By communication dated April 13, 1968, the Columbia Office of the FBI advised as follows:

CLARENCE SHAKELFORD of New York City, while traveling by Greyhound Bus from Jacksonville, Florida, noted at Walterboro, South Carolina, that a new bus driver boarded the bus at approximately 11 A. M. on April 12, 1968. A new passenger also boarded at Walterboro and sat by SHAKELFORD in the rear of the bus. This passenger reportedly strongly resembled the profile of the artist's conception of the individual who assassinated MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. He was described as a white male, about 45 years of age, 6 feet, 170 pounds, ruddy appearance, sandy-colored or light brown hair with widow's peak with receding hair line on sides, unkempt appearance, long thin nose with high bridge, pale complexion, wearing work pants and no coat, Army-type high boots, and no socks.

At Raleigh, North Carolina, the bus driver, who was described as being heavy and over 6 feet tall, walked to the back of the bus and gave this individual a ticket and mentioned something about having checked the man's blanket. At that time, the individual left the bus and returned a short time later with a khaki, rolled, Army blanket, which was loosely rolled and tied with a light-colored grass cord. Both the blanket and the man's shoes were covered with dried mud of light color. This individual stayed aboard the bus until it reached Richmond, Virginia, where he disembarked.

SHAKELFORD advised he believes this man had some prior conversation with the bus driver concerning the blanket and is certain the bus driver would remember him.

On April 13, 1968, D. R. BOUNDS, Manager, Greyhound Bus Terminal, Greyhound Bus Station, Charleston, South Carolina, advised the description of the driver fitted the description of R. T. HODGENS, who drove one of the two buses which left Walterboro at 11:25 A. M. on April 12, 1968. He advised HODGENS resides at Raleigh, North Carolina, and can be reached through R. P. WELLS, Superintendent, Greyhound Bus Terminal, Morgan Street, Raleigh, North Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA DONALD M. MURRAY:

AT RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA

R. T. HODGENS Greyhound Bus Driver, Raleigh, North Carolina, advised on April 13, 1968, that the incident described by SHAKELFORD occurred on April 9, 1968. He stated an unknown individual with a reddish-tan suitcase and a blanket roll boarded his bus at Florence, South Carolina, at approximately 2:30 P. M. and was observed by Mr. CAMPBELL, bus station manager. This individual is unknown to HODGENS and he was traveling at least as far as Richmond, Vriginia; however, he could have had a ticket to a more distant city. HODGENS said he departed the bus at Raleigh, North Carolina, and can furnish no additional descriptive data or information concerning the unknown individual.

Re JAMES EARL RAY

On April 20, 1968, the Bureau telephonically advised the Charlotte Office of the FBI that a call had just been received at Washington, D. C., from JAMES H. WILLIAMS. a Negro male, who resides at 137 Adams Street, Rochester, New York. WILLIAMS was calling the Bureau from a location near Washington, D. C. He advised that at approximately 11:00 p.m., April 19, 1968, he stopped at an Amoco Service Station on Interstate 85 just before getting to Durham, North Carolina. While at the station a man whom he believes was identical with JAMES EARL RAY drove into the station in a 1960 Chevrolet, gray, with a rust-red top bearing North Carolina License YT-1618. The man put gas in his own car and appeared to be in a hurry to leave. He was described as a white male, 5'11" tall, 185 pounds.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEONARD H. MC/COY:

On April 20, 1968, the records of the Department of Motor Vehicles, Raleigh, North Carolina, revealed that North Carolina License YT-1618 is issued to JERRY WAYNE TREXLER, Box 58, East Spencer, North Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA KENNETH R. SMITH at Salisbury and East Spencer, North Carolina:

On April 20, 1968, W. H. MORGAN, Spencer, North Carolina, advised he is a male carrier and is familiar with JERRY WAYNE TREXLER, a former resident of Spencer who presently resides in East Spencer. MORGAN was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and he advised there does not appear to be any resemblance between RAY and TREXLER.

On April 20, 1968, Mrs. M. B. WINGATE, Clerk, Town Hall, East Spencer, North Carolina, advised that JERRY WAYNE TREXLER resides at 12 Spencer Street, East Spencer, and has resided at that address at least since

December 29, 1967. She was not familiar with TREXLER personally and was unable to advise whether a photograph of RAY looked similar to TREXLER.

CHARLES E. HERRON, Chief of Police, East Spencer, North Carolina, advised on April 20, 1968, that he is familiar with JERRY WAYNE TREXLER inasmuch as he has arrested him several times for drunkenness. He said the police department does not maintain records and he could not recall the exact dates on which he arrested TREXLER. He stated that TREXLER is a long-time resident of Spencer and East Spencer and is employed by the Tar Heel Pavement Company, Salisbury, North Carolina. He viewed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and advised that TREXLER does not resemble RAY.

DAVE SHULER, Chief, Salisbury, North Carolina, Police Department, advised on April 20, 1968, that his records show that JERRY WAYNE TREXLER was arrested April 8, 1963, after causing an accident. At that time he was 20 years of age. SHULER does not know TREXLER personally.

On April 22, 1968, Mrs. MEREDITH NANCE, Tar Heel Construction Company, Salisbury, advised TREXLER has been employed by that company since January 30, 1968, and is still so employed. She said the payroll records show he did not report for work on March 30 or April 4, 1968, but was at work on March 29 and April 3, 1968.

By communication dated April 17, 1968, the Knoxville Office of the FBI advised as follows:

J. BOLES, Representative, Associated Press, Chattanooga, Tennessee, on April 14, 1968, furnished information that he attended college with one JAMES C. GALT of Richmond, Virginia. He said GALT has been employed by DuPont Company in Richmond, Virginia, and was recently transferred to Chattanooga.

Upon contact, JAMES COLQUHOUN GALT informed that he had been with the DuPont Company approximately ten years. (The records of DuPont Company, Chattanooga, indicated he was at work in Chattanooga on April 4, 1968.) GALT further advised he is an only son, however, he does have a cousin, (First Name Unknown) GALT, age 40 to 45. This individual is the son of his father's brother, THOMAS C. GALT, who resides in Raleigh, North Carolina, and works for a railroad.

Mrs. LAURA KICE, 720 Northwood Avenue, Charlottesville, Virginia, or J. D. SIEGFRIED, stepmother and cousin respectively of JAMES C. GALT, possibly have knowledge of the whereabouts of the son of THOMAS C. GALT.

The following investigation was conducted by SA DONALD M. MURRAY at Raleigh, North Carolina:

On April 19, 1968, ED WARREN, Seaboard Coastline Railroad, Raleigh, advised his records reflect CHARLES COLQUHOUN GALT was a former engineer for that company and retired on May 30, 1954. He resided on Morrison Avenue in Raleigh. He died on April 14, 1956, and was survived by his wife, name unknown, who died several years later. The records revealed nothing further regarding him or his family.

The 1956 Raleigh City Directory revealed that LILLIAN GALT, widow, resided at 316 Morrison Avenue and

the 1957 City Directory listed Mrs. BETTY J. GALT, employed at Boylan Pearce Company, as residing at the same address.

On April 19, 1968, Mrs. BETTY BARBOUR, Boylan Pearce Company, Raleigh, advised records revealed that BETTY J. GALT, wife of W. C. GALT, was employed as a secretary from February 21, 1957, to July 26, 1957, and resided at 316 Morrison Avenue. She was twenty-four years old in 1957, had one child, attended junior college in California and previously, in September, 1953, worked at Harolds Department Store, Marksville, Louisiana. Her husband was attending the North Carolina State University.

Mrs. BARBOUR stated that sometime after leaving Boylan Pearce Mrs. GALT filed an unemployment claim at Hessmer, Louisiana, or Alexandria, Louisiana. This was probably in April, 1959.

On April 22, 1968, Mr. T. GREYER, Registrar's Office, North Carolina State University, advised records revealed that WILLIAM C. GALT, 316 Morrison Avenue, Raleigh, born in Pamlico County, North Carolina, attended that school from February 18, 1950, to April 27, 1951, and from January, 1957, to August, 1958. His mother was listed as LILLIAN and he was a U. S. Navy veteran, Navy Serial Number The records contained no information regarding his current whereabouts. He attended Broughton High School, Raleigh, prior to entering State University.

On April 23, 1968, WILLIAM BLACKBURN, Broughton High School. Raleigh. advised his records revealed WILLIAM C. GALT, born Raleigh, resided 316 Morrison Avenue. He attended that school from 1943 until he dropped out in 1947. However, in 1950, he was granted a diploma as a result of passing a military SED test. The records contained no further pertinent information regarding GALT, his family or his whereabouts.

Re JAMES EARL RAY

On April 21, 1968, PETER S. GILCHRIST, 146 Placid Place, Charlotte, North Carolina, advised that on April 12, 1968, he was traveling from Atlanta, Georgia, to Houston, Texas, via Eastern Airlines flight 143. He said this flight left Atlanta at 11:05 a.m. and arrived in Houston at approximately 12:30 p.m.

He said upon viewing JAMES EARL RAY's photograph in the newspapers on April 21, 1968, he is sure that RAY was a passenger on the flight to Houston. He said an individual sat directly across the isle from him on this flight and that this individual was traveling without luggage. The only difference between RAY and this individual was the color of hair. He said the man on the plane was blond haired but otherwise had the same characteristics as RAY.

He advised that there were approximately 45 or 50 individuals on the flight but as far as he knew this individual was the only other individual who got off at Houston.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs L. HOLMES ELEAZER and CRAWFORD F. WILLIAMS at Charlotte, North Carolina:

On April 23, 1968, GILCHRIST was reinterviewed, at which time he advised that on the Eastern flight number 133 from Atlanta to Houston on April 12, 1968, he sat on the right side of the plane near the trailing edge of the wind. The individual he thinks looks like JAMES EARL RAY sat directly across the isle from him in the outside seat on the left side of the plane. He did not observe this individual before boarding the plane and did not observe this individual after they left the plane at Houston. He advised that he, GILCHRIST, was sitting on the side of the plane which had three seats and the unknown man was sitting on the side which had two seats. There were not any passengers sitting between

....

them. In front of GILCHRIST was a Negro girl. Other passengers surrounding them were not observed.

He described the unknown man he thinks looks like JAMES EARL RAY as a white male, 35 to 40 years of age, mature looking, 170-175 pounds, medium build, well dressed, no hat observed, wearing a brown suit with a fleck of gold or yellow in it, white shirt, tie and brown shoes. No scars or marks were observed and no glasses were observed. The man looked like he was in good health. He had no nervous habits which were observed. He had a conventional haircut and his hair was light brown and combed to one side. Overall the man gave a nice looking appearance.

GILCHRIST said that he, GILCHRIST, was carrying with him on the plane a small gray suitcase and was wearing olive-colored sport coat and grayish-green slacks. He did not observe the unknown man with any baggage on the plane.

GILCHRIST was shown various photographs of RAY and he advised that the profile photograph of RAY taken March 17, 1960, looks like the man he observed except for the hair. He said he did not observe the man's ears and would have seen only his right ear in any event.

During the flight, which lasted for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, the unknown man was not observed talking to anyone, including passengers or flight personnel. He stood up once in the isle and stretched his arms over his head and immediately sat down again. GILCHRIST said he could furnish no additional information regarding this man but reiterated that he looked like the profile drawing and photographs of KING's assassin.

FREDDIE WILLIAMS, 2613 North Bayou Drive, Golden Meadow, Louisiana, advised that a white male, age 35, 5'11" tall, 160 pounds, brown hair, dark complexion, who resembled a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, rented a room at WILLIAMS' residence from April 8 to April 11, 1968, with another white male, age 25, 5'8" tall, 140 pounds, light complexion, names of these individuals unknown to WILLIAMS.

He stated these individuals were driving a 1964 Ford two-door bearing 1968 North Carolina License YM-6355 determined to be registered to JOHN C. COWELL, Route 3, Box 135, Jacksonville, North Carolina. They departed Golden Meadow at 4:00 p.m., April 11, 1968, on a boat, name unknown, destined for Fort Isabelle, Texas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM PEARSON:

On April 19, 1968, Patrolman BILLY WOODWARD, Jacksonville, North Carolina, Police Department, advised that North Carolina registration records reflect 1968 North Carolina License YM-6355 is registered to JON D. COWELL, Box 255, Jacksonville, North Carolina, for a 1964 Ford two-door.

On April 20, 1968, VICTOR MELTS, Manager, ABC Laundry and Cleaners, Jacksonville, North Carolina, advised COWELL was employed as a truck driver for about three years until February 19, 1968. At that time COWELL, who is separated from his wife, took another woman, BETTY LAWSON, and allegedly went to Florida. He stated he had just received a letter from COWELL dated April 19, 1968, in which COWELL stated he was working on a shrimp boat and gave an address of Post Office Box 10, Cameron, Louisiana

The following investigation was conducted by SA DONALD M. MURRAY at Raleigh, North Carolina:

On April 10, 1968, Captain ROBERT E. GOODWIN, Raleigh Police Department, advised that on April 10, 1968, he received the following information from a confidential source:

One JEFF CROWELL of Wadesboro, North Carolina, in some respects appears similar to the artist conception of the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. CROWELL's nose and receding hairline are similar to the artist conception.

CROWELL worked for the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, Charlotte, until about two years ago. He was originally from Wadesboro, North Carolina, area but traveled throughout the State of North Carolina for Southern Bell and on weekends it was his habit to travel out of state. Consequently, he maintained no permanent residence. CROWELL admitted membership in the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (UKA) in Wadesboro and was known to have Klan literature in his car. He talked strongly on occasions about his feelings favoring segregation.

The last time the source heard of CROWELL was about eighteen months ago at which time he was self-employed and was selling some type of copying equipment in Charlotte.

CROWELL was described as follows:

SUTTON further advised that code number 20k-1 has not been used since 1/50/68, and would have been used prior to this in August of 1967, but due to the fact that he records are available, it would be impossible to determine who might have been assigned this code at that time or the color of the code used. SUTTON furnished samples of Thermo-seel tape used in his business for submission to the FBI Laboratory.

SUTTON was exhibited Wanted Flyer maker 442-A for JAMES EARL RAY, at which time he advised that he could not identify this individual as being identical with anyone he has observed in the past.

On 4/23/68, ROBERT POOLE, manager, Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma, advised SA NYLLIAM 8, FARRIS that his firm uses a code such as 20R-3. The latter in the code is changed weekly and the entire sighabet is utilized. By celculating on a cleadar POOLE was able to determine that the symbol 20R-3 would have been in use from noon, 9/22/67 through noon 9/29/67. Prior to this time the code would have been used in March, 1967. In March 1968, the code would have been used again but in March, 1968, POOLE's firm was not using a Thermo-seel marking machine. Prior to September, 1967, the firm was using a Thermo-seel marking machine which is no longer in operation but this machine produced a wider tape. This particular tape smeat a wider tape than the current machine being used and the tape used was gold in color. POOLE stated his firm does not retain records on home delivery transactions over 3 months. They do have available records on cash items at the counter. Sumbols 20R-2 and 20R-4 were located and POOLE stated this indicates 20R-3 was a home delivery as which no records are available. Samples of the Thermo-seal laundry markings were obtained from POOLE for submission to the PBI Laboratory.

SHARON ALLISON, 4426 Sheltenham, telephone 729-4961 called this morning and advised that she and her husband stopped at the Holiday Inn Motel Coffee Shop on Highway 187 in Corsicana, Texas at about noon on April 22, 1968. She stated as they entered the coffee shop, she observed a man seated in the front booth by the door and she remarked to her husband that he looked just like the picture of the man wanted in the MARTIN LUTHER KING killing. She stated she then noticed that the man was seated next to a blonde woman and she immediately remembered that JAMES EARL RAY was reported to be possibly traveling with a blonde haired woman. She stated that this woman later appeared in the women's restroom while Mrs. ALLISON was in there attending to her infant daughter. She was able to closely observe this woman and she described her as being in her middle 30's, , 120-130 pounds, long blonde hair, olive complexion, 5'6-5'7" attractive but coarse looking, wearing white burmuda shorts with white knee length socks. Mrs. ALLISON observed that she was not wearing a wedding ring. Mrs. ALLISON stated she did not observe the man standing but that he resembled the pictures she has seen of JAMES EARL RAY, although she did not observe any scars on his face. She stated the one outstanding characteristic about him was that his hair, which was black, appeared to be thinning noticeably in the back. He was dressed in plaid burmuda shorts and was wearing a striped shirt. She stated the waitress that waited on the couple was named LENA according to the name plate she wore on her uniform.

Mrs. ALLISON stated she could positively identify this woman if a photograph is available.

HOWARD STAFFORD called long distance at 11:45 this morning and advised he is staying with his brother ARNOLD GENE STAFFORD in Victoria, Texas, telephone 573-2017. STAFFORD stated at the time MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot, he was living in a rooming house at 336 Hyde Park Avenue, Tampa, Florida. He stated two days after KING was shot a man moved into the rooming house whose name he does not know. He stated he had observed this man on occasions and only from the back. He stated his appearance was most unusual in that his ears did not match. He stated by that he means one was larger and protruding out from his head more than the other one. He stated his build appeared to be the same as JAMES EARL RAY. STAFFOR stated the man's actions were most unusual in that he very seldom left his apartment and on those few occasions that he did leave, it was always late at night or in the early morning hours. He stated he is quite sure that this man was having an affair with a woman who had an apartment adjoining his (STAFFORD). He does not know the name of this woman, but she has been residing at the rooming house for some time. He stated that the owner of the rooming house, a Mrs. SCHUSTER would be able to furnish the names of the woman and the man. STAFFORD stated he left the rooming house last Sunday and came to Victoria and at that time, the man was still residing at the rooming house.
