SCRF is successor to the MCNA-cited Southern Conference for Human Velfare (SCRV) and has long been active in the integration and civil rights fields. Currently, SCRF is active in the so-called "peace movement."

The BRADESS have twice been indicted under Kentucky Sedition Statutes (1954 and 1967). In 1954, CARL BRADES was convicted and served 8 months of a 15-year sentence before being released on \$46,000 appeal bend. A Bureau informant was largely responsible for the 1954 conviction of BRADES.

CARL BRADEN also served approximately 9 months on a year and a day sentence for contempt of Congress. The contempt conviction grew out of his refusal to asswer questions before a Congressional investigating countities in 1956. The BIADOS have been interviewed on one occasion in connection with a civil rights matter in which they had an interest. They were pleasant but CARL BRADER was obviously untrathful. Any interview with the BRADERS should have sound investigative beats, and it is felt that they should not be interviewed unless they can be questioned re specific, pertinent matters concerning which they might logically be expected to have information. If an interview with them gave the impression that they were suspected of being implicated in the assessination of Dr. KING, or that the FBI was engaged in a fishing expedition, they would quickly seize upon the situation to ridicule and otherwise criticize the FBI for floundering in the investigation. If there are specific, pertinent matters concerning which the BRADERS should be interviewed in connection with this case, Louisville will conduct such interview. ANDREOTTI specifically requested that if it were necessary to interview GAY, that she not be identified as the person who identified him.

Photos of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to her and she positively stated that the individual in these photos was not identical to GAY. She described GAY as WMA, age about 28, 5:9" tall, 150 pounds, who was born in Colorado, and has resided in SF for the past five years.

SA GOSTING advised that Miss ANDRECTIT appeared to be somewhat unstable, age about 30 years, but appeared much older and is unemployed. Also she appeared to have a drinking problem.

DELMAS LEVI GAY, aka Del Gay, residing 3962 Clay St., Apt., SF. Calif., telephone 386-1272, was interviewed 5/21/68 by SA STANLEY J. EAGER at his place of employment, the San Francisco Payment Center, Social Security Administration (SSA), Department of Health, Education and Welfare (DHEW), 1235 Mission St., SF. He stated he has been employed as a Claims Examiner, SSA, in the San Francisco Payment Center since March, 1365, having been discharged as a Specialist 4, in the Medical Corps, Fitzsimmens General Hospital, Dewer, Colorado, in December, 1964 from the Army.

He said he has had no leave from his job with the exception of 5/20/68 and a half day on 5/21/68 which he took as Annual Leave to visit Carmel, Calif.

In January, 1967, he corresponded to the California Friendship Club (CFC), LongHeach, Calif., in an effort to make friends with persons of his own age. This was supposed to be a confidential friendship club but immediately after corresponding to this club he received approximately 200 letters from friendship clubs throughout the U.S. He added that it was through this club that he met Miss DORIS ANDREOTTI.

He stated that DORIS ANDREOTTI told him on 5/17/68 that the FBI was going to talk to her concerning the assassination of MARTEN LUTHER KING. He said Miss ANDREOTTI is a little unstable and has a drinking problem, making her an alcoholic. He stated she is unemployed and is supported by her mother.

Mr. GAY stated he also joined the Swingers Club in Michigan and as a result of joining the CTC and the Swingers Club he has corresponded and sent photographs of himself to about five different women. He stated that he belongs to a friendship club in SF called the Jet Set, which is a social organization of men and women who dine at various dinner spots in SF and enjoy dancing.

Photos of JAMES EARL RAY were exhibited to Mr. GAY and he stated he recognized these photos as the person who the FBI has been looking for for the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated he also read on 5/18/68 that JAMES EARL RAY had been involved with a friendship club in Long Beach. Calif.

Mr. GAY advised he was mt acquainted with JAMES EARL RAY, did not recognize his photos and did not know anyone who would know anything about this person.

Interviewing Agent observed that while GAY's height, weight, and build were similar to that of RAY's, he was not identical to JAMES EARL RAY.





### RE: RECORD OF UNIDENTIFIED DECEASED

On May 16, 1968, RALPH ROBERTS, Chief, Bureau of Vital Statistics, Alabama Department of Health, Montgomery, Alabama, advised SA DAN O. STEPHENS that his files reflect, to date, only one death of an unidentified person in Alabama since April 5, 1968.

This individual, a Negro male, age unknown, died on or about April 28, 1968, in Mobile, Alabama.

He was requested to notify the FBI of all other certificates received, reflecting the death of an unidentified person, until advised to the contrary.
