Mr. WAY stated that he had checked with his superintendent a long time laundry employee who is familiar with laundry operations. He is familiar with the Thermo Seal Tape but advised that no one in this area uses this equipment. Mr. WAY advised that at present there is not a laundry equipment jobber or supply house in Chattanooga and that there marking tape is ordered throu

Continued investigation of DK, KKKK, Inc. over period past several years has not identified any current individuals with potential for such violence with the exception of JAMES EDWIN GALLAHAN, Kx. ### RE HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON

At 10:35 p.m., 4/4/68, JAMES M. UNDERHILL placed from Charlotte a long distance telephone call to JIM WEST at telephone 487-9453, Shelby, N. C. The telephone was answered by a person sounding like an elderly white male, who stated JIM WEST was not there. After some delay, he identified himself as LEM PATTERSON, and conversation continued with him. After a short period, he turned the telephone over to another person who identified himself as HERMAN PATTERSON, son of LEM PATTERSON. During further conversation, the younger PATTERSON was asked his middle name and he stated it was EUGENE.

HERMAN EUGRNE PATTERSON sounded obviously intoxicated and during the conversation mentioned he had been taking some "pills" that day. It was extremely difficult to get any kind of coherent story from him and he at first denied any knowledge of JIN WEST and then later said that WEST had been there earlier that evening and had been drinking heavily and had left to go get some more to drink.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON stated he had been in Shelby all that day but did not give any clear account of his activities. Later during his rambling conversation, he said he had been in Knoxville, Tenn., up until a week or so earlier and had returned to Shelby when the family wired him money. Still later he said he had left Shelby on the morning of 4/4/68

and had gone to Mashville and Knoxville, Tenn., returning to Shelby about 9:00 p.m. At various times during the conversation he said he had gone to Mashville by hitching a ride with a truck driver and also said he had traveled by plane to Mashville and Knoxville.

Further during the conversation, which was not coherent, he stated he had that morning drawn his pay from Hewell Stroup of the Cherryville Nursery, for grading work he had done. He said he had taken this money which amounted to about \$12, to make the trip on.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was asked where he had been in Tennessee and he would only say he had been at a poolroom in Knoxville and claimed he did not know the name of it or its location or the name of the operator.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON denied any knowledge of any telephone call having been made to the FBI from that telephone on that date by anyone. At several points during the conversation, he denied any knowledge of a JIN WEST.

It is pointed out there is no commercial air service at Shelby, the nearest commercial airport being at Charlotte, approximately 40 miles away.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and LEM PATTERSON stated the above telephone was located at the residence of LEM PATTERSON, 627 S. DeKalb St., Shelby.

SAS FRANCIS X. BRADSHAW and JAMES M. UNDERHILL conducted the following investigation on 4/5/68:

Detective HOWARD SMITH, Shelby PD, stated that HERMAN RUGENE PATTERSON is the son of LEM PATTERSON, who lives at 627 S. DeKalb. LEM PATTERSON has operated a grocery store at that location for a number of years but recently suffered a stroke and has great difficulty in talking or getting around. Another son operates Patterson's Cleaners at the rear of the same location. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is a notorious town drunk and has been for years. Detective SMITH knows that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been away for some time up until

a couple of weeks ago and reportedly had been in Tennessee. He had no knowledge that he had been away from Shelby within the last several days. He knew that within the last few days HERMAN RUGENE PATTERSON had been doing some landscape grading work at the location of a new branch bank on DeKalb St. in Shelby, for HOWELL STROUP, Cherryville Nurseries. He had not seen HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON on 4/4/68. Detective SMITH further stated that PATTERSON, for years, has followed the pattern of working as little as possible and only until he can get enough to buy something to drink, and thereafter he will get drunk and usually wind up being arrested. He commented it would be impossible for HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON to have gone as far as Knoxville, Tenn., and back in the same day, because in his opinion as soon as he got to the firstplace he could buy liquor, he would buy it and get drunk and that would be as far as he would go.

Detective SMITH stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON has had about 30 arrests since 1950, at the Shelby PD alone, mostly for drunk, and some for cursing, fighting and petty larceny. He was locally arrested on 3/30/68 for drunk, at which time he gave his address as 627 S. DeKalb. From Mrs. MARTIN, Clerk of Recorders Court, Detective SMITH determined that PATTERSON had appeared in Court in Shelby on Tuesday, 4/2/68, and was sentenced to serve 20 days or pay costs of court. Further, he had come to Mrs. MARTIN's office on the early morning of 4/4/68 with part of the money for the costs of court and fine and left saying he would try to get the rest of the money. He returned about moon and paid the entire amount.

Detective SMITH stated that PATTERSON has on numerous occasions in the past called the PD with false reports. One time, a year or so ago, he called the PD without giving any name and said there was a drunk at a particular service station. This was late at night, and when officers responded, they found PATTERSON in an automobile, obviously waiting for them, and when the officers approached the automobile, he produced a gun and stuck it right in the stomach of one of the officers. The officer managed to get the gun away from him and placed him under arrest, after which it was determined this was only a toy gun, though it very definitely resembled a real gun. At that time, PATTERSON admitted he had been the

one who had made the call and indicated it had just been to see what the officers would do. In addition, within the last week, PATTERSON had telephoned the PD and said there was going to be a riot but he did not give any details or where it would take place. He had not given his name but his voice had been recognized and the call had been disregarded. On another recent occasion, he had telephoned the PD giving some false name which was not recalled, and said there was going to be a bomb placed at some unrecalled location and made the comment, "You'll find out where when it happens." Detective SMITH had been the one answering the telephone and he recognized the voice of PATTERSON and called him by his first name, after which PATTERSON gave his own full name and cursed the officer for recognizing his voice. No arrest action had been taken as a result of this incident.

Detective SMITH stated he had no knowledge of any JIM WRST in Shelby except for an attorney JAMES A. WEST, and definitely he was not any associate of PATTERSON and would not be hanging around drinking with him.

Detective SMITM stated in his opinion if a telephone call from a person claiming to be JIM WEST had been made to the PBI accusing HERMAN PATTERSON of being involved in something, the call had probably been made by HERMAN PATTERSON himself. He stated the only reason he could suggest for these activities on the part of PATTERSON was a desire to attract attention or to possibly play tricks on the police.

Mrs. JAMES T. WEST, 604 LeGrand St., Shelby, stated her husband is not related in any way to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or his family. She stated she knows of another family named WEST in Shelby and has no knowledge or reason to believe that they are in any way related to the PATTERSONS or have any association with them.

On 4/5/68, WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife MAR were interviewed at their residence located at the rear of 627 S. DeKalb St. Mr. PATTERSON is the brother of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and is the operator of Patterson's Cleaners. He expressed himself as completely disgusted with HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON, saying he is a notorious and constant drunk and has as little to do with him as possible. However, since he

stays with the father at their house at the same location, he does see him constantly. Both WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been in Knoxville and other unknown locations in Tennessee for several weeks up until about three weeks ago. At that time he contacted the family and his father sent him money to come home on. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had worked for a few days doing grading work for Cherryville Nurseries, but got drunk over the weekend of 3/30/68. He received a fine in court on 4/2/68 but was not required to pay it on that particular date. They continued that on the morning of 4/4/68 HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had said he was going to Cherryville to collect his pay in order to pay off his fine. Sometime after noon, he came back to that neighborhood and said he had paid his fine. At that time he was drinking and continued to be very drunk and Mr. and Mrs. PATTERSON stated they had seen him at least three times between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on 4/4/68. Part of that time he had been in their house since Mrs. PATTERSON had gotten him to come in and lie down just to get him off the streets.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had called over from the house of their father at the time the news came over the radio or television about the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and HERMAN EUGENE had commented in his drunken fashion that he was elated over this occurrence.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated he knows of a JAMES WEST in Shelby but there is no WEST who is related to his family or to the family of the wife of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON. In addition, he has no knowledge of any JIM WEST being an associate of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or of ever being in or around the house of their father, LEM PATTERSON.

On 4/5/68, HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was located at the home of a neighbor near his father's house. At that time he appeared sober. He stated that he had been at various places in and around Knoxville, Tenn., up until about a month ago, when the family sent him money and he came home. For

about two weeks he has been working for HOWELL STROUP doing grading work, but has not worked in the last few days. He was arrested over the past weekend in Shelby for being drunk and on 4/4/68 he went down to the Clerk of Court's Office to pay his fine. He found he did not have enough money and he hitched a ride with an unknown Negro truck driver to Cherryville to collect his pay. He said he went there once before 9:00 a.m. and again about noon. He collected his pay of momething under \$20 and returned to Shelby and paid his fine, paying it sometime around noon.

He continued that after that he went out and got drunk and spent most of the afternoon and evening in and around his father's house. He recalled that he had been at one time on 4/4/68 at the service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS in Shelby, and that at one time on that date he had ridden in a cab driven by ADAM HUMT.

PATTERSON stated he had no knowledge of a JIM WEST but said he believed he had heard that name in the last day or two, and possibly it was the name of the Negro truck driver who had given him a ride to Cherryville. He denied any knowledge of a telephone call having been made to the FBI in Knowville. He added that when he gets drunk he does not remember what happens. He did remember having talked to agent UNDERHILL on the telephone on the night of 4/4/68. PATTERSON was strongly warned against making any false calls to the FBI on police agencies.

Crude tattoos on both arms

He acknowledged that he was identical with the MERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON who had, in 9/67, together with another individual, stolen a taxi cab in Charlotte and driven it to Clover, S. C. In that case, Federal prosecution was declined and PATTERSON, on 9/7/67, was sentenced in local court in Charlotte to serve 90 days.

On 4/5/68, Cab Driver ADAM HUNT, Shelby, stated he had hauled HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON as a passenger from somewhere in downtown Shelby to a service station operated by MOWARD LEWIS on the edge of Shelby, this being somewhere around noon. He stated he did not recall having seen him later on that date. PATTERSON had apparently started drinking at the time he hauled him.

No further investigation as to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is being conducted by Charlotte.

At the time she observed that the man's profile closely resembled that of the newspaper sketch depicting the man who shot Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. She furnished the following description:

The man, white male, late 40's-early 50's, medium build, brown hair, receding, was wearing a tan shirt and khaki pants. The woman who appeared to be his wife was a white female, in her 30's, 5'l", light brown hair, stocky build and had a foreign accent. One white female, age 12-14, and one white male, age approximately 4 years, accompanied them.

Shortly thereafter, she left the store and she observed the man and the boy in a white car parked in a parking place on New Street between Broad and Commerce Streets. The car bore Sullivan County tags CX-2863.

A review of tag registration books at the Kingsport Police Department revealed that Tennessee license CX-2863 is registered to Hartford Steamboilers, Inc., 1323 C & S, Atlanta, Georgia.

On 4/8/68 CARL TRENT, Security Officer, Holston Ordinance Works, advised that Hartford Steamboilers, Inc., are represented in this area by GEORGE P. MARTIN, 2300 Blakemore Drive, Kingsport.

ELEANOR DAVEMPORT, another employee at Cole's Drug Store, recalls that WILBURN was at the drug store on Thursday even though MARTHA MYMATT got off duty at the same time on Friday. Mrs. DAVENPORT stated she still felt that WILBURN was there on April 4, 1968, Thursday.

Miss SHAROM BRADLEY, 1845 Terrace Avenue, Knoxville, advised on 4/8/68 that WILBURN was in the drug store at the time she heard the radio report that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING had been shot in Memphis, Tennessee.

During the contact with WILBURN it was determined that he was fingerprinted in connection with his military service. Files of the Knoxville PD reflect WILBURN was arrested on 4/20/63 for drunkenness and he was released without photograph or fingerprints being taken. This case was dismissed. He was also arrested for reckless driving on 2/25/64 and fined \$5.00.

On 4/8/68 it was determined that WILBURN's laundry was left at the One-Hour Cleaners on Friday, April 5, 1968.

It was determined that WILBURN is taking only one class at the University of Tennessee, which is Intermediate French, meeting 1:15 to 2:15 PM, Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

WILBURN's present address was determined through the University of Tennessee Student Directory,

On 4/10/68, HOWARD McCUSITON, Knoxville Parking Service, 5601 North Boradway, Knoxville, Tennessee, telephonically contacted SA HOWARD A. McKAMEY and indicated he had some information concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On the same date SA McKAMEY contacted McCUSITON, and he provided the following information indicating that he desired that this information remain confidential.

He stated that approximately three years ago he was a member of the American Nazi Party (ANP) at Washington, D. C., and lived in the ANP barracks in that city. He stated he disassociated himself from the ANP three years ago and returned to Knoxville. While in Washington, D. C., he became acquainted with ALLEN WELCH who at that time was the national secretary or the national treasurer of the ANP in Washington, D. C., and worked full time at the ANP headquarters. He stated that WELCH at one time worked with an insurance company in Texas and that he is from either Houston or Dallas, Texas.

He stated he observed a photograph in the local newspaper indicating this individual was the murderer of KING. When he observed this photograph, ALLEN WELCH immediately came to his mind and at this time he looked through some ANP literature and obtained a photograph of WELCH which appeared in some literature he obtained just prior to his leaving Washington, D. C.

He stated that WELCH is a white male, age 32, weight 160 lbs., and has receding light brown or blonde hair, medium complexion, and 6 ft. to 6 ft. 1 in. in height. He stated that WELCH has sharp features and no visible scars or marks. He further advised that WELCH is of the emotional type and that one time in Washington, D. C., he threatened to kill himself.

On 4/9/68, BH 251-R, a former member of the now defunct Dixie Klan of Anniston, Ala., and who is a close associate of the leading racial agitators in Anniston, advised the composite prepared by the exhibit section of

the FBI is not similar to any person he knows among the racial agitators at Anniston. He said that there is some similarity between this composite and a person he has seen in company with JACK BROWN (now deceased), former leader of the Dixie Klan from Chattanooga, Tenn. He said even though there is some similarity, he could not definitely state that they are the same individual. He said this person is unknown to him, but he would talk with one KENNETH LAMAR ADAMS, the former leader of the Dixie Klan at Anniston, and a former close associate of JACK BROWN,

in an effort to determine if he could identify this person

On 4/10/68, this source advised that he had talked with ADAMS during the previous night and he was unable to identify this person, due to the fact that ADAMS kept saying that BROWN had many friends whose names he did not know, or words to that effect. This source described this unknown person as being a white male, about 35 years old, 5'10" to 5'11" tall, approximately 180-190 pounds, and said he has not seen him in the past two years, or since the death of JACK BROWN when he and ADAMS attended BROWN's funeral in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Search of premises believed occupied by Unsub who assassinated Dr MARTIN LUTHER KING on 4/4/68, disclosed suitcase in which was located tee-shirt and undershorts bearing laundry mark on red tape with black lettering believed to be thermoseal type, manufactured by Textile Marking Machine Co., Inc., Syracuse N Y The tape is  $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide and 1 1/16" long and bears letters and numbers O2B-6.

Experts at Textile Marking Machine Company advise type on this machine is unusual in that the first two characters are 15 point type and the last three characters are 18 point type, with the middle character, the letter B, probably being narrow rather than regular type. The usual machine carries 15 point type for the first three characters and 18 point type for the last two characters

Textile Marking Machine experts also stated this machine is defective in that it is producing a tape  $1\ 1/16$ " long instead of  $1\ 1/8$ " long and is not projecting the tape far enough resulting in cutting off a portion of the first letter. The code used in the Northeast part of the U. S. is as follows:

The first letter 0 stands for lot number; the first number 2 indicates the day of the week, two being Tuesday; the second letter indicates the first letter of the store name, this is the letter B; the last number is the bundle number, this is 6 Color coding of the tag may designate various things such as a different month or the identity of a store in a chain. Experts also state the use of this system on laundry items is unusual in that the system is normally used on garments being dry cleaned

The Bureau has instructed that all textile machines using this type tape be located and machines using this code be identified.
