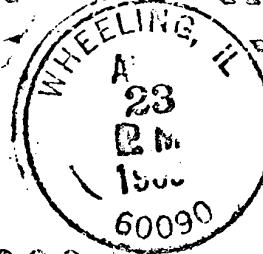

On 5/21/68, PCI MARJORIE LOUISE FETTERS advised SA JOHN E. OTTO at approximately 1:00 am on the same day JERRY RAY telephonically contacted her at 609-964-4923, the number of the telephone at PCI's residence at 2420 Arnold St., Camden, NJ.

Informant stated JERRY RAY said he might not be able to come to Camden as he previously indicated he would. Informant pressed him for an explanation and he replied he would rather give her his answer as to why he probably would not come to Camden in two or three weeks in a letter.

Chicago at his expense. When she told him she could not make such a trip due to her recent delivery of a baby, JERRY RAY said he would call her again on Friday (5/24/68) and they could discuss the matter again.

On 5/21/68, informant furnished the two enclosed letters. She said she received the letter dated 5/18/68, on 5/21/68. The second letter she said she previously overlooked when she furnished JERRY RAY's letters to SA OTTO. She noted that enclosed in the letter of 5/18/68, was \$20.00 in currency from JERRY RAY for her personal use.

On 5/21/68, informant sent two letters to JERRY RAY. In one she enclosed two photographs of herself. In the second letter she questioned JERRY RAY as to why he is apparently trying to avoid coming to visit her in Camden.

The informant was instructed to write the second of the described two letters in an effort to learn if JERRY RAY is possibly anticipating some form of contact relative to this case.

DONALD BRUCE LIVELY, Investments, 1600 LTV Tower, residing at 7215 Palado Street, telephone AD 9-5447, Dallas, related that the only person he recalls receiving telephone calls from in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico is RAY CARSON. He said he vacationed in Puerto Vallarta for about two weeks in about October, 1967 and for about three weeks in early February, 1968. While vacationing there he met CARSON, who was a free lance real estate broker. Subsequent to his first visit to Mexico, he received about five or six telephone calls from CARSON in regard to the possibility of LIVELY's buying a house in Puerto Vallarta. The purchase was not consummated, and he later learned that CARSON had been deported from Mexico for some reason. The last he heard of CARSON he was in Costa Rica.

During the first vacation he took in Puerto Vallarta, LIVELY rented a house known as Casa Los Rapidos and on the second vacation, he rented a house known as Casa Amorillo. CARSON also lived in a private residence but did not have a telephone in his home.

LIVELY viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated this person was completely unknown to him.

The following investigation was conducted at Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico:

On May 15, 1968, the State Judicial Police, Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, conducted inquiry in the vicinity of 1520 Fourth Avenue, Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico, and determined the following information:

W. G. LILAL has been deceased for approximately two years. KATHLEEN TOOLLEY was formerly a student at the Dental Institute at 1520 Fourth Avenue. She is now married and resides somewhere in Chula Vista, California. JUNE BROWN, a nurse who resides in a trailer house at 224 Broadway, Chula Vista, California, was listed as a person who would be able to furnish the address of TOOLLEY.

The following investigation was conducted at Chula Vista, California, on May 20, 1968, by SA ARNOLD W. O'BRIEN:

ELSIER LA JUNE BROWN, Space 45, 246 Broadway, Chula Vista, California, advised that approximately three to four months ago she started receiving correspondence from individuals who indicated they had received her name and address through the "Swingers" magazine.

Since that time, she has received approximately twelve letters from different individuals. At first she held on to these letters, but later when these letters appeared to be of a vulgar nature she disposed of all of them.

Miss BROWN could not recall having received any letter from a JAMES EARL RAY or an ERIC STARVO GALT.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were displayed to Miss BROWN and she advised she has no information concerning him. She further advised that in none of the letters received by her through the "Swingers" magazine were there contained any photographs of the senders.

SL files disclose BANK OF ALTON, Alton, Ill., was robbed by two unknown subjects on 7-13-67 (Bufile 91-27494) (Sifile 91-3699) (SLfile 91-3877). Description of number two man could fit RAY. Number ~~two~~^{one} man description does not fit CARPENTER, who is 5'8", 140 #, slender build.

St. Louis City Jail records establish ed CARPENTER was in City Jail from 6-5-67 to 3-1-68, and therefore could not have participated in the Alton BR, or met GAWRON during 1967 as alleged.

In view of foregoing, GAWRON is being considered as being of known unreliability.

Subject should STILL be considered as a possible suspect in all unsolved bank and other robberies subsequent to 4-23-67.

Rebulet advises that appropriate inquiry should be made at banks to determine identity of individuals making a withdrawal of \$10,000 and over in cash, and confining this inquiry for period of April, 1968. The Bureau advises that the possibility exists that subject was hired assassin and a pay-off could have taken place shortly before or after the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

For information of the Bureau and offices receiving this communication the following is being furnished.

For many years the Intelligence Units of the U.S. Treasury Department have been receiving from the Federal Reserve Banks a form known as the TCR-1 "Report of Currency Transactions; Person or Organization Concerned in Transaction Reported". These forms are used by the Intelligence Units of IRS for purposes of discovering large currency transactions resorted to by racketeers, dealers in narcotics, foreign agents, and others engaged in illegal activities as an attempted method of concealing income.

The TCR-1 is actually completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal, or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves U.S. Currency as follows:

1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of U.S. Currency in denominations of \$100 or higher.
2. Transactions involving \$10,000 or more of U.S. Currency in any denomination.
3. Transactions involving any amount in any denomination, which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the person or organization concerned.

After the TCR-1 Forms are executed they are then sent to the Federal Reserve Banks and their branches who in turn retain them for about one month and at which time they are then sent on to IRS Intelligence Units in the particular area.

In a recent major case (YOUNGNAP) within the Los Angeles Division, the above information became known, and as a result a Confidential Source was developed who furnishes us copies of these forms on a weekly basis. In reviewing the data on such forms it was believed that the information would be of value in investigations relating to Anti-Racketeering, Federal Reserve Act, Bankruptcy, Ascertaining Financial Ability, Fraud Against the Government, Bank Robbery and larceny cases as well as Security type matters.

For the above reason the Los Angeles Division opened a dead file captioned:

"CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS,
REPORTS ON PERSONS OR
ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED
AR"

And copies of all the TCR-1 Forms received since March 3, 1968 have been filed alphabetically in a special indices after they have been indexed to the general office index. These forms are then reviewed periodically for individuals whose name continually reappear for possibly anti-racketeering matters.

For information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Division is currently reviewing the TCR-1 Forms for individuals who may have made a \$10,000 withdrawal of funds and appropriate investigation will be conducted as to each such individual.

The Bureau may wish to have each office contact the IRS Intelligence Units within their division and review copies of these forms for the month of April, 1968. It is believed that this would expedite coverage of the requested lead and cover a larger geographical area.

For information of the Bureau and the Memphis Division, the following is set forth:

On 5/23/68, the Birmingham Division personally contacted all television stations in Birmingham, as well as local daily newspapers, these being "The Birmingham Post-Herald" and "The Birmingham News." The purpose of these contacts was to solicit their continuous cooperation in affording the MURKIN investigation all possible news coverage in an effort to develop any information concerning the possible whereabouts of JAMES EARL RAY.

A photograph of RAY, which was made in California last January (1968), which witnesses say resembles him more nearly than any other they have seen, was furnished to the television stations and newspapers for their assistance in affording this matter appropriate news coverage.

The aforementioned television stations and newspapers were most receptive and pledged their continuous cooperation in assisting the Bureau in bringing about RAY's apprehension. As a result of these contacts, the photograph of RAY, as well as a story concerning the KING assassination received front-page publicity in all editions of the Birmingham newspapers. This

In an effort to give the widest possible circulation of Identification Orders of JAMES EARL RAY, New Orleans has determined that the Port of New Orleans has a mailing list comprising over 5,000 individuals and business firms of all types, including the shipping industry. This mailing list also includes foreign distribution.

This mailing list is not made up on the normal addressograph plates, but are gummed stickers with names and addresses which are affixed to the printed material. The Port of New Orleans utilizes a local mailing service with a special machine which does affix the stickers to the material and the Port of New Orleans has advised that they will make these gummed stickers available to use free of charge.

Inquiry at the local mailing service has determined to affix these gummed stickers to the Identification Orders, they would not charge the FBI more than \$10.00 per thousand.

Bureau authority is requested to expend up to \$50.00 in the mailing of these Identification Orders. Please advise.

Mr. DAN GREER advised on June 11, 1968, that he determined there were no unusual entries to safety deposit boxes in their main office and 14 branch offices during April, 1968, or anything questionable about the persons who opened or closed the boxes during April, 1968, or shortly before or after that date.

Mr. GARY SOLOMAN, accountant, Memphis Bank and Trust Company, advised on June 12, 1968, that he assisted R. H. WEATHERLY in a review of the records concerning safety deposit boxes of this bank. SOLOMAN stated that there were no unusual safety deposit boxes rented at the main office or any of the three branches during April, 1968, or for a short period before or after that time, and that they were unable to determine any questionable or unusual entrances to any of the boxes. SOLOMAN stated they had determined the identity of all persons having safety deposit boxes as either being residents of the city of Memphis or that the persons renting the boxes were known to personnel of the bank.

JOHN WORLEY advised that the main office of the Commercial and Industrial Bank does not have any safety deposit boxes which they rent to customers. He said, however, that the four branches of the bank do have safety deposit boxes. He stated he did not determine any activity which could be considered questionable or unusual concerning the safety deposit boxes during the period April, 1968, or for the period shortly before or after that date. He was unable to determine that there were any unusual entrances to any of the boxes in the bank branches. He stated the persons renting the boxes were known to bank personnel.

Mr. ARVIS V. LATTING advised on June 12, 1968, that a review of the safety deposit box rentals at the main office and their one branch was made, and it was determined that the persons renting these boxes were known to various officials of the bank. JERRY has been instructed, however, that in the event he leaves the Chicago area, he is to advise the case Agent of his departure and destination. In all the interviews with JERRY, he has never mentioned MARJORIE FETTERS by name nor given any indication that he is corresponding with any female. He has made several comments that he might leave the Chicago area and go to somewhere on the East Coast and has on occasion mentioned both New York and New Jersey.

The Chicago Division cannot see where a trip by JERRY to Camden, New Jersey, in the near future would in any way interfere with this office's efforts to locate the subject. It should be noted that the Chicago news media has publicized JERRY's employment at the Sportsman's Country Club. Also, according to JERRY, the only way that the subject has of contacting him would be through P. O. Box 82, Wheeling, Illinois. Even a permanent leaving of the Chicago area by JERRY would not necessarily hinder efforts to locate the subject since it is felt that JERRY would maintain contact with his brother JOHN in St. Louis whose whereabouts is known to the subject.

It is noted that in the letter written by JERRY on May 18, 1968, he indicates that he will phone PCI FETTERS Monday night between 11:00 and 12:00 o'clock. This call would undoubtedly have to be made from the Sportsman's Country Club, Northbrook, Illinois. There is no phone in JERRY's roominghouse and his daily contact with the case Agent is made via pay phone from Lake Forest, Illinois. In JERRY's employment, he has access to numerous pay phones at the Country Club proper and one pay phone in the cottage where he used to reside. It is suggested that in a future contact, PCI FETTERS make an effort to determine the phone number from which JERRY is calling by use of some ruse to the effect that she might wish to get in contact with him immediately or any other type of pretext that the Newark Office deems advisable. The Chicago Division thereafter would attempt to set up appropriate coverage of this phone with the Illinois Bell Telephone Company to obtain toll charges. Also, in this regard, attempt to have the informant discover if this particular phone is habitually utilized by JERRY when he calls her.

In the event that Newark feels that this type of inquiry might compromise the informant, disregard.

Mrs. J. R. HOPKINS, 510 North St. Mary, advised her son, JOHN JACOBS, formerly sold real estate for her and her husband in Carthage. In about 1965, KENNETH R. HAYLES purchased her home in Carthage, and lived there with his wife and children. He traveled most of the time. In the Spring of 1967 HAYLES got behind in his house payments, and listed his house with them for sale. The house was sold, and HAYLES and his family moved from Carthage, reportedly to Shreveport, Louisiana. She is certain HAYLES and his family lived in Carthage from 1965 to 1967. She viewed the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and said HAYLES bears no resemblance to him.

DOROTHY G. KILGORE, employee, First National Bank, advised KENNETH R. HAYLES opened a checking account at this bank November 7, 1966, and closed it June 24, 1967. On May 14, 1966, he financed the purchase of a car through this bank, and was living at 1227 West Sabine in Carthage. In about August 1967 HAYLES sold his house, and moved to 9012 Blom Boulevard, Shreveport, Louisiana. While in Carthage HAYLES first traveled quite a bit, then operated a grocery store until it burned to the ground, then worked some in Dallas, where he reportedly tried to promote a fight for Curtis Cokes. HAYLES still owes \$2,070.89 on the car note, and is two payments behind.

H. A. SPEARS, JR., Loan Officer, First National Bank, advised he first made a car loan to HAYLES on October 20, 1965, when he first moved to Carthage. He thereafter furnished basically the same information as Mrs. KILGORE.

MARIAN TAYLOR, Loan Officer, Mrs. KILGORE and Mr. SPEARS all viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and each said he bears no resemblance to HAYLES.

ReBulet 5/21/68 concerning checks at Driver's License Bureaus.

On 5/21/68 JOSEPH McVEY, Chief Examiner, Driver's License Bureau, Honolulu Police Department, advised that the State of Hawaii is presently going through a relicensing procedure that will last all year. The Driver's License Bureau in Honolulu covers only City-County of Honolulu. On the outer islands driver's licensing is handled by police departments.

In the City and County of Honolulu alone since 1/1/68 more than 92,000 people have applied for new driver's licenses. At the Driver's License Bureau these applications are maintained only in alphabetical order, not by date. Therefore, to ascertain persons applying for a license in April and May it would be necessary to manually check all of the 92,000 cards. McVEY stated, however, the city is in the process of computerizing the driver's license information and this project is being handled by the State of Hawaii Information Systems at City Bank, 810 Richards Street.

On 5/23/68 JERRY MANN, City Information Service, advised as follows:

The Honolulu computer program for driver's licenses covers the entire state, and the system as of this date has all driver's licenses issued up until 5/17/68. MANN stated that it is possible to build a theoretical man and obtain possible hits from the computer. The computer is unable to supply information as to whether the application is for a new license or a relicensing; however, he stated that the computer contains Social Security numbers and old license numbers, and if any of these numbers that have been utilized by RAY are available they could be checked through the computer.

For the information of the Honolulu Division, JAMES EARL RAY, under the name of ERIC STARVO GALT, 2608 Highland Ave., Birmingham, Ala., was issued Alabama driver's license #2848947 on 9/6/67 reflecting his DOB as [redacted]

In 1951 while employed at Quincy, Ill., subject, under the name of JAMES E. RAY, was employed under Social Security [redacted]

Since the subject's true DOB is [redacted] and since he used the DOB of [redacted] under the name of ERIC STARVO GALT, which name he has used subsequent to his escape from prison, it is believed that if Honolulu would check the driver's license computer utilizing a 5 year leeway on each side of his year of birth, that this would logically narrow down the search of the Hawaii driver's licenses proposed by the Honolulu Division.

The Memphis Division currently has a summary report in dictation concerning this matter which sets forth considerable background information concerning the subject. The Honolulu Division may desire to hold in abeyance the proposed check of the driver's license computer until such time as Honolulu has an opportunity to review

Recheck of Unidentified Dead

LEWIS BUSH, Director, Bureau of Vital Statistics, Department of Health, Frankfort, Kentucky, stated on May 16, 1968, there are no central records maintained on unidentified deceased in the State. He stated that death certificates are eventually filed for unidentified dead in the Frankfort Office, but the information contained thereon will reflect only the Sex, Race, and approximate age of the deceased along with the cause of death and the County where the death is believed to have occurred. However, he stated that as unidentified bodies are held by any of the 400 or more funeral homes in the State or at a morgue in cities such as Louisville, the death certificate does not end up in file at Frankfort for some three or four months.

LEWIS stated that a great many of the unidentified bodies found in the State end up at the Medical Schools of the University of Louisville or Kentucky.

LEWIS stated he would be glad to furnish the list of the 400 or more funeral directors in the State if it is desired that they be circularized in connection with instant matter.

Recheck of Unidentified Latent Fingerprints.

On 5/8/68, SA THOMAS F. KELLERMAN contacted FRANK ANASTASIO, Identification Division, Kentucky State Police, Frankfort, Kentucky, who was requested to make a comparison of any unidentified latent fingerprints on file at his division of those of JAMES EARL RAY as set forth under I.O.
