For the information of the Bureau, CORDRA YORK advised that on 6/10/68 he was summoned to the State Attorney General's Office, Memphis, Tennessee, where he executed an affidavit relative to the sale of the binoculars identified with this case. In addition, he was reinterviewed by a representative of the Memphis Police Department. Mr. YORK stated that he was told by both representatives of local law enforcement agencies that these interviews were for the purpose of extradition of JAMES EARL RAY to the United States.

GALT, 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California. He said this letter was received by the American-Southern Africa Council in December, 1967. The letter was typewritten in capital letters and double spaced. It is set out as follows:

"12-28-67

"DEAR SIR,

"I RECENTLY READ AN ARTICLE IN THE L. A. TIMES ON YOUR CONCIL,

THE LOCAL JOHN BIRCH SOCIETY PROVIDED ME WITH YOUR ADDRESS.

MY REASON FOR WRITING IS THAT I AM CONSIDERING IMMIGRATINGTO RHODESIA, HOWEVER THEIR ARE A COUPLE LEGAL QUESTIONS INVOLVED.

"ONE: THE U. S. GOVERNMENT WILL NOT ISSUE A PASSPORT FOR TRAVEL TO RHODESIA.

"TWO: WOULD THEIR BE ANY WAY TO ENTER RHODESIA LEGALLY (FROM THE RHODESIAN GOVERNMENT POINT OF VIEW).

I WOULD APPRECIATE ANY INFORMATION YOU COULD GIVE ME ON THE ABOVE SUBJECT OR ANY OTHER INFORMATION ON RHODESIA.

An attorney, MICHAEL D. JAFFE accompanied JOHN ACORD with the above information. ACORD said JAFFE was with him as a friend rather than as ACORD's attorney. MICHAEL D. JAFFE resides at 1200 South Washington Street, Apartment 625 E, Alexandria, Virginia. JAFFE's office is at 300 Independence Avenue, South East, Washington, D. C.

JOHN ACORD, Chairman, American-Southern Africa Council, 800 Fourth Street, South West said his secretary, GLORIA WALKER sent a reply to ERIC S. GALT in connection with the inquiry in December, 1967 from GALT about Rhodesia which had been received by the American-Southern Africa Council. ACORD said the form letter would have shown appreciation for GALT's interest in Rhodesia and would have enclosed literature about Rhodesia. The letter would have suggested GALT write to the Department of Information, Salisbury, Rhodesia for information about immigration to Rhodesia.

ACORD said a valid passport is all that is required to visit Rhodesia. A visa is not needed by a tourist. Immigration to Rhodesia would require complete documentation.

ACORD said the American-Southern Africa Council has 15,000 members in the United States. The members pay dues and contribute for special projects. The organization also obtains money from the sale of products made in Rhodesia such as radios and electronic items. The American-Southern Africa Council conducts public relations on behalf of Rhodesia and other Southern Africa nations. A Newsletter is distributed and other promotional material prepared. ACORD added he also lectures on Rhodesia and South Africa and organizes tours to South Africa.

Recently she started going through a file folder of correspondence and put it in alphabetical order. During this work, she discovered a letter from ERIC S. GALT dated December 28, 1967 which was received by the American - Southern Africa Council. She said she turned the letter over to JOHN ACORD, Chairman of the American-Southern Africa Council.

During December, 1967, JOHN ACORD was in Rhodesia and GLORIA WALKER answered correspondence received by the American-Southern Africa Council. GLORIA WALKER said she would have answered the letter with a form letter enclosing literature about Rhodesia within about two weeks of the date the letter was received. She said she would have added at the bottom of the form letter, a handwritten note saying, "The enclosed folders may be of interest to you." She also would have changed the last paragraph of the form letter to indicate, she hoped he had a fine holiday season.

GLORIA WALKER said she believes she sent these items to ERIC S. GALT: Volume 2, Number 6, November - December, 1967 issue of American-Southern Africa Review.

Mr. KEN TOWSEY, Information Officer, Information Office of the Rhodesian Government, 2852 Mc Gill Terrace, N. W., was interviewed at his residence, 6807 Bradley Boulevard, Bethesda, Maryland.

Mr. TOWSEY advised that JOHN ACORD had visited Rhodesian Information Office earlier on May 9, 1968, and had given Mr. JOHN HOOPER of that office a copy of a letter dated December 28, 1967, from ERIC S. GALT, 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California, in which GALT had expressed an interest in travel to Rhodesia and asked to be furnished with information on that subject. He said that ACORD had told HOOPER that he, ACORD, had come across the letter in the files of his Office, the American-Southern Africa Council on this date.

Mr. TOWSEY stated that his interest in this matter was to offer on behalf of his Government all assistance possible, however, he asked that a formal request be made to his Government for such assistance. He stated that a written or oral request in any form would be honored.

Mr. TOWSEY requested that any request made of his Government and any information or assistance furnished by his Government not be made public in view of implications of exploiting the existing situation of his Government and of possibly expanding hostility toward his Government.

TOWSEY stated that if such request were presented to him he would not use open telegraph to pass the request on to his Government but would use the mails which are assumed secure. He stated that this method would require considerable time. He suggested that the United States Government might wish to present a request through the American Consulate at Salisbury, Rhodesia.

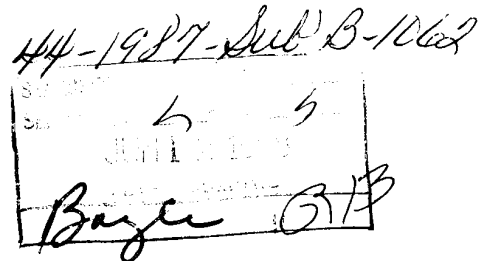
As Ray was apprehended in London, England, on June 8, 1968, this stop notice is no longer required and may be removed.

Mr. NORMAN BUCHANAN, General Manager, Paw Paw Laundry, Paw Paw, Michigan, advised that prior to April, 1968, his company used the code similar to "20R-3". He advised a search of the records of his company disclosed code # "20R-3" is issued to a bundle of six shirts belonging to one "GRIFFIN, 1206 Summit, Kalamazoo, Michigan", which had been returned to the Norge Cleaners in Kalamazoo, which is one of two substations operated by Norge in Kalamazoo, and they are located at 16143 Main Street, and 4419 South Westnedge.

Mr. BUCHANAN made available samples from code by the machine utilized by the Paw Paw Laundry, Paw Paw, Michigan.

The above samples were furnished to the FBI Laboratory on July 6, 1968. The FBI Laboratory, by communication dated May 14, 1968, reported that the laundry machine of the Paw Paw Laundry did not prepare the laundry tapes previously acquired as evidence.

Mr. HARPER indicated that stops would immediately be placed at the three points of entry into Canada from the State of Michigan for ERIC GALT.

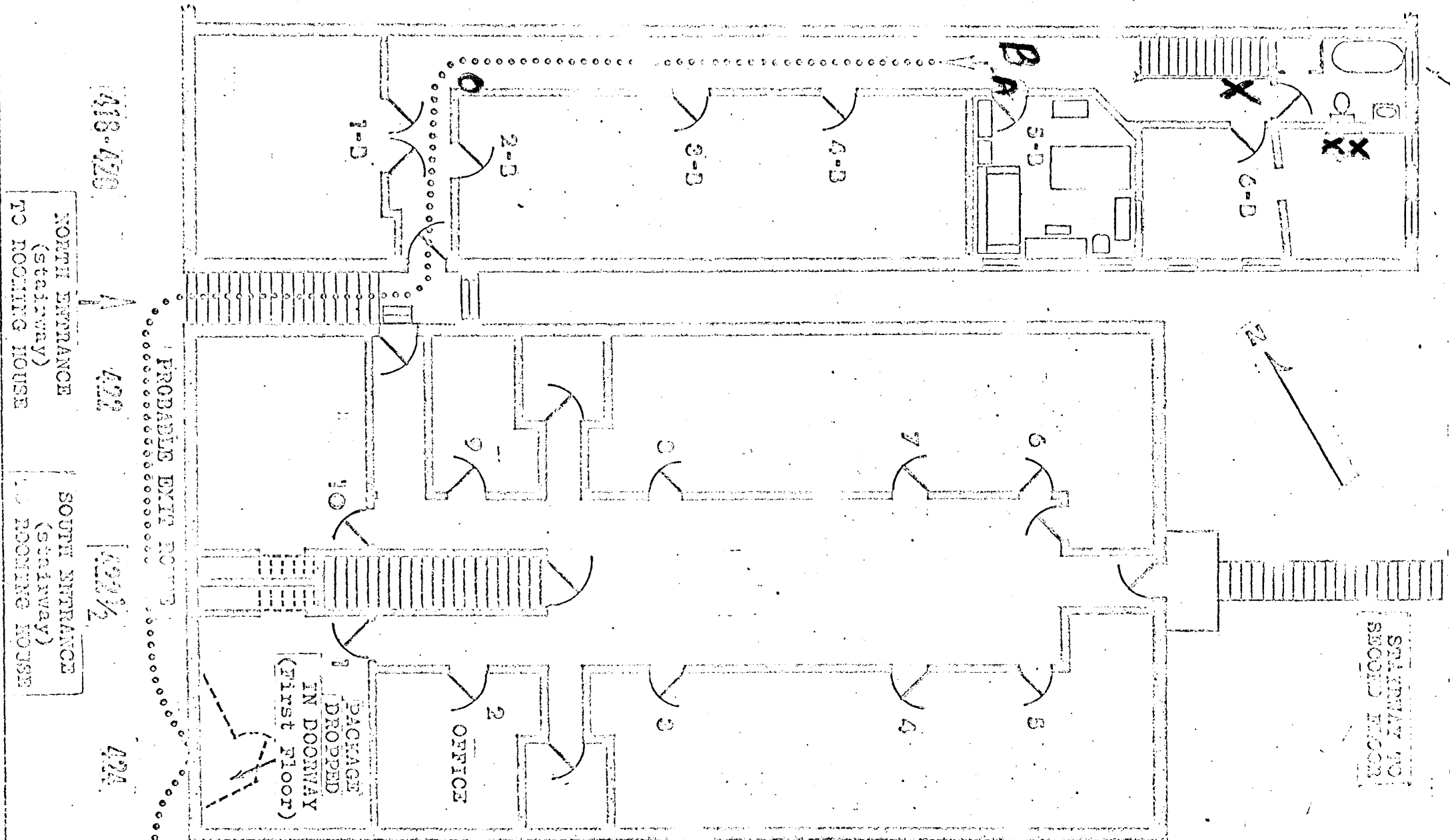

I, Charles Quitman Stephens, being duly sworn, depose and say:

1. I am 43 years old and at the time now I have no fixed address. From March of 1967 until June of 1968, I lived at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, Tennessee. On April 4, 1968, my common-law wife and I were living there in Apartment 6-B. The floor plan attached hereto and marked Exhibit I, the original of which I have signed, is a good likeness of the relationship of the rooms on the second floor, which was my floor.

2. Mrs. Bessie Brewer was the resident manager of the rooming house. At about 4:00 p.m., or a little later, on April 4, 1968, I thought I heard Mrs. Brewer's voice in the hall and I went out of my apartment to speak to her about the hot-water heater I had been working on. From the banister of the back stairs near my apartment door I saw her and a man standing in the hallway near the entrance to Room 5-B, which is just down the hall from my bedroom. I did not recognize the man with Mrs. Brewer and I assumed he was a new guest looking at the room. The man was looking into the room near the doorway and I got a glimpse at him from his left side. I have marked on the diagram the letter "I" where the man was standing, the letter "B" where Mrs. Brewer was standing, and the letter "X" where I was standing.

3. On April 24, 1968, I looked at FBI Wanted Flyer 442-A, and I identified the profile photograph on the left as looking very much like the man I saw looking at Room 5-B on the afternoon of April 4, 1968. A duplicate of that Wanted
