This 68-year-old white male has been in the prison system for the last 30 years of his life. At this time there is a possibility of a discharge. He is a surprisingly jovial individual despite the thirty years of incarceration. He himself states that there is no use worrying about things like this. He indicates that he has kept up a legal interest for the last thirty years and expects to be discharged. He also indicates that he feels that the warden stopped him from learning more about being a pastry chef. He states that he was transferred to Moberly and this stopped him from being able to continue as a pastry chef. He indicates that he is specifically against the warden for this. This is apparently a grudge that he has maintained over the years. He states that he would be all right as long as the warden had nothing to do with him. He seems to be a rather opinionated individual who once he "gets stuck on something" he follows through to the end. However, there is no evidence of any paranoid thinking or any delusional system. He indicates that he hopes to be able to go into business for himself when he leaves here. He indicates that there are people who owe him a few favors that he feels that he can approach for a sizable loan. However, this seems to be somewhat guarded in that he states that "There are not too many things that an old man like me can do". During the psychiatric interview he smoked a pipe and talked quite freely. There was no evidence of any guarding. There was no evidence of marked emotional lability. There was also no evidence of any thought disorder. It was clear that he had some difficulties with his sensorium and that both his immediate recall and his past memory were mildly impaired. This would seem the result of a mild brain syndrome. The diagnosis at this time is chronic brain syndrome, mild, which should not impair his functioning very much.

PRE-PAROLE PROGRESS REPORT

Social Data: Nolan, age 50, was born in St. Louis, Missouri May 4, 1900, the eldest of four children. He stated his parents were moderately well fixed financially. He attended high school in St. Louis and was in the second year high when he left school in 1918 to join the Army. His brothers all had at least two years of college. He served in the Medical Corp 38th Infantry for fourteen months. He enlisted in April of 1918 and was honorably discharged in July of 1919. He was married in 1920 and had one child. After his arrest and subsequent confinement he was divorced by his wife and at the present time he has not heard from her for a number of years. His first felony conviction was for Robbery First in 1926 and he was sentenced to 7 years at M.S.P. He was paroled in December of 1928. While on parole he was convicted of Armed Robbery in Illinois and was sentenced to one year to life at Menard, Illinois. He was paroled in 1941. Subject was sentenced to M.S.P. for Robbery 1st with a D. and D.W. for 50 years May 7, 1942.

INSTITUTIONAL RECORD

Conduct: There are no violations recorded.

Work: He has had a number of jobs since his commitment, most of them of a clerical nature. His supervisor at the Auxiliary Prison stated that his work there (assigned 2-3-50) has been very satisfactory.

Health: He states his health has been excellent for several years with the exception of a spinal disorder. He is unable to do manual labor due to an old spinal injury. Blood Test: Negative, 5-13-42.

Visits: None recorded, but carries on an extensive correspondence with friends and acquaintances.

POST RELEASE PLANS

He has several tentative plans for home and employment, but nothing definite at this time.

STATEMENT OF PROBLEM

Subject has been in prison for about twenty-four years, here and in Illinois, yet prison life has not seemed to affect him in the same way it has most other long term prisoners. He has seemingly made good use of his time by reading, writing and in other ways improving his mind. Although fifty years old, he could easily pass for a man of thirty-eight or forty. With the exception of having carried on, in writing, a personal feud with the prison authorities, his conduct record has been good. There are no conduct violations recorded against him. I am of the opinion that if he can secure suitable employment and a home, now if ever is the time for parole.

V. MARITAL STATUS: Married (subject has been separated from his wife for an extensive amount of time).

2. Visits: Is also irregular from friends.

POST RELEASE PLANS

Subject has a detainer in favor of the Illinois State Penitentiary, Menard Division. Subject was paroled from Menard in 1941.

Subject has served approximately thirteen years of a fifty year sentence for Robbery 1st by means of a Dangerous and Deadly Weapon. The subject served a prior sentence in Missouri State Penitentiary in 1926 for Robbery 1st (7 years). In 1930 he served a year to life sentence for Armed Robbery (Illinois) from which he was paroled in 1941. He was then convicted of his present offense (1942), served until 1950 when he received a parole. He violated this parole on February 20, 1952 and was returned to complete the present sentence. It is definitely established that the subject's crime pattern is consistent (robbery in all charges and specifications). The subject was given the benefit of parole but did not respond to the
