WALL, manager of the apartment house at 626 South Bonnie Brae Street, Los Angeles, telephone 483-3351, advised that last Monday, April 15, 1968, about 9:30 A.M., a man came alone to her office looking for an apartment. He said he was answering an advertisement appearing in the Los Angeles Herald Examiner . Mrs. WALL said that there are only apartments in her house and no rooms and the advertisement concerned single and double apartments from \$60.00, and up. Mrs. WALL said she: did not open the door in order to talk to the man, but observed him through a window in the door, this window being about 3" by 2". She said she only saw the man from the chest upward. He said he wanted an apartment only for himself. Mrs. HALL said she told him that they only register senior citizens whereupon he walked out of the front door, walking hurriedly judging from the slam of the front door. Mrs. WALL explained that they do not take young single men, but cater to senior citizens. She said she had never seen him before or after. To her knowledge he was unaccompanied and he was not seen with a car. not say much and spoke in a rather quiet voice. Mrs. WALL said she cannot recall that he had an accent. He did not mention his name, address or place of work. She said she had no idea as to how to locate the man; that he just went out the door, and her apartment is near the front door. She said that to her knowledge no one else in the apartment house saw him.

Mrs, WALL said that on Monday, April 15, 1968, she looked at the Los Angeles Herald Examiner for that date, and saw the advertisement pertaining to her apartment house. She said she also looked at this paper for Sunday, April 14, 1968, and the advertisement was there also. She said that in both papers her advertisement was the only one appearing for the Wilshire District. She said she did not know if the advertisement appeared in the papers for Friday or Saturday, April 12 and 13, 1968, as she did not look at those papers.

Mrs. WALL said that on Wednesday, April 17, 1968, she saw the two pictures of ERIC STARVO GALT in the newspapers, one with eyes open and one with eyes shut, and she immediately felt they were pictures of the man seeking the apartment. She

said she felt this due to the shape of the apartment seeker's face. She said that the apartment seeker "had a face you don't see every day". She also said the apartment seeker was cleancut.

The writer, SA ALBERT N. CARLBLOM, exhibited photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT, both with eyes open and with eyes shut. Further, she saw a copy of the "Wanted Notice" of JAMES EARL RAY as it appeared in the newspaper. She thereupon said that she is sure that the apartment seeker is the person on the photographs. She said that the picture of GALT with his eyes open looked just like the man who was seeking an apartment.

She described the person seeking the apartment as follows:

Mrs. MARTIN said that the person to issue a subpoena to in order to identify their records would either be GORDON W. SCHINDLER or MAUREEN MUSFELT.

It was noted that an emergency telephone number was set forth on the wall of this office for SCHINDLER as 672-3946.

As to the type or contents of this book which had been ordered, Mrs. MARTIN furnished a sample brochure, which also contains a similar order blank, which sets forth the following description of the book:

"THE SEXUALLY RESPONSIVE WOMAN"

"The latest book by the Doctors Phyllis and Eberhard Kronhausen. Here is a book devoted exclusively to the feminine side of sexuality. An especially valuable volume for husbands seeking a fuller insight into women's thoughts on sex. It is clear that many women will discuss the subject in more detail with scientists than with their husbands.

"Here we have wives confessing their greatest conquests---before and after marriage---as well as their greatest disappointments; descriptions of how the orgasm feels, favorite coital positions (as well as the problems encountered with others); varied methods of satisfying husbands; first sexual experiences; pre-marital adventures; extra-marital escapades; miscegenation (confessions which bring some surprises from black men and white women copulating);

"Experiences with a multitude of lovers (as well as experiences with various-sized penes); preference during fore-play and coitus; various means of achieving orgasm; masturbation; thoughts on the use of artificial penes; lesbian activities; sex practices of over-sexed wives (as well as reactions of husbands); varieties of oral sex technic (including wives who desire such activities);

"Effects of reading pornographic literature and viewing stag films; other erotic stimulants; failings of husbands; secret sex desires; coital contests; wife-swapping; most effective means of arousal, etc. Price \$5.95."

On April 16, 1968, Mrs. LORRAINE MARTIN, Secretary, FUTURA BOOKS, INC., 21839 South Avalon Boulevard, Torrance, California 90502, telephone 830-7903 furnished the following information:

This concern receives a large volume of mail daily, upon its receipt, it is dated, the orders are filled that day and either sent out that night or the following morning. They do not keep an index of individuals ordering their material. The money orders are set out by their numbers and amounts on one bank deposit sheet with a carbon copy being retained by the date of the deposit. This same procedure is followed in recording of checks. Names are not used.

Both Mrs. LORRAINE MARTIN and another office assistant were reluctant to furnish any information at first in view of the fact they thought someone had made a complaint to the Federal Government about their not filling an order. Mrs. MARTIN did not furnish her name until the conclusion of the interview and the other employee would not furnish her name. Both stated that they recognized the name of ERIC GALT from having read it recently in the local newspapers.

Mrs. MARTIN stated that unless she had a date that the order arrived, or an approximate date, she would be unable to locate this account.

Mrs. MARTIN, in checking her money order bank deposit carbon copy records located money order 0799 19430 in the amount of \$6.44 which was received on February 27, 1968. She thereafter located in the February 27, 1968 "Orders Filled" folder an Order Blank which had been dated February 27, 1968 from:

The Order Blank is one which is furnished in a brochure and Mrs. MARTIN advised was probably torn from such a brochure. She advised that he either called or sent a letter for such a brochure or possibly obtained same from a friend. She would have no record of such a request for the brochure. Mrs. MARTIN furnished a sample brochure which has the same Order Blank in it.

Mrs. MARTIN pointed out that the Order Blank of ERIC S. GALT is for the book entitled:

THE SEXUALLY RESPONSIVE WOMAN \$5.95 (Special Handding Charge) .25 California Sales Tax .24 \$6.44

Mrs. MARTIN stated that the inked date of "February 27, 1968" is placed there by one of their employees when the order is received. The individual handling the order, using a red felt writing instrument, placed the letters of "S H" in the upper right corner of the Order Blank which means "Special Handling". Further, this same employee underlines the name of the book order and then places a large check mark through it to reflect that the order was filled with that book. The employee then places an initial to reflect the identity of the person filling the order. This order bearing the initial of "O" was filled by:

ORTRUD RIEDEL

The amount, in red of \$6.44 reflects that is the amount received with the order.

Mrs. MARTIN stated that no one places a signature on the Order Blank and the signature at the bottom of this Order Blank must have been placed there by the person using the Order Blank.

Mrs. MARTIN made a Xerox copy, for her files, of the Order Blank, turning the original copy over to the Interviewing Agent. The Interviewing Agent furnished a handwritten receipt on the back of the Xerox Copy for this document.

The foregoing individuals have been known to the Postal Inspectors and the FBI to be mainly involved in mail order operations, the items being handled not being considered as suitable vehicles for Federal prosecution by The Department.

Postal Inspectors have furnished information that CLEMENS and ED WINKLER furnish financial backing for LAMBERT JOSEPH FONTENOT. FONTENOT operates a mail order operation under the name of UNITED SURGICAL SUPPLY, was arrested by Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office deputies on March 4, 1968 for selling hard-core color 8mm motion picture films which arrived by air from New York, allegedly from ARTHUR CARL MASCOLO.

ED WINKLER has been known to have the mail order operations of DICR at 3435 Motor Avenue and VIB-E-RECT, of the same address, both in Los Angeles, California

CLEMENS has been the subject of a Interstate Gambling Activities investigation due to his association with known gamblers in Venice, Fillmore and other small communities in Southern California. No arrest record was located for CLEMENS however he does employe a known bookmaker and gambler, HERSCHEL JACKSON.

LE JAY WINKLER was also a subject of a Interstate Gambling Activities investigation due to his association with CLEMENS and in the same areas as frequented by CLEMENS. LE JAY WINKLER has FBI#974 772 A, is also known as "DINK", was last arrested on 12/22/52 by the Los Angeles PD on a charge of Statutory Rape.

CAROLINE WINKLER is unknown, at this time, to either the Postal Inspectors or the indices of this office.

SCHINDLER has been the subject of Interstate Transportation of Obscene Matter investigations by both the Postal Inspectors and the FBI since 1952.

GORDON W. SCHINDLER was convicted in the U. S. District Court of Judge HARRY C. WESTOVER, Los Angeles, California on March 8, 1954 being sentenced to three years and fined \$1,000 and being placed on probation for a period of three years for sending obscene matters through the U. S. Mail. He was on Federal Probation until May 14, 1959.

SCHINDLER was interviewed January 28, 1958 by SA HOMER E. YOUNG pertaining to his knowledge of the printing and distributing of an alleged obscene book entitled: "ARABIAN LOVE MANUAL". SCHINDLER admitted that he had written this book in either 1951 or 1952 and had nothing to do with it since his Federal conviction. SCHINDLER at that time indicated he had set up MONOGRAM PUBLISHING COMPANY which was operated by his father, MAURICE SCHINDLER while he was on Federal Probation.

SCHINDLER is a male. White America, born in Winora, Minnesota has a high school education, FBI #61224-B.

The most recent inquiry concerning SCHINDLER is reflected in the FBI Laboratory Report of December 15, 1967 wherein one of SCHINDLER'S publications was submitted to the Laboratory by the Philadelphia Office, the publication was entitled: "FEMALE AUTO-EROTIC PRACTICES" by HAVELOCK ELLIS, M.D. a Monogram Book. It is not considered to be obscene.

The officers of the foregoing corporations are: GORDON W. SCHINDLER - President and Director; MAUREEN MUSFELT - Vice President and Director; and, LORRAINE MARTIN, Secretary-Treasurer and Director.



This concern deals in material which is sold through mail orders. The concern handles both its own material as well as other concern's material which they advertise in their brochures. When orders are received, they are placed in alphabetical order by the last name of the person placing the order, if the order is to be filled by TIFFANY products. In the event the order is for one of the other concerns, a designation is placed either on the front of the check, or money order, or possibly on the back of the check, just above the endorsement, so that they can credit this concern with that amount.

The checks, or money orders, are not listed on the bank deposit slip. Therefore, they have no record with which to locate any checks, or money orders, going through their concern.

GILROY stated that the employee who usually handles the filing of completed orders and makes up index cards for a possible mailing list in the future, or a mailing list which is sold to other mail order operators, was not present. Further, GILROY noted that this employee was behind in her filing.

GILROY stated that the index cards which are completed and filed, are filed by the State from which they originated and alphabetically thereunder.

GILROY caused a search to be made of the index cards and also through all completed order files attempting to locate an order or index card for ERIC S. GALT with negative results.

GILROY furnished a TIFFANY ENTERPRISE brochure which contains an Order Blank for this concern.

ROBERT J. REYNOLDS, 1712 Santa Anita Avenue, advised that he received a telephone call on the evening of June 10, 1968, from his father-in-law, K. C. MC MILLAN, 8 Emery Street, Georgetown, Ontario, Canada. During the course of the telephone conversation, MC MILLAN advised REYNOLDS that the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) was looking for REYNOLDS' uncle, EARL ANGLIN JAMES, in connection with investigation of activities of JAMES EARL RAY while in Canada. According to MC MILLAN, EARL ANGLIN JAMES is suspected of being, or having knowledge of "the mysterious fat man" who gave to RAY an envelope while RAY resided at a rooming house located at 962 Dundas Street, Toronto, Canada.

REYNOLD stated that EARL ANGLIN JAMES has been an associate of SUN LOO, an influential person in the Chinese community of Toronto, who also lived on Dundas Street. REYNOLDS noted that, according to the "Los Angeles Times," JAMES EARL RAY lived at a rooming house on Dundas Street operated by Mrs. SUN LOO. He advised if the RCMP are looking for his uncle, they could possibly obtain information as to his whereabouts from SUN LOO.

REYNOLDS advised that EARL ANGLIN JAMES was subpoened by JAMES GARRISON, New Orleans District Attorney, in his investigation of the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. REYNOLDS said that, according to information contained in the Toronto newspapers, his uncle received several telephone calls from DAVID FERRIE was allegedly an active participant in a conspiracy to assassinate President KENNEDY.

REYNOLDS described EARL ANGLIN JAMES as male Caucasian, age 69, 5'10", 220 pounds, obese build, dark brown hair, dark brown eyes, swarthy complexion, wearing mustache and goatee.

ALLAN O. THOMPSON was interviewed at the St. Francis
Hotel, his place of employment. After being advised of the
identity of the contacting Agents, he was interviewed regarding
his knowledge of the identity of a person allegedly having
knowledge of JAMES EARL RAY, who THOMPSON previously refused
to identify. During the course of the interview, it became
necessary to advise THOMPSON of the provisions of Title 18,

United States Code, Section 1001.

THOMPSON advised that he knows the individual whom he previously refused to identify by the name of "FITZ." He said he was approached by this individual at the Rabbit's Foot Bar, 5623 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, a few days prior to the date of the present interview. THOMPSON said he could not recall the specific date. He said this individual "You're Mr. THOMPSON aren't you?" and then proceeded to ask if THOMPSON was interested in splitting the reward money offered as a result of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. THOMPSON said he told this individual he was not interested. During the course of subsequent conversation, THOMPSON said "FITZ" told him he had observed JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, and another individual sitting together, engaged in conversation at a local bar, the name of which was not mentioned by "FITZ. THOMPSON said that "FITZ" told him that RAY called this individual "J.C." THOMPSON said the nickname "J.C." prompted his recollection of events as he related during the course of an interview on May 28, 1968, that is, RAY being called twice, possibly three times, by JAMES C. HARDIN from New Orleans and Atlanta.

THOMPSON said that he has seen "FITZ" on an infrequent basis in the vicinity of Hollywood Boulevard and Western Avenue, Los Angeles, California, during the past six months. He advised he has no knowledge of the associates of "FITZ," his residence, past or prior; his automobile; or his employment, if any.

THOMPSON said at some time after the first of the year he expelled "FITZ" and another Caucasian male from the parking lot of the St. Francis Hotel where they were sleeping

THOMPSON said that whenever and wherever he again observes "FITZ," he will immediately notify the FBI.

Concerning the telephonic contact of JAMES EARL RAY by JAMES C. HARDIN, THOMPSON added that he believes the voice of the person who identified himself as JAMES C. HARDIN on the telephone and the voice of the person who identified himself as Mr. HARDIN at the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, California, after these telephone calls, are identical. He said that the only basis for this judgment is his experience in dealing with people over the telephone and across the desk as a hotel manager. THOMPSON advised that on one occasion during a longdistance telephone call for RAY by HARDIN, he remembers having conversation with the long-distance telephone operator and hearing the conversation between the operator and HARDIN. He said that he, therefore, assumes that this telephone call was placed for HARDIN by the operator, rather than being dialed directly as he believes occurred on the other occasions.

MARVIN MILLER, G & M Enterprises, Inc., 14923 East Proctor, was contacted at the location of his business. He advised that the correspondence to ERIC S. GALT contained two leaflets: one pertaining to four lewd films, the other pertaining to a book "Intercourse". MILLER advised that also enclosed with these two leaflets was one printed self-addressed envelope.

MILLER stated that in view of the color of the address tape on which GALT's name and address was contained and the number thereon, that is 82, he could only conclude that GALT's name was purchased along with others by his firm. He said that it would be impossible to determine the source of GALT's address in that the source of the document is destroyed upon the sending of the initial correspondence. MILLER said the names and addresses of those who reply to the initial correspondence are maintained by his firm. He said they are only maintained upon the reply of the initial correspondence. MILLER stated that he has purchased mailing lists recently from GORDON D. SCHINDLER, President of both Monogramming Publications, Inc., and Futura Books, Inc. stated that he does not know if, in fact, the name and address of ERIC S. GALT was contained among those names and addresses that he purchased. He advised further that there would be no way his office could establish whether or not such a name and address was contained among those purchased.

ALLAN O. THOMPSON, Manager, St. Francis Hotel, 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, was shown photographs of JAMES WILBOURN ASHMORE, also known as James C. Hardin, FBI No. 4869529, at THOMPSON's place of business. After observing these photographs, THOMPSON said that he could not say that ASHMORE was not identical with the individual he knew by the name of JAMES C. HARDIN. Disregarding age in that the photographs were taken August 19, 1955, THOMPSON said the shape of the head and the appearance of the eyes of ASHMORE are of excellent likeness to those corresponding characteristics of HARDIN. He further observed that the hair in the photograph was much longer than the hair of JAMES C. HARDIN. THOMPSON remarked that ASHMORE's skin appears much smoothier than the skin of HARDIN, which he described as porous and course.

THOMPSON was shown photographs of J. C. HARDIN, FBI No. 190190C. THOMPSON said that this individual is not identical with the person he knew as JAMES C. HARDIN.

CHARLES J. STEIN, 5666 Franklin Avenue, Hollywood, advised that on the return trip from New Orleans in December 1967, RAY picked him up at his sisters house in New Orleans. STEIN stated ANTHONY DECARVELHO was with him at his sisters house when RAY picked him up. STEIN advised he could not remember if anything was put in the trunk at his sister's house. He further advised that when at his mother's house to pick up the children, he put a cardboard box containing the children's belongings in the trunk but can only recall RAY's suitcase and the yellow box as being in the trunk of the car. STEIN advised he could recall no objects the size or shape of golf clubs, fishing poles, camera tripods, or any case which could have contained these. STEIN advised he could not remember anything being in the trunk of the car on the return trip that had not been there when he and RAY left Los Angeles, except the children's belongings.

STEIN advised that he observed a set of license plates on the back window shelf of RAY's Mustang when he first met RAY. STEIN believed he observed the license plates on December 14, 1967. STEIN advised that he was not certain whether the date was December 14 or December 15, 1967, but that he associated the time to the period when RAY gave him a ride in the car to register for GEORGE WALLACE. STEIN advised that the license plates had black letters on a white background. STEIN stated that he did not remember the license plates being in the back window shelf of the car during the trip to New Orleans in December.

STEIN advised that he had not located the telephone booth used by RAY during the course of the trip to New Orleans. STEIN advised that he and LOUIS LOMAX attempted to locate the telephone booth but were unsuccessful. STEIN stated that he has been "conned, duped, used, and been made a mark" by the newspapermen to whom he has talked. STEIN advised that newspapermen had interjected their own ideas into the interviews and attributed the idea to STEIN. STEIN could not specifically recall the reporters. STEIN advised that he is presently

confused as to what actually happened during the December trip and what the newspapers have said happened.

STEIN stated he has received no money from any news-papermen, including LOUIS LOMAX, although promised shares of the reward and up to \$200,000 for his cooperation. STEIN declined to advise who had made the monetary offers.

STEIN observed a photograph of RAY taken in November 1967, in Mexico. STEIN advised that it looked like RAY but that the pose did not fit RAY's nature as STEIN had known him.

RITA STEIN, also known as Rita Rosas, was interviewed at her residence, 5666 Franklin Avenue, Los Angeles (Hollywood), California, on April 24, 1968, at which time she furnished the following information:

She said she was born in New Orleans, Louisiana. She is 5'3" tall, weight 118 pounds, dark eyes, and black hair. At the time of this interview she was wearing a mini-skirt and blouse and white high plastic boots. She said she attended McDonald School in the French Quarter and a Catholic girls academy in New Orleans. She said she was 30 years of age and has four children.

She said she is not sure of the exact date she first met ERIC STARVO GALT; but places the time as mid-December, 1967. She said she thought it was about December 10th or 12th, but her brother has a receipt for a political registration which would have made the date December 14, 1967. She met him in the Sultan Room bar in the St. Francis Hotel on Hollywood Boulevard in the Hollywood section of Los Angeles. It was in the evening. She was returning the keys to her cousin, MARIE MARTIN's, car, to MARIE, who was working as a barmaid in the Sultan Room.

MARIA and RITA were standing near the end of the bar and the individual she later came to know as ERIC GALT, was seated adjacent to the end of the bar where they were standing. She said she told MARIE that it was going to be necessary for her to go to New Orleans, "to pick up my kids". "GALT was having a drink. MARIE said, as a joke, 'Would you like to take my cousin home?' GALT evidently thought she meant around the corner. I had the impression that she had seen him before and was familiar with him. I told him that I had to go to get my kids in New Orleans. He said that he was from Alabama. He showed me his driver's license and I believe it was from Alabama. I gave him my local address. He seemed nice. Did not come on smart. He looked like an insurance man. Was real quiet."
