JOHN ACORD, Chairman, American-Southern Africa Council, 800 Fourth Street, South West said his secretary, GLORIA WALKER sent a reply to ERIC S. GALT in connection with the inquiry in December, 1967 from GALT about Rhodesia which had been received by the American-Southern Africa Council. ACORD said the form letter would have shown apprediation for GALT's interest in Rhodesia and would have enclosed literature about Rhodesia. The letter would have suggested GALT write to the Department of Information, Salisbury, Rhodesia for information about immigration to Rhodesia.

ACORD said a valid passport is all that is required to visit Rhodesia. A visa is not needed by a tourist. Immigration to Rhodesia would require complete documentation.

ACORD said the American-Southern Africa Council has 15,000 members in the United States. The members pay dues and contribute for special projects. The organization also obtains money from the sale of products made in Rhodesia such as radios and electronic items. The American-Southern Africa Council conducts public relations on behalf of Rhodesia and other Southern Africa nations. A Newsletter is distributed and other promotional material prepared. ACORD added he also lectures on Rhodesia and South Africa and organizes tours to South Africa.

Mr. KEN TOWSEY, Information Officer, Information Office of the Rhodesian Government, 2852 Mc Gill Terrace, N. W., was interviewed at his residence, 6807 Bradley Boulevard, Bethesda, Maryland.

Mr. TOWSEY advised that JOHN ACORD had visited Rhodesian Information Office earlier on May 9, 1968, and had given Mr. JOHN HOOPER of that office a copy of a letter dated December 28, 1967, from ERIC S. GALT, 1535 North Serrano, Los Angeles, California, in which GALT had expressed an interest in travel to Rhodesia and asked to be furnished with information on that subject. He said that ACORD had told HOOPER that he, ACORD, had come across the letter in the files of his Office, the American-Southern Africa Council on this date.

Mr. TOWSEY stated that his interest in this matter was to offer on behalf of his Government all assistance possible, however, he asked that a formal request be made to his Government for such assistance. He stated that a written or oral request in any form would be honored.

Mr. TOWSEY requested that any request made of his Government and any information or assistance furnished by his Government not be made public in view of implications of exploiting the existing situation of his Government and of possibly expanding hostility toward his Government.

TOWSEY stated that if such request were presented to him he would not use open telegraph to pass the request on to his Government but would use the mails which are assumed secure. He stated that this method would require considerable time. He suggested that the United States Government might wish to present a request through the American Consulate at Salisbury. Rhodesia.

- I, Charles Quitman Stephene, being duly sworn, depose and say:
- 1. I am 48 years old and right now I have no fixed address. From March of 1987 until June of 1988, I lived at 422% South Main Street, Memphis, Tennessee. On April 4, 1983, my common-law wife and I were living there in Apartment 6-3. The floor plan attached hereto and marked Emhibit I, the original of which I have signed, is a good likeness of the relationship of the rooms on the second floor, which was a floor.
- 2. Mrs. Despie Brewer was the resident manager of the rooming house. At about 4:00 p.m., or a little later, on April 4, 1938, I thought I heard Mrs. Brewer's voice in the hall and I went out of my apartment to speak to her about the hot-water heater I had been working on. From the banister of the back stairs near my apartment door I saw her and a man standing in the hallway near the entrance to Room 5-B, which is just down the hall from my bedroom. A field not recognize the man with Mrs. Brewer and I assumed he was a new guest looking at the room. The man was looking into the room near the doorway and I got a glimpse at him from his left side.
