On 4/17/68, landlord identified photo of subject as closely resembling GALT. Furnished signed statement re this identification. One tenant of adjacent rooming house operated by same landlord advised a white Mustang with out-of-state license parked at rear of 113 14th St. for a period of approximately two weeks and approximately two weeks prior to 4/15/68, but never observed operator. Interview of other tenants negative. Search of GALT's
