"the BRADENS, the Southern Patriot, 3210 W. Broadway, Louisville, Ky." and "Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), 572 Perdido St., New Orleans, Louisiana."

Referenced airtel suggested that interview of CARL and ANNE BRADEN for any information they might have concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING be considered.

CARL and ANNE BRADEN, Louisville Security Index subjects, are former CP leaders in Louisville, Ky. and currently head the Louisville based Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), formerly of New Orleans, La., which organization publishes the "Southern Patriot", as its official organ.

SCEF is successor to the HCUA-cited Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) and has long been active in the integration and civil rights fields. Currently, SCEF is active in the so-called "peace movement."

The BRADENS have twice been indicted under Kentucky Sedition Statutes (1954 and 1967). In 1954, CARL BRADEN was convicted and served 8 months of a 15-year sentence before being released on \$40,000 appeal bond. A Bureau informant was largely responsible for the 1954 conviction of BRADEN.

On both occasions the Kentucky Sedition Statutes under which the BRADENS were prosecuted were held to be unconstitutional.

CARL BRADEN also served approximately 9 months on a year and a day sentence for contempt of Congress. The contempt conviction grew out of his refusal to answer questions before a Congressional investigating committee in 1958.

The BRADENS have been interviewed on one occasion in connection with a civil rights matter in which they had an interest. They were pleasant but CARL BRADEN was obviously untruthful.

Any interview with the BRADENS should have sound investigative basis, and it is felt that they should not be interviewed unless they can be questioned re specific, pertinent matters concerning which they might logically be expected to have information.

If an interview with them gave the impression that they were suspected of being implicated in the assassination of Dr. KING, or that the FBI was engaged in a fishing expedition, they would quickly seize upon the situation to ridicule and otherwise criticize the FBI for floundering in the investigation.

If there are specific, pertinent matters concerning which the BRADENS should be interviewed in connection with this case, Louisville will conduct such interview.

Inasmuch as the BRADENS are Security Index subjects, it is felt that Bureau authorization should be obtained prior to conducting such interview.

On 5/20/68, Miss DORIS ANDREOTTI, 460 Rigo, Salinas, Calif., who had been previously interviewed by SA CARL A. GOSTING on 5/4/68, was reinterviewed by SA GOSTING on this date.

Miss ANDREOTTI according to SA GOSTING, furnished the following information:

She stated that the real name of her boyfriend correspondent whom she previously identified as GAY RANDALL, is DEL GAY, who resides at 3962 Clay St., San Francisco, telephone 386-1272. She stated that he is employed at the Social Security Office in San Francisco, telephone number 558-5144, and that she has been corresponding with this man for over one year. According to ANDREOTTI, she did not furnish the correct identity of this individual since she did not want her boyfriend "chased off" by the fact that she had furnished information about him.

ANDREOTTI specifically requested that if it were necessary to interview GAY, that she not be identified as the person who identified him.

Photos of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to her and she positively stated that the individual in these photos was not identical to GAY. She described GAY as WMA, age about 28, 5'9" tall, 150 pounds, who was born in Colorado, and has resided in SF for the past five years.

SA GOSTING advised that Miss ANDREOTTI appeared to be somewhat unstable, age about 30 years, but appeared much older and is unemployed. Also she appeared to have a drinking problem.

DELMAS LEVI GAY, aka Del Gay, residing 3962 Clay St., Apt. 1, SF, Calif., telephone 386-1272, was interviewed 5/21/68 by SA STANLEY J. EAGER at his place of employment, the San Francisco Payment Center, Social Security Administration (SSA), Department of Health, Education and Welfare (DHEW), 1235 Mission St., SF. He stated he has been employed as a Claims Examiner, SSA, in the San Francisco Payment Center since March, 1965, having been discharged as a Specialist 4, in the Medical Corps, Fitzsimons General Hospital, Denver, Colorado, in December, 1964 from the Army.

He said he has had no leave from his job with the exception of 5/20/68 and a half day on 5/21/68 which he took as Annual Leave to visit Carmel, Calif.

In January, 1967, he corresponded to the California Friendship Club (CFC), Long Beach, Calif., in an effort to make friends with persons of his own age. This was supposed to be a confidential friendship club but immediately after corresponding to this club he received approximately 200 letters from friendship clubs throughout the U. S. He added that it was through this club that he met Miss DORIS ANDREOTTI.

He stated that DORIS ANDREOTTI told him on 5/17/68 that the FBI was going to talk to her concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He said Miss ANDREOTTI is a little unstable and has a drinking problem, making her an alcoholic. He stated she is unemployed and is supported by her mother.

Mr. GAY stated he also joined the Swingers Club in Michigan and as a result of joining the CFC and the Swingers Club he has corresponded and sent photographs of himself to about five different women. He stated that he belongs to a friendship club in SF called the Jet Set, which is a social organization of men and women who dine at various dinner spots in SF and enjoy dancing.

Photos of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to Mr. GAY and he stated he recognized these photos as the person who the FBI has been looking for for the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated he also read on 5/18/68 that JAMES EARL RAY had been involved with a friendship club in Long Beach, Calif.

Mr. GAY advised he was not acquainted with JAMES EARL RAY, did not recognize his photos and did not know anyone who would know anything about this person.

Interviewing Agent observed that while GAY's height, weight, and build were similar to that of RAY's, he was not identical to JAMES EARL RAY.
