist who will preside in the trial of James Earl Ray. Ray is charged with murder in King's slaying.

But a source close to Stephens said Stephens is determined to get, if not complete freedom, "at least some of the amenities other free American citizens are guaranteed by the

Constitution."

The district attorney general's office said Stephens was placed in protective custody to insure his safety and to as-

sure his presence when needed to testify.

Stephens was a resident of the rooming house where police say the sniper fired the bullet that killed King April 4. He has told officers he saw a man fleeing the scene.

DONALD JAMES NISSEN, FBI Number 607 320 A, was a parole violator in case in which Phoenix was origin. He had proviously made telephonic contact with SA G. WAYNE MACK of the Phoenix Office and made arrangements to surrender himself to agent MACK at St. Louis on August 5, 1968.

On the morning of August 5, 1968, NISSEN called the St. Louis Office from the Municipal Airport at St. Louis stating he had just arrived by plane from Tampa, Florida, and desired to surrender to the FBI. He was subsequently taken in custody by SA CLETIS B. BIDEWELL and SA G. WAYNE MACK and upon interview furnished the following information:

NISSEN has remarried and his wife, who is pregnant, is living and working in Tampa, Florida. NISSEN has been working as a salesman for a book company which he declined to name and stated he has been doing very well financially. Until around the first of December NISSEN was living and working in the Atlanta, Georgia, area. Around the first or second of December, 1967, as he was leaving the Federal Building in Atlanta after having made his regular contact with his probation officer, he was hailed on the steps of the Federal Building by an individual, unknown to him. This person asked if he was DON NISSEN and when he replied in the affirmative, this individual stated he had a message for him from MAC. NISSEN understood MAC to be LERCY MC MENAMAN, who had advised him while they were fellow inmates at Leavenworth Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, that \$100,000 had been offered by the White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi to be paid to anyone who would kill MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The person accosting NISSEN on the steps of the Aulanta Federal Building then stated that apparently somebody had done some talking and NISSEN assumed he made reference to information that he had furnished to the FBI in Sherman, Texas, in April, 1987. Before any more conversation transpired, the individual who had transported NISSEN to the Federal Building called to him from across the street and the unknown individual immediately walked away from him. It was NISSEN's assumption that this person thought the individual calling him might be an FBI agent or police officer and did not desire that his identity be learned.

NISSEN described the individual accosting him as a white male, age 30-35, 5:10", 165-170 pounds, blond hair, cut medium short, and slightly wavy. He stated he was extremely well dressed in obviously expensive clothes.

NISSEN went on to state the more he thought about this incident, the more alarmed he became and left the vicinity. of Atlanta shortly thereafter and obtained other employment. The only other incident which served to arouse his suspicion were telephone calls made for him to his place of employment in which the individual calling declined to reveal his identity. NISSEN stated he considered relating above facts to him parole officer at Atlanta but resolved against it since he did not trust his parole officer too much and was afraid his parole might be revoked automatically. He also considered contacting the FBI Office in Atlanta but decided against this also. According to NISSEN he felt uncomfortable and worried in the Atlanta area in view of the information he had furnished in connection with the bounty on MARTIN LUTHER KING and the fact that the Ku Klum Klan was reportedly strong in that area. He stated it was his understanding that the Deputy United States Marshal, name unknown to him, who went to work about the time \ he started reporting to his parole officer at Atlanta was supposed to be a member of the Ku Klum Klan.

With reference to information furnished him by LEROY MC MENAMIN while at Leavenworth Penitentiary, NIESEN stated that in one conversation, MC MENAMAN told him that if, after his arrival at Atlanta, he could find out MARTIN LUTHER KING's travel route and itinerary, he could earn \$100,000 for himself.

Also include in the letterhead memorandum other information bearing on Nissen's claim. In this regard if investigation has not substantiated the alleged contact by individual allegedly representing Leroy McMonaman, same should be clearly set out in the letterhead memorandum.
