Re Driver's License Check.

Investigation conducted by the Louisville Office at both the Driver's License Bureau, Frankfort, Ky., State Capital, and at the Jefferson Co. Driver's License Bureau, Louisville, reflects that a check of individual driver's license applications would be highly impractical and virtually prohibitive for the following listed reasons:

On 5/24/66, contact was had with Mr. HAROLD FOW, Director of the Driver's License Bureau, Louisville, Ky., and with Lt. ROGER WILHOIT, 5/27/68, the latter Director, Driver's License Bureau, Department of Public Safety, Frakfort, Ky., who advised as follows:

There are approximately 2 million separate files in the Drivers Licenses Bureau representing holders of Kentucky Operator's Licenses. These records can be searched either through the code number assigned to each separate licensee or alphabetically. There is no manner by which the records can be searched as to a specific date of birth or age group and in order to accomplish this each file jacket would have to be searched individually. WILHOIT stated even if sufficient manpower were available to search these records, it would take an extremely long time to accomplish, probably as much as several months.

VILHOIT advised that when any applicant for a new license in the State of Kentucky makes an application, he would do so through any of the 120 counties in the state and would be required to take a written examination and even a driver's test regardless of whether he was licensed in another state. WILHOIT stated that these driver's tests are administered by examiners of the Kentucky State Police assigned to each of the counties in the state and as a practical manner in attempting to locate subject, JAMES EARL RAY, the individual license examiners could be contacted and shown the available photographs

of RAY to determine if he applied for a driver's license in the state.

In view of the above, UACB, the Louisville Office will contact each individual drivers license examiner in each of the 120 counties displaying and leaving wanted flyers on the subject with these examiners requesting that they be on the alert for any information indicating possible application for driver's license on the part of RAY. Efforts will be made at the same time to determine if anyone answring the description of RAY has made application during April and May of this year.

The caller stated she did not wish to give out her name at the present time but wanted some agents to come to her home at 612 E. Gray, accross from the Lounge. She further stated that she wished the agents to come to her first so she could turn the man in and get credit for the apprehension.

The caller stated that the subject was a w/m and was acting funny and seemed olut of place in a colored bar. The caller gave a brief description of the subject and it could possiblyyfit the subject, but she stated that she got the description from the paper.

The caller further advised that if someone did not come down and check thissreport out she would "call Washington or some other official and report that no action was being taken to apprehend the killer of King."

The caller was a negro female.

Supervisor Peters, SaHutchison advised and SAs Cavanaugh and Hornback sent to check out the report.


