officers pulled in front of the two white nales as the entered the Buick autoribile, observing that Maenza Entered the vehicle on the driver's side and was seated believe the steering wheel, while Trouard entered on the passenger side. Questlening the two mon, they identified themselves as above stated. When questioned about the activities going on within the residence from which they just came, Maenza told the officers that he and his friend Trouard, had just brought their dates home, and that they were preparing to go home themselves.

However, as the officers were questioning there two men, another white male, who later identified himself as Julius Louis Wallfarth, age 33, reciding 5745 Wilton Drive, came running up, and in an excited voice, asked Maenza and Trouard how much morey they had spent in the house. Before they could answer, Wollfarth blurted out that he had spent \$35.00 and had gotten two blow jobs. This occurred at approximately 12:30 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962, and it was at this point that the officers again identified themeselves to Wollfarth, and directed all three to return to the residence to assist the officers in gaining entry in order to conclude the investigation.

The undersigned officer and Fatrolian James Tyler accompanied the three men to the front door of the residence, while Patrolian James Whyte summoned Fatrolian Van Flynn, Grover Chamingham and John Sahuqua to meet them at the residence. Officer Whyte Immediately re-joined one undersigned and Officer Tyler as they reached the docrany of 2119½ Dauphine Street, upon which Haenza knocked twice with his fist. As he knocked, Haenza colled out the name of "Mickey", and a female voice from within the room inquired, Taho is 1191 Then Haenza replaied, "Dominick", Mickey (Hessina) opened the door, Whereupon the three men and the three officers entered.

It was noted that the time was about 12:35 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962 when the officers entered the residence at 21199 Bauphine Street. Officers Flynn, Junningham and Sahuque reached the residence about two minutes later, whereupon all persons in the residence were asked to identify themselves.

The five white females on the premises identified themselves as

follows:

- 1. Harie Milson (alias Mickey Hessina) age 30, 7813 Lucerne St.
- 2. Louise Irman, Age 37, 1337 Leonidas Street
- 3. Lynn D. Gonzales, alias Rose Delong, age 22, 1331 St. Roch Ave.
- 4. Lydia C. Chaisson, al ias Lydia Oropeza, age 18, 506 S. Rocheblave St.
- 5. Betty Ann Haddox, age 27, 3045 Dauphine Strect.

Each of the women were questioned as to which one of them resided in the residence, each denied living there, or paying rent for the premises. When asked what they were doing in the residence, none would reply. None of the women would give any explanation to the officers regarding their activities nor would they answer any other questions propounded. In didition to Haenza, Incount, and Wollfarth, who were returned to the residence with the investigating officers, three other white cales were found on the presises when the officers entered. These were identified as follows:

- k. Salvatore G. Baglio, age 35, 6730 Dorian Street.
- 2. Peter J. Schafant, Jr., age 20, 1301 N. Caudeway Blvd., Actairia.
- 3. Ferdimend H. Cerruti, age 31, 369 Navarre Avenue.

It was explained to the mon present in the residence that the investigating officers had maintained their curveillance for more than own hours, and that during this time, note, except had not had left the precises, and that Haenna was observed as he returned investigately after gotting a package of digarettes. They were asked to explain that they were doing in the house for the more than two hours during which no one was seen to leave.

Hacara was first to admit that they had come to the residence to see a stag show, and that the woman maned Mickey charged them ten dollars as they entered. Soplio acrosborated this information furnished by Macana, and these two men talked the Others into supersting with the officers in their investigation. In verbal statements residened on the scene of the Investigation, the men, when questioned, stated the following:

- 1. Raglio pointed to Louise Roman and told the officers that she had performed a crime against nature upon his person, as well as on two of the other man.
- 2. Trueard stated he had sexual intercourse with Lydia Chaisson after he had given her ten dollars. Later, he sawe listly Maddox ten dollars and had sexual relabions with her.
- 3. Maenza told the officers that Louise Irman performed a crime against nature on his person, and on other men present.
- 4. Wollfarth stated he had relations with Lydia Chaisson and that Lynn Consales had performed a crime against nature on his person.
- 5. Schafani and Cerruti denied having relations with any of the women, but confirmed that they had witnessed Louise Irman perform a crime against nature on the person of Mickey Messira.

When confronted with the foregoing verbal statements, the women denied having relations with any of the men, and stated they were just having a party. They were adviced that they were under arrest, and after summoning a patrol wagen from the Fifth District Police Station, the women were transported there and booked as hereinbefore stated.

The six men agreed to make written statements encerning the activities which went on at the stag show, and were transported in their private vehicles to the office of the Headquarters Special (Vice) Squad where they dictated and signed the following statements.

"My rame is Salvators G. Geglio, and I live at 6730 Borian Street. Puring the week of Honday, April 9, 1962 through Saturday, April 14, 1962 the runor was round the store where I work, at Professional Tharmacy, AAAC Magnelia Street, that there was going to be a stag show somewhere in them on Priday night, April 13, 1962. I overheard a couple of fellows talking about this stag show.

A friend of mine finally found out where the stag show was going to be held and when, and he told me. At about 5:15 Fh on Friday, April 13, 1962, I wet this friend of mine at the FCAC, and he told me the stag show was going to be held in the 200 block of Daughine Street. I drove down there with him and got there at about 9:00 FM, and just went into the house.

My friend and I just sat around for a while, and the girls put on an act. There were four girls in the place and they took all their clothes off. One of the girls, a Chinese-locking girl, was in her alip and bra. They were all nude, and a red-

haired woman by the name of Louise

She also while I

was there. By I mean the woman gave
me and the other men that is, she

We were not charged anything for but we had to pay ten dellare to get in the place. We gave the ten dellars to Mickey at the door, as we went in. I was there about 45 minutes, and I left to go see another friend of mine. I came back at about 12:25 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962 to give my friend Ferd the keys to his car. I was there about five minutes when the police walked in and took all the women to jail.

The foregoing statement was dictated by Salvatore Gaglie to the undersigned officer and was completed at about 1:50 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962, and was witnessed by Fatrolain James Whyte.

The following statement was distated to the undersigned officer by william Paul Trought, and was taken at 2:47 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962 in the office of the Fear Lanters Special (Vice) Squad, and willessed by Patrolean Jones Whyte.

"My name is William Paul Trouard and I live at 3433 Havana Street. I work for myself, and wish my father in real estate. On Friday, April 13, 1962 at about 6:15 FM, my friend, Dominick Faenza, called me and asked me if I wanted to go to a stag show. He talked me into going with him. We picked he up at my house at about 8:00 FM. At the same time, my friend, Julius, came over at about the same time Dominick arrived, and I was sleeping at the time. I got up, got dressed, and told Julius to come with us. Dominick took us toward the place and told us the show would not be until 2:30 or 9:00 TM.

While driving toward the place, we told Julius where we were going and he said okay. We arrived there about 8:30 or 8:45 FM. I noticed that the place was around a playground, but I didn't know the name of the street. We saw Fickey's car, and we pulled in behind it. She took us to the house and we went inside with Mickey and four other girls. After we got in, Dominick gave the girl, Mickey, ten dollars for me and ten dollars for himself, and ten dollars for Julius. As we walked in, some other men showed up and they came in too, and Mickey collected ten dollars from them also. Mickey loft to go get some beer at about 9:15 FM.

We went in the next room to the front room, and the red haired girl named Louise invited Dominick into the room and not him or the hed.

Then

Louise took all of her clothes off

I got to talking with the girl named lee and she wanted ten dollars to the ten and

Hickey care back stout 10:45 PH and she and the girl Louise got together, and Louise ate Mickey's pussy. I also with a girl named Botty, a dark haired girl, heavy est, about 5:7% tall. I cave her ten dollars before I

When I got finished I was ready to go home. While in the house, I saw a little Chinese-torking wirl blow Julius. I also saw the red haired woman parlier, but when they got finished, they left."

Posinich Hacoma rendered the following signed statement, dictating his version of the happenings in the residence at 2119 Daughine Street to the undersigned officer at 2:25 AM on Saturday, April 14, 1962.

"My rame is Pominion loonga Hachan and I live at 2919 Grand Route St. John. I am employed at Vincent Machan Eanans Company located at #55 - #57 French Market Flace.

I called dickey at 282-1586 and 288-3701 last night just before 6:00 fill on Friday, April 13, 1962, and before I could say anything, she told me she was joing to have a stag show tonight. She told me to call back about 7:30 FM and she was id give me the address. I get hold of my buddy, Billy, and Julius, who was at Billy's house, after I called Mickey back, and the told me the address of the stag show would be at 2119 Dauphine Street.

I called my friend Billy and told him I would fick him up at about 7:45 PM, and I would him I was going to a stag show and I asked him if he wanted to come along, and he said all right. At about 7:45 PM I want to pick Billy up at his bouse, and Billy's wife and a friend of his by the name of Julius were there. He was sleeping at the time, and Julius was locking at TV. Julius asked us where we were going and I told him we were going to Jefferson Downs. He said he would come with us. When we got in my car, I told Julius we weren't going to Jefferson Downs, but that we were going to a stag show. He raised hell with us and didn't want to go, but he was citting in the middle between me and Billy, and we took him along with us.

We drove to the address at 2119 Dauphine Street, and we saw Mickey there. She told us to park the car and follow her into the house. There were three other girls besides Vickey in the house, and Mickey went out to buy some teer, but before she left she told the girls to go right on with the show, that she would be tack in 30 or 45 minutes. She also charged us each \$10.00 to get in to see the show.

After Mickey left, three other fellows came in and they sat around while the women put on the show. Two of them got untrasced and started playing around with the fellows, tenently their penis, and whom no one would make a nave, I got untrasced and one of the warran went down or me.

This was a red haired woman by the name of Louise.

A young girl by the name of two took a young fellow into the next rame and haired woman fellow having with las, the young roman.

The woman and he left right after that.

She then another follow while I was there.

Rilly had with Lee, and Julius also lee. When we got finished, we went mext door to use the pheno to try to call Miskey to tell her we didn't like the show.

The red haired girl called 298-3701 and talked to a man and asked where was blokey. He didn't know where she was and said he would try to get in touch with her and have her come to the place. We want back in the roos next door to the stag elow, and that's when Betty got out of a tend cab and went into the house at 21192 Daughire Street.

Betty just sat down because she said she didn't know anyone and had just came here from out of town. That's when Mickey wakked in, and hickey and the red haired woman named Louise put on a show. The red haired woman Nickey after Mickey took all of her clothes off. We all watched as Louise lickey's when Louise had finished, they got drashed. Then the Chinese-looking girl Julius.

Estty and Billy went into the next room and they

When that was over with,

Kickey wanted everybody to put up two dollars apiece
to have another show. There were five of us men in the
room at the time. The Chinese girl wanted

Lee, but when we didn't put up the two dolars each,
they wouldn't put on the show.

I went outside to get a pack of digarettes, and after I came back I stayed a little while and then decided to leave. I left with Billy. Julius was drinking a beer and sitting on a sofa, and I thought he was right behind us because he was dressed and ready to go home. Billy and I walked to my car and that's when the police storyed us and asked us what was going on in that place.

Then Julius came running up and asked up how much we had spent, and said he had spent \$30.00 in the place. The police were talking to up at the time, and Julius said he police told us all to go with them back to the house at 2119 Except ine Street.

When we got to the house, I knocked on the door and asked for Hickey. A voice from inside asked who it was, and I told her Dominick. She opened the door and the police walked in and errested the waman."

The above statement by Dominick has nze was dictated to the undersagned officer in the presence of habrolman James Whyte.

Julius Hollfarth rendered the following statement concerning the activities in the stag show at 21172 Daughine Street.

"My name is Julius Louis Wollfarth and I live at 5745 Wilton Dr. I am employed as an insurance salesmen for Union National, 14102 h. Empid Avenue."

At about 7:15 PM on Friday, April 13, 1962, I went to my friend Billy's Louse on Ravana Street, and at about 7:45 PM, Dominick Mienza arrived and they tild me they were going to the race truck and asked me if I wanted to go with them. We got in the car, and then they teld me they were going to a stag show.

At about \$130 PM we drove around the place where the stag show was going to be held a mi when we saw a girl by the name of Mickey with some other girls, she parked her car and Dominick parked his car behind her. When she got cut with the other girls and went in the house, we followed her. They introduced themselves, and said they had more fellows coming, and Mickey said she would go and get some beer. Dominick gave Mickey \$30.00. She left to get the beer.

The red haired woman named Louise took her clothes off and she began to entice the fellows

Dominick went over to where she was on the

The little red head named Lee wanted to go with me, so
I gave her ten dollars and Mickey came
in later with some beer and I drank a beer or two and
then later on the red baired woman named Louise

We went best to the house with the officers and luminisk knowed on the door and asked for hickey. Then like y opened the door, the police west in and air stad thous.

The above statement was dictated to the undersigned officer, in the presence of Patrolman James Whyte, in the office of the Eradquarters Special (Vice) Equal, and was completed at Fall All on Estaday, April 14, 1908.

Feter J. Schafami, Jr., MMID, residing 1001 N. Caucevay 11vd., Metairie, a gloyed by nic father at Restaurant Schafami rocated at 1101 N. Cauceway 11vd., Petairie, dictal of the following statement to the undersigned officer, in the pressure of Patrolpan James Whyte.

"A few says ago, I heard a rumor about a stag show that was going to be held somewhere. My friend, Ferd Cerruti found out where the show was going to be held on Friday, April 13, 1962, At about 8:15 or 3:30 PM on Friday, April 13, 1962, Ferd and I left the restaurant together and he drove to Flysian Fields Avenue and parked by a park. We walked over to the lower and ment in. We sat around for a while and the show was hard to get started because nobody wanted to do anything. Finally, one of the guys want with a red haired woman and

The small red haired mirl named Lee was naked and she wanted

I gave Fickey ten dollars to get in the place, and I only had five dolars left. Actually, I just wanted to see what it was all about. Then

the red haired girl named Lee.

Then the old red baired woman named Louise

Fickey came back at about 10:00 PM and
we sat around for a long time. Then a black haired

The following statement was lictated to the undersigned officer by Ferdirand F. Cercuti, EM31, residing 369 haverre avenue, in the office of the Headquarters Special (Vice) Equad, and was completed at 4:54 AV on Baturday, April 14, 1962. This statement was witnessed by Petrolmen James Tyler and James Whyte.

"My name is Ferdinand H. Cerruti and I live at 869 Mavarre Ave. I work at Rostaurant Schafani, 1301 N. Causeway Elvd., Hetairie.

last weekend, on Saturday, April 7, 1962, I was in the Swarp Room or Canal Street, and I heard about a stag show that Mickey was going to put on during the coming week. A fellow I know by the name of Joe told as about the stag show. I knew Mickey because I went to one of her stag shows before, about a year ago, which she held at the Continental Ricci on Dakin Street in Jefferson Parish.

I called her on several occasions at the telsphone number 282-1566 to get fixed up with a girl. I met different girls each tire, and I paid her, each girl I would date, \$15.00 with me. A courle of \$15.00 with me. A could of times when I would call time number, a fellow by the name of Charlie would answer the phone, and I would tell him that I wanted a girl, and he would call Mickey to the phone. On one occasion, I remember I called and Mickey wasn't there, and Charlie told me where to go to meet the girl. One time I went to an apartment house on Josephine Street, right near Commander's Falace. It was the first apartment on the right hand side as you entered the building on the ground floor. On the occasion I talked to Charlie, whom Mickey wasn't there, he told me to go to a hotel on Foydras Street, right off St. Charles. I remember I had to go upstairs to a room all the way in the back, and it was in the second room from the back, on the right hand side. I don't revember the girl's name,

but she was a nice looking girl, with black bair, about 16 or 19 mars of age, well built. She charged me \$15.00 for her room.

I called Mickey at the tele, home number 282-1586 on Twesday, April 10, 1362 or Wednesday, April 11, 1362, and asked her about the stag show she was going to put on. The told me it would be Friday, April 13, 1962, but that I would have to call lack to find cut whereit was going to be held. I called back during the afternoon of Friday, April 13, 1962, and she told me at first that it was going to be called off, but then she said it was not really called off, but that the girls weren't in the mood. She told me to call back in a caupie of hours and she would let ac know for sure. I called back a few hours later and she told me the mich was going to be held about 8:30 PK, and she gave me the address as 2119 Dauphino Street.

At about 2:30 PM, I went there with my fri and Fete Schafami and there were three girls already there. Mickey was there, Lee, a nice looking red head girl, young, and a thin. small black-haired Chinese-looking girl. After a few minutes of conversation, I gave Mickey ten dollars and my friend-Pete also gave her ten dollars.

A few minutes later, an old red Laired woman named Louise came in. At this time, Mickey said she was going to get some beer and digarettes, and she had to go to her house cut at Echwegmann's on the highway, and said she would be back in about 20 minutes. She told the other woman go shead and start the show, and that she wouldn't be too long.

The red haired woman named Louise started to take her clothes off, and a little while later, the other women also removed their clothing. They finally got a fellow to get on the rattress they had jut on the floor in the middle of the second room, and the red haired woman named Louise

The Lee went over for a few seconds and kissed the man on his chest. Then she got up and valked away while Louise stayed with theran and finished the job.

Louise went over to some other guy and gave him and then he left. She also Sal Gaglio and Pete Sclafani.

I se wont in the front room where

with a young fellow, and he left after

Then a tall fellow wearing glasses also with Lee.

Setby came in and talked for a while wal thus went to bed with the tall fellow with the glasses called Billy.

The little Chinese broad the follow with the lad eye and who wore glasses.

Mickey case lask and after talking for a while, she and the red head woman maded Louise took off their clothes and levan to out on a show for us. The red haired woman lickey,

Three of the follows, Filly, the guy with the bad eye, and the Italian fellow said they had to leave. A few minutes after they last, we heard a knock on the dwor, and Mickey said, "Milo is 12", and a male write answered, "Dominick". She opened the door and the police cause in and arrested the women.

I didn't have relations with any of the women because I didn't have any money after I paid the ten deliars to Hickey to see the show."

When verbal statements of Maenza and Cerruti indicated that they had made previous telephone calls to Mickey Messina at the telephone numbers 282-1586 and 283-3701, this information coincided with a previous investigation conducted by the undersigned officer wherein it was established that these telephone numbers were servicing a residence at 4101 Stephen Glaurd in the Gentilly Woods residential area. This investigation, which was conducted and finally reported under NGPD Item Number 6-652-fit, coordinated with the officers of the Department's Marcotics Equad, resulted in the arrest of the Messina account and Charles J. Stein on charges of narcotics possession and possession of stolen property.

According to Cerruti's statement, he had made frequent calls to the telephone number 282-1525 to arrange to nest various women for purposes of prostitution, the said arrangements being handled by Mickey. Cerruti also recalled speaking to a man at this telephone number, whose he identified as Charlie, and who on one occasion, told him where to go to meet a woman.

Upon learning this, Patrolmon Van Flynn, Grover Cunninghon, and John Sahuque were dispatched to the residence at 4101 Stephen Girard to apprehend Charles Stein in connection with the present investigation. These

officers rejorted by beliephone that they had checked the residence and found not one at hime. They were directed to check at the Fifth District Police Station, and then if Stein was not family there, to check some of the night clube Stein was known to frequent. The officers rejorted by telephone a few minutes later that they had found Stein in the Fifth District Police Station arranging for the release of the women who had been arrested earlier from 21192 Doughline Street. Stein was arrested at this point, and was booked as hereinbefore stated.

During the afternoon of Saturday, April 14, 1962, the undersigned officer received a telephone call from Patrolman Arnoli Ricey, assigned to the Detective Furnau, who advised that he had information that a warrant was outstanding for Betty Maddox as a figitive from Tangipahoa Parish. Officer Risey advised that he had placed a "FORTIVE FORD" on the haddox women pending arrival of police authorities from that Farish. On Wednesday, April 16, 1962, the following report was received from Officers Joseph Vitari and Arnold Risey, and is quoted hereinbelow and node part of this report.

Fratroleen Joseph Mitted and Anneli Risey report of receiving orders at 2:00 Mt, April 14, 1962 to go to the Fifth District and question a white female, one Betty Faddox AF27 yrs, residing 3045 Dauphine Street, who was arrested with some other white females and two white rales after the Vice Squad raided a sex party at 2119½ Dauphine Street. Through checking it was learned that there was a stopper in the Eureau of Identification in Betty Maddox's police jacket stating that she was wanted as a Fegitive from Justice from Mobile, Alabama, and Livingston Parish, Ia. This stopper was put on her in March 1961 by Pins. Vitari and Risey. For full particulars on this arrest by the Vice Squad, one white paper report made under item D-5829-62.

Officers questioned Batty Maddox whose real-name is Elizabeth Ethel Maddox, and she said she is not wanted in Mobile, Alabama, and she was licked up once before for Livingston Parish, La., and theck out all right there. Officers sent telegrams at 7:30 M. April 14, 1962 to Mobile, Alabama, and also to Livingston Parish, La., notifying them of Betty Maddox's arrest and to learn if the is wanted. Officers received an answer from Mobile, Alabama stating that Beity Maidox is not wanted by their Department. Also received a telegram from Sheriff Taft Faust stating that Petty Maddox is wanted by his Department. Elizabeth Ithel Haldox, alias Betty Maddox, was rebooked at the Fifth District as a Fugitive from Justice from Livingston Parish, La. et 3:40 PM, April 16, 1952. Betty Maddox was turned over to Deputies Ponald Hoover and Cawald Johnson of Tangipahoa Parish, Arrest Book so rorked."

A recapitulation of offenses committed within the premises thering functiful humber 2019) Dauphine Street on the evening of Friday, April 13, 1362 through Caturday noming, April 14, 1362, between the hours of 5:30 If on April 13th, and 12:35 AM on the 14th of April, according to the signed statements quoted hereinbefore, is as follows:

- 1. Mickey Messina, with allaces, engaged in abnormal sexual relations with Louise Incen; was in charge of putting on the sex show, collecting two delices from each male who entered; falsified Department records by causing incorrect information portaining to her residence to be entered in the Arrest book of Record. She was also responsible, with Charles Stein, for organizing the stag show. Our 3 of I #67731.
- 2. Lydia Chaisson, alias Lydia Secelia Gropeza, alias "Lee" our B of I \$105-826 performed an act of prostitution with an unidentified white male who left the premises before police arrived; performed an act of prostitution with William Trought; performed a crime against nature with Fulliam Trought; performed a crime against nature with Julius Hollfarth.
- 3. Lynn D. Gonzales, alias Bose DeLorg, alias Bose Sedillo, alias Roslyn Diane Sedillo. our B of I #82135, elso referred to in foregoing statements as the "Uninese-locking girl", performed crime against nature with Julius Wollfarth, and crime against nature with Poter Schafani, Jr.
- 4. Louise Inman, our E of I #107-686 performed crimes against tature on Ioxinick Maenza, Salvatore Gaglio, Pater Sclafani, and Mickey Messina. The also committed crimes against nature on at least two other white males who left the premises before arrival of investigating officers.
- 5. Betty Maddox, alias Elizabeth Ethel Maddox, our B of I #59708 performed an act of prostitution with Milliam Troward. (She was returned on Pupitive Marrant to authorities of Tenginahoa Farish).

Charles Stein, our B of I #65122, resided with the Messira woman at 4101 Stephen Girard since July 1961, and was familiarly known as Mickey's "cld man", having worked closely with her in the operation of a prostitution racket from their residence situated in an otherwise respectable neighborhood in the Bentilly Woods subdivision, sharing with her the procesds from these illegal activities.

The fact that Charles Stein was arrosted at the Fifth District Police Station while attempting to gain the release of the Messian woman, and others arrested in the raid at 2019; Daupline Street, lends tacit support to the fact that Stein was not only familiar with the operation of the stag show, but was implicated and ausociated with the Pausina woman in itr organication as well.

After sitting in the bedroom for about ten minutes the phone rang and was answered by Medina who said, "You got three guys, O.K., how much do they want to spend?, \$20.00 a piece, O.K., I'll call you back." Medina then hung up the phone and consulted a pad that was lying on a table beside the bed. Then she began calling various numbers and asking for girls at each of the numbers she called. When she had no luck reaching any girls, she began calling and asking for "Charlie." When she was unable to locate "Charlie, she became very excited and began cursing him, saying, "That dirty M----R F----R, he ain't playing cards, he's out F-----G his society where." "Well, I'm not going to take any more of his S--T."

After a few minutes, Medina entered the bedroom and told her mother, "Gurlie will bring you home and I'll see you tomorrow." She then told Officer Mahoney, "You go with them, I got something to do."

Officer Mahoney then went outside with the white male informer, Charles Stien and Mrs. Medina.

Upon arriving there and entering the premises, Stien told Officer Mahoney to take a seat on the sofa and he, Stien, and the white male informer went into the bedroom and began talking to Medina. Relative to the foregoing arrests, the understaned officer received information on April 26, 1961, that Marcades Midraus Mickey Medina, (Our B of I No. 67331) had moved into a residence at 4101 Stephen Girard Street in Gentilly Moods. In was further 1-arned at this time that there was unusual amount of traffic to this residence, some of the vistors being known to investigating officers as narcotics users.

These suspicions brought about a further investigation in which it was learned that the property at 4101 Stephen Girard Street was purchased by Mercedes Medina on April 14, 1961, the said information registered in 008 NC. 628/286, notarized by Sidney K. Fate, recorded in MOB NO. 1988/474.

Upon questioning the Medina woman about the marajuna digarette retrieved from the sewer, she denied having made a stooping motion as she went out to the cab driver, and denied further that she had no knowledge of how the digarette got there.

Buring the search of the premises, narcotics officers found a quantity of white tablets and pink and brown capsules wrapped in tin-foil. These items were later submitted to the City Chemist and after being checked no presence of narcotics were found in the pills.

The two rings listed above were found contealed in a cotton swab box in the bath room by Officer Comstock. Charles Stein and the Medina woman when questioned about the hidden rings both stated that they knew nothing about the rings, that oney did not own them and did not know now the rings got in the box. Both denied owning these items.

When questioned about other items confiscated from the premises, neither Stein or the Medina woman could produced any written receipts showing purchase or ownership of these articles.

Continuing their search of the premises, the investigating officers found a number of photographs of the Medina woman in the nude, and one photograph of a nude white male.

Angeline Joseph, the colored maid, told the officers that she had been working for the Medina woman for about two weeks and stated that she knew nothing about stolen property or narcotics.

The three were transported to the Third District Police Station where they were booked as hereinabove stated.

At this writing, the Medina woman is free on bond while Stein and the Joseph woman are still held in the Third District Folice Station.

Investigating Officers are still checking out the property listed herein, but at this time efforts to locate proper owners, and efforts to extablish positively whether or not this is stolen property, have been to no avail. Information developed establishing these facts will be submitted in a supplementary report.

The Office of the Honorable District Attorney to be consulted at this time so that Charles Stein and Angelina Joseph may be avail the opportunity of securing their release from custody.

On Friday, July 14, 1961, Mercedes Miorano, with alias Mickey Mescina, alias Marie Milson and others, M730, residing 4101 otephen Girard Street, Angelina Joseph, C737, residing 1237 Korlerec Street and Charles J. Stein, WM DETAILS 32, residing 4101 Stephen Girard Street were arrested from 4101 Stephen Girard Street, after officers of the Headquarters Special (Vice) Squad and Narcotics Squad had conducted an investigation and secured a Search Warrant which subsequently resulted in the arrest of the three aforementioned subjects, the full details of which is reported under Item No. G-0524-61.

On Thursday, July 20, 1961, the Office of the Honorable District Attorney was consulted in this matter and Assistant District Attorney Edward A. Estalotte refused the charges due to insufficient evidence.

It was noted at the time that the investigating officers were serving this search warrant that a Checker Cab No. 1462 was parked in front of 4101 Stephen Girard Street with an unknown white male behind the steering wheel. presumably the driver.

It was learned later, while the officers were conducting their search of the residence that Mercedes Miorano had left the residence and was observed handing the cab driver a package.

On Monday, July 17, 1961, Officers of the Headquarters Special Squad went to the Checker Cab Co., where it was learned that one Dominick Attardo, MM49, residing at 1423 Marigny Street was the retular driver of Cab No. 1462.

Officer then went to Attarda's residence and asked him if he had been to 4101 Stephen Girard Street on July 14, 1961. Attardo stated that he had. On Thereday, July 20, 1961, Officers Van Flynn and John Jahugue went back to the Thecker Tab Do., for further investigation on Attario, where it was further learned that a white female had called the Checker Cab Co. on July 19, 1961 and stated that she lived at 4101 Stephen Girard Street and that she was trying to contact the driver of Checker Cab Do. 1462, as she had given him some cooks to hold for her.

With this information Officers out a broadcast for the arrest of Dominick Attardo and also secured a learch sarrant for his residence. Officers at this time felt that it was possible that heredes Mioranao had handed Attardo narcotics when he was at her residence and also since she had been backed with narcotics violations.

While Officers Flynn and Sanuque were still at the Cab Company Attardo entered same, whereupon he was arrested. A search of Attardo's residence by Officera Flynn, Schuque, Altobello and Cunningnam proved to be futile.




