On both occasions the Kentucky Sedition Statutes under which the BRADENS were prosecuted were held to be unconstitutional.

CARL BRADEN also served approximately 3 sonths on a year and a day sentence for contempt of Congress. The contempt conviction grew out of his refusal to answer questions before a Congressional investigating committee in 1988.

The BRADENS have been interviewed on one occasion to connection with a civil rights matter in which they had an interest. They were pleasant but CABL SEADEN was obviously untruinful.

any interview with the AMADENS should have sound investigative basis, and it is felt that they should not be interviewed unless they can be quostioned re specific, pertinent matters concerning which they might logically be expected to have beforeation.

If an interview with them gave the impression that they were suspected of being implicated in the assassination of Dr. KING, or that the FMI was engaged in a fishing expedition, they would quickly seize upon the mituation to ridicule and otherwise criticize the PMI for floodering in the investigation.

If there are specific, pertinent matters concerning which the BEADERS should be interviewed in connection with this case, Louisville will conduct such interview.

The TCR-1 is actually completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal, or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves U.S. Currency as follows:

- 1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of U.S. Currency in denominations of \$100 or higher.
- 2. Transactions involving \$10,000 or more of U.S. Currency in any denomination.
- 3. Transactions involving any amount in any denomination, which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the person or organization concerned.

After the TCR-1 Forms are executed they are then sent to the Federal Reserve Banks and their branches who in turn retain them for about one month and at which time they are then sent on to IRS Intelligence Units in the particular area.

In a recent major case (YOUNGNAP) within the Los Angeles Division, the above information became known, and as a result a Confidential Source was developed who furnishes us copies of these forms on a weekly basis. In reviewing the data on such forms it was believed that the information would be of value in investigations relating to Anti-Racketeering, Federal Reserve Act, Bankruptcy, Ascertaining Financial Ability, Fraud Against the Government, Bank Robbery and larceny cases as well as Security type matters.

For the above reason the Los Angeles Division opened a dead file captioned:

"CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS, REPORTS OR PERSONS OR ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED AR"

And copies of all the TCR-1 Forms received since March 3, 1968 have been filed alphabetically in a special indices after they have been indexed to the general office index. These forms are then reviewed periodically for individuals whose name continually reappear for possibly anti-racketeering matters.

For information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Division is currently reviewing the TCR-1 Forms for individuals who may have made a \$10,000 withdrawal of funds and appropriate investigation will be conducted as to each such individual.

The Bureau may wish to have each office contact the IRS Intelligence Units within their division and review copies of these forms for the month of April, 1968. It is believed that this would expidite coverage of the requested lead and cover a larger geographical area.

At approximately twelve noon, 5/19/68, STEVEN CLIMER and a friend, DAVID PARKS, had occasion to be in Cesar's Cocktail Lounge, Tijuana, B.C., Mexico.

CLIMER entered Cesar's Cocktail Lounge by himself and was later joined by DAVID PARKS. Shortly after entering, an individual came in and sat next to him. This individual started aconversation with CLIMER and told him the following concerning himself:

He stated that he was staying in either Chula Vista or San Diego and seemed vague about the area with a Lieutenant JACOBY (phonetic) and that this Lieutenant JACOBY had purchased an airline ticket for him to return somewhere back East.

This individual advised that he took a flight from San Diego, California, to Los Angeles, California, where he cashed in his airline ticket. He then took a Greyhound bus from Los Angeles to San Diego with the idea of returning to Tijuana, B.C., Mexico, to see the bullfights. This individual advised that he also purchased a train ticket to return to somewhere in New York State. This individual showed CLIMER the train ticket and he noted the final destination was New York State and the total price was eighty seven dollars and a few odd cents. This individual also advised that he purchased meal tickets for his train trip back East.

This individual advised that he was going to leave California on Monday evening, 5/20/68.

At this time, this individual advised CLIMER that he needed a place to stay and asked CLIMER if he resided by himself, at which time CLIMER advised that he stayed with his mother and was unable to bring this individual to his house.

CLIMER's friend, PARKS, then entered the bar and observed this individual briefly.

CLIMER and PARKS again returned to Cesar's Cocktail Lounge at approximately 9:30 p.m., 5/19/68, at which time they again saw the same individual at the end of the bar. On this occasion, they had no contact or conversation with him.

On 5/20/68, CLIMER had occasion to view a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY in the Chula Vista newspaper and stated that there was a resemblance between JAMES EARL RAY and the individual he had contact with at Cesar's Cocktail Lounge.

Mr. TOM LOWE, Ticket Agent, Santa Fe Railroad Station, San Diego, California, was contacted and he made inquiry among other ticket agents to determine if the above unknown individual had purchased a ticket recently to the State of New York. None of the ticket agents could recall such an incident and were unable to identify photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

Mr. LOWE advised the fare from San Diego to New York City is \$109.55, one way. The only \$87.00 fare to New York State is Jamestown, New York, for \$87.18. Mr. LOWE also advised that meal tickets pan be purchased to pay for the meals en route to any destination.

On 5/21/68, PAMI Locator, 11th Naval District, was contacted to determine if there are any Lieutenant JACOBYs in the San Diego area, at which time, it was determined that the only Lieutenant JACOBY in the 11th Naval District is Lieutenant ROBERT M. On 5/10/68 the Los Angeles Office received a letter from EDDIE FITZGERALD KANTER, 734 North Breed Street, Los Angeles. The letter was addressed to WESLEY S. GRAPP, Special Agent in Charge, FBI-1340 West Sixth Street, Los Angeles, California. The letter is being placed in 62-0-48022. The letter, which rambled in incoherent phrases, contained in part the statement that "possibly good leads on Ray", "Martin Luther King's killer".

The letter said that KANTER had been to Tijuana. Mexico, in the last 14 days and further said that there will be attempts to kill W. RAPP BROWN and CARMICHAEL next and soon. A review of indices reflects that KANTER is identical with subject of 62-0-48032, who is emotionally unstable individual who has made signed allegations to Washington Field Office (WFO) (www WFO letters to Los Angeles 10/14/66 in 62-0-48022) and to Los Angeles Office on 11/15/66, 11/16/66, and 11/25/66. KANTER has written similar letters alleging attempts on his life, and one written 7/5/67 is in file 62-0-48022.

In view of the fact that KANTER is obviously emotionally unstable and unreliable, he is not being interviewed and no further action is being taken on the letter which he wrote to Los Angeles 5/10/68.
