RE: JOSEPH LUNCEFORD

By communication dated April 9, 1968, the Savannah Office of the FBI advised that information had been received to the effect that one JOSEPH LUNCEFORD was in Darien, Georgia, on that date and closely resembled the artist's conception of the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. The information also revealed that LUNCEFORD was in contact with someone at Clinton, North Carolina, telephone number 592-9345. He was accompanied by a white female and a small child and was driving a pink Nash or Rambler with a light colored top, bearing 1968, North Carolina license HF-7050.

LUNCEFORD was described as a white male, age 30 to 35, 5 feet 8 inches tall to 5 feet 10 inches tall, medium build, sandy, receding hair.

The following investigation was conducted by IC MARION E. HILLIARD:

AT RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA

On April 11, 1968, SARA WATSON, Registration Section, North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles, advised that MONNIE MATHIS PETERSON, Route 2, Box 150-A, Clinton, North Carolina, is the registered owner of a 1962 Rambler, bearing 1968 North Carolina license HF-7050.

AT CLINTON, NORTH CAROLINA

On April 11, 1968, Mrs. MAMIE MATHIS, Route 2, Box 245, Clinton, North Carolina, advised that her daughter, MONNIE LEONE PETERSON, is the owner of a 1962

Rambler, bearing 1968 North Carolina license HF-7050. She said that on April 5, 1968, her daughter told her she was leaving Clinton in search of employment and said she would call home when she was settled. Mrs. MATHIS stated she believes her daughter is in the company of an individual named JOSEPH LUNCEFORD, and that her daughter has one of her children, a five-year-old boy, with her. She said that on April 6, 1968, she received a telephone call from her daughter, at which time she was in a town near West Palm Beach, Florida.

Mrs. MATHIS said her daughter has talked about JOSEPH LUNCEFORD for the past two or three weeks, and to the best of her knowledge, LUNCEFORD has been employed somewhere in Clinton as a mechanic. He is believed to be originally from Durham, North Carolina. She advised that she never saw LUNCEFORD and knows very little concerning him. Mrs. MATHIS advised that her telephone number is 592-3495.

On April 19, 1968, Mrs. MATHIS advised that she had received no information concerning her daughter's whereabouts or the whereabouts of JOSEPH LUNCEFORD.

On April 24, 1968, Mrs. MATHIS advised that on that date she had received a letter from her daughter, MONNIE, showing her return address as 26-A Garden Apartments, Boca Raton, Florida. She advised that her daughter did not mention JOSEPH LUNCEFORD in the letter.

RE: JIMMY RAY BUNDY

By communication dated April 23, 1968, the San Diego Office of the FBI advised as follows:

On April 22, 1968, a Mrs. WILLIAMS telephonically advised that approximately one and one half weeks previously a male cousin of a neighbor and another male individual named JIMMY RAY BUNDY visited a neighbor of hers. The cousin was driving a car bearing North Carolina license. Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that she and her husband thought that BUNDY bore a striking resemblance to ERIC STARVO GALT and that his actions while at the neighbor's home were most circum-spect. She said that BUNDY had a peculiar reluctance to converse and that he left rather unexpectedly, hitchhiking his way south.

Upon contact, Mrs. WILLIAMS advised that the neighbor to whom she referred is Mrs. MARJORIE GREGG, who resides directly across the street from her home at 138 Quail Drive, Chula Vista, California. The neighbor's cousin was driving a 1957 Chevrolet bearing North Carolina license HJ-7057.

Mrs. WILLIAMS said that she had determined that JIMMY RAY BUNDY was taken to Alpine, California, by Mrs. GREGG several days previously and was let out at which time he began hitchhiking back to North Carolina.

MILTON GRAY MANNING, temporary resident at 138 Quail Drive, advised he is the cousin of MARJORIE GREGG, the owner of that residence. He said about April 9, 1968, he and a friend, JIMMY RAY BUNDY, left Greenville, North Carolina in his Chevrolet en route to California. He said they were in California for about one and one half weeks, and when BUNDY departed he was hitchhiking to Greenville, North Carolina or Portsmouth, Virginia.

BUNDY was employed by his father, who operates his own real estate company in Portsmouth. His mother, Mrs. IDA SAWYER, lives in the Village Grove Section of Greenville, North Carolina, and is married to RUDELL SAWYER.

Mrs. MARJORIE GREGG verified the information furnished by MANNING and advised that she took BUNDY to Alpine, California, on April 19, 1968, where he began hitchhiking to North Carolina.

Mrs. GREGG advised she has known BUNDY and his family for many years, and when shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, she stated there was no resemblance between BUNDY and RAY.

MANNING also advised that there is no resemblance between BUNDY and RAY.

Main Street, Kalamazoo, Michigan. **BUCHANAN** informed this
was a bundle of six shirts belonging to one "GRIFFIN", 1206
Summit, Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Enclosed herewith is one handkerchief containing
colored samples of tape with the printing of the machines
utilized by the Paw Paw Laundry.

It is requested that the FBI Laboratory compare
the printing found on the markings of sheet and pillow case
with the samples appearing on the enclosure. In the event
there is no direct comparison, the material may be destroyed.
It is requested that the results be furnished to Detroit and
Memphis.

arriving at her home and have been coming to her home since; however, she denies having participated in this correspondence in any way. She has saved all letters received and displayed them for review. None of the letters viewed were from RAY under any of his known aliases. She claimed she was not acquainted with RAY or any of his known aliases. She was left a copy of the I.O. on RAY and advised she would immediately contact the FBI if she received any contact from RAY or anyone with a picture resembling him.

AT CHICO, CALIFORNIA

Owner of dwelling at 244 Oak St., Chico, advised has owned dwelling at this address since January, 1965, and does not recall PATRICIA TEVES. A neighborhood resident remembers name of TEVES; however, possesses no information. The 1964 Chico "Polk's City Directory" lists a GERALD and PATRICIA TEVES at 419 West 6th St., Chico. Occupation listed as U. S. Army. Subsequent directories negative re TEVES family. U. S. Post Office, Chico, has no address in records under TEVES name. Forwarding addresses cleared every two years by U.S. Post Office, Chico. No record Chico PD re TEVES family.

It would appear PATRICIA TEVES would not have received correspondence from "Swinger Correspondence Club" in view of U. S. Post Office clearing forwarding addresses every two years and Sacramento contemplates no investigation re TEVES.

AT FRESNO, CALIFORNIA

CONSUELO RIVERA, 1137 Tuolumne Avenue, Fresno, sister of CHRISTINA RIVERA, advised CHRISTINA has been married 3 years and previously belonged to Swinger Correspondence Club and all mail received from club during past 3 years destroyed by CONSUELO at CHRISTINA's request since CHRISTINA has a jealous husband and mail was vulgar in content. CONSUELO does not recall any correspondence from GALT or ERIC and added all mail received was destroyed without attention to sender. She advised no mail was forwarded to CHRISTINA and CHRISTINA has no knowledge of contents of mail.

JEAN STATON, aka. Jean Slaton, 1184 N. Marks Avenue, Fresno, advised she formerly resided in trailer court at 2827 W. Clinton. She advised she may be listed as member of club but never signed up for membership. She has, however, received a quantity of mail as result of joining two other clubs. She stated most of mail vulgar in content and she could recall no correspondence with anyone named ERIC or GALT and photograph of GALT not familiar to her. A review of correspondence in her possession failed to reflect any correspondence from ERIC or GALT.

This is being suggested in light of the possibility that subject may have rented such a box and then while fleeing may have made entry for the purpose of withdrawing valuables.

BILLY BROWN AEBY, Stark Road, Seagoville, Texas, phone AT 6-3042, interviewed in the Dallas Office, advised he is unemployed and his wife, **MARY**, works at the General Office of Gibson Products Company, Seagoville. **AEBY** advised he has five brothers as follows:

AUBREY, an inmate at the U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas;

KEAL, an inmate at the Texas State Penitentiary;

OTIS, a shampoo salesman residing in Houston, Texas;

FRANKLIN, engaged in the lumber business in Wisconsin;

JAMES, a Dallas, Texas businessman who operates a Mobil Station, Lovers Lane and Preston Road.

AEBY stated he is on bond at this time in connection with possession of narcotics charges in Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas. He said he expects to plead guilty to these charges if he can get an agreement on about eight years in the penitentiary as a sentence. He desires to begin serving his sentence as soon as possible. These are state charges.

AEBY said he entered Missouri State Penitentiary in 1961 to serve three concurrent nine year sentences for armed robbery out of St. Louis, Missouri. He was transferred to a prison farm in 1964. During the period of 1961-64 he was acquainted with **JAMES EARL RAY**, whom he knew as **JIMMIE RAY**. Both were employed in the prison bakery where **RAY** was considered a good worker. **RAY** worked both in the pastry crew and bread crew and in the latter capacity was a bread slicer and packager. **AEBY** speculated that if **RAY** were to seek a legitimate job on the outside, it might be in the bakery field since he would appear to be qualified to some degree in this area.

AEBY classed **RAY** as being "money hungry" and he dealt extensively in the sale of amphetamine powder and benzadrine to other inmates, such items apparently being obtained by **RAY** through prison guards. **RAY** used amphetamine on a restricted basis himself, but **AEBY** thought he was more interested in the money derived from sales. The amphetamine

powder is injected in solution in the human body.

ABBY stated RAY kept to himself a great deal and did not attempt to meddle in other peoples' business. The only inmate with whom RAY was apparently associated to any degree, was a man, name not recalled, 50 years old or more, who got caught with bullets in his pocket and was sent to an isolation ward as a result. ABBY recalled that one occasion, RAY had an inmate named GREEN beaten up by two other inmates because of non payment to RAY for amphetamine powder. One of the inmates who beat GREEN up was recalled as (first name unknown) WADE from Kansas City. ABBY mentioned that one EARL HARRIS, a Negro "kingpin" from St. Louis, sold amphetamine powder to Negroes and was believed to have known RAY. He recalled also one RALPH GERTON would possibly have known RAY, but not intimately.

The only relative RAY ever spoke of was a brother in St. Louis who was apparently a middle man for money paid by relatives and friends of inmates for amphetamine powder. This was a dangerous device by which persons on the outside would pay for the powder on behalf of their relatives and friends. RAY'S brother, in turn, was believed to have turned the money over to a lawyer who was trying to get an appeal on RAY'S robbery conviction. ABBY believed RAY'S brother was undoubtedly in the hoodlum element.

ABBY recalled RAY as having the general appearance, except for hair, of the 1960 photos of RAY which appear on the FBI Identification Order No. 4182. He said RAY normally wore his hair medium length, possibly with a part which was believed on the left side. ABBY stated he would not have recognized RAY from a stand up photo which appeared in some newspapers and would not have recognized him from a 1968 photo of RAY under the name of ERIC STARVO GALT. This name is unknown to ABBY.

ABBY described RAY as having a normally modulated voice, possibly having a midwestern accent. He said RAY had clean personal habits, did not use profanity or vulgar language to any marked degree, is likely a good dresser, and would likely have the general appearance of a businessman on the outside. He said it appeared to him RAY probably has a high school education.

ABBY said RAY was not recalled to have had any special

interest or to have ever commented regarding Negroes, Ku Klux Klan, his army service, sports, foreign travel, women friends, homosexuality, clubs, drinking, and the outside world in general. He liked to play poker and AEBY considers he was a good player. He is not a braggart, is usually mild mannered and might appear timid to persons who do not know him well. AEBY has no knowledge that RAY had any interest in "hard narcotics".

AEBY said he considered RAY'S normal criminal occupation as apparently armed robbery, based on conversation, that he would be of the "hit and run" type covering wide areas. He said he cannot conceive that RAY would have killed MARTIN LUTHER KING except for money. He said since RAY was "on the lam" he would only be asking for trouble to have killed KING except for money.

AEBY said he does not specifically recall anything unusual regarding RAY'S features or personal nervous habits. He said he would not know where to begin looking for RAY if it was his job to find him. He said he does not anticipate RAY will attempt to contact him, although RAY unquestionably knew AEBY was from the Dallas area. He stated he expects to be "on the street" for a week or more at best, but would cooperate if RAY should contact him or should other information of value come to his attention.
