WILLIAMS STATES SHE SAW GALT ON TWO OCCASIONS WHILE GALT WAS IN NEW ORLEANS IN DECEMBER, NINETEEN SIXTYSEVEN. THE FIRST TIME SHE SAW GALT WAS AT MARIE LEE'S

APARTMENT ON BURGUNDY STREET. SHE WAS INTRODUCED TO GALT BY CHARLES STEIN. GALT DID ACKNOWLEDGE THE INTRODUCTION. SHE WAS IN GALT'S COMPANY ABOUT FIVE MINUTES . THE SECOND TIME SHE SAW GALT WAS THE DAY GALT AND STEIN DEPARTED NEW ORLEANS. SHE OBSERVED GALT, CHARLES STEIN, RITA STEIN'S TWO CHILDREN AND CHARLES DECARVELHO PACKING GALT'S WHITE MUSTANG. SHE DID NOT TALK WITH GALT ON THIS OCCASION. SHE ADVISED THAT STEIN ASKED HER TO DATE GALT , BUT SHE DECLINE. SHE STATED SHE WAS ADVISED BY CHARLES STEIN THAT GALT WAS COMING TO NEW ORLEANS ON BUSINESS AND ARRANGEMENTS WERE MADE BY MARIE MARTIN TO HAVE CHARLES STEIN ACCOMPANY HIM ON TRIP.

SHE ADVISED SHE FEELS CERTAIN THAT CHARLES STEIN DID NOT KNOW GALT PREVIOUS TO THE TRIP AS STEIN INFORMED MARIE LEE OF THIS FACT AND STEIN WOULD NOT LIE TO HIS SISTER. SHE STATED BECAUSE OF THE SHORT PERIOD OF TIME THAT CHARLES STEIN KNEW GALT SHE DID NOT FEEL THAT GALT AND STEIN WERE INVOLVED IN NARCOTICS SALES IN LOS ANGELES. SHE ADVISED THAT STEIN WAS TO STAY IN NEW

ORLEANS ONLY ONE DAY BUT REMAINED SEVERAL DAYS. SHE RECEIVED THIS INFORMATION FROM MARIE LEE AND WAS ADVISED BY LEE THAT STEIN REMAINED IN NEW ORLEANS AS GALT HAD SOME BUSINESS TO CONDUCT. MAIN PURPOSE OF STEIN'S TRIP TO NEW ORLEANS TO RETURN ITA STEIN'S TWO DAUGHTERS TO CALIFORNIA.

CHARLES STEIN INFORMED HER THAT HE IS A FIRM BELIEVER IN COSMIC PHILOSOPHY AND ALSO INFORMED HER THAT GALT PAID FOR ALL FOOD, GAS AND MOTEL BILLS ON THE TRIP. WILLIAMS DID NOT KNOW WHERE GALT AND STEIN STOPPED ON TRIP. W SHE DID NOT KNOW IF STEIN FIXED GALT UP WITH ANY WOMEN WHILE THEY WERE IN NEW ORLEANS, BUT DOUBTED THIS AS STEIN WAS OUT OF TOUCH IN NEW ORLEANS DUE TO HIS ABSENCE.

WILLIAMS ADVISED DID NOT COME FORWARD SOONER PER REQUEST OF MARIE LEE AS LEE INFORMED HER SHE DID NOT FEEL SHE WILLIAMS COULD FURNISH FBI ANY PERTINENT INFORMATION.

LOUIS TRENT, ATTORNEY FOR ROSE WILLIAMS SUBSEQUENTLY, ADVISED CONFIDENTIALLY THAT ROSE WILLIAMS ADMITTED TO HIM THAT MRS. CLOVINA OLONZO WAS PRESENT WHEN GALT AND CHARLES STEIN DEPARTED

He stated he had just come from Big Joe Joe's Bar at Century Boulevard and Sepulveda in West Los Angeles and while there had had a "couple of beers." He stated while in the bar, he noticed an individual who looked like ERIC STARVO GALT, who was also a patron of the bar and had been there since about 9:30 a.m. This individual was dressed in a blue and white checkered sports shirt and unknown colored slacks. He was drinking "vodka and something." He described this individual as being about 5'9", tall and having a very noticeably protruding left ear. When this individual left the bar, CASEY followed him out and wrote down the license number of the vehicle in which this individual left the area. The license number is MNX 341 which was a late model Chevrolet, white in color.

Department of Motor Vehicles, Los Angeles, advised above licensed vehicle registered to LOUIS PAUL SERPAS, Box 434, Suisun City, California. The vehicle is described as a 1964 Chevrolet Coupe.

MRS. DAVID (JOAN) HEINZ, 415 Calle Granada, Santa Barbara, advised that she and her husband flew from Los Angeles via Mexicana Airlines to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico on Thursday, 10/26/67, arriving at 6:05 PM. They were booked by their travel service at the Hotel Rio, where they had a room on the second floor at an outside street corner of the hotel. They stayed there only one night and because of the noise of truck traffic outside their window they moved on Friday, 10/27/68 to another hotel, the name of which she recalled as the "Inn of the Jungle", a quarter of a mile away. They stayed there two nights and on Sunday morning, 10/29/68 they flew on to Guadalajara.

She recalled that they had observed no one coming in or out of any rooms at the Hotel Rio and she observed no one who resembled any of the photographs of subject RAY. She recalled no suspicious persons in Puerto Vallarta during the period they spent there and stated that although they observed several North Americans in various bars and dining places and struck up a conversation with one or two, they did not know the names of any other North Americans in town.

She stated that her husband is presently employed by Autonetics, a division of North American Aviation at Anaheim, and that she has sold their Santa Barbara home and will join him in a few weeks.

Her husband's business address is 3370 Miraloma Avenue, Anaheim, telephone 632-5379 or 5370. He lives in apartment H, 131 Fahrion Place, no telephone.

Her address or employment there unknown. She stayed for a period in Florida, and then went to New Orleans where she resided for a short period of time. Her address or employment there also unknown to Mrs. STANLEY OLSON. She apparently

was taking some type of drugs during this period, and was seldom in contact with her parents. She has no particular occupation, and has become a "drifter", according to Mrs. S. OLSON. She went to Mexico, location not known, after leaving New Orleans and after a short stay there, went to California, where she is currently believed to be residing.

Mrs. S. OLSON provided some letters from PAT from which the following addresses were obtained:

12/20/67 - PAT OLSON, 5842 Carlton Way, Hollywood, California. Letter with this return address was postmarked Los Angeles, California (36) on indicated date.

11/29/67 - PAT OLSON, 5842 Carlton Way, Los Angeles, California, Apt. 3.

11/25/67 - PAT OLSON, St. Francis Hotel, Room 527, Hollywood and Western Blvd., Los Angeles, California.

4/27/67 - PAT OLSON, 1746 North Gramercy Place, Apt. 16, Hollywood, California.

3/31/67 - K. WILLIAR, in care of TERRY CALLIGAN, 1746 South Gramercy Place, Hollywood, California.

Mrs. S. OLSON advised that on a date she recalls to be 3/18/68, PAT telephoned her from somewhere in California. The conversation was general, and PAT mentioned that she was babysitting for some woman in California, city not named. Nothing was said concerning anything relating to MURKIN. On about 4/3-4/68 PAT called again from California and the conversation again was general. PAT spoke most of the time with her daughter DENISE. Several days after receiving that last call on 4/3-4/68 Mrs. S. OLSON received an inquiry from the telephone operator concerning that call. The operator advised her that a PAT OLSON was using a telephone credit card of another person. No inquiries from the telephone company were received after the call of 3/18/68.

Mrs. S. OLSON advised that she does not know any of PAT's friends in California. She has never heard the name of CHARLES or RITA STEIN, MARIE MARTIN or MARIN. The name, aliases and photograph of JAMES EARL RAY are unknown to her. Mrs. S. OLSON advised that her husband, age 50, is employed with the Contee Construction Co., Baltimore, Maryland, Telephone 636-3758, and is not home during the week. She is certain that he would not be familiar with the names of STEIN or MARTIN or RAY.

On 5/1/68, ANTHONY ANGELO SALERNO, of 29 Ferris Avenue, Apartment 22, Norwalk, Conn., advised he visited in California from late January, 1968, until 4/10/68, during which time he lived at the El Dorado, Western Avenue, Los Angeles, except for the last week spent at the apartment of TOMMY SATINI (phonetic), Flores Avenue, Los Angeles, a student at L.A. Community College.

SALERNO went to California to get away from his wife from whom he is separated. He advised he is living with his girlfriend, KATHY EDYK and noted that EDYK's parents think they are married.

SALERNO while in California made a number of telephone calls to his girlfriend, KATHY EDYK, Norwalk, to the home of her parents, telephone 847-9088, in addition to calling his mother, Mrs. EDILMA CASTELLUCCI, 86 Oak Street, Bridgeport, Conn., telephone number 334-6597. SALERNO advised these were the only collect calls he made from California which he noted were from a pay phone at the corner of Hollywood and Western Avenue, Los Angeles, near the St. Francis Hotel, as well as the El Dorado motel.

SALERNO stated he was not familiar with JAMES EARL RAY whom he stated he has never seen.

SALERNO, based upon description, does not approximate that of JAMES EARL RAY.

She stated that JULIA FORBES is in the process of obtaining a divorce from her husband, RON FORBES and is currently residing at 23114 Avenue San Luis, Apt. Woodland Hills, Calif. She further stated that she is living with her brother, MELVIN, and her first husband Robert WANDREY at that address. Mrs. MONTAMBAULT stated that at one time JULIA FORBES was living at the Hollywood Colonial Motel or Hotel, tel. 467-5141. Mrs. MONTAMBAULT stated that she does not recall receiving a phone call from Los Angeles on 2/18/68. She added that the call in question was probably made by her sister in response to a call from Mrs. MONTAMBAULT since Mrs. MONTAMBAULT's March, 1968 telephone bill reflects a phone call made to Los Angeles, California, 2/16/68, to telephone number (213) 402-7426. SUSPECT HAROLD EDWARD NICHOLS, aka Hal Nichols.

For information of offices not previously having information concerning NICHOLS, he is considered possible suspect and co-conspirator because of an alleged offer to an informant to furnish airline tickets and untraceable weapon if the informant would travel to unspecified place to kill certain designated Negro leaders including MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The reliability and credibility of the informant is unknown but is considered subject to doubt because of discrepancies of his stories, and because of information received from other sources.

NICHOLS has been extremely active in affairs of the American Independent Party in California, promoting GEORGE WALLACE for president.

AGENTS IN INTERVIEWS SHOULD EXERCISE DISCRETION AND CAUTION TO PREVENT ANY FALSE ALLEGATIONS THAT THE FBI IS CONDUCTING INVESTIGATION CONCERNING ACTIVITIES OF THE AIP.

HAROLD EDWARD NICHOLS, commonly known as HAL NICHOLS, was interviewed at his apartment, #33 Los Palmas Apartments, 15375 Tropic Court, San Leandro, California. After proper identification, he was advised that investigation was being conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning a violation of Federal Law in connection with the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. Further, that an allegation had been received that Mr. NICHOLS might have information pertinent to this matter on the basis of remarks NICHOLS is reported to have made concerning such matters in the presence of others.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he has no information concerning the murder, and except for his personal opinion as to who might be responsible, has no specific information concerning the murder. He said he had absolutely no objection to discussion of the matter.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he is extremely active in the political field at the present time and in the recent past. He is a member of an eight man board in charge of promoting candidates for the American Independent Party (AIP) in California, and particularly in behalf of the candidacy of former Governor GEORGE WALLACE of Alabama for President. He stated that most persons not familiar with the AIP program and objectives, seem to assume that those favoring AIP are what is sometimes termed "negro-baiters." He denied that this is true, and said that from the view point of promoting the AIP, the murder of Dr. KING under such circumstances was a set back to the AIP who might have favored their principles.

He said that no one knowledgeable in affairs of the AIP would have caused or participated in a situation or action such as this in that it would be certain to make a "Martyr" of Dr. KING, which would hurt the AIP.

However, since persons generally seem to associate AIP members with "negro-baiters," he is frequently "kidded" along such lines by certain persons with whom he regularly comes into contact.

He said that in recent months he has regularly frequented the Blue Dolphin, a San Leandro restaurant, and in fact assisted in arranging a couple of luncheons there in honor of WALLACE. Therefore, he has become acquainted with the owner of the Blue Dolphin, BILL PELUSO, and with many of the employees, including the bartenders.

When he goes to the cafe, he frequently goes to the bar and the bartenders frequently "kid" him concerning some current event involving Negroes or the AIP. This has been going on for several months, and everything said has been in jest.

However, he speculated that some person hearing such conversation might misinterpret the conversation, and draw a conclusion which would not be warranted.

In connection with Dr. KING's murder, he recalls such a conversation in the bar of the Blue Dolphin either the same night Dr. KING was killed, or possibly the evening after that.

As he recalled he had been driving on the Nimitz Freeway in Oakland, about 5:00 pm the night of the murder, April 4, 1968, when he first heard the announcement on the car radio.

When next visiting the Blue Dolphin, he recalled one of the employees greeting him with the comment "Well, I see you got him," or some similar comment. He believed he replied that "It wasn't me."

The next comment dealt with "How did you get back from Memphis so soon?"

As he recalled, he made some facetious remark such as "There's planes leaving every hour."

He again stated that the above conversation was strictly in the nature of "kidding," and except for the actual specific subject matter, was very similar to other comments made at the same place on numerous occasions.

He believed that these comments could have been misconstrued by someone who heard them, if the listener did not understand the circumstances or attached some literal interpretation to the remarks.

Mr. NICHOLS said that he had no objection to furnishing his whereabouts on March 29,30, 1968 and April 4, 1968, and to furnishing independent substantiation if he could.

Relative to the date April 4, 1968, Mr. NICHOLS said that he could definitely establish his whereabouts on that date. He stated that he left the Bay Area in his own car sometime between 7:00 and 9:00 am, drove to Berkeley, California, where he picked up a real estate dealer named CYRIL STEVENSON, Jr., telephone 524-2392. They then proceeded to Oroville, California, to look at some real estate which they were considering for investment purposes.

He recalled that they visited a savings and loan association in Oroville, but does not recall the name of it, although Mr. STEVENSON would probably know. To the best of his recollection, they returned to the Bay Area about 5:00 pm. He dropped Mr. STEVENSON off at his car in Berkeley, and proceeded out the Nimitz Freeway toward San Leandro. It was at this time that he first heard of the killing of Dr. KING on his car radio.

In further support of his whereabouts, Mr. NICHOLS said that when in San Leandro he frequently charges his gasoline at a Douglas Service Station on Marina Blvd. When traveling, he pays cash. He does not use a credit card. Whether charged to his account, or when paying cash, he usually obtains a purchase ticket. He throws these tickets in the glove compartment of his Cadillac where they are available if needed for his business records.

He located in his glove compartment the following charge tickets which he said recorded purchases at Douglas Service Station, Marina Blvd., San Leandro, both dated April 4, 1968:

Ticket #B 036026 dated 4/4/68 recording purchase of \$5.00 of gasoline.

Ticket #B 36186 recording purchase of \$4.55 of gasoline.

Mr. NICHOLS said that undoubtedly he had put gas in the car in the morning when leaving for Oroville, and had put in gas upon his return that evening.

A search of the available tickets failed to record any purchase of gasoline in the Oroville area, although Mr. NICHOLS believed they must have purchased gasoline. He does not recall, but thought that perhaps Mr. STEVENSON had paid for some gasoline in the area.

Relative to his whereabouts on March 29, 30, 1968, Mr. NICHOLD said that he does not recall specifically where he was. He stated that he tries to go to his home in Southern California every other weekend to visit his wife and 2 1/2 year old son. By consulting a calendar, he determined that this would have been the weekend when he normally visited his wife.

When he makes this trip, he normally leaves on Saturday morning, which in this instance would have been March 30, 1968. He sometimes drives and sometimes flies via Air California from Oakland, California Airport to Orange County Airport.

He searched his available gasoline tickets and could locate no record of purchases on March 29 or 30, 1968. This indicated to him that if he had visited his home in Southern California that weekend he had probably gone by air.

Mr. NICHOLS was asked if he could establish his whereabouts on March 29 & 30, 1968 through other records. He said that his business records probably would not show such information, with the exception of his appointment book, which might give him a clue as to where he had been. He contacted his secretary and ascertained there were no notations in his appointment book for those dates.

He said that he has discontinued the use of a checking account due to several civil suits having been filed against him, so he could not establish his whereabouts by cancelled checks.

He does not use credit cards, whether for gasoline or airline travel. He examined numerous airline ticket folders which he found in his apartment. He said he makes no particular effort to save these. He found some undated and none for the pertinent dates. There were no copies of tickets.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he makes numerous long distance telephone calls, business, personal and political in nature. He makes them from his business phone, 483-3151, and from the phone in his apartment, 483-1270.

He said his telephone bill for the period contains record of numerous long distance telephone calls which could definitely establish that he was in San Leandro on March 29, 1968 and probably on March 30, 1968. He furnished the following concerning these records:

March 29, 1968

- 10:13 am Telephone call to 714 774 2969, Anaheim, California where he talked to an ex-business associate RUSSELL TOWNSEND.
- 4:34 pm Telephone call to 714 871 2950, Fullerton, California, where he talked to JIM TOWNSEND, brother of above RUSSELL TOWNSEND.
- 3:49 pm Telephone call to 805 831 5379, where he talked to Mr. MAYALL, State Chairman of the Committee directing AIP campaign in California. He believes this telephone number is no longer in use, but Mr. MAYALL can be reached through 871 6283 in Bakersfield, which Mr. NICHOLS believes is the home telephone of Mr. MAYALL.

Collect telephone call, person to person, received by him from AL STANLEY, who was calling from telephone 553 4530 in Oroville, California. Mr. STANLEY does not have a telephone, so location of above phone is unknown to him. STANLEY can be located through the M&K Hancock Service Station in Oroville.

His telephone records reflect that at 12:11 pm, a call was placed from his office to 916 725 2908, Roseville, California. He noted that this is the telephone number of his employee, CHUCK SULLIVAN, who works in San Leandro but returns to his home in Roseville on Friday evening for the weekend.

Mr. NICHOLS does not specifically recall making this call, and in reality it could have been made by any company employee. However, he sometimes handles Saturday business at the office so SULLIVAN can go home on Friday, and it is most likely that he is the one who made the call.

Since this is the last recorded call on Saturday, March 30, 1968, and since he is quite certain he visited his wife in Southern California on that weekend, he feels that shortly after this call he went to the Oakland Airport and got a flight to Orange County Airport.

He said he would have flown Air California Air Lines and since they make their reservations by name, this line should have a record of his having made such a trip.

He also volunteered information on a trip he had made back East. He said his mother-in-law, JEANNETTE CRITTENDEN, 502 Lee Circle, Johnson City, Tennessee, died about two to three weeks prior to March 1, 1968. His wife had naturally gone back for the funeral. His wife remained there for two or three weeks after the funeral to clear up details of the death and the estate.

Mr. NICHOLS said that he desired to visit his wife's relatives and to bring his wife back to California. He decided to drive his car back to Johnson City, and because of his interest in activities of the AIP, he decided to stop and confer with leaders of that party in Montgomery, Alabama.

He said that en route to Johnson City, he stopped in Montgomery on the night of February 27, 1968, at which time he stayed at the Holiday Inn, Midtown. Next day he drove to Johnson City, where he stayed a few days at 502 Lee Circle.

On March 3, 1968, accompanied by his wife and small son, he was again in Montgomery en route to California. At this time, he stayed at the Town House Motel.

He next has record of a cash receipt from Cotton's Truck Stop, Las Cruces, New Mexico on March 5, 1968, which he said was for the purchase of gasoline on his return trip to California.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he was born [redacted] Aberdeen, Washington. He has been in California most of the time since 1945. He attended high school at Golden Gate Academy, which was at that time in Berkeley, California, but which moved to some hill area near Oakland. He is not sure it is still in operation. He graduated in 1947.

During the school year 1950-51 he attended La Sierra College in Riverside, California.

From 1951 to 1953 he was in the U.S. Marine Corps under MSN 1206458. Since 1953, he has worked as a salesman, principally in California, but actually traveling in numerous states.

He is married and his wife lives in Southern California. He said he is reluctant to furnish her specific address because he feels that reprisals against his wife and child are very possible because of his political activities in behalf of AIP should her address become generally known.

He said that he established a business in Sacramento, California in July, 1967, known as Certified Wire Service. This business is still in operation but he intends to dissolve it as it is losing money.

He came to San Leandro in December, 1967, and established his present business known as Diamond Fence Co., 14494 Wickes Blvd., San Leandro.

He is active in experimenting with gold dredging combined with skin diving, and spends some weekends in the Sierra stream areas searching for gold, or conducting experiments along those lines.

He also had interest in speculative investment in businesses in the Oroville area, which are in a depressed state due to departure of the workmen engaged in building the now completed Oroville Dam. He believed such property could be purchased cheaply and held until business picks up, insuring an excellent profit. He has abandoned this idea, at least temporarily.

No further investigation is being conducted in this matter by the El Paso Office.

THOMAS JUDKINS, 855 Victor Ave., Inglewood, Cal. (no phone), who is employed by the Kovacs Paper Co., telephone 775-3595, telephonically contacted the LA Office at 3:40 am, 5-4-68, to report that a girl he had met on the beach that day had related to him during the course of the evening that she had an uncle names JAMES EARL RAY who was supposed to have served time in Nebraska and Missouri State penitentiaries and died in prison about 13 years ago. This girl, known to him only as "JAN", seemed to have knowledge of, and an interest in, the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. However, JUDKINS pointed out, "JAN" had been drinking and he did not know how much of her conversation resulted from that, and he was not able to tell how much of what she said was fact, how much fancy. He said he would return to the apartment where "JAN" and the others in the party were drinking, and attempt to obtain more specific information from "JAN", including her identity, and would call back as soon as he had obtained more specific info.

On 5-6-68 JUDKINS was contacted at his place of employment, at which time he said that by the time he had returned to the group drinking at 216- 36th Place, Manhattan Beach, "JAN" had apparently left. However, he did obtain her name, JAN MANN, and the information that she lived on 9th Place in Manhattan Beach with another girl, LAUREL (LNU), believed to be employed at TRW's Semi-Conductor Div. JUDKINS said he had friends employed at this division and felt he would be able to obtain LAUREL's phone number through his friends. JUDKINS later called to say that LAUREL's and JAN's phone number is 376-3954.

It is suggested that JAN MANN be contacted to determine if, in fact, she has an uncle named JAMES EARL RAY and if he could be identical to the JAMES EARL RAY of captioned case. In this connection, it is suggested that every effort be made not to disclose the identity of the source, who said he is engaged to be married this month and is fearful that if his fiance were to learn of his activities during the evening and night of 5/3-4/68, his engagement might be jeopardized.

He stated that when he returned to Los Angeles on the evening of 4/15/68, he saw a photograph on television that was announced to be the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING. BITNER advised that he thought the photograph bore a strong resemblance to the man he observed at the motel in Phoenix.

BITNER described the man he saw as white, male, 5' 10", 185 pounds, blue eyes, 45 years of age, light brown hair cut short, receding hairline. He advised that he did not hear this man speak, does not know the room where he stayed, and did not observe the man drive any car.
