He said that this is a vague recollection, which he has regarding this mail and said he could not swear to it. He said no person named GAULT has been a tenant at 923 South Normandie Avenue to his knowledge.

ALLAN O. THOMPSON advised that he was the manager of the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. THOMPSON said that he lives at the hotel. He said that this hotel was primarily a resident hotel and did not cater to transient type people. He said that he has been the manager of the St. Francis Hotel for approximately two years. THOMPSON said that he did, in fact, recall a former tenant ERIC GALT. He produced a registration card, which showed the name ERIC GALT as a tenant from January 21, 1968 until March 17, 1968. He advised that GALT paid a monthly rental rate of \$85. He said that GALT occupied Room 403 in the hotel. Concerning GALT's tenancy, THOMPSON said that he did not recall GALT having an automobile. He said he was certain that he did not obtain a parking ticket as provided by the hotel for occupancy of their automobile parking space. He said that GALT had no telephone in his room. THOMPSON said that on occasion he did receive telephone calls but they were irregular and not of any large number, perhaps six telephone calls per week. THOMPSON advised that the St. Francis Hotel maintains no record of local telephone calls received by tenants and that there is no record of any long distance calls received by GALT. THOMPSON said there was no record of any long distance telephone calls reflected on the registration card. He said that GALT received few letters, perhaps one or two personal letter per week. He advised that GALT received no magazines. THOMPSON did say that GALT watched for these letters and usually came to the desk for his mail at 10:00 A.M. THOMPSON said that he cannot recollect from where the mail came.

THOMPSON said that GALT maintained irregular hours and because of this, he did not appear to have any employment. THOMPSON stated that he did not recall cashing any check for GALT. THOMPSON said that GALT remained alone during his tenancy and had no visitors as to his recollection.

THOMPSON stated that when GALT arrived, he had two regular size brown leather suitcases and when he departed, he left with the same number. He said that the apartment which

GALT and dated March 17, 1968, advising that his old address of 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, 90028, has been changed and that his new address is General Delivery, Main Post Office, Atlanta, Georgia. This Change of Address Order further showed that this change of address is temporary until April 25, 1968.

The service was explained to GALT, and he was told the service would cost \$3.00 per month, and in addition to the \$3.00, the subscriber to the service would be required to pay all postage.

HEDGPETH advised he forwarded to GALT literature regarding this service at GALT's address, the St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California. GALT in turn sent HEDGPETH \$3.00 in cash and asked to be a subscriber from February 1, 1968, to March 1, 1968, and wanted all mail forwarded to St. Francis Hotel address in the name of ERIC S. GALT, ERIC S., or E. S. G.. GALT was also mailed Post Office Form 1583 which authorizes HEDGPETH to forward mail to GALT. GALT signed this form and returned the form to HEDGPETH. HEDGPETH in addition sent GALT another letter whereby he asked that he forward an additional \$1.00 to cover postage. This communication was never replied to by GALT.

HEDGPETH advised that he advertises his services in the "Los Angeles Free Press," Popular Mechanics, Political Science, Mechanics Illustrated, and the National Informer. He advised he assumes GALT probably learned of his business through the "Los Angeles Free Press," because most of his inquiries about the service originating in the Los Angeles area is due to his advertising in the "Los Angeles Free Press." HEDGPETH stated he was certain GALT had never used the forwarding service, because his records showed no postage credited to GALT's account.

HEDGPETH advised he has had no further correspondence or telephonic inquiry from anyone identifying himself as ERIC GALT, and he could furnish no other information.

himself as 175 pounds, 5'10" and as having no physical defects. This application was signed by ERIC S. GALT.

LAU made available the above application, indicating he observed GALT complete and sign this application in his office on January 19, 1968. LAU also made available the Installment Notice dated January 19, 1968 at Los Angeles, California, payable to International School of Bartending in the amount of \$125 for a six week bartending course and signed ERIC S. GALT and TOMAS REYES LAU. LAU stated he also observed GALT sign this document on January 19, 1968.

LAU also made available a color photograph and negative dated March 2, 1968 depicting GALT and LAU together in LAU's office on March 2, 1968, the date of GALT's graduation from the International School of Bartending.

LAU recalls GALT driving a dark, possibly black, late and small model Ford having red interior bearing out of state license plates, possibly black and white in color.

LAU recalls that approximately one week after GALT's graduation on March 2, 1968, GALT telephonically contacted him (LAU) at which time LAU advised him that he had a possible job opportunity for him as a bartender. GALT advised LAU that he was leaving town within two weeks for an undisclosed destination to visit his brother and did not wish to take a job at this time. GALT stated that he would return to Los Angeles and check with LAU regarding employment at that time.

LAU stated he had no information which would indicate that GALT has held a position as a bartender in the Los Angeles area. LAU stated that while GALT was a student at this school, he did not observe him to associate closely with any other student. LAU continued that GALT did not talk about himself, his past experiences or any associates.

A National Dance Studio "Enrollment Agreement and Contract for Dancing Instruction", reflected that ERIC GALT, residence 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California, telephone 469-8096, on December 14, 1967, executed an enrollment agreement, agreeing to take a course of 50 hour lessons for the total amount of \$499. The course consisted of 25 private hour lessons and 25 party or group technique hour lessons.

GALT paid \$100 on account and agreed to pay the balance of \$399 under the following terms:

\$149 due December 18, 1967;

\$50 per week until the contract was paid in full.

The National Dance Studio agreed to give the above stated 50 hour lessons within four months from the date of execution and stipulated that this course of 50 hours of dance instructions expired on March 14, 1968. The contract was signed by ERIC S. GALT and A.S. JORGENSEN, Dance Instructor.

National Dance Studio Card Number 66429, a dance analysis card used by instructors, in the name of ERIC GALT, 1535 Serrano, reflected that the dance student had previously had dance lessons in the State of Alabama, had taken fox trot and cha cha dancing. It was dated December 5, 1967, and reflected that GALT's dancing counselor was Miss LIPTON and instructor was ARDELLE.

Mr. RODNEY ARVIDSON, owner - operator, National Dance Studio, 2026 Pacific Avenue, Long Beach, California, telephone 591-5651, advised as follows:

He recalled ERIC GALT as a dancing student who enrolled at National Dance Studio during the first week of December 1967, and who subsequently quit taking lessons quite abruptly on approximately February 12, 1968.

ARVIDSON stated that during this period of time he had several occasions to talk with GALT and on at least one occasion he interviewed GALT for approximately two hours, in an attempt to benefit him socially through his dance lessons at the studio.

Through his conversations with GALT, ARVIDSON stated that he was told by GALT that he had been in Mexico and as he, ARVIDSON, recalled he believed it was in the early part of 1967. ARVIDSON stated that he believed GALT informed him that he owned a restaurant in Mexico City. ARVIDSON stated that he spoke Spanish fluently and when he conversed with GALT in Spanish, GALT did not reply, leading ARVIDSON to believe that GALT was not conversant to any degree in that language. ARVIDSON stated that GALT used rather poor language, leading him, ARVIDSON, to believe that he had achieved education no higher than high school.

ARVIDSON recalled that he never saw GALT in any attire other than shirt and tie. He often wore a very expensive pair of alligator shoes which ARVIDSON believed were loafer cut. GALT told him sometime during their conversations that he was a merchant seaman and that he very much desired to return to the sea.

Upon terminating his dance instructions, GALT stated that he wanted to attend bartending school in order

that he may open his own restaurant, and his dance instructions were conflicting with his desires to attend bartending school.

ARVIDSON stated that GALT was somewhat backward socially and was a poor dancing student because he was ill at ease with others. GALT could never seem to relax while in a mixed group or around other people. ARVIDSON recalled that GALT was driving a white automobile, make and model unrecalled by ARVIDSON.

ARVIDSON stated since GALT was a student for such a short period of time he did not obtain a photograph of him, which was customary for all students enrolled in the dance studio.

GALT did not smile readily, was pleasant but very evasive. He would not talk about himself at all and would not look the individual he was conversing with in the eye. He was bashful and a true introvert and smiled with a crooked smile. To ARVIDSON's recollection, GALT never appeared at the dance studio with any associates, male or female.

ARVIDSON stated that he was of the opinion that GALT was a complete loner, was transient, although he seemed to have money. ARVIDSON recalled that in each instance when GALT paid for dance instruction as agreed, he removed a roll of bills from his trouser pocket and paid his account as agreed.

ARVIDSON stated that ARDELLE, a part-time dancing employee, instructed GALT more than any other of the National Dance Studio employees. ARVIDSON stated that ARDELLE was the nickname of SHARON RHOADS, 5411 Don Ricardo Drive, Los Angeles, residence telephone 293-2616. ARVIDSON stated that RHOADS was employed by Charter Title Company, located on Wilshire Boulevard, Beverly Hills, California, business telephone O F 9-0326.

KEELEY said that each desk clerk utilizes the same procedure in handling rental payments at the St. Francis Hotel. He advised that at the end of each shift, the money and checks are placed in a plain white envelope and sealed. This envelope is then date stamped and then placed into a safe through a mail slot. KEELEY said that the owner of the hotel, Mr. DAVIDSON, periodically opens the safe and deposits the receipts at a bank with whom he does business.

Mr. ROBERT HEROLD GRAY, house father, Child Guidance Center of Sun Valley, 11582 Sheldon Street, Sun Valley, California, was interviewed at the above address on April 16, 1968, at which time he furnished the following information:

Prior to moving to his present location, Mr. GILY resided in Room 414 at the Saint Francis Hotel, 533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles (Hollywood), California. He was at the Saint Francis Hotel from approximately the last of June 1967 to March 27, 1968.

Mr. GRAY said the name of ERIC STARVO GALT was entirely unfamiliar to him. He did recall that an adult male Caucasian resided in Room 403 at the Saint Francis Hotel during a portion of the period that he himself resided there. He said that he was employed for a few months, exact dates not recalled, as a desk clerk at the hotel, while he was also a resident of the hotel, so he thus became acquainted with some of the tenants at the hotel. Mr. GRAY said he never became well acquainted with the resident of Room 403, as they resided on different floors in the hotel.

According to Mr. GRAY, the resident of Room 403, "was very average." He said that he would not be able to describe that individual, other than to say that he had the impression the man from Room 403 was, "husky, with an athletic build." He said that man was quiet, did not mingle much with the other guests of the hotel; but did spend quiet a bit of time in the television room, off the hotel lobby. After talking to the occupant of Apartment 102, the man apparently left the apartment house, as the next time she saw him was when he was walking up and down on the sidewalk out in front of the apartment. He walked up and down for about three or four minutes and then walked across the street to where he had parked his car. BLANK stated that it was very dark that night, but she thinks his car was an older model, make unknown, four door sedan, dark in color, with a bad muffler. She knew the muffler must have been bad, as it made a loud noise when he drove off.

At the time of this contact, BLANK advised that she had found something else that the FLIKEIDS had left behind when they moved. She furnished a paid room receipt from the Miramar Hotel, Post Office Box M, Santa Barbara, California, in the name of T. M. FLIKEID, 1831 North Gramercy, Hollywood, California, a review of which indicates FLIKEID spent January 20, 1968, at this hotel.

Later during the day of April 15, 1968, BLANK was recontacted at her place of employment by Special Agents THEODORE M. GARDNER and FREDERICK E. BROCKE, and was shown a picture of a person believed to be ERIC SARVO GALT. She was asked if this person resembled the white male who had contacted her on the night of April 11, 1968. During the early morning hours of April 12, 1968, Miss ANITA LOUISE KATZWINKEL was contacted at her residence of Apartment 9, 1727 North Garfield Place, and after being advised of the identity of the contacting Agents, she was interviewed regarding her background, associates, and knowledge of ERIC STARVO GALT.

KATZWINKEL stated she knew and had associated with a girl by the name of GINGER and another girl by the name of SUE. She identified GINGER as GINGER NANCE and SUE as SUE HARRIS, also known as Sue Flickeld. She denied knowing anyone by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT. When asked to furnish the details surrounding her association with NANCE and HARRIS, she furnished the following information:

NANCE, HARRIS and she grew up together in Dixon, Illinois, and all three attended the same high school and ran around with the same "crowd". While still in high school, HARRIS' parents sent her to Los Angeles, California, to live with her aunt, Mrs. (FNU) GOSS, because her parents felt HARRIS was running with a wild crowd and that she would be better off in California.

During May or June, 1967, KATZWINKEL and NANCE decided to go to California and meet with HARRIS. They left Dixon, Illinois, traveling in a bronze colored 1960 or 1962 Rambler which belonged to CHARLEY DAY, NANCE's ex-husband. This car broke down on Highway 66 just outside Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, so they abandoned the car there. At this point they met two men who gave them a ride to San Diego, California. These men were from San Diego but KATZWINKEL could not furnish any additional information regarding them other than they were white males. From San Diego they obtained a ride to Los Angeles, California, and arrived in Los Angeles the Tuesday before Mother's Day in 1967.

Thereupon they took up residence in the Palms Motel, located somewhere on Sunset Boulevard in Hollywood, California.

KATZWINKEL and NANCE rented a room at the Palms Motel for approximately two weeks and thereafter moved to the Serrano Apartments, located at 1535 Serrano Avenue, Hollywood, where they rented Apartment 6. Both the room at the Palms Motel and the apartment on Serrano Avenue were rented in KATZWINKEL's name. They rented this apartment until about the middle of June 1967; however, KATZWINKEL stated that she spent only about one or two nights at this apartment because in the meantime she had met THOMAS HUNTER. Shortly after meeting HUNTER she moved into his apartment located at her present address of 1727 North Garfield Place. NANCE continued to reside in the Serrano Avenue apartment until the middle of June. Thereafter, she returned to Dixon, Illinois, and KATZWINKEL has not seen her since then.

Regarding NANCE, KATZWINKEL stated that while in Los Angeles she dated a Negro, whose name and further descriptive data was unknown to KATZWINKEL. KATZWINKEL stated that upon returning to Dixon, Illinois, NANCE was arrested by police authorities there on a bad check charge and was supposed to have served six months in prison. NANCE has been married a couple of times and goes by the name of GINGER DAY, GINGER NANCE or GINGER CUNNINGHAM. NANCE was the last name of one of her husbands, KENNETH NANCE. CUNNINGHAM is the name of her father, who was last known by KATZWINKEL to reside in Bellflower, California.

According to KATZWINKEL, when NANCE left the apartment at 1535 Serrano, she left a number of her clothes and personal items in her apartment. She locked the door of the apartment and KATZWINKEL had to ask a friend of hers to help her open the door. Some boy friends of NANCE's in Dixon, Illinois, who might know her whereabouts at the present time are JIM LEIGH (phonetic), CHARLEY GULF, and TOM SHERIDAN.

Regarding SUE HARRIS, also known as Sue Flickeld, KATZWINKEL stated that when she and NANCE arrived in California in May or June, 1967, they found HARRIS living in a common-law relationship with TOM FLICKED at the Palms Motel. When asked whether or not HARRIS was operating as a prostitute, KATZWINKEL stated that she was. KATZWINKEL denied

working as a prostitute but did admit on occasions she would answer HARRIS' phone and set up dates for HARRIS. When asked whether or not TOM FLICKEID was gainfully employed, KATZWINKEL stated that she did not know his employment but that he was not a pimp for HARRIS. When asked if she had ever lived with HARRIS or FLICKEID at their apartment at 1831 North Gramercy Place, KATZWINKEL stated she had not. When advised that the phone number at their apartment was listed in her name, KATZWINKEL stated that SUE HARRIS had obtained her permission to put the phone in her name because HARRIS owed the phone company a large amount of money on a previous phone under her own name. When asked whether GINGER NANCE had acted as a prostitute while in California, KATZWINKEL stated that she had not because "she was too fat and ugly".

When asked if she knew the present whereabouts of SUE HARRIS and TOM FLICKEID, KATZWINKEL stated that they were presently on a three-month vacation touring the Southern states. She advised that just prior to leaving they had purchased a 1967 Ford Thunderbird for this vacation from Cort Fox Ford in Hollywood. When asked if she knew where they obtained the money for this automobile, KATZWINKEL stated she believed HARRIS had paid \$500.00 of her own money as down payment for this car. She stated she last saw HARRIS and FLICKEID on the night of February 14, 1968.

When asked if she knew where HARRIS and FLICKEID were at the present time, KATZWINKEL stated that they wanted to be in Dixon, Illinois, by April 12, 1968, to visit HARRIS' mother there. KATZWINKEL described TOM FLICKEID as a white male American, 6', about 170 pounds, light brown hair, blue eyes, very Norwegian looking, well built, a very neat dresser, left-handed, and somewhat of a braggart. She also stated that he smoked, which she remembered to be Camel cigarettes, and drank Scotch and water.

After furnishing the above information, KATZWINKEL was asked again if she had ever known anyone by the name of ERIC GALT or anyone using the last name of GALT. She stated that she had not. She was asked if she knew anyone who owned

a white Ford Mustang. She stated she did not. She was then asked if she could ever recall having furnished her name and address on Serrano Avenue to anyone. She stated that she could not recall ever having done so. She was then advised that her name and her address of her apartment on Serrano Avenue had been located on the paper found in a white Mustang which had recently been recovered by the FBI in Atlanta, Georgia. She was then asked if she could give any reason or explanation as to why her name and address would have been on the paper located in this automobile. KATZWINKEL stated that she had no idea. When asked what the word "Oklahombe" meant to her, KATZWINKEL stated that she had no idea, other than it sounded like a misspelling of the word Oklahoma.

At this point in the interview the results set forth above were discussed once again with KATZWINKEL, and she was asked whether or not she could furnish any further information regarding any point covered above. She stated that she could not at this time remember or recall any further details surrounding her trip to California and her association with NANCE, HARRIS or TOM FLICKEID, nor the reason her name and address would have been on a piece of paper found in an automobile recovered in Atlanta, Georgia.

After relating the above information, KATZWINKEL made available to the interviewing Agents three colored snapshots. One was a snapshot of herself standing in front of the apartment house located at 1727 North Garfield Place; the second was a snapshot of SUE HARRIS in a bathing suit on a beach, and the third was a picture of TOM FLICKEID seated in a chair facing the camera with SUE HARRIS on his lap.

The following descriptive data was obtained from KATZWINKEL:

During the late afternoon hours of April 13, 1968, KATZWINKEL was contacted at her place of employment and was agreeable to being reinterviewed. She was interviewed in a Federal Bureau of Investigation automobile located in the 5300 block of Santa Monica Boulevard.

During the course of this interview she was asked to reiterate the details of her trip to California and her association with GINGER NANCE and SUE HARRIS. She was asked specifically how she and NANCE had obtained a ride from San Diego to Los Angeles. She stated that when they arrived in San Diego, NANCE telephonically contacted her father, Mr. (FNU) CUNNINGHAM, who picked them up in San Diego and took them to his trailer in Bellflower, California. They spent the first night at his trailer in Bellflower. The next morning he drove them to the Palms Motel on Sunset Boulevard, in Hollywood, California. There they met up with SUE HARRIS who, at that time, had an apartment at the motel with TOM FLICKED. KATZWINKEL and NANCE rented room No. 7 at the Palms Motel and KATZWINKEL rented it in her name and paid for the room.

When asked where she obtained the money for the room, KATZWINKEL stated that while coming to California she called a friend of her brother's by the name of HOWARD CARLSON, and he sent her \$30.00. She called CARLSON from some place in Texas. CARLSON resides in Mendota, Illinois, and he agreed to send her \$30.00 by Western Union telegram. This money was sent to her at the Western Union Office in San Diego, California.

When asked why she chose the Palms Motel, KATZWINKEL stated that she had corresponded with SUE HARRIS prior to leaving Dixon and HARRIS had made reservations for her at the Palms Motel.

KATZWINKEL advised that they had stayed at the Palms Motel for two weeks. When asked how much rent they paid for their room and where they obtained the money for it, KATZWINKEL stated that the room ran them about \$20.00 a week and that she had filled "dates" at the motel on two or three occasions to obtain money.

When asked where she contacted these "dates", KATZWINKEL stated that she worked for SUE HARRIS and that HARRIS had the contacts. She was paid \$10 to \$15.00 per "trick" and this money was paid to KATZWINKEL and not to HARRIS. KATZWINKEL stated that HARRIS was running a call girl service by herself and that HARRIS would send those "dates" to her that she did not have time to fill herself.

During this time TOM FLICKED, who was living with HARRIS, was employed by the Hollywood Carpets as an installer. KATZWINKEL stated she did not fill any "dates" with any persons from FLICKED's place of employment and would recall doing so because she knew the people FLICKED worked with. KATZWINKEL stated HARRIS took her to the Vegas Club located on Hollywood Boulevard and she met some of her contacts there. HARRIS, NANCE and KATZWINKEL went to the Vegas Club regularly, according to KATZWINKEL. When asked if she recalled a Negro guitar player there, KATZWINKEL stated that there was a Negro guitar player at the Vegas Club whose first name was TONY.

KATZWINKEL stated that after staying at the Palms Motel for about two weeks, she and NANCE moved to the Serrano Apartments and rented Apartment 6 in her name. She asked if she ever received any utility bills at the apartment, KATZWINKEL stated that her utilities were included in the rent for the apartment.

When asked whether or not she ever filled a "date" while living in the Serrano Apartments, KATZWINKEL at first stated she did not because although the apartment was rented in her name for about three weeks, she herself lived there one or two nights. After asking her to think over this question for awhile, KATZWINKEL stated that she did fill one "date" at the Serrano Apartments. Her customer was a man whose name she thought to be TOM REGGIE, who ran a laundry located on Sunset Boulevard. This "date" had been given to her by SUE HARRIS and was a regular customer of HARRIS'. REGGIE did laundry for HARRIS and was repaid by her favors rather than with money. KATZWINKEL described REGGIE as a white male, about 35 to 40 years of age, 5'10", about 250 pounds, black curly hair, possibly having a hairline mustache, and driving a white panel truck. KATZWINKEL stated that she met REGGIE at HARRIS' apartment and that he drove her and GINGER to the Serrano Apartments where she turned the "trick". Afterwards REGGIE took both she and NANCE to lunch in his white truck.

KATZWINKEL was then asked if she would be willing to furnish samples of her handwriting and she advised that she would be agreeable to do so. She was then given a white, lined tablet and asked to write various words in sequence on the tablet. These words included her name, ANITA KATZWINKEL, GINGER and DAY; the address 1535 Serrano, Oklahombe, and Apt. 6. After writing these words, she was then shown the colored photograph of a Kleenex box top on which appeared the writing "GINGER DAY & ANITA KATZWINKEL, etc." After looking at this photograph, KATZWINKEL stated that the writing depicted in the photograph appeared to be her writing but she could not recall ever having given her name and address to anyone. She stated that the word "DAY" appearing immediately above and after the word "GINGER" in the photograph was the last name of GINGER DAY, who is identical to GINGER NANCE. She stated she knew nothing whatsoever of the words "Oklahombe" and "Broult" which also appeared in the photograph. When asked whether or not Oklahombe was the name of a Negro guitar player at the Vegas Club, KATZWINKEL stated that she did not think so. When asked whether or not she could give any explanation as to why her name and address were found in an automobile believed to have belonged to ERIC GALT, KATZWINKEL stated that she had no idea whatsoever.
