Re Los Angeles airtel to Director, 5-14-68, transmitting a copy of a letter from ALBERTA LOMAX, editor-publisher of the Lomax Post and Tribune, in which she suggested as "professional leftists who use the Negro cause"... "the BRADENS, the Southern Patriot, 3210 E. Broadway, Louisville, Ky." and "Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), 822 Perdido St., New Orleans, Louisiana."

Referenced airtel suggested that interview of CARL and ANNE BRADEN for any information they might have concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING be considered.

CARL and ANNE BRADEN, Louisville security index subjects, are former CP leaders in Louisville, Ky. and currently head the Louisville based Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), formerly of New Orleans, La., which organization publishes the "Southern Patriot", as its official organ.

SCEF is successor to the NCDA-cited Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) and has long been active in the integration and civil rights fields. Currently, SCEF is active in the so-called "peace movement."

The BRADENS have twice been indicted under Kentucky Sedition Statutes (1954 and 1967). In 1954, CARL BRADEN was convicted and served 8 months of a 15-year sentence before being released on \$40,000 appeal bond. A Bureau informant was largely responsible for the 1954 conviction of BRADEN.

On both occasions the Kentucky Sedition Statutes under which the BRADENS were prosecuted were held to be unconstitutional.

CARL BRADEN also served approximately 3 months on a year and a day sentence for contempt of Congress. The contempt conviction grew out of his refusal to answer questions before a Congressional investigating committee in 1958.

The BRADENS have been interviewed on one occasion in connection with a civil rights matter in which they had an interest. They were pleasant but CARL BRADEN was obviously untruthful.

Any interview with the BRADENS should have sound investigative basis, and it is felt that they should not be interviewed unless they can be questioned re specific, pertinent matters concerning which they might logically be expected to have information.

If an interview with them gave the impression that they were suspected of being implicated in the assassination of Dr. KING, or that the FBI was engaged in a fishing expedition, they would quickly seize upon the situation to ridicule and otherwise criticize the FBI for floundering in the investigation.

If there are specific, pertinent matters concerning which the BRADENS should be interviewed in connection with this case, Louisville will conduct such interview.

Inasmuch as the BRADENS are Security Index subjects, it is felt that Bureau authorization should be obtained prior to conducting such interview.

Rebulet advises that appropriate inquiry should be made at banks to determine identity of individuals making a withdrawal of \$10,000 and over in cash, and confining this inquiry for period of April, 1968. The Bureau advises that the possibility exists that subject was hired assassin and a pay-off could have taken place shortly before or after the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

For information of the Bureau and offices receiving this communication the following is being furnished.

For many years the Intelligence Units of the U.S. Treasury Department have been receiving from the Federal Reserve Banks a form known as the TCR-1 "Report of Currency Transactions; Person or Organization Concerned in Transaction Reported". These forms are used by the Intelligence Units of IRS for purposes of discovering large currency transactions resorted to by racketeers, dealers in narcotics, foreign agents, and others engaged in illegal activities as an attempted method of concealing income.

The TCR-1 is actually completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal, or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves U.S. Currency as follows:

1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of U.S. Currency in denominations of \$100 or higher.
2. Transactions involving \$10,000 or more of U.S. Currency in any denomination.
3. Transactions involving any amount in any denomination, which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the person or organization concerned.

After the TCR-1 Forms are executed they are then sent to the Federal Reserve Banks and their branches who in turn retain them for about one month and at which time they are then sent on to IRS Intelligence Units in the particular area.

In a recent major case (YOUNGNAP) within the Los Angeles Division, the above information became known, and as a result a Confidential Source was developed who furnishes us copies of these forms on a weekly basis. In reviewing the data on such forms it was believed that the information would be of value in investigations relating to Anti-Racketeering, Federal Reserve Act, Bankruptcy, Ascertaining Financial Ability, Fraud Against the Government, Bank Robbery and larceny cases as well as Security type matters.

For the above reason the Los Angeles Division opened a dead file captioned:

"CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS,

And copies of all the TCR-1 Forms received since March 3, 1968 have been filed alphabetically in a special indices after they have been indexed to the general office index. These forms are then reviewed periodically for individuals whose name continually reappear for possibly anti-racketeering matters.

Enclosed for the Bureau and each office receiving this communication is one unexecuted copy of the TCR-1 Form.

For information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Division is currently reviewing the TCR-1 Forms for individuals who may have made a \$10,000 withdrawal of funds and appropriate investigation will be conducted as to each such individual.

The Bureau may wish to have each office contact the IRS Intelligence Units within their division and review copies of these forms for the month of April, 1968. It is believed that this would expedite coverage of the requested lead and cover a larger geographical area.

On 5/20/68, Lieutenant CLIFF REED, National City Police Department, telephonically contacted the San Diego Office and furnished the following information:

REED advised that he had just been contacted by STEVEN CLIMER, age 20, and DAVID PARKS, age 20, of 1138 East 20th Street, National City, California, who advised REED that at twelve noon and again at 9:30 p.m., 5/19/68, they had been talking to a man who resembled JAMES EARL RAY.

The man had been at Cesar's Cocktail Lounge, Tijuana, B.C., Mexico. The man told CLIMER and PARKS that he was staying with a Lieutenant JACOBY (phonetic) in Chula Vista. Lieutenant JACOBY had purchased this individual an airline ticket to someplace back East, but this individual went to Los Angeles, cashed the airline ticket at Los Angeles, and came back to Tijuana for the bullfights.

Lieutenant REED was recontacted by SA ARNOLD W. O'BRIEN on 5/21/68 and advised he had no additional information and that CLIMER seemed to be the individual knowing Unknown Subject better than PARKS.

STEVEN CLIMER, 1138 East 20th Street, National City, California, was contacted by SA O'BRIEN on 5/21/68 and advised as follows:

At approximately twelve noon, 5/19/68, STEVEN CLIMER and a friend, DAVID PARKS, had occasion to be in Cesar's Cocktail Lounge, Tijuana, B.C., Mexico.

CLIMER entered Cesar's Cocktail Lounge by himself and was later joined by DAVID PARKS. Shortly after entering, an individual came in and sat next to him. This individual started a conversation with CLIMER and told him the following concerning himself:

He stated that he was staying in either Chula Vista or San Diego and seemed vague about the area with a Lieutenant JACOBY (phonetic) and that this Lieutenant JACOBY had purchased an airline ticket for him to return somewhere back East.

This individual advised that he took a flight from San Diego, California, to Los Angeles, California, where he cashed in his airline ticket. He then took a Greyhound bus from Los Angeles to San Diego with the idea of returning to Tijuana, B.C., Mexico, to see the bullfights. This individual advised that he also purchased a train ticket to return to somewhere in New York State. This individual showed CLIMER the train ticket and he noted the final destination was New York State and the total price was eighty seven dollars and a few odd cents. This individual also advised that he purchased meal tickets for his train trip back East.

This individual advised that he was going to leave California on Monday evening, 5/20/68.

At this time, this individual advised CLIMER that he needed a place to stay and asked CLIMER if he resided by himself, at which time CLIMER advised that he stayed with his mother and was unable to bring this individual to his house.

CLIMER's friend, PARKS, then entered the bar and observed this individual briefly.

CLIMER and PARKS again returned to Cesar's Cocktail Lounge at approximately 9:30 p.m., 5/19/68, at which time they again saw the same individual at the end of the bar. On this occasion, they had no contact or conversation with him.

On 5/20/68, CLIMER had occasion to view a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY in the Chula Vista newspaper and stated that there was a resemblance between JAMES EARL RAY and the individual he had contact with at Cesar's Cocktail Lounge.

Mr. TOM LOWE, Ticket Agent, Santa Fe Railroad Station, San Diego, California, was contacted and he made inquiry among other ticket agents to determine if the above unknown individual had purchased a ticket recently to the State of New York. None of the ticket agents could recall such an incident and were unable to identify photographs of JAMES EARL RAY.

Mr. LOWE advised the fare from San Diego to New York City is \$109.55, one way. The only \$87.00 fare to New York State is Jamestown, New York, for \$87.18. Mr. LOWE also advised that meal tickets can be purchased to pay for the meals en route to any destination.

On 5/21/68, PAMI Locator, 11th Naval District, was contacted to determine if there are any Lieutenant JACOBYs in the San Diego area, at which time, it was determined that the only Lieutenant JACOBY in the 11th Naval District is Lieutenant ROBERT M. JACOBY, Serial Number 698811, stationed at Point Magu, California.

On 4/22/68, United Airlines Stewardess BARBARA SHRADER, PEGGY KNIGHT, and IRENE CONDIT, were interviewed. Each advised they had worked UAL flight 516 on 4/17/68. They checked photographs of subject and stated they did not recalled seeing anyone who resembled subject. Each stated they had previously viewed photographs of RAY and were on the look out for anyone resembling him. IRENE CONDIT stated she recalled Mrs. CLELAND and also recalls a man who sat next to her. She stated she did not feel he resembled subject.

CHARLES JOSEPH STEIN, 5666 Franklin Avenue, was contacted and advised that when he made the trip to New Orleans, La., with JAMES EARL RAY, in December, 1967, that they drove straight on through to New Orleans, and were not held up in Van Horn, Texas, by the snow storm.

He also advised that a person with the name of JOE WATERMAN is unknown to him, and that he has not been approached by a person of the news media to submit himself to sodim penathol examination. (See Serial 44-1574-1098)

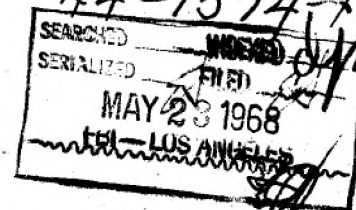

On 5/10/68, the Los Angeles Office received a letter from EDDIE FITZGERALD KANTER, 734 North Breed Street, Los Angeles. The letter was addressed to WESLEY S. GRAPP, Special Agent in Charge, FBI-1340 West Sixth Street, Los Angeles, California. The letter is being placed in 62-0-48022. The letter, which rambled in incoherent phrases, contained in part the statement that "possibly good leads on Ray", "Martin Luther King's killer".

The letter said that KANTER had been to Tijuana, Mexico, in the last 14 days and further said that there will be attempts to kill W. RAPP BROWN and CARMICHAEL next and soon. A review of indices reflects that KANTER is identical with subject of 62-0-48022, who is an emotionally unstable individual who has made signed allegations to Washington Field Office (WFO) (two WFO letters to Los Angeles 10/14/66 in 62-0-48022) and to Los Angeles Office on 11/15/66, 11/16/66, and 11/25/66. KANTER has written similar letters alleging attempts on his life, and one written 7/5/67 is in file 62-0-48022.

In view of the fact that KANTER is obviously emotionally unstable and unreliable, he is not being interviewed and no further action is being taken on the letter which he wrote to Los Angeles 5/10/68.

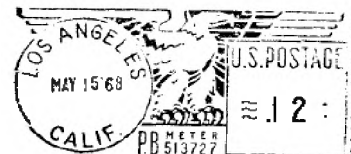
