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HARRELL in September, 1952, at Lake Village, Arkansas, and had lived with him for one year, separating from him in September, 1953. She said that in December, 1953, she gave birth to a daughter who is now 14 years of age. She stated that following separation, she has heard that her ex-husband had been in prison and she stated that as a matter of fact he had been arrested by the Flagstaff Sheriff's Office and sent to the Arizona State Penitentiary, Florence, Arizona, for non-support in connection with their child. She said this is the last she had seen of thim, but that she understood that he had later returned to Arkansas and had obtained a divorce.

Mrs. WILSON advised that she and DAVID WILSON were married in January or February, 1965, and that that summer they went to Idaho. She stated that while they were in Idaho "JIMMIE" HARRELL came to Flagstaff, Arizona, and was out to the house of her sister, TILLIE HERNANDEZ, looking for her, EDNA WILSON. She stated that HARRELL was not given any information as to her whereabouts, however, at that time.

Mrs. WILSON advised that HARRELL was about 40 years of age, 5' 9-10" tall, 150 to 160 pounds, small boned, brown hair and brown eyes. She said that he was born in Mississippi, but that he was brought up in Lake Village, Arkansas. She stated that HARRELL's parents resided in Lake Village, Arkansas, and that she believed his father's first name was EMMETT. She further stated that HARRELL has a married sister, FANNIE (last name unknown), at McGee, Arkansas.

Mrs. WILSON advised that HARRELL had had various relatives in Flagstaff, Arizona, principally an aunt and uncle, but she believed that they probably no longer reside in Flagstaff. She said also in Flagstaff he had had a cousin, PAUL HARRELL, who had married a Mexican girl named MOLLY.

Mrs. WILSON stated that she had no recent information concerning HARRELL. She recalled, however, that on the night her husband had taken her to Flagstaff, Friday,

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April 12, 1968, her husband DAVID WILSON had picked up some of the children at the show and then had gone by the Snack Shack in Flagstaff to see if RONNIE HERNANDEZ, the 17-year-old son of her sister TILLIE HERNANDEZ, wanted a ride home. She said that RONNIE declined the ride and later mentioned that some guy or guys in the Snack Shack had questioned him after DAVE had left concerning the identity of DAVE, apparently eliciting the information that he was married to her, KDNA WILSON. RONNIE was also asked where DAVE WILSON had obtained the car he was driving, which Mrs. WILSON said was a rental vehicle, and that RONNIE told the inquirer that he had paid cash for it. Mrs. WILSON stated that HARRELL used to go to the Snack Shack and that it might just be possible that he could have been there and questioned RONNIE or overheard someone else questioning RONNIE.

Mrs. WILSON advised that she had never heard her husband say anything indicating he had any knowledge of the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

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The following investigation was conducted by SA ERREST J. VAN LOCK:

AT PROBRIZ, ARIZOMA

On April 22, 1968 FLOYD L. MINARD, Identification Bureau, Phoenix Police Department, nevised that a search of his records failed to locate any information concerning DAVID WILSON, berm , or one CLARENCE CLARE, described approximately in his fortion, five feet one or two inches tall, 135 to 140 pounds.

Mr. MICHAEL F. GROCK, Supervisor, Drivers License Records, Motor Vehicle Division, Arizona Highway Department, advised IC LESLIE SANDERLIN, JR. on April 29, 1968 there is no record of a driver's license issued to DAVID BELL VILSON of either Phoenix or Flagstaff. Arizons.

By communication dated April 22, 1968 the Dallas Division reported that T. L. MAULDIN, Records Clerk, Federal Correctional Institution (FCI), Texarkane, Texas, advised that the records of that institution show that DAVID L. WILSON, FCI Number 12591, was received on Navonber 7, 1961 and was transferred to the Federal Correctional Institution, Tallahassee, Florida on January 12, 1962.

Mr. MAVIDIM further advised that one CLARENCE JAMES CLARE, age 38 in 1956, FCI 11353, was serving a sentence for White Slave Traffic Act violation at FCI, Texarkana, until he was transferred to the Federal Respital, Springfield, Missouri on July 17, 1961. He was scheduled for release in 1961, exact date not given, with time off for good behavior. CLARE would then have been on conditional release for 336 days. CLARE was shown as being from Lake Charles, Louisians. CLARE and VILDOW were not at the FCI, Texarkana, Texas at the same time, according to these records.

By communication dated April 22, 1968 Jacksonville reported that the records of the Florida State Prison, Raiford, Florida, reflect that DAVID L. VILSON, Immate Number 6474747, FBI Number 792242C, was received November 21, 1988 to serve two years for escape from Pasco County, Florida Jail where he was originally convicted on a rebsery charge.

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PI 44-371 ME 44-1597 IJVL/mcl VILEGE was released April 6, 1969 upon expiration of mentence. We record of a CLARENCE CLARE was located at the Exiford Prison, based on the information available. Examination of records of the Florida Division of Corrections, Tellahossee, Florida, fails to locate a further record on VILSON, or any record for CLARK. Records of the FCI, Tallahausee, show that DAVID VILSON was received from Texarkana, Texas on January, 1962, and was pareled September 4, 1962. FCI, Tallahassee, had no record on CLARK. By communication dated April 23, 1965 the Kansas CLARE. V. S. Pomitontiary Number 76195-L. demortbed as follows:

In view of the physical description of this individual it would not appear that he is identical to the CLARRET CLARK previously referred to by DAVID L. WILSON.

A review of the Identification Records of DAVID LINDSET WILSON, FBI Number 7922420, me of April 22, 1968, and JANES RARL RAY, FRI Number 405 942 G, as of April 22. 1968, fails to indicate that these two individuals were ever incarcorated in a common institution at the same time.

By communication dated April 22, 1968 the Houston Division advised that CLARENCE EUGERE BEIZERDINE, Els Springs, Arkansas, interviewed at Houston, advised that in the summer of 1967 he and DAVID L. VILSON were on a crosscountry run for Shaw Company when their truck was stopped at Labanon, Missouri by the police while WILBOW was driving. Wilson was charged with drunk griving, BRIZENDINE having been salesp in the truck bunk at the time and was not taken into custody. BRIXENDINE stated that he spent that night in the truck cab and the next morning, without an extra

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driver. He returned to the point of origin. BRIKERDING stated that he has not seen VILSON since that time and that he does not knew VILSON's whereabouts. He learned that VILSON was fixed \$100.00 and had called his employer for the fixe payment. BRIKERDING stated he knew very little of the background of VILSON as he had made only one previous read trip with VILSON. He described VILSON as "odd" and pessibly an alcoholic. He said VILSON indicated that his family was at Flagstoff, Arizons. He said he recalled no conversation with VILSON concerning racial problems and he had been unaware of any prison confinement for VILSON.

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PATRICIA HERNANDEZ, 2 Woodland Circle, Flagstaff, Arizona, advised that she is the daughter of TILLIE HERNANDEZ who is the sister-in-law of DAVID L. WILSON. She said she has known WILSON since his marriage to her sunt, EDNA, in 1965. She said that during this time the WILSONs have been irregular but frequent visitors to her home and seemed to have a great deal of personal problems. She said she is fond of DAVID WILSON who has always been kind to her and the other HERNANDEZ children, but knows very little about his personal life prior to his marriage to EDNA.

Miss HERNANDEZ advised that, during her acquaintance with DAVID WILSON, he has never brought a personal friend or acquaintance to her home other than local people with whom she was already acquainted. She advised that she can recall no acquaintance with anyone associated with WILSON who speaks with a Southern accent. She said she has never heard the name GLARENCE GLARE and it means absolutely nothing to her.

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JOE HERNANDEZ, 2 Woodland Circle, Plagstaff, Arizona, advised he has known DAVID L. WILSON for approximately four years, most of this period as the husband of his wife's sister. EDNA. During this period his association with WILSON has been only as a host on numerous weekend visits. He is aware that WILSON has spent considerable time in prison, but WILSON did not ever go into detail concerning these experiences. He does not consider himself in any way close to WILSON, although he does like him and feels sorry for him for the difficulty he seems to have with his personal life. He can add very little to the statement given by his wife as his own relationship with WILSON has been far more limited.

On Friday, April 19, 1968, he returned from work late at night. He was awake at the time WILSON arrived at his home from Phoenix, but spoke to him only briefly before retiring for the night. He was not awake during WILSON's second visit that night and he was away from the house working all day Saturday.

He is absolutely certain that none of WILSON's former friends or associates have ever visited his home during the period of his acquaintance with WILSON. He is unacquainted with the name of CLARENCE CLARE and has never met anyone by that name. WILSON was alone when he arrived at his home on Friday night.

He, HERNANDEZ, was at home during the late afternoon of Saturday, April 20, 1968, when WILSON returned in the company of a policeman. He observed WILSON's behavior at that time and described it as "very umsual." WILSON kept to himself and cried alot. He did not discuss the details of the afternoon, nor his conversation with the FBI or the policeman.

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Mrs. TILLE HERMANDEE, 2 Woodland Circle, Flagstaff, Arizona, advised as follows:

The is the mister of EDMA VILSON, wife of DAVID L. WILSON. WILSON married EDMA in January, 1965, at Villiams, Arizona. She knows no details of VILSON's prison record prior to his marriage to EDMA but is aware of the fact that he has spent time in a number of prisons. VILSON has not been in trouble with the law, to her knowledge, since his marriage to EDMA.

She can think of no former friends or associates of WILSON who have visited her home in Plagstaff, even for a brief period of time, during her acquaintance with WILSON. The only associates of WILSON who have been to the house are local people of Mexican-American descent with whom she is personally acquainted. Her sister has never mentioned visits by personal friends of WILSON during her marriage to him nor any personal, distante she may have for these associates.

On the evening of Friday, April 19, 1968, WILSON arrived at her home at approximately midnight. He had just driven from Phoemix, Arizona, in a rented car in order to see his wife and children who were temporarily staying in Plagstaff with various relatives. HIMA was not at her house at this time but at the house of their mother, Mrs. JUANITE CASABOS, 219 Pine Street, Flagstaff. Upon his arrival, WILSON was alone and made no reference to having driven anyone else from Phoenix to Flagstaff. She has never met anyone by the name of CLARENCE CLARE nor has she ever heard the mame mentioned by either WILSON or EDNA. After his arrival on Friday might, WILSON ate some enchilidas and visited with her briefly. He appeared to have been drinking although was not heavily intoxicated. He left her home shortly after 1:00 a.m. and went to the home of her mother to see HIMA. He maid he wanted KDNA to return to Phoenix with him.

Wilden returned to her home about one-half hour later and told her that MMA had refused to return to Phoenix with him giving her medical treatment by the local family

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physician as her reason. He said he had given EDNA some money with which to purchase bus tickets for her and the children in order for them to join him in Phoenix later in the week. WILSON drank some coffee then again departed the HERNANDEZ home shortly after 2:00 a.m. At the time, he said he was planning to return to Phoenix. She learned the next day from EDNA that he had not returned to Phoenix but had returned, instead, to the CASADOS house where he spent the remainder of the night with her.

On Saturday, April 20, 1968, WILSON returned to her home with EDNA and the children to visit. Shortly after their arrival, she had to leave to keep a beauty shop appointment. She later learned from her brother, ALBERT CASADOS, that shortly after her departure he (CASADOS) accompanied WILSON with all the children to a nearby Dairy Queen for ice cream. According to her brother, when they returned, they spotted the car of the interviewing agent in the HERNANDEZ driveway. According to her brother, upon sighting the car WILSON stated "That's a cop car, I have got to get out of here." According to her brother, they drove around the block and waited a while until the FBI car disappeared, then returned. WILSON returned to the HERNANDEZ house and let off ALBERT CASADOS and all children. He then re-entered his car and disappeared for several hours. re-appeared in the late afternoon and was joined shortly thereafter by a policeman whose car he entered and with whom he drove away. She recognized the policeman but does not know his name.

Mrs. HERNANDEZ advised that her sister's marriage to WILSON has been a strain on both she and her husband and the entire family at large. She said WILSON is generally pleasant and friendly but drinks heavily, frequently lapses into despondency, and has difficulty holding a job. She said that, on the occasions when he is out of work, the family is forced to support EDNA and the children. She said that since EDNA's marriage to him, he has abandoned her twice. She said that shortly after their marriage EDNA

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Eastern states in search of work. She said that after several months absence, EDNA telephoned from Jamestown, Tennessee, in a state of near hysteria, saying she was destitute and WILSON had abandoned her. She said the family chipped in and sent EDNA bus fare back to Flagstaff. She said that upon her arrival, EDNA discovered she was pregnant and just before the birth of their first child, WILSON re-appeared without notice. She EDNA and WILSON reconciled and again took off for Idaho and Utah where he worked at several mining jobs. She said they returned to Arizona and WILSON again found work as a miner in Superior, Arizona.

Mrs. HERNANDEZ advised that, during the late spring of 1967, WILSON again disappeared in search of work, leaving EDNA behind. She said that at this time EDNA was again pregnant with twins born in November, 1967. She said WILSON stayed away through the summer of 1967 and the only contact from him that she recalls was while he was in jail in a small town in Missouri. She said she recalls that he was working as a truck driver at the time. She said she does not know any of the details of this confinement but was certain it was not in connection with a felony.

Mrs. HERNANDEZ advised that upon his return from the FBI interview on Saturday, WILSON behaved peculiarly. She said he was withdrawn, uncommunicative and wept off and on. She said he made a telephone call to his sister, DOROTHY MEYER, in Saline, Michigan. She said she does not know the results of this phone call but received a phone call herself from MEYER on Sunday night, advising that she had sent WILSON some money in order for him to bring the family to Michigan where they could stay with her.

Mrs. HERNANDEZ advised that she was not awake when WILSON returned from his second FBI interview early Sunday morning. She said she saw him later in the morning as he and EDNA spent the rest of the night with her family. She said that WILSON and EDNA and the children left Flagstaff from her home before noon on Sunday, bound for Phoenix.

She said that after their departure, a man named HARVEY WALD, who identified himself as WILSON's employer, arrived at the house by prearrangement with WILSON in order to pick up WILSON's rental car. She said WALD was visibly annoyed at not having been told that WILSON was returning the car himself.

Mrs. HERNANDEZ advised that earlier today she had a telephone call from her sister, EDNA, who said she and WILSON had vacated their residence at 2129 West Lincoln, Phoenix, and that WILSON had lost his job at the body shop and had spoken of mysterious threatening phone calls at work. She said EDNA told her that WILSON had received some money from his sister and was planning to disappear as he felt that he and the family were in danger. She said EDNA, WILSON and the children will be returning to Flagstaff via bus this evening. She said she has absolutely no idea where WILSON is or of what he is afraid.

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Lieutenant ROBERT JACKSON. Plagstaff Police
Department, Plagstaff, Arizona, was re-interviewed by SA
WARNER at the Plagstaff Resident Agency. Lieutenant JACKSON
was reminded of the serious nature of the interview and the
importance of clarifying every statement unde to him on
April 20, 1968 by DAVID WILSON after WILSON fled from the
interview room in which a tape recording of the voice of an
amonymous telephone caller was being played. JACKSON advised
as follows:

En route to the HERNANDEZ home from the Sheriff's Office in Plagstaff, Wilson wept and trembled. He stated that JIMMY RAY did not assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING and that the real killer was still in Atlanta. He stated JIMMY RAY was presently hiding in Pajers (phonetic). Mexico, after fleeing from the assassination conspiracy in which he was designated as the original triager man.

WILSON recognized the voice on the recording as that of an ex-convict with whom he had done prison time in Kansas. This man's identity was known to WILSON but he would not divulge it. WILSON said the assassination compliancy consisted of a group of four or five ex-convicts, all sworn to secrecy, of which the man on the recording was one. WILSON said the voice on the recording was not that of CLARENCE CLARE with whom he had driven from Phoenix to Flagstaff the previous night. The identity of the voice on the tape, WILSON said, would not be unknown for long as he would be found dead within a few days after it had been learned be had been talking.

Lieutement JACKSON advised that these were direct and unequivecal statements by WILSON and definitely were not the result of his own interpretation.

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BAVID L. WILSON, 2129 West Lincoln, was interviewed at the FSI Office, Phoenix, Arizona, concerning his know-ledge of JAMES RANL BAY, who was being sought for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

WILSON advised that he has been in Phoenix since November, 1967, except for a brief period around Christmas and Nov Years when he was in Flagstaff, Arizona, and worked for Southwest Lumber Company. He said that he began working for the Continental Body Shop in Phoenix in Movember, 1967, and that he worked there until he went to Flagstaff briefly and that he has worked at the Continental Body Shop since his return from Flagstaff in January, 1968.

VILSON stated that he married his wife MDNA WILSON in 1965 at Flagstaff, Arizona, and that they have five children. He said that his wife and the children have been in Flagstaff visiting his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. LOUIS CASAROS.

VILSON stated that he knew JAMES RAM, RAY, about whom he had earlier been questioned at Flagstaff, Arizona, where he had gone to pick up his wife and return her to Phoenix. He said that the last time he had seen RAY, whom he referred to as "JYMMIX", was during the previous summer, namely the summer of 1967. He said that he may RAY at some little town in Hissauri where he had been arrested while driving a truck. He stated he believed the name of this town was Lupton or Lufton, Missouri. WILSON related in this regard that at the time he was in the company of GENN SRISHMOISE (phometic) of Rim Springs, Arkaness, a truck driver for Villia Show of RIM SPRINGS, Arkaness. WILSON said that he and MRISHMOISE had been drinking and that SRISHMOISE was out flat on his back. In order to protect SRISHMOISE, he VILSON, got behind the sheel and, upon being arrested, was thus charged with "WI." He said that he was finds an inspectable assent, promibly \$50, \$100 or \$150 and that he had so money to pay this fine. He stated that his sister sent him some postal money or protect.

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get the money. He said that he is still negotiating with the government concerning the money he was supposed to get through these postal money orders. He stated that as a result he remained in jail for three or four weeks until the money due him came from the trucking company and when it arrived, he was able to pay his fine and secure his release from jail.

WILSON stated that when he get out of jail, which he said was certainly a county jail, he went into a bar, name unrecalled, about four blocks from the jail. He said he went in this bar to use the telephone and that while in the bar he was approached by RAY who recognized him, saying "You're WILSON aren't you?" WILSON stated that he replied that he was and that he knew he had seen RAY Before some-place, and RAY told him that they had "done time" together. He said that he told RAY that he was broke and the latter gave him \$50 with which he get a motel room that night in some motel with the word "Shady" in the name, and on the next day bought a ticket to return to Flagstaff by bus. WILSON stated this was the last time he saw RAY and when questioned as to when he had seen RAY previous to that, he could not specify an occasion or a place but stated that he knew he had seen him before.

Florida State Prison at Raiford, Florida, in 1958. He said that this was for escape, his having been previously held locally for Theft of Mail and Robbery. While being held on these latter charges he had escaped and was then sentenced to the State Prison. In 1961 he received a Federal sentence for Mail Theft and was imprisoned at Texarkana, Texas, and later at Tallahasse, Florida. WILSON stated he never had served time in the Missouri State Penitentiary but that he had been at the Federal prison, Springfield, Missouri, while being transferred during the serving of his Federal term. He said he was there only briefly, that he was not there for any psychiatric treatment or the like and that he was there merely pending transfer.

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The following photographs, all of which had identifying data covered, were shown to DAVID L. WILSON:

From the foregoing, WILSON selected the photograph of RAY and the photograph of RIFE as being photographs of RAY. He said that the photograph of RAY indicated the face to be too broad and that the photograph of RIFE was the best likeness of RAY.

WILSON was also shown a combination phtograph of two men in overcoats, identified as JAMES EARL RAY on the left and WALTER T. RIFE on the right, and indicated to have been taken March 28, 1955. WILSON stated that the individual in the picture on the right (namely RIFE) was RAY. He referred to the person on the left side of the photograph (namely RAY) as having two lean a face for RAY.

WILSON advised that RAY was probably younger than himself and he stated that he was 36 years of age. He said RAY would be 5' 6-7" tall, 160 pounds. He also stated that RAY continually changed his hair style and when asked about scars or marks, he said that RAY had a scar someplace in

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the forehead area. He picked up the above-described photograph of WALTER T. RIFE and examined it for a scar but said he could not observe any.

WILSON denied that he had made any recent trip to Memphis, Tennessee, from Phoenix, Arizona, and he stated that his employment records would bear this out. He stated that the last time he was on an airplane was sometime prior to November, 1967, at which time he had been visiting his sister in Michigan and he flew from Michigan to Florida. He stated he has not been on an airplane since then.

WILSON denied that he had any information concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., or of a plot on the part of ex-cons to assassinate KING. He denied that he told Lieutenant JACKSON of the Flagstaff Police Department that he had such knowledge or that RAY had been the original triggerman but had backed out the day before and the others involved in the plot pinned it on RAY because RAY was already a wanted person. He further denied that he told Lieutenant JACKSON that the real killer was still in Atlanta and that RAY was presently hiding in any specific place in Mexico. WILSON stated that the enly thing he said to Lieutenant JACKSON to that effect was that if he, WILSON, were RAY, he would be in Mexico.

WILSON stated that prior to his contact by the FBI in Flagstaff earlier on April 20, 1968, he had been completely unaware of any publicity by way of newspaper or radio implicating RAY in connection with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. He stated that he had not read the paper on Friday.

WILSON listened to a tape recording of a male voice saying in substance that DAVID WILSON, the husband of a Mexican girl from Flagstaff, was an ex-convict and an associate of RAY, also known as Galt, and that WILSON had made a trip to Memphis, Tennessee, via Nashville, Tennessee, a day or two prior to the killing of KING, at which time RAY allegedly was also in Memphis. During the running

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of this tape, WILSON stated on several occasions "That's dirty." After listening to the tape, WILSON stated that he did not know the person on the tape who was giving the information partly in a telephone call. When asked if he had any idea as to the identity of the caller, he replied merely that he did not know who it was. He repeatedly gave this answer. He was asked whether the caller was CLARENCE CLARE and he stated it was not. Also, he denied that he had told Lieutenant JACKSON of the Flagstaff Police Department that the caller was another ex-convict from Kansas City. He insisted that the caller was not CLARE while he agreed that CLARE was the only person outside of his family that he could think of who knew he was in Flagstaff at the time.

WILSON related that on Friday, April 19, 1968, he had worked at the Continental Body Shop in Phoenix until approximately 5:30 p.m. and, of course, was in the presence of the boss, JACK BENCHAM, a Mexican fellow named FELIX and a young helper named MIKE. He said that after work he took a bus to 24th Street where he rented a car from the Rite Rate Rent-A-Car. He said he guessed this was possibly about 6:30 p.m. when he rented the car. He said he did not yet have his check cashed and the man let him take the car without putting amy money down, but he then went to Keaton's Market on West Van Buren and cashed his check. Following that he shopped briefly at Keaton's and also at Frye's Market. Next he went to pay his rent at an address that he could not recall. He explained that he had telephoned the Green Realty and had been told to go to a certain individual's house to pay the rent, which was \$26. He said he did this but he cannot recall where the house was.

WILSON advised that after he paid the rent he went to McGoo's, a bar on West Van Buren, at about 19th Avenue. He said that at McGoo's he had only one beer and was not there more than ten minutes. Upon leaving, he met CLARENCE CLARE, who asked him for a ride downtown. He said he had seen CLARE previously in Florida and they had done time together in the Florida State Prison at Raiford, Florida. He said he believed CLARE was in prison for safes. He described CLARE as a man in his 40s, 5' 1-2", 135 - 140 pounds,

Little and thin build, gray hair. He advised that he took CLARK with him and they went back to the Rite Rate Rent-A-Car where he paid the man for the rental of the vehicle. After that he went home and picked up his clothes and drove to Flagstaff, Arizona, with CLARK accompanying him. He said that CLARK was going to go on to Denver, Colorado, after he dropped CLARK off on the street at the college in Flagstaff. He said he thought this was about 9 p.m., and he then went on to the house of his sister-in-law, TILLIE HERMANDEZ. He stated that he recalled watching television at the HERMANDEZ residence but that he could not recall for how long. He said he also drank coffee at TILLIE's and he would guess it was about 1 a.m. when he went to bed. He said there were no visiters who came to the house while he was there.

WILSON stated that the following morning he took the "kids" to get some ice cream at a Dairy Queen and that after he returned home, he learned that FBI Agent WARNER had been there looking for him. He said he dropped the kids off and left immediately, driving around and finally dreve to Truck City. There he waited until his wife found out what the FBI wanted him for. He stated he then contacted Lieutenant JACKSON and arranged to meet him and talk with the FBI.

Mr. WALD, after checking his employment records, adviced that during the week April 1 - 5, 1966, 24720 WILLIAM was employed at the body shop and completed a full week's week on Friday, April 5, 1968.

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Within an hour after his departure from the Coconino County Sheriff's Office (SO), Flagstaff, Arizona, with DAVID L. WILSON, Lieutenant ROBERT JACKSON telephonically contacted SA C. RICHARD WARNER, JR. and related the fellowing information concerning statements made to him by WILSON on their ride home to the HERNANDEZ residence at 2 Woodland Circle. Flagstaff:

WILSON wept and trembled throughout the ride home and intermittantly blurted, "They're trying to pin it on me." He stated that JIMMY RAY did not assassinate MARTIN LUTHER KING, that the real killer is still in Atlanta, Georgia. He said the KING assassination was the result of a plot involving four or five ex-convicts, originally intended to include RAY as the trigger man. He said RAY "chickened out" at the last minute", abandoning the conspiracy and fleeing to Mexico where he is presently hiding at Fajora (phonetic).

WILDER said he immediately recognized the voice on the tape as that of an en-convict with whom he had done time in Eannas. He said this voice was definitely not that of CLARENCE CLARE whom he earlier stated had ridden from Phoenix to Flagstaff with him Friday night. He declined to identify the voice on the tape but said it was that of one of the conspirators. He teld JACKSON that he would soon know the identity of the voice as, when it became known that he had been talking, he would be found dend. He said the voice on the tape belonged to a man from Kansas City.

According to JACKSON, WILSON told him he would like to relate all he knew but was afraid to do so. He said WILSON told him he was in danger of being killed if he talked.

JACKSON advised that, in his conversation with WILSON, WILSON gave him the impression that RAY had come to Phoenix after the assessination, berrowed money from either WILSON or other associates in Phoenix, then proceeded to Mexico. He said WILSON gave him the impression that he had inadvertently become involved wisherhip INFOrmation against

Upon arriving in Flagment's he let CLARE out near the Morthern Arisons University campus in Flagment's and proceeded to the home of his sisteria-law. Hrs. THALES HERMANNES, CLARE did not accompany him to the EMMANNES home as he maid he was bound for Denver Colorado. CLARE is a former ands crucker with whom he had done time in the state penitentiary at Maiford. Florida CLARE is described as a small min, approximately 120 pounds. 5' 3" or 5' 4" this homey face approximately 40 years of age, and noticeable southern drawl. As far as he knows, CLARE had no other means of transportation from Flagment's and was on foot when he was last mean.

as JIM. He first met RAY in prison, although he does not recall which one or at what time. He does know that RAY was, at one time, part of a Florida safe-cracking ring. does not know whether CLARK and RAY are acquainted. He would describe RAY as an "excellent" safe cracker. He last saw RAY during the summer or early fall of 1967. At the time he was driving a truck for Willis Shaw Transport Company, Elm Springs, Arkansas. He had a brief encounter with RAY at a bar in a small town in Missouri. He does not recall the name of the town but knows it began with an L. At the time of his encounter, he had just been released from the local city jail where he had served several days in connection with a charge of driving while intoxicated. At the time of the encounter, he was almost "broke" after having paid his DWI fine. Because of their previous acquaintance, RAY loaned him some money with which to travel home. He (WILSON) has served prison termsat Texarkana, Texas; Springfield, Missouri; Leavenworth, Kansas; Tallahassee, Florida; Dade City, Florida and Raiford, Florida. He has never served time at Atlanta. He was not with RAY when RAY broke out of prison in Missouri. He does have a recollection of RAY in connection with a prison hospital. It seems to him that RAY was regarded as escape prone and, because of this, was personally escorted to the hospital by the prison warden. He has some recollection of RAY attempting to escape from a prison hospital but this memory is not clear.

At this point, WILSON was advised of the complete nature of his interview and told that the previous night, an anonymous telephone caller, with a southern accent, had named him as a close associate of JAMES EARL RAY who had flown from Phoenix to Memphis, Tennessee, two days prior to the MARTIN LUTHER KING assassination. WILSON advised that this allegation was impossible as employment records at the Continental Body Shop, Phoenix, where he is employed, will verify his presence on the job throughout the critical period. He was asked if he had any idea who would attempt to make trouble for him by telephoning the authorities with such an untrue story. He said he had no idea. WILSON was advised that the telephone call had been recorded on tape and asked

if he would listen to it in an effort to help identify the anonymous caller. He agreed to do this and accompanied SA WARNER and Lieutenant JACKSON to the Coconino County Sheriff's Office, Flagstaff.

In a private room at the Sheriff's Office the tape recording of the anonymous telephone call made the previous night was played in the presence of SA WARNER, WILSON and Lieutenant JACKSON. Within a few seconds of play, WILSON's face flushed, his eyes filled with tears and prespiration broke out upon his forehead. He shook his head violently, stated "That's dirty", said that the voice was definitely not CLARENCE CLARK, then fled from the room. WILSON became extremely distraught, unmanageable, and refused to discuss the matter further. He wept sporadically and begged to be taken home. He was escorted home by Lieutenant JACKSON and the interview was terminated.

A review of the Falgstaff City Directories and telephone books from 1965 through the present failed to reflect any listing for DAVID L. WILSON.

LIMPA MOON, Credit Bureau of Flagstaff, advised that she has a file on BAVID L. WILNOW with several collection motices, the largest and most recent of which is from Seaboard Pinnace Company, Flagstaff, for an unsettled balance of \$653.50. The record reflects that VILNOW is a miser by occupation and lists previous addresses as Superior, Arisons, Idaho, and Florida. The file lists three dependents and contains notice of suit for divorce filed in Cocomine County in Nevember of 1967 by his wife, EDMA. The file also reflects an assaylaised attempt to locate him at 2 Woodland Circle, Flagstaff, and lists a previous employer as Vaion Carbide, Mishop, California, until October, 1966. The file also notes that he has a prison record but explains no further.

This action was dissolved upon WILSON's audden reappearance after Thanksgiving, 1967. WILSON was employed locally for a few make at Southwest Porest Industries Saw Hill and then he, KEWA, and the children departed suddenly after the first of the year. She does not know WILSON's present whereabouts.

Later, on April 20, 1868, Mrs. TILLIE MEMANDES telephoned the Flagstaff Resident Agency and naked to be recentacted at 2 Woodland Circle. She said he left Flagstaff shortly after 1 AM. She said their last address in Phoenix was 2129 West Lincoln.

Mrs. WILSON advised that, after leaving Plagataff in January of 1968, she and her husband resided briefly in Avendale, Arimona, She said that in this time, her husband has not been away from ever night with the exception of one night when he was in Phoenix City Jail on a disturbance charge. She said her husband's employment at Continental could be verified for the period covered through the last week in March and the first week in April, 1968.

Coconino County Beputy Sheriff RAY STOCK. lagstaff, Armona, advised that at 2:20 AM, he received a telephone call from a male who reported that he had some important information to give to the FBI but declined to furnish his name. Beputy STOCK stated that at the outset, when the caller indicated the call was important, he immediately cut a tape of the conversation and made available the tape, a transcription of which is set forth below.

Denuty STOCK also stated that during the call and immediately thereafter, he dispatched deputies to truck stops on the outskirts of Flagstaff in an effort to locate the caller who indicated he was having a steak which was getting cold while he talked. This investigative effort developed two license numbers of cars, which later turned out to belong to local people, and failed to locate any place that was serving or had served a steak at the pertinent time.

The above tage is transcribed as follows:

Caller: "On this guy VILSON from here in Flagstaff and - he married a girl from Flagstaff, a Spanish girl, and I happen to know that this guy was in Momphis, at the time. He bought a plane ticket from Phoenix to Memphis at the time, and him and this BAY, YAY RAY, the guy that was, the FBI was eh, I don't know exactly about what the story was
