All laundry agencies in Savannah checked, with negative results, re use of thermo-seal marking machine tags, red in color, bearing markings of 028-6 or D28-6.

Three area laundries were found to be using thermo-seal marking machines; however, number-letter systems and/or color of tags used differ from those mentioned in retel. The following additional information was determined, which may be of value to further investigative efforts:

Local laundry managers using thermo-seal markers advise that most red tags they have seen on laundry coming in for service are from military personnel recently arrived this area from other locations. In addition, local users advise that it is unusual to utilize a letter as the first digit in setting up a letter-number group such as D2B-6. Local users further advise that most systems encompass only a three-digit system, rather than the four-digit system mentioned in retel.

Yurthermore, user advised the lettering and/or numbering found on older model thermo-seal markers is smaller than that on more recent models.

Laundry managers also advised that "finished" laundry, which would be tagged such as that in retel, might

On 4/9/68, BH 251-R, a former member of the now defunct Dixie Klan of Anniston, Ala., and who is a close associate of the leading racial agitators in Anniston, advised the composite prepared by the exhibit section of the FBI is not similar to any person he knows among the racial agitators at Anniston. He said that there is some similarity between this composite and a person he has seen in company with JACK BROWN (now deceased), former leader of the Dixie Klan from Chattanooga, Tenn. He said even though there is some similarity, he could not definitely state that they are the same individual. He said this person is unknown to him, but he would talk with one KENNETH LAMAR ADAMS / the former leader of the Dixie Klan at Anniston, and a former close associate of JACK BROWN in an effort to determine if he could identify this person through conversation with ADAMS.

On 4/10/68, this source advised that he had talked with ADAMS during the previous night and he was unable to identify this person, due to the fact that ADAMS kept saying that BROWN had many friends whose names he did not know, or words to that effect. This source described this unknown person as being a white male, about 35 years old, 5'10" to 5'11" tall, approximately 180-190 pounds, and said he has not seen him in the past two years, or since the death of JACK BROWN when he and ADAMS attended BROWN's 44-1987-Sub B-67 funeral in Chattanooga, Tennessee.
