These forms are completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations, and other financial type institutions then a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves the U.S. Currency in which \$10,000 or more is handled.

In view of this, every office receiving this communication will explore the feasibility of obtaining the information from Internal Revenue Service Intelligence Units within their division. It is very possible that the information requested by the Bureau regarding withdrawals of \$10,000 or more from banks could be more readily obtained through the Internal Revenue Service.

If any discussion ensues at banks or other financial institutions, you should not mention the completion and filing of these forms under any circumstances. This information is for your intelligence only.



Re Los Angeles memo of SA LEONARD M. HALE, 7/1/68, (Re SCHONFELD info concerning DONNA LNU)

On 7/3/68, Miss STEPHANIE ADAMS, Assistant Dean of Women, University of Southern California, Los Angeles, California, advised that in 1968 a girl named DONNA SAPIR, residing at 423 South Rexford Dr., Beverly Hills, had "deactivated" herself from A E Phi Sorority. Miss ADAMS stated that she was the only "DONNA" in the sorority.

On 7/3/68, Miss DONNA SAPIR, 423 South Rexford Dr., Beverly Hills, California, advised that on the Sunday following the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, she drove into a Shell Service Station located at the corner of Olympic and Bundy Dr., West Los Angeles. She advised that she was driving a 1966 Mustang, green in color, and had her lights on in commemeration of Dr. KING. She advised that it was approximately 3:00 PM.

Miss SAPIR stated that an employee of this station made the following statements to her: "Why do you have your lights on? Why are you mourning for that nigger?" She stated that she did not make any statement to this employee, or solicit these remarks in any way. She advised that this employee also made some remark about his having contributed to an organization that killed KING. She advised that she could not remember the exact words used in that remark, but it dealt with a "contribution." She advised that this man spoke in a loud sarcastic tone. She stated that he did not appear to be mentally deranged. She described him as follows: white male, 30-35 years, light brown hair, ruddy complexion, 5'10", medium build, and spoke with a noticeable southern accent.

On 7/5/68, ANDREE BERNARDIN, Owner, Bernardin Brothers Shell Service Station, 11944 West Olympic Blvd., West Los Angeles, advised that he has an employee, named JACK LEE, who does not care for negroes. He advised that LEE is an excellent employee although he has often heard LEE express the sentiments that too many negroes are collecting welfare they are not entitled to receive. He also advised that he heard LEE speak to the above

girl. He advised that prior to the above incident, he heard LEE state that he (LEE) would contribute to pay the costs of the killer's attorney. BERNARDIN advised that LEE has been working for him for about four years, and has not taken any extended period of time off during the past six months. He advised that LEE was working at the station on the day of the KING killing. He also advised that LEE was not serious in his remarks about KING, notwithstanding his general dislike for the negro race. He stated that LEE made these remarks more in a joking sense.

On 7/5/68, JACK LEE was interviewed at the Bernardin Brothers Shell Service Station and was advised by the writer and SA RICHARD J. RAYSA that the reason for the interview was in connection with remarks reportedly made by him on the Sunday immediatly following the death of Dr. KING. LEE read and signed a waiver of rights form prior to being interviewed. LEE stated that he remembers the girl in the green Mustang and the remarks he made to her. He stated that he admits calling Dr. KING a"nigger! He advised he does not like KING because he believes KING has caused many disturbances and riots in this country with his speeches and actions. LEE advised that he did not make any statement that he already did contribute to an organization wanting KING killed. He advised that he said that he would contribute to such an organization, and that he did not say this in a serious manner. LEE advised that he does not belong to any racist or militant organizations. He also advised that he never did, in fact, contribute to any individuals or organizations promoting the death of Dr. KING.

Sgt. GEORGE EDSON, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office, Antelope Valley, California, telephone 805-948-4615 advised this writer of the following information at 1:30 a.m. 5/24/68:

At approximately 3:30 p.m. 5/23/68 an unidentified white male had his 1967 Plymouth Fury, green, California license VRP-778 completely serviced at the Shell Service station located at 7826 East Pear Blossom Highway (Calif. Hwy 138). This station is owned and operated by ED HAVLIK who lives behind the station. This station is located in the municipality of Little Rock, Calif. EDSON advised that he has determined this license is registered to the Chrysler Leasing Corporation, 1207 W. 3d st., L.A., Calif. A Shell credit card was used to pay for the servicing; the name on the receipt was E. B. HOMMER. This unidentified individual inquired about the use of a private pay phone and requested ten dollars in change. He used the phone booth at the Gulf Service station across the street. The telephone number of that booth is 805-944-9140. This white male left the area at about 6:00p.m. 5/23/68. He drove east on Hightay 139.

EDSON advised that the above information was furnished by NETTIE VALENCIA, owner and operator of BUDGE CAFE, 7200 E. Pear Blossom Hwy, Little Rock, telephone 805-944-2214. Her reason for contacting the SO was due to the fact that the unidentified white male bore resemblance to JAMES EARL RAY wanted for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

EDSON could provide no further information, but advised that his office had been unable to contact HAVLIK concerning the unidentified white male, and the degree of his resemblance to RAY.

### OFFICERS OBSERVATIONS:

Upon arrival at the scene ofc. Mayer 12772 observed a female cauc., (Dennino) standing beside the east bedroom window of 5666 Franklin. Ofc. approached the susp and asked her what she was doing. Attached is a copy of the Arrest Repor by the Los Angeles Police Department, Hollywood Division, as reflected on DR 67525038.

On 7/5/68, MARIE MARTIN, aka, advised that she had been arrested with CHARLES JOSEPH STEIN by the Hollywood Division of the Los Angeles Police Department for violation of Section 459 PC (burglary). She advised that subsequent to the arrest, she was released. She stated that the item allegedly burglarized from the Los Angeles School System was a typewriter.

Contact with Lt. THOMAS J. CORNWELL of the Hollywood Division, LAPD, provided the attached Arrest Report.




# PERNELL EZZELL

On June 6, 1968, Mr. FRANK WETZEL, Manager, Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated, 2425 Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

PERNELL EZZELL is a former employee who has been missing about three weeks on this last occasion. He has previously left his job on past occasions and has been taken back. He called WETZEL on the morning of June 6, 1968 from 4:15 a.m. to 5:15 a.m. saying he was in Denver, Colorado. Mr. WETZEL said EZZELL seemed as though he were nervous, crazy or drunk.

EZZELL alleged to WETZEL that he had a great amount of money. He said he had a pile of \$20.00 bills which he had obtained as a result of his part in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and the shooting of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. EZZELL remarked that he had proof he was in Orlando, Florida when KING was shot and he was in Las Vegas when KENNEDY was shot if he were to need it. He alleged he was on the payroll of "CIA" and "OSI". He remarked that he had a "38", a "357", a "30-30" and a "306" type of guns in the trunk of his car. He said he was using a U-Drive-It car in Las Vegas the previous day with the "357" gun on the seat when he was stopped by a deputy. He said the deputy released him when he produced his Associated Detective Agency 44-15 card andhis gun permit which he read the number from as being #92B.

Mr. WETZEL said that EZZELL did not threaten any one during his call or indicate that he intended to do any harm to anyone else.

WETZEL said that EZZELL indicated that he was his only friend in Orlando, Florida and he just wanted to talk to him to find out if he could come back to Orlando.

On June 6, 1968, Mrs. FAY EZZELL, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida furnished the following information.

She advised that she married PERNELL EZZELL on February 25, 1967, this being her third marriage. She said they have one infant by this marriage and she has children by previous marriages. She said that EZZELL has caused her extreme anxiety and debt during their short period of marriage. She said he has deserted her at least three times and he was last seen by her over three weeks ago. said that he had been treated for extreme alcoholism during their short marriage on at least two occasions by Doctor HERBERT COLLINS in Orlando, Florida and she had taken him to the Florida Sanitarium Hospital, Orlando, Florida for the same type treatment. She advised that he has been also treated at the Cherry Hospital for extreme alcoholism but she could not recall the name of the town in which the hospital is She said that she hoped that her husband located. does not return.

Mrs. EZZELL said that PERNELL had called her on June 6, 1968 about 2:00 a.m. and the call lasted until about 3:00 or possibly a little later. She said he stated he was in Denver, Colorado. She said that on one occasion the call was interrupted by an operator who requested that he make a new call for credit charges which he did but the operator did not specifically identify herself as being in Denver, Colorado. EZZELL said that PERNELL had called her on the morning of June 5, 1968 during the early hours saying that he was in Las Vegas, Nevada but she had no way of knowing his actual whereabouts at that time. She said that on both occasions he did not divulge his address or location. She said that in April, 1968, he was drinking heavily and she refused to allow him to come to the house with her children. She said he went to several motels around the Orlando, Florida area and ran up very large bills on credit cards which caused her financial difficulties. She said that on this occasions his drinking was only terminated when she took him to Dr. COLLINS for treatment of She said that the doctor extreme alcoholism. gave him tranquilizers to bring his shaking under control. She said he is a hopeless alcoholic and that when he is drinking he becomes affected mentally. Mrs. EZZELL advised that in the past PERNELL EZZELL when drinking had delusions of grandeur. She said that he would refer to big news stories in the newspapers and try to cause her to believe that he was in some way connected with military service intelligence and he would have to check on these news worthy events.

She said that on several occasions when he was drinking and he had disappeared he would finally call her telling her that he had a large sum of money and that he would buy her all sorts of new presents. She said that on these occasions she found him penniless and drunk in North Florida.

Mrs. EZZELL said that when PERNELL called her on the past two mornings he had not made any allegations involving himself in any assassination plots on Dr. KING or Senator KENNEDY. She said he had not threatened anyone on these occasions except her when she told him she was weeking employment. He said that if she obtained a job he would come by and pick up the baby.

Mrs. EZZELL said that PERNELL did have some sort of a gun which he kept in his car because she would not allow him to bring it into the house. She said he had a permit to carry this gun because he worked as a guard during the night time at Associated Detective Agency, Orlando, Florida. She said he worked in the day time as a television technician for the Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated.

Mrs. EZZELL said that she has been receiving numerous bills from oil companies and American Express credit card which she did not open but forwarded to his mother in North Carolina because she could not pay them. She advised that she feels that her financial situation is so destitute that she will lose her home and furniture because of previous bills made by EZZELL.





On June 6, 1968, Dr. HERBERT COLLINS, 3558 South Orange Avenue, Orlando, Florida. advised that he treated PERNELL EZZELL for about the past couple of years due to extreme alcoholism the last period of treatment being in April. 1968. He said this man is unstable but he did not further describe him.

On June 6, 1968, the files of the Orlando, Florida Police Department furnished by MARIAN HARRISON revealed PERNELL EZZELL was arrested on June 2, 1961 being charged as a public drunk; on Noveber 19, 1961 being charged with driving while intoxicated; and he was picked up on suspicion of auto theft March 9, 1962 at which time he was turned over to the Orange County Sheriff's Office. No photograph or fingerprint records for EZZELL were available.

On June 6, 1968, BERNICE FOGARTY, Orange County Sheriff's Office, Orlando, Florida, Identification Division and Deputy PHILIP MURPHY, Plain Clothes Division, both advised that they could locate no information pertaining to EZZELL in their files.

It is noted that on July 5, 1967, Officer
JAMES WATFORD, Kissimmee, Florida, Police Department, advised
the Tampa Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)
that PERNELL EZZELL had made statements to EZZELL's wife
that he was an agent of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA)
and in this capacity had to make secret trips, leaving his
wife alone for periods of time. WATFORD indicated he knew
of no one else who had been told by EZZELL that he was a
CIA agent, and that there was no evidence EZZELL had obtained
anything of value from anyone other than his wife

On August 4, 1967, a representative of the CIA, Washington, D. C., advised that a check of CIA personnel files failed to disclose any individual named PERNELL EZZELL as being employed by that agency.

On August 28, 1967, Assistant United States Attorney KENDELL WHERRY, Middle District of Florida, was informed of above facts by a Special Agent of the FBI. Mr. WHERRY stated that the facts were insufficient to constitute a violation of the Impersonation Statute, and that he would therefore decline prosecution of EZZELL.

EZZELL SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS IN VIEW OF HIS REPORTED POSSESSION OF A FIREARM, AND SINCE HE WAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS AN ALCOHOLIC WHO BECOMES UNSTABLE WHEN INTOXICATED.

Reference is made to memorandum dated June 11, 1968, captioned as above.

On July 18, 1968, Mr. Emory Dowling, Sr., Owner, Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated, 2425 East Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, advised that the captioned individual had returned to Orlando, Florida. He had taken him back on his job as a technician.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Fay Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, advised that her husband had returned to Orlando, Florida, and she had seen him at the Holiday Inn located on South Orange Blossom Trail, Orlando, Florida. She said he had a gun and he had frightened a bell boy with it when he came to the room with ice. Allegedly her husband was drinking.

Mrs. Fay Ezzell said that her husband had not mentioned being connected with any conspiracy or plot to shoot Dr. Martin Luther King and Senator Robert Kennedy, but she was fearful of him in his condition.

Mrs. Ezzell said she understood she would have to consult either the Orlando, Florida Police Department or the Orange County Sheriff's Office for any personal protection.

On June 13, 1968, Sergeant George Pegues, Orlando Police Department, Orlando, Florida, was advised of the above information furnished on that date by Mrs. Ezzell. It was also furnished to Deputy Sheriff Otis Mosley, Orange County Sheriff's Office, Orlando, Florida, on the same date who said he had Ezzell's presence verified at the motel but the management said they could not locate any bell boy who had encountered Ezzell with a gun. They did locate one who had served him ice but he denied Ezzell had confronted him with a gun.
