On 5-17-68 Mr. HARVEY COBB, Owner, L & M Cylinders, 2078 Lane Avenue North, Jacksonville, Florida, was contacted and interviewed regarding two possible past employees of L & M Cylinder known as "RED" (LNU) and (FNU) FOLKS.

Mr. COBB advised that "RED'S" real name is CHARLES EDWARD UNDERHILL, 2606 Orchard Street, Jacksonville, Florida. UNDERHILL was employed at L & M Cylinders from June until August, 1966, and it was obvious to Mr. COBB that UNDERHILL was a militant hater of the Negro race. Mr. COBB further advised that he had no record for a past employee having the last name FOLKS and feels sure he has never hired anyone by that name.

Mr. COBB stated that a close friend of "RED" (UNDERHILL's) at the time they were working for him was PAUL BRADY DYAL, 275 Willowbranch Street, Jacksonville, Florida. DYAL worked for L & M Cylinders from May until August, 1966, and was also quite adamant for his hatred for the Negro race.

Mr. COBB was shown several photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated definitely that neither Mr. UNDERHILL nor Mr. DYAL in any way resembled RAY.

Mr. FOLKS' activities have been closely followed by the Jacksonville Office for many months and his whereabouts on the evening that MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot have been established. Furthermore, Mr. FOLKS in no way resembles various photographs of suspect, JAMES EARL RAY.

By communication dated 5/8/68, Atlanta advised that on 5/8/68, Mr. J. E. McWHORTER, Spangler International Press, Atlanta, Georgia, advised DONALD JAMES NISSEN is no longer employed by that company, having left approximately 12/67, to go to Corpus Christi, Texas, where he was employed by the Americana Encyclopedia Company. McWHORTER stated he recently learned that NISSEN is working in Panama City, Florida, selling a safety device which operates as a gyroscope.

The following investigation was conducted at Columbia, South Carolina, on May 16, 1968, by Special Agents MULBROW B. MILLS and ROBERT E. ROBERTSON:

On May 16, 1968, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) Agent TED OWENS telephonically advised that an individual giving his name as HARRY LOGAN, not further identified, telephonically contacted SLED a short time previously and advised that he spotted an individual somewhat resembling the newspaper photograph of JAMES EARL RAY. According to LOGAN he followed this individual to the Carolina Motel, Two Notch Road, Columbia, South Carolina, where he entered a room. LOGAN stated that this individual was driving a beige Oldsmobile bearing 1968 Texas license GCW 799.

On May 16, 1968, inquiry at the Carolina Motel disclosed that individual driving above mentioned automobile had given his name as DANIEL PARMA and his address as Waco, Texas. He rented a room at this motel on May 13, 1968, and paid one week in advance.

On May 16, 1968, DANIEL EUGENE PARMA, was interviewed at the Carolina Motel, Columbia, South Carolina, when he was eliminated by fingerprints with JAMES EARL RAY. He voluntarily consented to being fingerprinted and furnished the following information concerning himself. His name is DANIEL EUGENE PARMA and he resides at 2915 Grim Avenue, Waco, Texas, with his mother Mrs. MARGARET H. PARMA. He made available Texas Driver's License [redacted] and Social Security card [redacted] in the name of DANIEL E. PARMA.

He came to Columbia, South Carolina, from Birmingham, Alabama, on May 13, 1968. He is a commercial artist and for the past few days has been arranging an art show to sell his

paintings which he hangs in a Telford rental trailer. He has rented a store at 4423 Devine Street, Columbia, South Carolina, where he will hold his art show on Saturday, May 18, 1968. The following physical description of PARMA was obtained through observation and interview:

RE: Investigation in South Carolina concerning unidentified deceased persons since April 5, 1968.

On May 15, 1968, Bureau requested that since subject JAMES EARL RAY may have died since commission of the crime the U.S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and advised that no central records for unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested and the Bureau instructed that offices covering state capitals to check with the Bureau of Vital Statistics or a similar agency for unidentified dead from April 5, 1968, to date. On May 16, 1968, Mrs. DORIS M. BYARS, South Carolina Bureau of Vital Statistics, Columbia, South Carolina, advised that her agency maintains no unidentified deceased records but that the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, Columbia, South Carolina, is always called in to investigate any unidentified dead person in order to identify such persons.

On May 17, 1968, Agent MILLARD CATE, South Carolina Law Enforcement Division, Columbia, South Carolina, advised he investigates all unidentified deceased persons located in South Carolina. He stated that no such person has been located during 1968 and as far as he knows there are no unidentified deceased persons in South Carolina.

CATE said that he always fingerprinted such individuals and forwarded these prints to the FBI, Washington, D.C., or removes the fingers and forwards them to the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation if the body is decomposed.

On April 30, 1968, E. R. PAULK, Clerk, Business
Licenses Division, City Hall, reviewed the records and
advised there was no record of a place doing business in
Columbia as Chubby's Steak House. He stated this restaurant
may possibly be identical with Chub's and Tub's, 1201 Lady
Street, which is owned by a FRANK B. TAYLOR.

He also stated there was no record of a restaurant
or club known as the Downtown; however, there is a business
called the Downtowner Steak House located at 1301 Main Street,
which is owned by a CHARLES T. NOVELLUS or NOVELLUS.

He stated the Red Rooster is out of business, and
when it was in operation it was located at 1632 Sumter Street.
The owner was reflected as DOROTHY HAIRWOOD.

On April 30, 1968, Detective T. M. SHARPE, Columbia
Police Department, advised that the business license of the
Red Rooster was taken away several months ago. He also
stated the business is owned by BARNEY LEE HAIRWOOD, 4716
Linden, Columbia, South Carolina, and displayed a lengthy
arrest record for Mr. HAIRWOOD.

On the same date ANN MULLEN, Records Clerk,
Identification Division, Columbia Police Department, advised
no arrest record for CARLOS LEE BILLINGS, JUNE TAYLOR, JOHNNIE
BLACKWELL or GLEN BARKER could be located. She also advised
that no arrest record could be located for a JAMES BARKER who
is described as a white male, approximately forty years of age,
5 feet 10 inches in height.

On April 30, 1968, BARNEY LEE NAIKWOOD, 4716 Linden, advised he formerly operated a club known as the Red Rooster on Sumter Street. He stated a JUNE TAYLOR was formerly employed there but left months ago. He stated he had heard she was remarried, and did not know her new last name, nor did he have a Social Security Number available for her. He stated she may still receive mail at Wagener, South Carolina. Mr. NAIKWOOD stated JOHNNIE BLACKWELL worked at the Lounge on Lady Street in Columbia, and she may still be working there. He advised JUNE TAYLOR has a brother living near Outlaws Garage in South Congaree, South Carolina, near a junkyard and she used to work at the Club 21 in Augusta, Georgia. On April 30

On April 30, 1968, CYNTHIA FROST, Records Clerk, Richland County Sheriff's Office, reviewed the indices of that law enforcement agency and advised they were negative concerning JUNE TAYLOR, JOHNNIE BLACKWELL, CARLOS LEE BILLINGS, GLEN BARKER, and JAMES BARKER.

The following investigation was conducted by
SA THOMAS H. CURRAN and ROBERT R. JOHNSON:

On April 30, 1968, EDNA OVERTON, barmaid, The Lounge, 1103 Lady Street, advised she had been working there since the last week in January, 1968, and that no person by the name of JOHNNIE BLACKWELL had worked there, as far as she knew. She stated the owner Mrs. DOROTHY HUFF, 3801 Bureka Street, maybe able to furnish more information.

On April 30, 1968, Miss HUFF stated her mother, DOROTHY HUFF, was too ill to receive visitors and she asked her mother about JOHNNIE BLACKWELL. She then advised that JOHNNIE BLACKWELL had worked at the Lounge but had quit some

months ago. She advised her mother could furnish no information about JOHNNIE BLACKWELL'S whereabouts.

On the same date VICTOR REINHARDT, Criminal Investigation Detachment (CID), Fort Jackson, South Carolina, advised that agency had no information regarding a GLEN or JAMES BARNER or the theft of a .50 caliber machine gun.

On April 30, 1968, Sergeant JAMES MCCARTHY, Desk Sergeant, Military Police Company, Fort Jackson, stated the military police had no traffic arrest or other records concerning a GLEN or JAMES BARNER.

On April 30, 1968, Sergeant First Class KEYNALDO RESKNEK, Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge, Mental Health Clinic, Fort Jackson, advised that unit had no record concerning a GLEN or JAMES BARNER.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT R. JOHNSON:

On May 1, 1968, Master Sergeant I. W. JONES, Chief Clerk, Registrar's Office, United States Army Hospital, Fort Jackson, advised that facility has no record on a GLEN or JAMES BARNER. He suggested that the individual's file may be obtained from the Military Personnel Records Center, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri.

The following investigation was conducted by SA'S KENYON D. BOWEN, JR., and ROBERT R. JOHNSON:

On May 1, 1968, CAROL LEITZKE, 2205 Rosewood Drive, stated she is acquainted with JOHNNIE BLACKWELL and a JEAN TAYLOR. She stated JOHNNIE BLACKWELL formerly worked at the Lounge, but quit some time ago. She advised she could furnish no information whatsoever regarding her whereabouts. She stated JEAN TAYLOR formerly worked at the Copa Cabana, a club which had been demolished several months ago. She stated JEAN TAYLOR resides outside of Columbia at an unknown location on the Gunter Highway. She also advised JEAN TAYLOR had been

an in-patient at the Columbia Hospital from which she had been released several weeks ago.

On May 1, 1968, inquiry at Medical Records, Columbia Hospital, was negative concerning the treatment of a JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR.

Date May 15, 1968

As a result of investigation on April 30, 1968, to locate her at Columbia, South Carolina, Mrs. JOHNNIE BLACKWELL GENTRY, Apartment K-3, Lexington Apartments, West Columbia, South Carolina, telephonically contacted the Columbia FBI Office on May 9, 1968.

She was interviewed and advised as follows:

She has been married several times and is generally known as JOHNNIE BLACKWELL. About May of 1965, she and a girl friend, JUNE TAYLOR, were residing on Chestnut Street in Columbia, South Carolina. She was then working at The Lounge, 1103 Lady Street, Columbia, South Carolina, as a waitress. The Lounge is located in the same block as the Downtowner Motel in Columbia, South Carolina. Her roommate, JUNE TAYLOR, was dating a white male with the last name of BILLINGS and through BILLINGS, she, BLACKWELL, met a white male with the last name of BARBER. During May, 1965, these 2 men moved into the apartment with her and TAYLOR where they lived for several days. During this period, BILLINGS owned and drove a red Chevrolet convertible with what she believed was a Maryland license tag. She said during this period, JUNE TAYLOR was working at the Red Rooster Bar, in Columbia, South Carolina, and that the 4 of them for several days lived as man and wife.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she does not recall during this period or ever knowing 2 men by the name of JAMES and EDDIE, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning such individuals. She emphatically denied that anyone had ever asked her if she could get a machine gun for them and she is certain that BARBER never asked her such a question. She does not recall ever visiting the VFW Club in Columbia, South Carolina, when BARBER and BILLINGS were there. She said that she was unable to furnish any information concerning BARBER having sticks of marijuana in his possession but that she was told that he had recently been discharged from the Army. She said that she could furnish no information concerning a person with the first

name of JAMES who owned a 1964 or 1965 Lincoln Continental who was from Tennessee.

She did recall that on one occasion while (first name unknown) BARBER and (first name unrecalled) BILLINGS were living with her and JUNE TAYLOR, these men left for a couple of days in BILLINGS' car, but she does not know where they went, as they moved out shortly after returning to Columbia, South Carolina, and she has seen neither of them since. She said that she does not recall ever visiting a large drive-in restaurant in Columbia, South Carolina, with these persons, and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning BARBER and BILLINGS taking a trip to Louisiana while she knew them.

Mrs. GENTRY said that she has never heard anyone discuss the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.; and she could furnish absolutely no information concerning any such conspiracy. She said that individuals such as JAMES and EDDIE were completely unknown to her.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were shown to Mrs. GENTRY, who said that as far as she can recall, she had never seen such a person. She said that she was of the impression that BILLINGS had been in Columbia, South Carolina, before the time she met him. She said that BARBER, during the time she knew him, did not own an automobile.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR, mentioned above, has been married or lived with numerous men and that she has used the names JUNE TAYLOR, JUNE JEFFCOAT, JUNE CABEAN, and NORMA MAE CABEAN. She said that she has absolutely no idea where JUNE TAYLOR is presently residing, but the last she heard, TAYLOR was reportedly married to a serviceman and living in Augusta, Georgia, where she was working at a night club.

She said that JUNE TAYLOR's step-father is named RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, and he presently operates a store just

outside of Wagener, South Carolina. JUNE TAYLOR has a brother named DEMPSEY JEFFCOAT, who lives in South Congaree, South Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CLARENCE A. GROOMS, JR., on May 6, 1968, relative to locating JUNE TAYLOR:

WILLIAM R. BUSBEE, a long-time resident of Wagener, South Carolina, advised the only white TAYLOR family residing in Wagener was CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener. Mr. BUSBEE stated he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR presently receiving mail in Wagener, nor did he recall anyone by this name who in the past has received mail in Wagener.

Chief of Police FRANK W. GANTT, Wagener, South Carolina, advised he knew of no JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR residing in Wagener or the immediate area.

Mrs. CLINE N. TAYLOR, Route 2, Box 143, Wagener, South Carolina, advised she had no children or relatives to her knowledge who were named JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, and that she knew of no one by this name in the Wagener area. She stated to her knowledge, she and her husband and immediate family were the only white family of TAYLORS in Wagener.

On May 10, 1968, PHYLLIS WATTS, clerk, Medical Records Section, Columbia Hospital of Richland County, Columbia, South Carolina, advised SA ROBERT R. JOHNSON that she could locate no record of a former patient by the name of JUNE or JEAN TAYLOR, JEFFCOAT, or CABEAN.

On May 10, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, advised that she has a daughter who has used the name of JUNE TAYLOR and who formerly worked as a waitress at the Red Rooster in Columbia, South Carolina.

She said this daughter has also used the name NORMA LEE and the last names of JEFFCOAT, TAYLOR, and CABEAN.

She said that her daughter is presently using the name of JUNE SPELLMAN as she is now allegedly married to a soldier with the last name of SPELLMAN (first name unknown) who is stationed at Fort Gordon, Georgia. She said her daughter is possibly working at a night club in Augusta, Georgia, that she would attempt to obtain her exact address, and would furnish this to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

On May 13, 1968, Mrs. JEFFCOAT was again contacted and stated her daughter had visited with her on May 12, 1968; however she could not find the name or number given her to call, and thereupon told her daughter the FBI was looking for her. She stated her daughter was to report into the Columbia Office on May 13, 1968. She stated she did not ascertain where her daughter was living but that she was believed to be working at the Spar Club or Bar in Columbia, South Carolina. Mrs. JEFFCOAT was again requested to have her daughter contact SA GROOMS in the event she returned to Wagener.

Investigation at Columbia, South Carolina, on May 15, 1968, disclosed no concern named the Spar Club or anything similar thereto is located at Columbia, South Carolina.

On May 17, 1968, Mrs. RUDOLPH JEFFCOAT, Route 1, Wagener, South Carolina, was advised JUNE TAYLOR had failed to contact the FBI Office at Columbia, South Carolina. She said her daughter could be "anywhere" and using "any name", and she could suggest no one who would know her whereabouts.

In view of the nature of the origin of the information from BILLINGS which was refuted by JOHNNIE BLACKWELL, no additional efforts are being made to locate JUNE TAYLOR since her whereabouts is unknown by her family and friends and considerable investigation has been conducted to locate her.

The Bureau ^{HAS} advised that one JOHN EUGENE GAWRON, when interviewed in St. Louis, stated that he thought JAMES EARL RAY to be a burglar, and contended that on or about 6/23 or 6/24/67, he read in the "Chicago Tribune" of a \$50,000 bank burglary in a Southern state and recalled that he and RAY had cased this bank in 1958, or 1959.

GAWRON claimed that he was visited by a man whom he refused to identify, and this man told him that he and others had robbed the bank and displayed a valise full of money. GAWRON further claimed that about 6 weeks ago this man again visited him and indicated that RAY and one or more other persons had been involved in the bank robbery. The bank was allegedly in the Deep South in a city near a river, and the city was on the east bank of the Mississippi River.

For the information of St. Louis, the American Bank and Trust Co., Airline Highway Branch, Baton Rouge, La., was robbed on 3/30/67, and \$55,693 was taken. The title of this case is, "UNSUBS (2), AMERICAN BANK AND TRUST CO., AIRLINE HIGHWAY BRANCH, BATON ROUGE, LA., 3/30/67; BR; NO 91-3073; Bufile 91-26681."

A lone W/M entered the bank at approximately 12:10 PM, and pulled a gun believed to be a German Luger, and told the 2 employees in the bank to lie down behind the counter. During the commission of the bank robbery, a shot was fired, believed to have been accidental, and the shell casing and slug were recovered. Latent fingerprints from the bank and from the get-away-car were also developed. The individual who entered the

The Bureau may wish to give consideration to the following potential investigative leads and suggestions:

In view of subject RAY's statements to associates that he had previously been employed as a river man and cook on board a water vessel and his knowledge of various "beer joints" located in close proximity to the terminus of the navigable Warrior River, on which large barges operate, it is suggested that subject's photograph and description be published in "The Waterways Journal," Room 701 Chemical Building, 721 Olive Street, St. Louis, Mo., which is considered the "bible" for all employers and employees who work on the major rivers.

It is noted RAY was working in the Missouri Penitentiary bake shop at the time of his escape. In view of the possibility RAY may seek employment as a baker, it is suggested that RAY's photograph and description be circularized in all publications designed for or directed to the baking industries. It is also suggested that similar circularization be given to all baking unions.

In view of the fact that RAY may have been employed aboard a barge on the Inland Waterways System, the Bureau is requested to consider circularization and/or contact with Coast Guard stations and cutters patrolling the navigable river system. It is noted Coast Guard personnel board and inspect craft on the rivers and might be in a position to

locate RAY or former associates of RAY.

Inasmuch as RAY was known to have been interested in locksmithing and tinkering with locks in his spare time and was once enrolled in a correspondence course from the Locksmith Institute, Little Falls, New Jersey, it is suggested that the Bureau consider having Newark recontact the Locksmithing Institute regarding all correspondence course applications from 4/5/68 to the present time to ascertain if RAY may have reapplied for enrollment in a locksmithing course under an assumed name, and identify other locksmithing schools and publications.

It is noted that RAY expressed a great interest to fellow convicts while confined in Missouri State Penitentiary in baseball and baseball news and was considered an avid baseball fan. Therefore, it is suggested that the Bureau may wish to contact the J. J. Taylor Spink Publishing Company of St. Louis, Mo., publishers of "The Sporting News," the recognized "bible" of baseball fans, to ascertain if "The Sporting News" would consider publishing an article and photograph of RAY.

In line with the above suggestion, it is suggested that the Bureau instruct all divisions having major and minor league baseball teams contact appropriate officials of these clubs to insure circularization of concession stand operators and security personnel and other appropriate individuals in view of the fact that RAY may attend professional ball games.

It is suggested that the Bureau may wish, in light of the successful results achieved in previous Bureau cases of major proportion, to consider contacting the Saturday Evening Post and Reader's Digest magazines, which have international circulation, to ascertain if these magazines would publish an article concerning RAY's fugitive status.

The Bureau may wish to explore the feasibility of taking fingerprint pictures of all thumb impressions of all persons who applied for permanent visas to Canada and Mexico from March until the present time and submit these to the Identification Division for comparison with subject's thumb prints.

It is noted that the Bureau previously directed that Birmingham, Atlanta, Memphis and several other southern divisions personally contact all laundries and cleaning establishments within their respective territories regarding RAY's fugitive status, as well as the reward being offered for his apprehension. It is, therefore, suggested that the Bureau may desire to have all divisions contact all cleaning and laundry facilities within their respective areas, noting, however, that in the divisions with extremely dense population centers, the use of mailing lists may be more feasible than personal contact.

Miss MILLER saw a poster with photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and noted a resemblance of the 1960 photograph to a man with whom she had the following dealings:

Miss MILLER put an ad in the Classified Sections of the Sunday Star and Washington Post advertising a sofa for sale for \$175.00. She believed that the ad appeared in the April 7 or 14th issues. On a Wednesday night after the ad appeared she received a telephone call from a man asking about the sofa. It was late, 11:30 p.m., and the man said he would come to see the sofa the next evening.

He came to Miss MILLER's residence in a station wagon with a male companion and bought the sofa. He paid for the sofa with a check drawn on the Suburban Trust Company, Hyattsville, Maryland. The names DAVID and LALAH COOPERMAN, Account # [REDACTED] was printed on the check, but no address was listed. The purchaser of the sofa wrote the following addresses and telephone number on the check and signed it "DAVID COOPERMAN".

Telephone # 526-4042 (Miss MILLER learned from the Telephone Company that his phone is subscribed to by a person named PORTER, 1915 Otis St., N.E., WDC.) She has been unable to reach this person by phone.

Re the purchaser: Miss MILLER described him as about age 37, 5'10", slender build, sandy blonde hair, eye color not known, just a trace of Southern accent. She did not know the make of station wagon, thought it was late model, license number unknown, light colored with wood tone trim. The companion of the purchaser is described as early twenties, "cute, slim, blonde". No names were exchanged between the two men.

The check was returned with a note "Non sufficient funds" and was dated 4/26/68.

Miss MILLER said that last Sunday, 5/5/68, she drove out to the residence of DAVID and LALAH COOPERMAN and spoke to them. They knew nothing about the transaction, but stated that ~~their~~ checkbook had been lost about two^c months previously and that they had learned that someone had purchased a refrigerator using one of their checks.

Miss MILLER stated that she ^{has} the check for the sofa in her possession and ^{can} be reached at her home phone or at the Fairfax Recreation Department.

Inquiry, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Richmond, Va., determined that driver's license applications are filed alphabetically and not by date.

Mr. R.C. BOSCHLER, JR., Director, Data Processing, DMV, advised that every application or license on file, which totals in excess of two million, would have to be processed. A check of this type would require their equipment to be programmed in such a manner that the entire system would be tied up for an excessive period of time, specifically a minimum of three days, to accomplish a primary breakdown. Such a check would of necessity be made by DMV IBM employees.

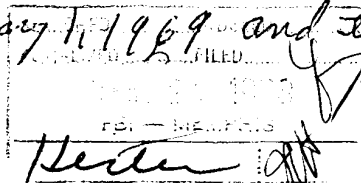
Dear "Mayorie"?

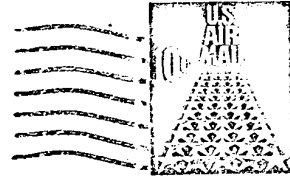
