At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [REDACTED], his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "2OR-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type,

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

On 4/4/68 KX 1006-R was contacted to determine if he had received any information concerning the identity of the individual responsible for the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Informant stated that he could suggest the name of no one whom he would suspect of being responsible for this crime. Informant advised that when the crime occurred the members of Maryville Klavern No. 1 of the UKA, Inc., KKKK, were holding their regular closed meeting at the Klan Hall in Maryville, Tennessee. Informant stated that when news came to them that KING had been assassinated all members seemed rather shocked and some commented that it was not surprising because KING had been making a lot of people mad by his statements that this summer he was advocating mass civil disobedience throughout the United States. Informant advised that the following members of Maryville Klavern No. 1 were present on 4/4/68 when KING was assassinated:

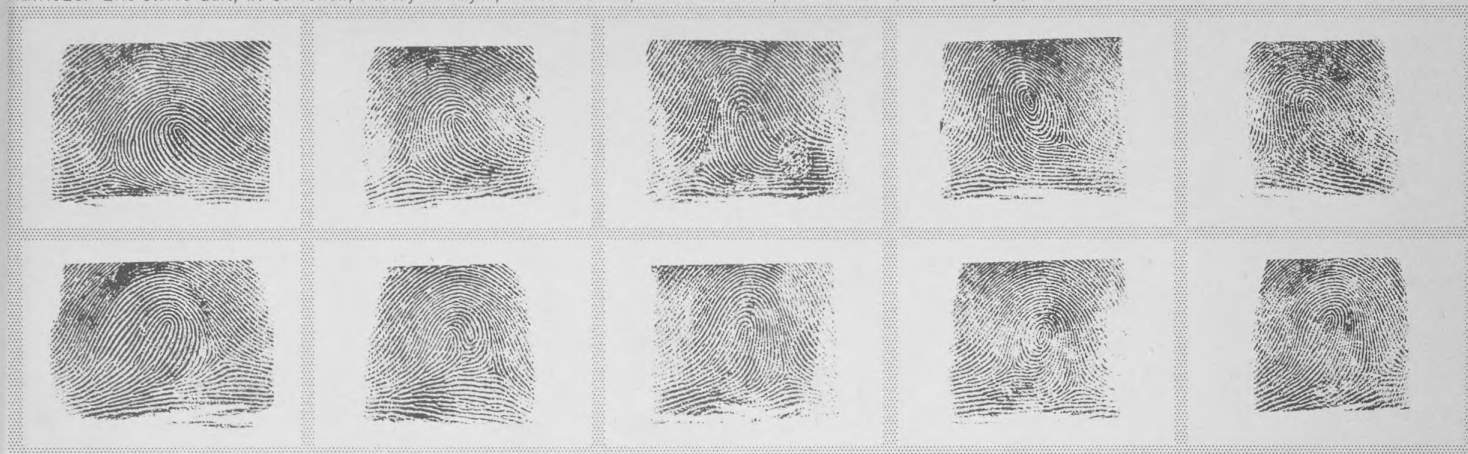

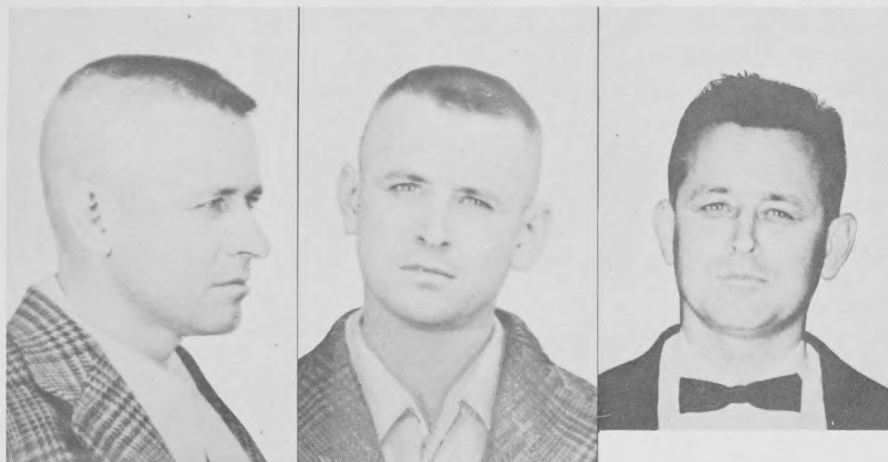

A Federal warrant was issued on April 17, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, charging Ray as Eric Starvo Galt with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 241). A Federal warrant was also issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri, charging Ray with Interstate Flight to Avoid Confinement for the crime of Robbery (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1073).

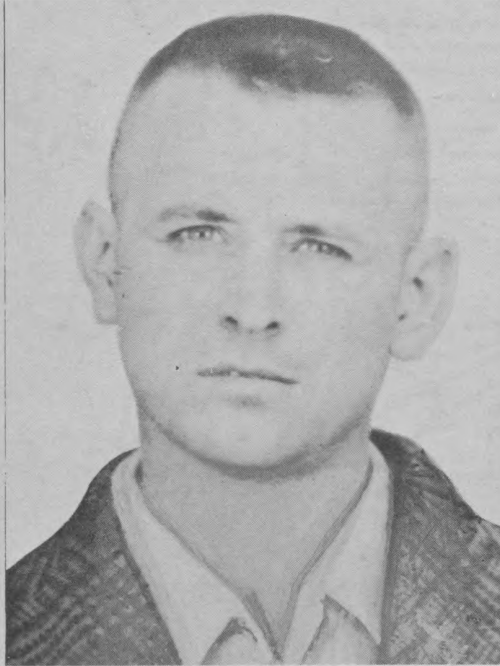

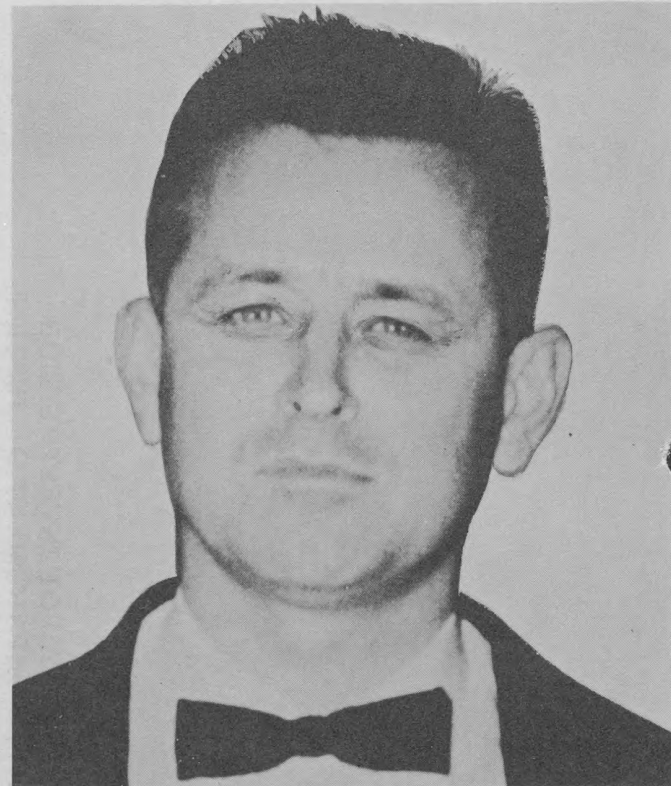

Inspector DALY stated that this letter would be forwarded to the dead letter office in Memphis, where it would be opened. It appeared that the letter contained a religious tract. SAC JENSEN stated that the letter was returned to Inspector DALY before the office could examine its contents.

SAC JENSEN desires that Inspector DALY be immediately contacted concerning this letter, and that if possible it be determined who sent the religious tract to GALT at 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, and that the religious organization which printed the tract be contacted to determine if it sent the letter and, if so, how it happened to obtain GALT'S name and address. All other information in the possession of the religious organization concerning GALT should be obtained.

This information was furnished to SA DONALD L. STOUT with instructions that this matter be handled immediately.

WILLIAM VAUGHAN WILBURN was interviewed at his apartment, 2112 Highland Avenue.

WILBURN advised that he is a graduate student at the University of Tennessee (U-T), working toward a Ph.D and attends class on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

When asked the question regarding his whereabouts on April 4, 1968, he stated that he was at Knoxville but pointed out that he would not have been in class that day because it was Thursday. He recalled that he awoke about 8:00 AM and spent the morning at the U-T Library. He stated that he either ate lunch at Byerly's Cafeteria or Evans' Cafeteria on the way from the library back to his apartment, where he checked his mail and may have taken a nap. During the afternoon, approximately 2:00 PM, he walked to Cole's Drug Store located at the corner of Cumberland Avenue and 17th Street where he purchased some vitamins. He recalled having a conversation with MARTHA MYNATT, a cashier, at the drug store. He stated that they were at the fountain or lunch counter and he was talking jokingly with Miss MYNATT about her drinking habits when another employee made the comment that Miss MYNATT did a better job when she was drinking.

Mr. WILBURN stated that he took his laundry to the One-Hour Cleaners directly behind the Cole's Drug Store, either Thursday or Friday morning. He stated that he does not know the name of the employee on duty when he left the laundry but recalled that she agreed to have it ready on Monday.

After leaving Cole's Drug Store during the afternoon, WILBURN stated that he returned to his apartment where he took a short nap and then studied in preparation for a French examination to be taken during the following week.

At about 7:00 PM on April 4, 1968, WILBURN was in Karns Drug Store, which is located on Cumberland at 19th Street, which is in the same neighborhood where he resides. The cashier, whose name WILBURN could not recall, told him that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING had just been shot in Memphis, Tennessee. According to WILBURN, this cashier is on duty daily at the store and works during the evening and night.

At one point in the interview Mr. WILBURN stated that he did not desire that this investigation be brought to the attention of anyone in the Sociology Department at U-T since he felt it would hurt his reputation. He also stated that he had previously been in trouble with school officials at the University of Chattanooga where he taught Anthropology during 1964-1965. According to WILBURN, he used scientific findings concerning the size of the brain in Negroes, along with the instances of delinquency, crime, illegitimacy and disease in connection with his classes. This also got him into trouble at the University of Richmond where he was Associate Professor of Sociology during 1965-1966. He stated he incurred the wrath of Dr. E. W. GREGORY, JR., who caused him trouble until he left the school.

It was determined that Mr. WILBURN's car is a 1960 white Comet, 2-door, six cylinder, with radio antenna missing. It bore Knox County, Tennessee, license CK-2907.

During the interview with Mr. WILBURN he stated that he had an arrest record at the Knoxville Police Department for drunkenness during 1963 and passing a stop sign in 1964. He stated that he paid \$5.00 fine for passing the stop sign and the drunkenness charge was dismissed. He also advised he had been arrested for drunkenness at Clarksville, Tennessee.

WILBURN advised that he was at Knoxville on March 29-30, 1968, and was positive that he had attended a class on March 29, 1968, as this date was on Friday.

Mrs. RUCKS stated that A. RODNEY RUCKS, her husband, is currently working as a salesman traveling in the State of North Carolina. He returns on Fridays by U. S. She further advised that the name HARVEY LOWMYER and JOHN WILLARD are also unfamiliar to her.

According to BOLDS, GALT's mother had advised that JAMES C. GALT is presently employed with the DuPont Company and is in the process of moving from Richmond, Virginia to Chattanooga, Tennessee. He is a white male, age 37, with date of birth of [REDACTED]. His height is 5'11", weight 175 pounds, blue eyes, and brown hair.

JAMES COLQUHOUN GALT was interviewed at his residence 201 Sunnybrook Trail, Signal Mountain, Tennessee, on April 15, 1968 by SAS KENNETH G. POLLARD and DONALD L. STOUT. During the course of the interview, GALT advised that he has been with the DuPont Company for approximately 10 years and has only recently been transferred from Richmond, Virginia to Chattanooga, Tennessee. He stated that he is moving into his residence at 201 Sunnybrook Trail on April 15, 1968, further that he has been between Richmond and Chattanooga during the past month primarily at Chattanooga. According to GALT, he was employed at the plant in Chattanooga on April 4, 1968, the date of the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

ARNOLD STULCE, Personnel Supervisor, DuPont Company, advised that JAMES C. GALT is an employee of the DuPont Company and was so employed at the company on April 4, 1968. GALT attended a conference held at the DuPont Company on this date.

During the course of contact with GALT, he advised that he has a cousin, first name unknown, but the last name would be GALT and that this individual's father is THOMAS C. GALT of Raleigh, North Carolina. A communication has been sent out concerning the possible contact of this individual. An FD-302 is being submitted concerning the interview with JAMES GALT.

On 3/6/68 COFFIN was contacted concerning any comments he may have regarding the racial situation in Blount and Sevier Counties, Tennessee. Also, whether there was any indication of racial trouble. COFFIN stated at this time nothing had come to his attention to indicate any racial difficulties. He said to his knowledge race relations in both counties at the present time were good and he did not anticipate any problems.

On 3/26/68 COFFIN was recontacted concerning Knoxville file 157-1218, entitled "BLACK NATIONALIST MOVEMENT; IS-BN." COFFIN was asked if he knew of any individual or individuals whom he would classify as militant Black Nationalists residing in Blount or Sevier Counties, Tennessee, and who traveled extensively throughout the United States. COFFIN stated he knew of no one whom he would place in this category. He advised that there are some young Negroes in the Alcoa, Tennessee area who feel that the older Negroes are not moving fast enough and not making enough demands, however, he did not feel this group was any threat at the present time. He said they have no organization and that they are just young Negroes who want to move faster.

COFFIN was also contacted at this time regarding Knoxville file 157-1279, entitled "WASHINGTON SPRING PROJECT (WSP); RM." COFFIN stated that he knew of no individuals or groups from the Maryville-Alcoa, Tennessee area who had planned to travel to Washington, D.C. during April, 1968, and participate in the massive demonstration that is to occur in Washington, D.C. headed by MARTIN LUTHER KING. He said if he learned of any such units or groups planning to travel to Washington for this purpose, he would advise the writer.

On 4/4/68 COFFIN was contacted to determine if he had any knowledge that there may be demonstrations or riots in Sevier or Blount Counties, Tennessee, as a result of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. COFFIN stated that when the assassination occurred, he was working at the Aluminum Company of America and did not return to his own residence until a few minutes after 10:00 P.M. in the evening. COFFIN advised that from his observation, most of the Negroes in the Maryville-Alcoa, Tennessee area were in a state of shock as a result of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING and that he did not hear any rumors or statements which would indicate there was anyone planning to riot or demonstrate as a result of the assassination. COFFIN stated he did not believe there would be any difficulties in this area, however, if he received any information of the possibility of a demonstration or riot, he would immediately contact the writer.

COFFIN was asked if he could suggest the name of anyone whom he would suspect of having committed this crime and he stated he knew of no one whom he would suspect of assassinating KING.

WARREN at this time was asked if he knew of any individuals in the Maryville-Alcoa, Tennessee area whom he could classify as militant Black Nationalists. Also, whether or not he had any knowledge that individuals whom he may consider in this category are traveling extensively. WARREN stated that to his knowledge he knew of no one in his area who could fit into this category.

WARREN was also contacted concerning Knoxville file 157-1279, entitled, "WASHINGTON SPRING PROJECT (WSP); RM." WARREN advised that he knew of no groups or individuals in his area who planned to travel to Washington, D.C. during April, 1968, to attend the demonstration planned by MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On 4/4/68 WARREN was contacted concerning Knoxville file 44-696, entitled "MURKIN." At the time that WARREN was contacted, he was listening to the radio concerning the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING when the announcement was made that KING had died. WARREN stated that he knew of no one in the Maryville-Alcoa, Tennessee area whom he would suspect of having assassinated MARTIN LUTHER KING.

He added he would immediately contact the writer if anyone came to his mind or was suggested to him. WARREN was asked if he believed there would be any trouble such as demonstrations or rioting in the Maryville-Alcoa, Tennessee area as a result of the assassination of KING. WARREN advised he did not believe there would be, however, there are some "hot heads" who are unpredictable and that he could not say what they may do. He stated that if he received any indication of a demonstration or riot he would immediately contact the writer.
