Jour down The writer at approximately 2:20 P.M., 4/22/68, was advised by Supervisor NEAL MC GINNIS that LOUIS LOMAX had telephonically advised him that he had information concerning this case, that he was not in a position to talk about the matter at that time, and that he would call me in about half an hour.

At 2:45 P.M. LOMAX contacted the writer and desired to know if we had any information regarding calls made by GALT during the trip to New Orleans with STEIN. He was informed we could not give out any information and was asked if he were with STEIN. He advised that he was with STEIN in the Sultan Bar, St. Francis Hotel, and that he had a "hot lead" on the telephone calls which he could not very well give over the telephone and requested the writer to contact him. He was advised that Agents would be in contact to get whatever information he had.

SAC GRAPP was then contacted by the writer and advised of the above, and it was recommended that an Agent completely unfamiliar with the case do the interviewing of LOMAX. SA TIMOTHY L. DONOVAN was given the assignment, and SA WILLIAM JOHN SLICKS accompanied him.

After completion of the interview, the writer was advised by SA's DONOVAN and SLICKS of LOMAX's proposal to take CHARLES STRIN to New Orleans over the same path STEIN and GALT had traveled and find the phone booths, and that LOMAX wanted an FBI representative to accompany them. At approximately 245 p.m. on 4/22/68, LOUIS LOWAX, a former Los Angeles television commentator, telephonically contacted Supervisor WILLIAM JOHN NOLAN. Mr. LOMAX advised that he was in possession of information which might possibly be of assistance in investigation of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Mr. LOMAX indicated he preferred to talk personally to agents rather than telephonically concerning this information, and was advised that agents would contact him within a few moments.

At approximately 3:10 p.m., SAS WILLIAM JOHN SLICKS and TIMOTHY L. DONOVAN contacted Mr. IOMAXat the Sultan Room of the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

Mr. LOMAX indicated that he had been working diligently as a newsman in connection with the assassination and more particularly with the activities of CHARLES STEIN, the individual who accompanied the man he knew as ERIC S. GAIT to New Orleans in December, 1967. Mr. LOMAX advised that he had determined that GAIT, while en route to New Orleans, made five telephone calls apparently from telephone pay booths. Four of these calls were completed and one was not complete. Mr. LOMAX advised that he was endeavoring to travel with CHARLES STEIN over the same route that was made with GAIT in an effort to actually locate the specific phone booths utilized by GAIT. Following identification of these booths, he would endeavor to have phone records checked to determine to whom the calls may have been made, being under the impression that they were made to New Orleans.

LOMAX had no substantiation of the fact that the calls were made to New Orleans other than it was his impression because of the fact that GALT was actually en route to New Orleans.

LOMAX stated that he was to contact Mr. STEIN later that afternoon concerning this possible trip and if it could be arranged, he was desirous of agent personnel joining him. Mr. LOMAX was advised that it would be very unlikely that agent personnel would be allowed to travel on the route with him, but if the trip were made and if specific phones were identified, that he should contact the nearest office of the FBI, furnishing that office with whatever information he had developed.

LOMAX further advised that he had determined that RITA STEIN is not CHARLES STEIN's sister, but could be his common-law wife or even possibly a prostitute being pimped by CHARLES STEIN.

LOMAX stated that RITA STEIN had advised him that she had seen GALT in a white Mustang with Alabama plates at the parking lot at the Sears Store located at Wilcox and Pico Boulevard, Los Angeles, approximately three weeks prior to the assassination of KING. LOMAX further stated he is endeavoring to identify a girl friend of GALT who he believes used to frequent the Sultan Room, and that following her identification, would interview her for any additional information which she might have concerning GALT and his activities.

Mr. LOMAX indicated that his private telephone number at his home was 278-1223, and should he not be at home, his wife, ROBINNETTE, would know of his whereabouts. He requested he be contacted on the evening of 4/22/68, for any additional information he might have concerning his proposed trip with STEIN.

This is to advise that at 9:30 a.m. LOUIS LOWAX, TV commentator, called the Office and asked to speak to SA RICHARD M. WOOLF. In the absence of SA WOOLF, the call was referred to the writer. LOMAX stated that he wished to discuss a matter with SA WOOLF and left his phone number, requesting that SA WOOLF call him.

In addition, LOMAX inquired if when RAY escaped from Missouri State Penitentiary, was there an FBI wanted notice issued for him at that time.

LOMAX was courteously informed that a copy of the press release would be made available to him if he desired. He requested that this be done. Accordingly, the press release, wanted flyer and photographs of RAY were left at the reception desk for LOMAX or one of his staff to pick them up.

At 2:30 p.m. while on the ASAC's desk in the absence of ASAC ROGGE, LOMAX again called and stated that he had some information that he wished to furnish concerning the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that he would like to talk to someone who was familiar with the case. LOMAX stated that at the phone from which he was calling, he was not in a position to discuss the matter but that he would call back in approximately half an hour and speak to Supervisor NOLAN.

I have never met Mr. LOMAX personally but have made several contacts with his office at KTTV, particularly with Mr. WILLIAM F. WALKER, Executive Producer, "The Louis Lomax Show." Mr. LOMAX apparently obtained my name through these contacts.

I returned Mr. LOMAX's call as requested. Mr. LOMAX commenced his conversation by asking if I had detailed knowledge of the RAY investigation. I explained that I was aware of the general facts of the case and asked the nature of his inquiry. He explained that he was investigating some "hot leads" in this case and desired to discuss these leads with an appropriate individual. I said that I would be glad to accept any information he had to offer. He said because the case was complex, he wanted to talk with someone who had detailed information concerning the case, to preclude his explaining how his information fitted into the matter.

Because of the foregoing, I suggested that he should furnish the information to Mr. NOLAN. I determined that Mr. NOLAN was at lunch at the time. Mr. LOMAX said he was leaving his home and would telephonically contact Mr. NOLAN later. I left a message with Mr. NOLAN's secretary concerning the above information.

SA DWAYNE FRANKLIN, Albuquerque Division, on 4/18/68, at 1:05 p.m., telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office, at which time he advised that on the night of 4/17/68, the Albuquerque night clerk was in the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Albuquerque, waiting for his mother who was an inbound passenger from Dallas. The night clerk observed a Greyhound bus, number 1273, arrive from Dallas and while the porters were unloading the luggage, the night clerk observed a brown Samsonite twin suiter silhouette model suitcase bearing the name GALT which was written by a red marking pen on a piece of masking tape, 8" long affixed to the suitcase. No destination tag was observed. No one claimed the suitcase. Theluggage in which the suitcase was included was reloaded to another cart and thence to the bus which the clerk observed was en route to San Francisco.

The Albuquerque Division advised that bus 1273 left. Albuquerque at 11:45 p.m. due to arrive Barstow, California at 1:52 p.m. Los Angeles time. Its next stop was Bakersfield at 5:15 p.m., and thence to San Francisco, exact arrival time not known. The Albuquerque Division noted the luggage could possibly be on a follow-up bus for it is to be noted Greyhound buses usually travel in pairs.

A call was placed with SA MARTIN at Barstow and it was determined that he and Agent WESSEL were at Parker Dam, 250 miles from Barstow. SA MARTIN stated he could ascertain whether or not the suitcase was on the Greyhound bus in question by contacting the Greyhound bus manager, a friend and confidential source. The bus manager will be requested to contact the Los Angeles Office collect if the suitcase is on the bus as reported.

On 4/23/68, Miss March Vince 5750 San Vincente, Los Angeles, California at first denied and then reluctantly admitted she had called the FBI about a patient at this small sanitarium whom she feit resembles Fugitive RAY. She adviséd that she had no information Adentifying this patient, OWEN FITZMAURICE, with this case other than the fact that she felt he resembles the photograph she has seen of RAY. She did comment that FITZMAURICE is an unpleasant individual and that she and other Negro female attendants at this sanitarium are afraid of him.

Also on 4/23/68, Dr. MARTIN MATOMAN, operator of this sanitarium, advised that he sees no resemblance between the photograph of RAY and his patient, FITZMAURICE, except that they both have pointed noses. He pointed out that FITZMAURICE has been a patient at this alcoholic's sanitarium off and on during the past several months. He stated that FITZMAURICE resides at the Figueroa Hotel in Los Angeles and works as a reporter for the Herald-Examiner newspaper in Los Angeles. He described this man from records at the sanitarium as a Caucasian, male, born height 5'9", weight 160, brown hair, blue eyes. He said that FITZMAURICE is from Duluth, Minn.

In view of the above, it is not felt further investigation of FITZMAURICE as a suspect is warranted. LA indices are negative re this name.
