There is no information in instant teletype which has any bearing on the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING which is handled by Memphis Division under caption "MURKIN." This investigation deals only with an effort to locate the murderer of Dr. KING.

The various Racial Matters and disturbances which are outgrowths of the assassination of Dr. KING are of no specific interest to Memphis unless they have a bearing on the identity of the suspect in instant case.

Little Rock submitted under caption "UNSUB; ASSASSINATION OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING," 4/4/68, Memphis, Tenn., RM," OO: ME, an Airtel which dealt primarily with marches in memory of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING in Little Rock and Fayetteville, Arkansas. The Memphis Office has no specific interest in Racial Matters in Little Rock territory unless they have a specific bearing on the solution of the murder of Dr. KING.

JOHN HUBEART WILLARD after being advised of the nature of the inquiry and the identity of the interviewing agents, was given a form entitled "Your Rights" and after reading the form and signing the 'Waiver of Rights' section of the form, furnished the following information concerning his activities. On April 4, 1968, he stated that he arrived at his place of employment, the Day Brite Lighting, Incorporated, plant located at South Green and Day Brite Drive, Tupelo, Mississippi, shortly before 7:00 A.M. He said that he was at the plant all the day long and punched out several minutes after 3:30 P.M. on April 4, 1968. He related after leaving the plant he and BILLY GLENN DOWDY went to the Union Hall located on North Spring Street, Tupelo, Mississippi, and attended a union meeting of local 1028, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. This union meeting lasted until shortly before 5:00 P.M., after which time he and DOWDY got into his 1968 Ford pickup Deluxe, yellow and white, having no license plate, and drove to the home of DOWDY located on Warren Street, Pontotoc, Mississippi, where he let DOWDY out of the truck and then he proceeded to his home located west of Pontotoc, Mississippi, on Highway 6, approximately five miles.



Transmitted herewith are five sample laundry tapes bearing Code # 02B-6.

Enclosed sample tapes were obtained from from Thermoseal tape machine, Serial Number 31973, Model H5L1, owned and operated by Blum's Individual Laundry and Bry Cleaning Co., 463 Cotton Avenue, Macon, Georgia.

Investigation at Blum's revealed this establishment does not use a code similar to Code #02B-6. Their code consist of 1- through 99 for lot number, a letter for week and last two digits for bundle numbers running -1 through 20. Red tape is used by Blum's for special work. They do not ordinarily place a tape on small items such as shorts unless the work only consists of two or three items. Blum's machine has only five characters. The tape is cut one and one eighth inch long and there is no indication that the machine has malfunctioned in the past causing tape to be cut one and one sixteenth inch long.

FBI Laboratory is requested to compare enclosed sample tapes with tape from suspect's shorts previously submitted by the Memphis Office.
