Ray Will Be Transferred Into a Federal Prison

WASHINGTON (UPI)— James Earl Ray, confessed assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, will be transferred from the Tennessee State Penitentiary into the federal prison system, the Federal Bureau of Prisons confirmed Friday.

A bureau spokesman said Director Norman A. Carlson had agreed to a request by Tennessee Corrections Commissioner Mark Luttrell that Ray be moved into a federal prison.

Luttrell made the request last week and the spokesman said federal officials were "in the process of drawing up formal paperwork" on the transfer.

Ray filed suit in federal court in Nashville Thursday opposing the transfer

Initial plans call for Ray to be sent to the medical center for federal prisoners in Springfield, Mo., for observation for any health problems for a 60-day period.

Under the terms of the transfer, the state would enter into a contract with the Bureau of Prisons and agree to pay all costs to support Ray during his incarceration.

Government sources said lay was being moved for 'security reasons" but would not elaborate why Ray's safety in the Tennessee maximum security prison at Nashville was in jeopardy.

Ray is serving a 99-year term imposed after he leaded guilty in 1969 to killing of the civil

"The United States District Court is without authority to interfere with the administration of the state penal system in the absence of factual allegations of federal constitutional violations," Morton said.

Ray pleaded guilty in 1969 to the April 4, 1968, rifle slaying of King in Memohis. Since then he has filed several appeals and ther motions in an attempt to rescind his guilty plea and get a new trial.

Ray Seeks Damages, End to Imprisonment

NASHVILLE (UPI) — James Earl Ray, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, Thursday filed a \$500,000 damage suit against Tennessee officials, claiming he was being confined in "oppressive" conditions for a crime he did not commit.

The suit, one of many legal actions taken by Ray since his guilty plea in the 1968 assassination, drew special attention when a local television station quoted sources Wednesday night as saying it would contend others were involved in the Memphis slaying of the civil rights leader.

But the only hint of conspiracy mentioned in the suit concerned two Louisiana telephone numbers. Ray claimed his former attorney, Percy Foreman of Houston, had mishandled information about the phone numbers.

Ray, who drafted the suit in his solitary confinement cell in state prison here, said he gave the two phone numbers to Foreman, who in turn gave them to a Z. T. Osborn, whom Ray described






