arriving at her home and have been coming to her home since; however, she denies having participated in this correspondence in any way. She has saved all letters received and displayed them for review. None of the letters viewed were from RAY under any of his known aliases. She claimed she was not acquainted with RAY or any of his known aliases. She was left a copy of the I.O. on RAY and advised she would immediately contact the FBI if she received any contact from RAY or anyone with a picture resembling him.

AT CHICO, CALIFORNIA

Owner of dwelling at 244 Oak St., Chico, advised has owned dwelling at this address since January, 1965, and does not recall PATRICIA TEVES. A neighborhood resident remembers name of TEVES; however, possesses no information. The 1964 Chico "Polk's City Directory" lists a GERALD and PATRICIA TEVES at 419 West 6th St., Chico. Occupation listed as U. S. Army. Subsequent directories negative re TEVES family. U. S. Post Office, Chico, has no address in records under TEVES name. Forwarding addresses cleared every two years by U.S. Post Office, Chico. No record Chico PD re TEVES family.

It would appear PATRICIA TEVES would not have received correspondence from "Swinger Correspondence Club" in view of U. S. Post Office clearing forwarding addresses every two years and Sacramento contemplates no investigation re TEVES.

AT FRESNO, CALIFORNIA

CONSUELO RIVERA, 1137 Tuolumne Avenue, Fresno, sister of CHRISTINA RIVERA, advised CHRISTINA has been married 3 years and previously belonged to Swinger Correspondence Club and all mail received from club during past 3 years destroyed by CONSUELO at CHRISTINA's request since CHRISTINA has a jealous husband and mail was vulgar in content. CONSUELO does not recall any correspondence from GALT or ERIC and added all mail received was destroyed without attention to sender. She advised no mail was forwarded to CHRISTINA and CHRISTINA has no knowledge of contents of mail.

JEAN STATON, aka. Jean Slaton, 1184 N. Marks Avenue, Fresno, advised she formerly resided in trailer court at 2827 W. Clinton. She advised she may be listed as member of club but never signed up for membership. She has, however, received a quantity of mail as result of joining two other clubs. She stated most of mail vulgar in content and she could recall no correspondence with anyone named ERIC or GALT and photograph of GALT not familiar to her. A review of correspondence in her possession failed to reflect any correspondence from ERIC or GALT.

On 5/8/68 complainant JEWELL BROWN was interviewed at her residence at 840½ Alta Vista Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. Mrs. BROWN was interviewed regarding her belief that a renter of hers who moved out of the apartments she manages resembled the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY which was published in the Los Angeles newspapers on 5/8/68.

The insuing interview of Mrs. BROWN revealed that GUS P. STRAGELOS, caucasian, age middle 40's, was a tenant of Mrs. BROWN's in apartment 836 Alta Vista Boulevard, Los Angeles from November 1967 until April 10, 1968. Mrs. BROWN further advised that STRAGELOS drove a late model Lincoln automobile which had a white bottom and a black top. She stated that STRAGELOS was employed with the Lytton Savings and Loan at 2620 Bronholly Street, Los Angeles. She further stated that Mr. STRAGELOS wore glasses. Mrs. BROWN was shown numerous photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and she advised that STRAGELOS only appeared to be similar in appearance but not identical.

He stated that the man who resembled JAMES EARL RAY and the woman he met in the lounge departed in the red Mustang (ROE 880) about five minutes after he had called the office.

Mrs. RICHARD MOHAN, 16848 Hiawatha St., Granada Hills, advised on 5/3/68 that the 1965 red Mustang (ROE 880) is registered to her husband and that she had it on the evening of 5/2/68. She met CHARLES GOLD, who is in the Product Evaluation Department of Lockheed Aircraft, and who is family friend of over twenty years standing, at the Red Coach Cocktail Lounge at about 7:00 pm that evening.

Mrs. MOHAN was then informed of the reason for the inquiry and was shown photographs of RAY. She stated that GOLD was not identical and in no way resembled ~~XXXX~~ RAY.

Officer FUNK advised he would dispatch a unit to interview the caller. After approx. 45 minutes the writer received a call from Officer D. WILSHANS, serial number 11569, who advised he had interviewed a Mr. STEEL, 2223 Barrington, Los Angeles, Calif. WILSHANS stated that STEEL advised that while he was in the bar known as "Mr. ROBERTS" he noticed a man who he thought resembled JAMES EARL RAY, in the company of two unidentified white males. STEEL further stated that he began shooting pool with the look alike and the men with the look alike. STEEL stated that the look a like told him his name was "WILLIAM; however STEEL advised that he heard the look alike tell others in the bar that his name was "CLYDE" and "MILLER". STEEL advised that he visits the above mentioned bar frequently and that he is sure he has seen the look alike in there before. STEEL advised that one of the two men with the look alike left the bar with a tall white female and got into a 1967 green mustang fast back bearing Calif. lic. INF-. STEEL stated he was unable to get the complete lic. STEEL advised the look alike had a small mustache.

He stated that he knew RAY as JOHN EDWARDS and that the pictures that appeared in the "Los Angeles Times" on 5/8/68 were pictures that made him feel certain that his former roommate, JOHN EDWARDS, was JAMES EARL RAY.

He said that EDWARDS had several guns in their residence and he considered him to be a "nut." He also stated that he believed the FBI questioned EDWARDS concerning his efforts to purchase a bazooka and bazooka ammunition.

FIMBRES stated that he had no additional information concerning GILMER or EDWARDS and was furnishing this data for whatever action was deemed appropriate by the Los Angeles Division.

She states that MERCER is employed by a police department or sheriff's office, address not known. She states that Mrs. MERCER is usually home during the day.

Attempts were made to contact Mrs. MERCER on 5/2, 3 and 6 without success.

On 5/7/68 Mrs. MERCER advised that the general shape of the face of RAY might possibly resemble the shape of her husband's face but the similarity ends there; she states her husband is much heavier but only 25 years of age; further he is employed by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office in the Hall of Justice - day shift - jail detail;

For the information of Bureau, Office of Origin, and Atlanta, Mr. ROBERT E. GRAHAM, uncle of DOWDA's wife, advised on reinterview 5/3/68 that he had consulted his wife concerning the particulars of the DOWDA's visit to the GRAHAM residence during the Thanksgiving Season, 1967.

GRAHAM stated that LEWIE DOWDA and Mrs. DOWDA arrived at the GRAHAM residence, 5419 Diversity Drive, Palos Verdes, California, driving a Volkswagen automobile bearing Georgia license plates the date prior to Thanksgiving, 11/28/67, as he recalled. After having Thanksgiving dinner with the GRAHAMS, the DOWDA's left in their Volkswagen at approximately 4:00 p.m. to see a friend of DOWDA's who allegedly worked in a hospital, believed in Santa Barbara, California. DOWDA also expressed his consideration of seeking employment at this hospital.

The DOWDA's returned to the GRAHAM residence on Friday, 12/1/67, and immediately upon arrival, Mrs. GRAHAM telephoned GRAHAM at his office telling of the DOWDA's arrival from Northern California.

DOWDA advised that he had lost his wallet in Santa Barbara, California, while swimming and GRAHAM had to loan or give DOWDA sufficient funds to drive back to Atlanta. The DOWDA's left the GRAHAM'S residence on Saturday, 12/2/68, enroute to Atlanta via San Diego, California.

GRAHAM stated that he knew DOWDA by first name "WHITEY". DOWDA stated he was a dietician and had attended three years college in the State of Missouri, perhaps the University of Missouri.

GRAHAM stated that he was of the opinion that DOWDA was prone to stretch the truth and he, GRAHAM, personally doubted his veracity for the short period of time he was acquainted with him.

The above information is furnished to Atlanta in slight variation of re Los Angeles airtel to Bureau.

GRAHAM stated that the information furnished in this communication was more nearly correct as to exact dates inasmuch as he had contacted his wife and the two of them had more accurately pinpointed the times and dates in question.

On April 24, 1968, SAs JAMES RICHARD FLICK, JOSEPH G. SHEA, and JACK T. BEVERSTEIN interviewed LEWIE RAYMOND DOWDA, an inmate at the Cobb County Jail, Marietta, Georgia. DOWDA advised he was formerly incarcerated at the Missouri State Prison, Jefferson City, Missouri. He stated while at the Missouri State Prison, he was acquainted for approximately three years with JAMES EARL RAY, a fellow inmate. DOWDA advised he was released from the Missouri State Prison on December 23, 1966, and JAMES EARL RAY was still incarcerated. He stated he had been the chief cook at the Missouri State Prison and RAY worked as a bread slicer.

DOWDA advised RAY was the type person the other inmates did not "mess with." He described RAY as a "loner" who usually initiated the conversation if he wanted to talk to anyone. He stated that RAY spoke in a mild, low tone and when angry would speak even softer. He stated he had never known RAY to become excited and shout. To his knowledge, he has never known RAY to smoke. He stated RAY had a fair complexion, which was blotchy, having pimples around the lower portion of his face. He stated RAY had a rash on the right side of his head during the entire time he had known RAY and RAY would scratch this rash. He stated this rash was very noticeable due to the type of haircut in the Penitentiary and RAY put some type of salve on this rash. He stated RAY's hair was lightly streaked with gray. He advised the only scar he can recall which RAY had was a large burn scar on his forearm, side unrecalled. He stated this scar was located near the wrist. He stated RAY had dingy teeth.

DOWDA advised RAY always talked about "running around" in St. Louis, Missouri. He normally talked about two girl friends, one of these he had met at the Gaslight

(a bar) located in either St. Louis or Kansas City. DOWDA stated the other girl was a girl RAY had met around the college at Columbia, Missouri, and it was his impression this girl had worked in a tavern there.

DOWDA advised RAY, while in prison, wore a ring on his left hand which was made at the Penitentiary, having been made from white metal with raised initials. He stated RAY never smiled, but when he smiled, it looked like a smirk. He advised RAY was clean and not sloppy in his dress. He described RAY as an avid reader and considered RAY to be intelligent. He advised RAY participated in softball games as a pitcher and would watch all of the baseball games at the Penitentiary, however, he had never heard RAY speak of professional baseball.

DOWDA stated that some time in 1966, a group of Black Muslims had petitioned for the right to have their own religious services. He stated the Muslims would congregate in groups and that a subsequent search of the Negro prisoners had uncovered a large cache of weapons. DOWDA stated the white prisoners then armed themselves and there was a riot at the prison. DOWDA stated three Negro prisoners were killed. DOWDA stated he would not say RAY had knifed these Negro prisoners, but did say that if RAY had not knifed them, he definitely knew who had killed them.

DOWDA stated RAY definitely was a racist and hated Negroes. He stated RAY had made the statement and firmly believed that all the Negro prisoners inside the Penitentiary should be killed. He stated RAY had on several occasions made the statement that if the price were right, he would kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DOWDA stated he does not recall ever hearing anything which would indicate a "contract" was out for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

DOWDA advised he would not be surprised if JAMES EARL RAY was the murderer of MARTIN LUTHER KING, however, he does not believe RAY would have killed KING without being paid for it.

DOWDA stated approximately four months before he, DOWDA, was released RAY had attempted to escape from the Missouri State Prison by going out of the prison behind the ovens in the prison bakery. He stated RAY was apprehended and RAY had broken his arm in this escape attempt. He stated RAY had talked about escaping from the Penitentiary prior to this. DOWDA advised he does not believe RAY returned from maximum security confinement prior to DOWDA's release from prison.

DOWDA stated while in prison, RAY was particularly interested in Western music. He stated he does not recall RAY ever mentioning anything about dancing. He stated that during this period a number of orchestras from the Lake of the Ozarks had played at the State Prison and RAY would never miss these performances. He stated RAY often talked about planning to go to the Lake of the Ozarks when he got out of prison. DOWDA stated he would have no idea who RAY would contact at the Lake of the Ozarks, but stated if he were to look for RAY there, he would first find out who was selling dope and through this person, locate RAY. He stated RAY had talked about being on dope prior to being in the Missouri State Prison. He advised RAY had to have an outside source of income while in prison inasmuch as RAY's dope habit was costing RAY \$35 to \$40 a week for shots and RAY appeared to be well fixed, never wanting for anything.

DOWDA estimated RAY spent \$15 to \$20 a week for personal conveniences. He stated RAY, while in prison,

used amphetamine, taking the shot in the "main line." He stated RAY would take two to three shots a day. He stated RAY never lacked for money, but had no idea of RAY's source of income. DOWDA stated he is certain RAY was not selling amphetamine to other prisoners, stating he has known RAY to give free amphetamine to prisoners who needed a shot. DOWDA denied that he himself had ever taken any shots, but admitted he has taken pills. DOWDA claimed he and RAY were not engaged in the sale of amphetamine at the Missouri State Prison.

DOWDA stated that HAROLD SCHAEFER, Guard on the gate in the kitchen of the Missouri State Prison, was very close to JAMES EARL RAY and it was DOWDA's understanding that SCHAEFER was RAY's source of amphetamine. He stated BENJAMIN O. GOODIN was a civilian in charge of the kitchen and he is certain GOODIN was not connected in any way with the bringing of amphetamine into the prison. He stated while GOODIN was friendly with RAY, he understands it was GOODIN who had disclosed RAY's hiding place when RAY had attempted to escape in 1966.

DOWDA advised one NEIL ABBY (phonetic) was RAY's closest friend in the Missouri State Prison and was responsible for bringing RAY into the kitchen. He stated ABBY at this time was chief cook at the prison. He believes ABBY was serving time for breaking into a drug store and he does not know that dope was connected with ABBY's offense. He stated ABBY had a detainer on him as he was an escapee from the State of Texas. DOWDA does not know whether or not ABBY is presently in custody but does not believe he is presently in the Missouri State Prison.

He stated RAY had another friend, one DONALD DEAN RIGGER. He stated RIGGER was from California and RIGGER's wife was a psychiatrist at the Napa State Hospital, which

is located north of San Francisco, California.

DOWDA advised that RAY and other inmates that might have DOWDA's address would have a Route 1, Sanford, Florida, address, and would not know that he is presently in Marietta, Georgia. He stated his father, STEVEN C. DOWDA, presently resides at 110 South Chandler Street, Deland, Florida, and that anyone inquiring for him at Sanford, Florida, would be sent to Deland, Florida. DOWDA claims he has not been contacted by RAY and has heard nothing to indicate RAY has attempted to contact him. He stated RAY had talked about traveling over all the United States, but had never mentioned anything which would indicate RAY was associated with anyone in the Atlanta, Georgia, area. DOWDA stated the only other prisoner he knew who was from the State of Georgia, who was an inmate at the Missouri State Prison was one JERRY WHITE from Calhoun, Georgia. He advised WHITE had a Federal detainer against him and believes WHITE is still incarcerated at the Missouri State Prison.

DOWDA advised he had made a trip to California in November of 1967, and that he and his wife had spent Thanksgiving Day visiting her uncle, BOB GRAHAM, who resides at Palos Verdes, California. He stated GRAHAM is Regional Manager for IEM in that area. He stated that he and his wife had stopped at Jefferson City and while there, contacted a Missouri State Prison guard, Mr. "PETE" PETRIE. He stated he had not made any inquiry concerning RAY and was not aware that RAY had escaped. He stated he had not made any inquiry concerning inmates inasmuch as his wife did not know he was a former inmate of the Missouri State Prison. He stated he had stopped in the Kansas City, Missouri, area and attempted to locate PAUL ALVIN LAIL, JR., who had been in the Missouri State Prison as PAUL ALVIN CARTER. He stated LAIL had been released approximately a year before he had and that they had agreed to attempt to get together

after their release from prison. He stated LAIL worked in the license shop at the Missouri State Prison and although he was acquainted with RAY, he did not believe LAIL was a particularly good friend of RAY. He stated after his return from California, he was contacted by PAUL ALVIN LAIL, JR. He stated LAIL owns a home at 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, West Palm Beach, Florida, Telephone Number 965-4221. He stated LAIL in February of 1968 was out of a job and had come to Marietta, Georgia, looking for employment. He stated LAIL had come to Marietta, Georgia, with his wife and a small baby and had resided with DOWDA for approximately one and one-half weeks, leaving approximately two or three days after DOWDA was arrested, DOWDA having been arrested on March 4, 1968.

DOWDA advised he could recall nothing else concerning RAY which might assist in his location, but in the event he remembered anything additional, he would contact the FBI.

On 5/2/68 Mr ROBERT E. GRAHAM, 5419 Diversity Drive, Palos Verdes Peninsula, Los Angeles, California, was telephonically contacted by the writer, at which time he advised as follows:

He stated that LEWIE RAYMOND DOWDA married his brother's daughter, and as best he could recall DOWDA and his wife visited the GRAHAM family during the Thanksgiving Holidays, 1967, exact time of their visit as to day they arrived and departed, unrecalled.

He stated that the DOWDAs left the GRAHAM residence, after perhaps a two day visit, enroute to Monterey, California. Approximately a day to a day and a half, they returned, and DOWDA advised that he had lost his wallet in the Monterey, California area. GRAHAM stated that he gave DOWDA sufficient money for him and his wife to return to Atlanta, Georgia, in their Volkswagon.

GRAHAM stated that he could recall nothing further about the DOWDAs visit and that during the evening of 5/2/68, would consult his wife about the visit and would advise the writer the following day of anything pertinent that his wife could remember.

GRAHAM was interviewed at his place of business, 16005 Sheman Way, suite 102, Van Nuys, California, on 5/3/68, by the writer and SA DAVID R. PENDER, at which time GRAHAM advised as follows:

He stated that he had talked with his wife the previous evening, and she reminded him of the following pertinent facts relative to LEWIE RAYMOND DOWDA's visit during the Thanksgiving Season, 1967.

H. advised that the DOWDAs arrived at the GRAHAM residence the day prior to Thanksgiving Day, on 11/28/67, as he recalled. They had Thanksgiving Dinner with the GRAHAMS, and left the GRAHAM Residence at about 4:00 PM Thanksgiving Day to see a friend in Santa Rosa, California, who was working in a hospital in that city. DOWDA was considering seeking employment in the same hospital that this friend, name unrecalled, was working.

GRAHAM stated that after talking to his wife about the visit, that he recalled that it was odd that a man and his wife would drive all the way across country to have Thanksgiving Dinner with a relative, and then leave immediately after the dinner.

GRAHAM stated the DOWDAs returned to the Los Angeles Area on Friday afternoon, 12/1/67, and immediately called him at his office, advising him that DOWDA had lost his wallet while swimming in the Monterey, California.

The DOWDAs left Los Angeles, California, after again visiting the GRAHAMs on Saturday, 12/2/67.

GRAHAM stated that he believed that DOWDA was untruthful with him on several occasions during their visit. He told GRAHAM that he had attended three years college at the University of Missouri, which GRAHAM discounted, because he did not think that the demeanor of one who had attended college. He also told GRAHAM that he was a dietitian, but he had little knowledge about how to prepare foodstuffs and the caloric content of various foods.

GRAHAM stated that he knew DOWDA as Whitie.

He said that the individual that he saw in San Diego, California, on 4/10/68, did not look at all like the individual in the photograph.

Several telephone calls were initiated to locate SHAW through the telephone number that he provided on 4/20/68. It was determined that this telephone number was that of his mother, who does not reside with SHAW.
