ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS, MARKS HAS BEEN INTERVIEWED PERSONALLY BY BUREAU AGENTS. IN GENERAL, HE RELATES THESE MATTERS IN A RAMBLING AND INCOHERENT MANNER. HE HAS BECOME ABUSIVE, DEMANDING, AND HAS GIVEN EVIDENCE OF BEING UNSTABLE. OTHER INDIVIDUALS INTERVIEWED ABOUT HIM HAVE DESCRIBED HIM VARIOUSLY AS A "NUT" AND A MENTAL CASE.

HE HAS ON AT LEAST ONE OCCASION TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. AND HAS, AT VARIOUS TIMES, CONTACTED THE U. S. ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA ABOUT THESE SAME MATTERS.

ON OCTOBER SEVEN, SIXTYFOUR, HE WAS ARRESTED BY THE SANTA MONICA, CALIFORNIA POLICE DEPARTMENT AS A RESULT OF FELONY COMPLAINTS FILED AGAINST HIM BY MR. AND MRS. ROSE (SUPRA). ON NOVEMBER THIRTEEN, SIXTYFOUR, HE WAS INTERVIEWED AT THE LOS ANGELES OFFICE AT WHICH TIME HE CLAIMED HIS CIVIL RIGHTS HAD BEEN VIOLATED REPEATEDLY AS A RESULT OF THIS ARREST BY THE SANTA MONICA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND LOS ANGELES COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

CONSIDERABLE BACKGROUND INFORMATION HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN FURNISHED TO THE BUREAU RELATIVE TO JOSEPH M. MARKS. CERTAIN OF THIS INFORMATION IS CONTAINED IN LOS ANGELES AIRTEL TO BUREAU DATED OCTOBER FIFTEEN, SIXTYFOUR, CAPTIONED, "UNSUB; UNKNOWN OFFICERS, SANTA MONICA POLICE DEPARTMENT AND LOS ANGELES COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE; JOSEPH MORRIS MARKS DASH VICTIM DASH CIVIL RIGHTS" (LOS ANGELES FOUR FOUR DASH ONE ZERO THREE ZERO DASH FOUR). IN ADDITION, THIS COMMUNICATION IDENTIFIES FOR THE BUREAU SEVERAL OTHER LOS ANGELES COMMUNICATIONS TO THE BUREAU, ALL CONTAINING ADDITIONAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION RELATING TO MARKS.

ATTEMPTS WERE MADE ON JUNE TWENTYTWO INSTANT TO INTERVIEW MARKS AT HIS BUSINESS ADDRESS, ONE EIGH TWO ONE ZERO SHERMAN WAY, RESEDA, CALIFORNIA, AND ALSO AT RESIDENCE ONE EIGHT FOUR TWO FOUR COLLINS STREET, TARZANA, CALIFORNIA. THESE EFFORTS WERE NEGATIVE.

Writer received call on above date from DAVID LANG, 2178 Roscomare Rd., Bel Aire, California, phone GR 6-5253, who advised as follows:

LANG Stated has acquaintance named ROBERT (BOB) SMEED, last known living at somewhere near Haworth and Fountain, Hollywood, tel# OL 6-1392, who, prior to the assassination of KING, often talked of his hatred for negroes. SMEED also alleged to be president of Los Angeles association known as the "Rhodesian Council" or something to this effect. SMEED also used to state that his mother was associated with the John Birch Society and that they used to live in Toronto, Canada. SMEED also advised that he often made trips to England but that something had happened causing him to lose his passport or visa privileges.

SMEED used to state to the LANGS that that he someday intended to live permanently in Rhodesia.

LANG stated that because of recent occurrences of KING's murder and JAMES EARL RAY being ~~identified~~ identified as the suspect and RAY having been determined to have ~~resided~~ resided in Toronto, England and had intentions of seeking refuge in Rhodesia, LANG thought possibly there may have been some connection between RAY and SMEED and wanted to furnish above info for to FBI.

Re Los Angeles tel to Baltimore and Memphis dated 4/26/68; and Baltimore airtel to Los Angeles which was undated.

Referenced Baltimore airtel set forth information concerning interview with Mrs. STANLEY WHITNEY OLSON (MARGARET STELLA OLSON), residing in a trailer home behind Star-Lite Inn, Pocomoke City, Maryland, with mailing address of Post Office Box 245, Pocomoke City, and having home telephone number (area 301) 957-2337, who furnished information regarding her daughter, KATHERINE PATRICIA OLSON WILLIAR. KATHERINE WILLIAR placed a call to the home of Mrs. OLSON from the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, where JAMES EARL RAY resided.

Investigation at Los Angeles determined that KATHERINE WILLIAR lived for a time with RITA STEIN. RAY made a special trip to New Orleans, Louisiana to pick up STEIN's children and returned them to STEIN's address, 5656 Franklin Avenue, Los Angeles, at which location OLSON was reported to have left subsequent to RAY's trip to New Orleans.

Efforts to locate KATHERINE WILLIAR in Los Angeles through friends and places she was known to have frequented has met with negative results.

Credit and criminal records in the Los Angeles Division were reviewed with negative results concerning KATHERINE PATRICIA OLSON WILLIAR.

On 6/22/68, Don Imhoff, 1044 Appleton Ave, Long Beach, California, telephonically advised that sometime in late March, a man fitting the same general description as the accused assassin of Martin Luther King made a withdrawal of \$50,000 from the Bank of Long Beach, 4201 Long Beach Blvd., Long Beach, California.

Imhoff advised that he works in the Life Circulation in the building of the Bank of Long Beach. He stated that he recalled this because the individual requested the withdrawal in small denominations, \$10 and \$20.

Imhoff stated that he could not positively identify this individual but that because of the large withdrawal he thought that this information might be of some value to the FBI.

Recommended verifying any such large withdrawal from the Long Beach Bank and subsequently identifying the individual mentioned in the transaction.

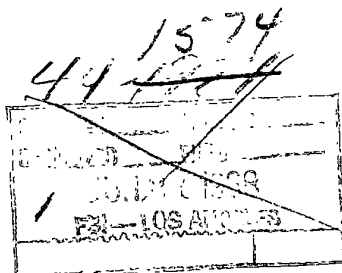

SAC, in accordance with Bureau instructions, did make contact with GENE BROWN, Intelligence Unit, Internal Revenue Service at Memphis. BROWN advised that Federal Reserve Bank Form TCR-1 is used on a very limited basis by banks in the Memphis area. He advised that use of this form was rather common during the war years but there is nothing compulsory about the form and as a result banks are very reluctant to use same. No form had been filed by any bank in the Memphis area for the period from March 15 through April 30 which contained any information of pertinence to this case.

For information of Chicago and Springfield, on 5/17/68, the Los Angeles Times had contact with one BOB (LNU), who said he had information concerning what actually had taken place in connection with the death of Dr. KING. The following is a summary of the allegations made by BOB:

1. The day before the shooting, RAY was picked up in Athens, Alabama, and was taken to Memphis.

2. He registered in a rooming house. Another man registered as SAMUEL LEWIS. LEWIS was supposed to be the backup man and kill KING at the rally that night if RAY missed his chance on the balcony.

3. After shooting KING, RAY walked two or three blocks to the getaway car, accompanied by a girl and a guy. The car was a new blue Buick, with Alabama license plates. The first digits of the license are believed to be one four. The car was owned and driven by EDDIE WILBURN of Huntsville, Alabama. It is equipped with a police radio. The second man stayed overnight and then took an early bus to Knoxville.

4. RAY, two girls and a child were driven from Memphis by WILBURN in the blue Buick. They went to Kansas City and the trip took six and one half hours. The girls, the child, and WILBURN are all from Huntsville, Alabama.

5. In Kansas City, RAY stayed overnight at a home, described as a small gray, shingled, one bedroom house about three miles from central Kansas City.

6. At dusk the next day, 4/5/68, RAY was flown to Belle Glade, Florida in a private plane. The plane took off from a private field, also used as a training field for the military. RAY arrived early 4/6/68.

7. The plane in which RAY was flown is owned by a WILLIAM PIERCE, a wealthy man who owns or operates an airport in Belle Glade, and once owned a contracting company in Cuba. It is not known if PIERCE flew the plane. PIERCE also owns a motel in Belle Glade and cottages in nearby Okeechobee, or maybe on nearby Lake Okeechobee. PIERCE is said to be a Klu Klux Klan member.

8. RAY is believed to have stayed in the motel or in a cottage. He may still be there or in Cuba.

9. On 4/11/68 RAY boarded a yacht, probably a charter boat in Key West, Florida. The boat was owned by BEN THOMPSON. A BEN THOMPSON of Miami owns three fishing boats.

10. PIERCE often flies his own private plane to New Orleans and is supposed to know District Attorney JIM GARRISON.

11. PIERCE and WILBURN are said to be related.

12. WILBURN is possibly a Veterans of Foreign Wars club member in Huntsville, Alabama.

13. The rifle was supposedly left in the furnace of a Memphis rooming house, and is believed still there. This is believed to refer the rifle of the backup man.

14. RAY is now wearing bifocals.

15. The white Mustang belonging to RAY was not in Memphis on the day of the KING slaying, and he did not escape in it. Presumably it never left Georgia in April.

16. On the day of the killing, 4/4/68, RAY made a telephone call from Memphis to Belle Glade and it is believed to have been made from a bus station.

17. In the weeks before the killing, RAY stayed somewhere in Belle Glade, Florida.

18. WILBURN is supposed to have been paid off in Reno. The night before the killing when somebody hit a keno ticket for \$25,000 in Cal-Neva Lodge, which was rigged to pass the money. The rigging was done with the knowledge of CHARLIE CATE, 6880 Pebble Beach Drive, Reno, California, who runs a shift at the Cal-Neva. JACK STRUGIS of St. Louis, who formerly worked in a bar on Second Street, Reno, Nevada, came into a lot of money and allegedly was a contact in this operation also.

19. RAY stayed in the Clark Hotel, Room 700, on 4/17-18/68.

20. LAMONT WHITE, who works for Western Union, Los Angeles, sent money to Louisiana and bought two pistols. The pistols really went to FRANK BRICKLEY of Chatanooga, Tennessee, who was formerly in prison with RAY. BRICKLEY is allegedly in Los Angeles.

21. HAROLD's Cafe, 555 South Main Street, Los Angeles is a "queer" bar where RAY formerly worked and a guy named CONNIE, who works there, allegedly knows RAY.

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22. WILLIE SHEA, who once worked the Top Rail Bar, Seventh and Alvarado Streets, Los Angeles, was allegedly formerly married to RAY. SHEA is from St. Louis and now lives in North Hollywood, California. SHEA's mother lives in Compton, California. SHEA is married and now lives at 812 South Westlake Avenue, Los Angeles, with a man who owns a bar. SHEA is blond, about 38 years of age.

23. A telephone credit card supposedly used by RAY was issued to Ridell Catering, U. S. Rubber Company, Detroit, either in the name of FNU RIDELL or ROBERT BRICKELY. RIDELL reportedly lives in Harper Woods, Michigan. Calls on credit card reportedly made from Memphis to Belle Glade.

24. SAMUEL LEWIS, the second man in the rooming house, was discharged in 1963 from the penitentiary at Milan, Michigan, and previously served time in Chillicothe and Terre Haute. The Los Angeles Times reported the Warden at Milan had no record of LEWIS.

25. LEWIS took a bus from Knoxville to Los Angeles on 4/7/68, and travelled en route through Memphis and El Paso.

26. The house in Kansas City is described as follows: It is located off a main street starting from downtown Kansas City, Missouri, direction unknown, and from the main street a smaller street goes to the left, which street has a Western Union building located on it and goes off from the main street in the form of a steep hill. Two or three miles up the hill on the left are located nice looking apartments, brownish in color, where students from some school live, and just prior to this on the right is the location of a moving company, name unknown, and a grocery store is located in the vicinity of the moving company on the same side. About two blocks beyond the grocery store there is a narrow street with ramshackle houses on one side and vacant lots on the other. Turning right on this street, the third house on the left would be the correct house involved, which is occupied by an individual who sells beer and booze after hours and

hides guys out. The house is described as one bedroom, no garage, dirt driveway, single story, and has a large freezer in the living room.

The information contained above has been checked out and investigation to date has failed to substantiate any of the above allegations. The Los Angeles Times has declined to further identify the source of their information; however, investigation indicates it is probably LESTER EDWARD PACKETT, FBI No. 827-170A. ODELA A. PACKETT, his estranged wife, advised that she believes LESTER has probably returned to Chicago, where he was living earlier this year.

The Bureau has instructed that reasonable effort be expended to locate LESTER EDWARD PACKETT and resolve the above allegations.

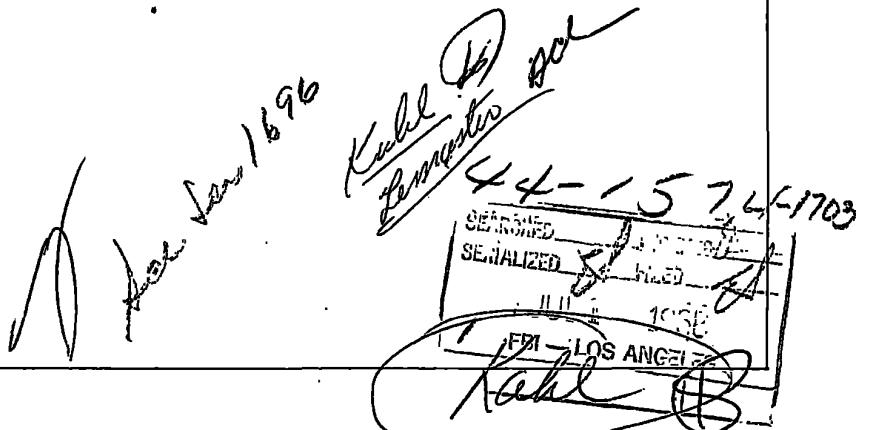

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER

On June 11, 1968, Mr. JOSEPH FORROR, Assistant Postmaster, Main Post Office, San Diego, California, advised as follows:

Found on the incoming mail belt was a piece of paper not in an envelope written in green ink which was addressed to "Post Office Post Master". This note reads as follows:

"If the F.B.I. wants Ray's buddy go to 124 Broadway Metropole Hotel Room 117. He may be under the name Geore Letsinger or George Anderson. He knows about Kennedy and also King's death's. He may have part in Kings death. I know he was in Tenn. before and after King was killed. I know Letsinger is wanted in Seattle. Also in Big Stone Gap, Virginia, by the F.B.I."

On June 12, 1968, information was received from the Seattle Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation, that one GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER, FBI Number 584 742 F, born [redacted] at Macomb, Missouri, was arrested at Jacksonville, Florida, on April 11, 1968, charged with grand larceny having stolen \$550 to \$60 from a restaurant in Seattle, Washington, for which he was employed.

LETSINGER was returned to Seattle, Washington, and on the basis of the charge against him, received a three-year deferred sentence, six months in the county jail and ordered to make restitution.

LETSINGER appealed this sentence and was placed on bond, however, departed the State of Washington and a bench warrant was subsequently issued by the Superior Court, Seattle, Washington.

Information was also furnished that authorities at Seattle, Washington, desired his apprehension and would extradite LETSINGER to Seattle, Washington. Based on this information, the San Diego Police Department arrested GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER at Room 117, Metropole Hotel, 124 Broadway, San Diego, California, on June 12, 1968. At time of arrest, LETSINGER admitted his identity and the fact that he knew he was wanted by the State of Washington.

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER was interviewed by Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at San Diego, California, on June 13, 1968, at which time he advised as follows:

LETSINGER advised that in 1963 he went to England and visited the Russian Embassy, Grovesner Square, London, England, for the purpose of renouncing his United States citizenship.

He was arrested while in England by New Scotland Yard, based upon a check which he had deposited in a bank prior to his departure to England and later determined it was a fraudulent check.

LETSINGER was asked why he desired to renounce his citizenship, to which he replied the country is no longer a country for the white people and is eventually being taken over by the "niggers."

LETSINGER exhibited a strong anti-Negro sentiment and stated that at one time he had been a member of a clan-type organization at Big Stone Gap, Virginia.

LETSINGER was questioned as to his association with JAMES EARL RAY and whether he had any knowledge concerning the assassinations of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and President JOHN F. KENNEDY. LETSINGER merely replied "I do not wish to talk about these subjects."

LETSINGER did say, however, that if Senator TED KENNEDY and Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY continue to seek the Presidency of the United States, they will be assassinated. LETSINGER did not desire to elaborate regarding this information.

GEORGE ROBERT LETSINGER

LETSINGER admitted previous mental history, having been confined during 1961 for a short period of time at St. John's Hospital, Springfield, Missouri.

Handprinting was obtained from LETSINGER and was compared with the note received by the U. S. Post Office, San Diego, California, and because of a close resemblance of these, LETSINGER was asked if he, in fact, had written the note himself.

He categorically denied having written this note.

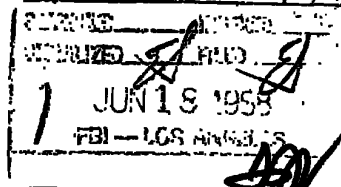

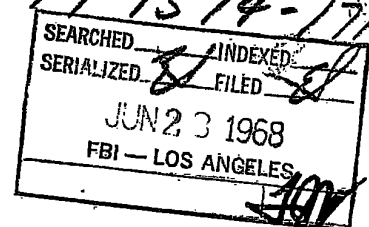

Re memo SA Alfred C. Greiner 5-24-68 re inquiry of persons withdrawing \$10,000 or more in cash during April 1968.

In this regard the following concerns Verna Mae Cornelius, 2640 Grand Av. Huntington Park, Cal. who on 4-30-68 with drew \$10,000 from her savings account at the Bank of America, Hollywood-Ivar Br., 6333 Hollywood Bl, L. A.

Mr. C. L. Trumbly, Manager, and J. E. Johnson, Assistant Cashier of above bank, 6-4-68 identified Cornelius as a former office manager and reported former paramour of J. L. Holtzendorff owner of a detective agency and plant security service at 5343 Sunset Bl., L. A. # 467-9105, recently deceased. He died and his son and daughter took over the business and ousted Cornelius. She has been a customer of the bank for many years and has been known to Trumbly as a customer in excess of ten years. She banked for the above company and had her own savings account. It was a surprise to the bank that she came in and withdrew the large amount on 4-30-68. Trumbly tried to talk her out this action, particularly taking the money in \$100 bills. He stalled her a day or two and had to make special arrangements to get the \$100 bills. She claimed she wanted to get the money out working.

Trumbly is of the opinion the real reason for the withdrawal was that the Internal Revenue Service had been investigating Cornelius. An agent from the IRS intelligence division had been to the bank a several months ago making an inquiry re Cornelius. Trumbly was also surprised that she had a savings account that large. He thought she might be the victim of some confidence game at first but after talking to her and knowing of the interest of IRS, he discounted this possibility. He had no reason to question the activities of Cornelius other than stated above.

L.A. FBI indices negative beyond lead in instant case on Cornelius. Further no record located in the identification records of the LA 50, 6-6-68, per, IC Merton R.
