On 5-17-68 Mr. HARVEY COBB, Owner, L & M Cylinders, 2078 Lane Avenue North, Jacksonville, Florida, was contacted and interviewed regarding two possible past employees of L & M Cylinder known as "MED" (LNU) and (FNU) FOLKS.

Mr. COBB advised that 'RED'S' real name is CHARLES EDWARD UNDERHILL, 2606 Orghard Street, Jacksonville, Florida.

UNDERHILL was employed at L & M Cylinders from June until August, 1966, and it was obviouslto Mr. COBB that UNDERHILL was a militant hater of the Negro race. Mr. COBB further advised that he had no record for a past employee having the last name POLKS and feels sure he has never hired envone by that name.

Mr. COBB stated that a close friend of "RED"

(UNDERHILL's) at the time they were working for him was PAUL

BRADT DYAL, 275 Willowbranch Street, Jacksonville, Plorida.

DYAL worked for L & M Cylinders from May until August, 1966, and was also quite adament for his intred for the Negro race.

Mr. COBB was shown several photographs of JAMES HARL RAY and stated definitely that neither Mr. UNDERHILL nor Mr. DYAL in any way resembled RAY.

The following investigation was conducted at Columbia, South Carolina, on May 16, 1968, by Special Agents MULDROW B. MILLS and ROBERT E. ROBERTSON:

On May 16, 1968, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SCLED) Agent TED OWENS telephonically advised that an individual giving his name as HARRY LOGAN, not further identified, telephonically contacted SCLED a short time previously and advised that he spotted an individual somewhat resembling the newspaper photograph of JAMES HARL RAY. According to LOGAN he followed this individual to the Carolina Motel, Two Notch Road, Columbia, South Carolina, where he entered a room. LOGAN stated that this individual was driving a beige Oldsmobile bearing 1968 Texas license GCW 799.

On May 16, 1968, inquiry at the Carclina Motel disclosed that individual driving above mentioned automobile had given his name as DANIEL PARMA and his address as Waco, Texas. He rented a room at this motel on May 13, 1968, and paid one week in advance.

On May 16, 1968, DANIEL EUGENE PARMA, was interviewed at the Carolina Motel, Columbia, South Carolina, when he was eliminated by fingerprints with JAMES EARL RAY. He voluntarily consented to being fingerprinted and furnished the following information concerning himself. His name is DANIEL EUGENE PARMA and he resides at 2915 Grim Avenue, Waco, Texas, with his mother Mrs. MARGARET H. PARMA. He made available Texas Driver's License and Social Security card in the name of DANIEL E. PARMA.

He came to Columbia, South Carolina, from Birmingham, Alabama, on May 13, 1968. He is a commercial artist and for the past few days has been arranging an art show to sell his

RE: Investigation in South Carolina concerning unidentified deceased persons since April 5, 1968.

On May 15, 1968, Bureau requested that since subject JAMES EARL RAY may have died since commission of the crime the U.S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and advised that no central records for unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested and the Bureau instructed that offices covering state capitals to check with the Bureau of Vital Statistics or a similar agency for unidentified dead from April 5, 1968, to date. On May 16, 1968, Mrs. DORIS M. BYARS, South Carolina Bureau of Vital Statistics, Columbia, South Carolina, advised that her agency maintains no unidentified deceased records but that the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, Columbia, South Carolina, is always called in to investigate any unidentified dead person in order to identify such persons.

On May 17, 1968, Agent MILLARD CATE, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, Columbia, South Carolina, advised he investigates all unidentified deceased persons located in South Carolina. He stated that no such person has been located during 1968 and as far as he knows there are no unidentified deceased persons in South Carolina.

CATE said that he always fingerprinted such individuals and forwarded these prints to the FBI, Washington, D.C., or removes the fingers and forwards them to the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation if the body is decomposed.

The fellowing investigation was conducted by SA BORERT R. JOHNSON:

On April 20, 1968, N. R. PAULK, Clerk, Business License Division, City Hall, reviewed the records and advised there was no record of a place doing business in Columbia as Chubby's Steak House. He stated this restaurant may possibly be identical with Chub's and Tub's, 1201 Lady Street, which is owned by a FRANK B, TAYLOR.

He also stated there was no record of a restaurant or club known as the Downtown; however, there is a business called the Downtowner Steak House located at 1301 Main Street, which is goned by a CHARLES T. HOVELLESS or HOUGHLESS.

He stated the Red Ropeter is out of business, and when it was in operation it was located at 1632 Sumter Street. The owner was reflected as DCROTHY HAIRWOOD.

On April 30, 1968, Detective T. M. SMARPE, Columbia Police Department, advised that the business license of the Red Rooster was taken away several months ago. He also stated the business is owned by RARMEY LEE HAIRWOOD, 4716 Linbn, Columbia, South Carolina, and displayed a lengthy arrest record for Mr. HAIRWOOD.

On the same date ANN MULDE, Roc ords Clerk, Identification Division, Columbia Police Department, advised no arrest record for CARLOS LKE BILLINGS, JUNE TAYLOR, JOHNIN MLACENCIA or GLEN HARREN could be located. She also advised that no arrest record could be located for a JAMES BARREN who is described as a white male, approximately farty years of ago, 5 feet 10 inches in height.

She stated the owner Mrs. BCHCTMY MUFF, 3801 Euroka Street, maybe able to furnish more information.

On April 20, 1968, Miss MIFF stated her mother, honorsy HUFF, was too ill to receive visitors and she asked her nother about JOHNNIE MACKWELL. She then advised that JOHNNIE MACKWELL had worked at the Louise but had quit some

JEAN TOLOR resides outside of Columbia at an unknown location on the Sunter Highway. She also advised JEAN TOLOR had been

As a result of investigation on April 30, 1968, to locate her at Columbia, South Carolina, Mrs. JOHNNIE BLACKWELL GENTRY, Apartment K-3, Lexington Apartments, West Columbia, South Carolina, telephonically contacted the Columbia FBI Office on May 9, 1968.

She was interviewed and advised as follows:

She has been married several times and is generally known as JOHNNIE BLACKWELL. About May of 1965, she and a girl friend, JUNE TAYLOR, were residing on Chestnut Street in Columbia, South Carolina. She was then working at The Lounge, 1103 Lady Street, Columbia, South Carolina, as a The Lounge is located in the same block as the Downtowner Motel in Columbia, South Carolina. Her roommate, JUNE TAYLOR, was dating a white male with the last name of BILLINGS and through BILLINGS, she, BLACKWELL, met a white male with the last name of BARBER. During May, 1965, these 2 men moved into the apartment with her and TAYLOR where they lived for several days. During this period. BILLINGS owned and drove a red Chevrolet convertible with what she believed was a Maryland license tag. She said during this period, JUNE TAYLOR was working at the Red Rooster Bar, in Columbia, South Carolina, and that the 4 of them for several days lived as man and wife.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she does not recall during this period or ever knowing 2 men by the name of JAMES and EDDIE, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning such individuals. She emphatically denied that anyone had ever asked her if she could get a machine gun for them and she is certain that BARBER never asked her such a question. She does not recall ever visiting the VFW Club in Columbia, South Carolina, when BARBER and BILLINGS were there. She said that she was unable to furnish any information concerning BARBER having sticks of marijuana in his possession but that she was told that he had recently been discharged from the Army. She said that she could furnish no information concerning a person with the first

name of JAMES who owned a 1964 or 1965 Lincoln Continental who was from Tennessee.

She did recall that on one occasion while (first name unknown) BARBER and (first name unrecalled) BILLINGS were living with her and JUNE TAYLOR, these men left for a couple of days in BILLINGS' car, but she does not know where they went, as they moved out shortly after returning to Columbia, South Carolina, and she has seen neither of them since. She said that she does not recall ever visiting a large drive-in restaurant in Columbia, South Carolina, with these persons, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning BARBER and BILLINGS taking a trip to Louisiana while she knew them.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she has never heard anyone discuss the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.; and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning any such conspiracy. She said that individuals such as JAMES and EDDIE were completely unknown to her.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were shown to Mrs. GENTRY, who said that as far as she can recall, she had never seen such a person. She said that she was of the impression that BILLINGS had been in Columbia, South Carolina, before the time she met him. She said that BARBER, during the time she knew him, did not own an automobile.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR, mentioned above, has been married or lived with numerous men and that she has used the names JUNE TAYLOR, JUNE JEFFCOAT, JUNE CABEAN, and NORMA MAE CABEAN. She said that she has absolutely no idea where JUNE TAYLOR is presently residing, but the last she heard, TAYLOR was reportedly married to a serviceman and living in Augusta, Georgia, where she was working at a night club.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR's step-father is named RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, and he presently operates a store just

outside of Wagener, South Carolina. JUNE TAYLOR has a brother named DEMPSEY JEFFCOAT, who lives in South Congaree, South Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLARENCE A. GROOMS, JR., on May 6, 1968, relative to locating JUNE TAYLOR:

WILLIAM R. BUSBEE, a long-time resident of Wagener, South Carolina, advised the only white TAYLOR family residing in Wagener was CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener. Mr. BUSBEE stated he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR presently receiving mail in Wagener, nor did he recall anyone by this name who in the past has received mail in Wagener.

Chief of Police FRANK W. GANTT, Wagener, South Carolina, advised he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR residing in Wagener or the immediate area.

Mrs. CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener, South Carolina, advised she had no children or relatives to her knowledge who were named JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, and that she knew of no one by this name in the Wagener area. She stated to her knowledge, she and her husband and immediate family were the only white family of TAYLORs in Wagener.

On April 30, 1968, Captain HARRY SNIPES, Columbia, South Carolina, Police Department, advised that he was formerly acquainted with JOHNNIE BLACKWELL and JUNE TAYLOR because they were well known prostitutes in Columbia, South Carolina. He said that he had no idea where they were presently located, but he is certain they are still working as waitresses and prostituting wherever they may be.

On May 10, 1968, PHYLLIS WATTS, clerk, Medical Records Section, Columbia Hospital of Richland County, Columbia, South Carolina, advised SA ROBERT R. JOHNSON that she could locate no record of a former patient by the name of JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, JEFFCOAT, or CABEAN.

On May 10, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, advised that she has a daughter who has used the name of JUNE TAYLOR and who formerly worked as a waitress at the Red Rooster in Columbia. South Carolina.

She said her daughter is possibly working at a night club in Augusta, Georgia, that she would attempt to obtain her exact address, and would furnish this to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. On May 17, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, was advised JUNE TAYLOR had failed to contact the FBI Office at Columbia, South Carolina. She said her daughter could be "anywhere" and using "any name", and she could suggest no one who would know her whereabouts.

In view of the nature of the origin of the information from BILLINGS which was refuted by JOHNNIE BLACKWELL, no additional efforts are being made to locate JUNE TAYLOR since her whereabouts is unknown by her family and friends and considerable investigation has been conducted to locate her.

The Bureau & advised that one JOHN EUGENE GAURON, when interviewed in St. Louis, stated that he thought JAMES EARL RAY to be a burglar, and contended that on or about 6/23 or 6/24/67, he read in the "Chicago Tribune" of a \$50,000 bank burglary in a Southern state and recalled that he and RAY had cased this bank in 1953, or 1959.

GAWRON claimed that he was visited by a man whom he refused to identify, and this man told him that he and others had robbed the bank and displayed a valise full of money. GAWRON further claimed that about 6 weeks ago this man again visited him and indicated that RAY and one or more other persons had been involved in the bank robbery. The bank was allegedly in the Deep South in a city near a river, and the city was on the east bank of the Hississippi River.

For the information of St. Louis, the American Dank and Trust Co., Airline Highway Branch, Eaton Rouge, La., was robbed on 3/30/67, and \$55,693 was taken. The title of this case is, "UNSUBS (2), AMERICAN BANK AND TRUST CO., AIRLINE HIGHWAY EDANCH, DATON ROUGE, LA., 3/30/67; BR; NO 91-3073; Bufile 91-26681."

A lone W/M emered the bank at approximately 12:10 PM, and pulled a gun believed to be a German Luger, and told the 2 employees in the bank to lie down behind the counter. During the commission of the bank robbery, a shot was fired, believed to have been accidental, and the shell casing and slug were recovered. Latent fingerprints from the bank and from the getaway-car were also developed. The individual who entered the

He came to Miss MILLER's residence in a station wagon with a male companion and bought the sofa. He paid for the sofa with a check drawn on the Suburban Trust Company, Hyattsville, Maryland. Re the purchaser: Miss MILLER described him as about age 37, 5'10", slender build, sandy blonde hair, eye color not known, just a trace of Southern accent. She did not know the make of station wagon, thought it was late model, license number unknown, light colored with wood tone trim. The companion of the purchaser is described as early twenties, "cute, slim, blonde". No names were exchanged between the two men.

The check was returned with a note "Non sufficient funds" and was dated 4/26/68.

Miss MILLER said that last Sunday, 5/5/68, she drove out to the residence of DAVID and LALAH COOPERMAN and spoke to them.
