

Mr. GLENN MORNIG, 602 Gray Ave., Wildwood, owner and operator of the Family Diner, Edvised in 1957 or 1958, he employed as a cook and dishwasher for a short period of time a paroles from the Illinois State Prison at Menard, Ill., one HARVEY LOWRYER. According to HORNIG, LOWMYER only worked for him for a short period of time and this was at his night club that he, HOENIG, operated at Chester, Ill.

MOINIG advised he believes LOVMIER was merving a sentence for "armed robbery" when he was paroled.

He recalled that LOVEYER indicated he had a sister in El Cajon, Calif. MORNIG was of the opinion that LOVEYER went to California after leaving his employment.

According to HORNIG, he never had any further contact with LOWKER after he left his employment in Illinois. He advised, however, the Illinois State Prison System should have a file regarding LOVEYER.
