On 5/24/68, contact was had with Mr. HAROLD FOW, Director of the Driver's License Bureau, Louisville, Ky., and with Lt. ROGER WILHOIT, 5/27/68, the latter Director, Driver's License Bureau, Department of Public Safety, Frankfort, Ky., who advised as follows:

There are approximately 2 million separate files in the Drivers License Bureau representing holders of Kentucky Operator's Licenses. These records can be searched either through the code number assigned to each separate licensee or alphabetically. There is no manner by which the records can be searched as to a specific date of birth or age group and in order to accomplish this each file jacket would have to be searched individually. WILHOIT stated even if sufficient manpower were available to search these records, it would take an extremely long time to accomplish, probably as much as several months.

WILHOIT stated his department searches and files the drivers license applications or renewals received from all of the 120 counties in the state as they are received in Frankfort. At the present time all of the April, 1968, applications and renewals have been filed and the department is working on the group received in the Bureau as late as May 17, 1968. WILHOIT also stated that the applications for new drivers licenses are not filed separate from the renewals and there is a standard card utilized through the service with check marks appearing thereon where the applicant for a driver's license checks whether his request is for a new license or for a renewal. It was only WILHOIT's estimate, but he stated that applicants for new licenses in the state total approximately 5,000 monthly.

WILHOIT added that it would be a physical impossibility to check these drivers license records during a usual work day because of other commitments in the department, that his office is presently understaffed and if the work was to be done, in searching these 2 million records, it would have to be done after hours and time and a half overtime would have to be paid all of the employees. WILHOIT stated that it was only a rough estimate, but he believed the cost of searching these records would run about four cents a file. There is no state appropriation to meet this expense. With regard to a team of FBI Agents searching these records, WILHOIT stated that it would not be desirable to have any outsiders to go through the Bureau's records, no matter how responsible they might be. He pointed out that the Department of Public Safety has a responsibility to the public in reporting to the different examining stations prior traffic offenses for drivers license applicants and if one of these files on an offender was misplaced or misfiled and the offender was issued a legitimate driver's license and then became involved in a serious accident, the State of Kentucky would be liable from a civil standpoint for not identifying the applicant as a prior offender.

WILHOIT advised that when any applicant for a new license in the State of Kentucky makes an application, he would do so through any of the 120 counties in the state and would be required to take a written examination and even a driver's test regardless of whether he was licensed in another state. WILHOIT stated that these driver's tests are administered by examiners of the Kentucky State Police assigned to each of the counties in the state and as a practical manner in attempting to locate subject, JAMES EARL RAY, the individual license examiners would be contacted and shown the available photographs

of RAY to determine if he applied for a driver's license in the state.

In view of the above, UACB, the Louisville Office will contact each individual drivers license examiner in each of the 120 counties displaying and leaving wanted flyers on the subject with these examiners requesting that they be on the alert for any information indicating possible application for driver's license on the part of RAY. Efforts will be made at the same time to determine if anyone answering the description of RAY has made application during April and May of this year.

Dear Joe:

As I understand it there are approximately 310,000 practicing physicians in the United States.

If you arrange for the Bureau to:

1. Prepare a one page insert (with photo, descriptive data and requests);
2. Fold and insert into franked envelope and seal envelope;
3. Deliver to Fisher Stevens Company, 120 Brighton Road, Clifton, New Jersey; then

Fisher Stevens will address each envelope and will bag and mail the material for a charge of \$12.15 per thousand. This would come to an approximate total of \$3,766.

Another possibility is to obtain the addressing material from Fisher Stevens and perform the addressing and mailing function at the Bureau. This would involve an approximate cost of \$6.65 per thousand or total of \$2,061. Fisher Stevens is completely computerized and set up for this type service and could do the job of addressing and so forth in about three days.

The X-Agent at Fisher Stevens is Mr. Ralph Duke Powell who has advised me that they have previously done work of a similar nature for the FBI. He specifically mentioned having circularized dentists in connection with the identification of specific dental work.

There exists one to several other companies which perform similar services. However, I do not know their identities.
