On June 26, 1968, Lonnal Wilhelm, P.O. Box 686, Columbus, Texas with residence at 431 Front Street, Columbus, applied and received P.O. Box 602, U.S. Post Office, Columbus, Texas. Wilhelm reportedly listed the purpose for having P.O. Box 602 as being for the receipt of funds for the defense of James Earl Ray suspected murderer of Martin Luther King on April 4, 1968. Lonnal Wilhelm, a white male, is approximately 30 years old, married and is the son of Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen, P.O. Box 686, Columbus, Texas, residence 431 Front Street, Columbus, Texas. Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen, also known as Loyce Bentsen arrived at Columbus, Texas in August, 1967 from Harlingin, Texas.

Lonnal Wilhelm's Texas driver's license number is 0072544 and Mrs. Fred M. Bentsen's Texas driver's license is 0022346.

On July 3, 1968, Frances Davinport, Credit Bureau of Columbus, Texas, advised that on June 26, 1968 she had a local inquiry on a L.E. Wilhelm who was reported to be self-employed as a nurseryman.

On July 3, 1968 a check of records of Colorado County Sheriff's Office, Columbus, Texas, revealed no information identifiable with the name Lonnal Wilhelm.



The House Sub-Committee invertigating Klan activities heard the following witnesses and none were represented by counsel:

WILLIAM MUCH MORRIS

This witness gave an account of his own Klan membership since 1924. * He said he was Imperial Wizard of the Federated KKK at the time it became defunct and admitted that during a 1949 Alabama Grand Jury investigation, he was arrested for contempt of the Grand Jury because he refused to identify Klan members. He said to Klan group was not involved in floggings.

WFO 157-744 He said he served on the Board of the National Knights of the KKK (NKKKK) with JAMES VENABLE and H. J. HILL, but later resigned from that Board and formed the Knights of the Klu Klux Klan (KKKK), and is now Emperor of that group. He said he was unable to furnish records of the Federated Klan as ordered because his house burned in 1954 or 1955 and destroyed all such records and also said that he has no records pertaining to the KKKK although he later stated he had some material which he will search out and make available to the committee. He refused on the basis of constitutional privilege to identify members of the Imperial Concillium. He took this privilege in refusing to furnish the identity of persons in attendance in April, 1965, at the organization meeting of the KKKK. He stated he was aware of the "assassination letter" written by DANIEL WAGNER and that he had discussed this letter with ELOISE WITTE, but said that both regarded the letter as ridiculous, and he said he never administered any oath or any part of the Klan writual in WAGNER's presence or to WAGNER as he regarded him as a "mad dog" in his thinking. He said he did tell WAGNER to write out the specifics contained in that letter but never investigated any part of it and had not informed any law enforcement agency of its contents. He stated he talked to the FBI initially contacted him in regard to it. reported trip of MAGNER and CHUCK GILLIAM to Georgia to get dynamite and knew nothing of any dynamite being transported He stated the Klan rally held at PARKIE SCOTT's farm was advertised as being a KKKK rally but was a joint venture as JAHES VEHABLE was in attendance. He said approximately 300 people signed applications and 100 paid 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

WFO 157-744 Ohio Klan with BOBBY J. STEPHENS. He said records pertaining to the rallies at Brunswick and Lodi, Ohio, were kept for SCOTT and all together he had received approximately \$250 towards his own expenses. MORRIS stated that VENABLE brought a "degree team" to Ohio to initiate members and identified them as FNU MC GRIFF of Georgia and EARL HOLGUMB. MORRIS attempted to clarify the difference between the KKKK and the NKKKK as it exists in Ohio and stated that he had no knowledge of a document dated 7/29/65 basers the NKKKK to do business as a foreign concern in the state of North Carolina, and said he had not given consent for his name to be affixed to that document as Vice President, NKKKK. This date, according to the committee, was after he had resigned from the NKKKK. MORRIS admitted that a hational association of Klan Units existed but said it was not a cover for the NKEKK. He identified VENABLE as Chairman of the group and the following as members of it: FNU MADDOK, Association of Georgia Klans. Association of Georgia Klans. Florida Klan. Dixie Klans. WFO 157-744 He said the KKKK has no Klaverns as it is just in a formation stage and stated members received into the Klan at the rally at PARKIE SCOTT's farm may be in the NKKKK. He identified JIM HARRIS of Cincinnati as Great Titan in the KKKK and FNU LOUIS of Akron as an officer in that group. He said he only knew of HARRIS' reported meeting with ROBERT SHELTON through rumor. MORRIS stated he did not know of any dynamite stored in the area of Barnesville, Georgia, and said WALTER M. HUFF (ph) is not an Imperial Officer of the KKKK, and he did not know if he was an officer in the NKKKK. iz ider Witness was continued of subpoena until 3/1/66, to produce records called for by the committee. . ELOISE WITTE U This witness stated she is currently a member of the NKKKK and two years ago was commissioned Grand Empress. She stated she maintains no records pertaining to the MKKKK or the KKKK and produced only two letters from VENABLE. She stated she has had correspondence with MORRIS about rallies but generally does not save this correspondence. She said she attended the rally at PARKIE SCOTT's farm but did not attend rallies at Brunswick or Lodi, Ohio. She cited constitutional privilege in refusing to identify individuals active in the Cleveland area in the HKKKK or mumber of Klaverns of that organization in Ohio. letter" of WASHER to be ridiculous and stated he had never discussed the detailed violence in that letter with her. believe in violence, although it was her impression that he believed the Klan was engaged in violent mob action, and seemed emotionally upset in this regard. She stated she did not introduce him to W. A. DAVIS at a National States 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

WFO 157-744 Rights Party meeting to put him in touch with a gun dealer but stated DAVIS was just one of numerous people she introduced WAGNER to at that meeting. She said whenever WAGNER became emotional in conversation, she would change that conversation before he detailed any of his plans, repeatedly telling him that the Klan was not a violent organization. She stated she knew (ph) HANNA as a former member of the American Nazi Party and also regarded him as a psycopath. She said she had felt initially that she could help straighten WAGNER out but he later became a source of irritation to her and her family. EARL DONALD HOLCOME This witness cited constitutional privilege in refusing to answer questions of the Sub-Committee and added to the privilege that to testify "might jeopardize my life or that of my family." He said he did not have any records pertaining to theUKA but took the 5th amendment in refusing to state whether he had such records or if he destroyed them after receiving the subpoena. We refused to answer the following: 1. If he was a member of the NKKKK. 2. If he was wearing a UKA lapel pen. 3. If he was a member of the Black Shirts. 5. If he had given dynamice to CHUCK GILLIAM 6. Macher VIMABLE was aware of trip to Georgia by GILLIAM and WACHER. 7. Whether statement by WAGNER that he, HOLCUMB, GILLIAN's car and also refused to state purpose for which they obtained this 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

Referenced teletype indicates ELOISE VITTE bead of Committee of One Hillion Cameasians to Harch on Congress, Cincinnati, in July, 1964.

Referenced WFO sirte), 2/14/66, re HCHA Klan Hearings, RM (Klan) (a dopy enclosed for Hemphia) contains information about RLOISE VITIE's testimony before HCHA on 2/14/66. This testimony included the following:

ELDISK WITTE, in 1966, an Empress of Mational Knights of the Kn Klux Klan (WEKK) in Ohio, Also, WITTE considered "assessination latter" of WAGMER to be ridiculous and stated WAGMER had never discussed the detailed violence in that letter with her. KLOISE WITTE said she repeatedly told WAGMER the Klan did not believe in violence.

HTO indices reviewed and do not contain any information that ELOISE VITTE, 1654 Otto Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio, was interviewed concerning her textimony before House Committee on Un-American Activities on 2/14/66.

"Activities of Na Kiux Kian Organizations in the United States," Part 3, Hearings Before the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 89th Congress, Second Session, published by U.S. Government Printing Office in 1966, reviewed concurning testinony of ELDISE WITTE on 2/14/66 and ELCHARD JOSEPH HAMMA on 2/15/66.

Page 3543 of Hrs. WITE's testimony contains the following:

Mr. MANUEL: "Did you ever make the statement to Mr.
WAGNER that the Klan had bired a gunman for
\$25.0007"

Mrs. WITTE: "Resvens, no."

Mr. MANUEL: "Did you have any conversation with Mr. WACHER regarding the appearance of MANIER LUTHER KING at Antioch College in Tellow Springs, Obio?"

Mrs. WITTE: "No."

WITTH added that WAGNER read of this in newspaper, wrote a latter to WITTE, and phoned has about KING's appearance at Antioch College. DANNY WAGNER said he hoped WITTE would not be alarmed with him but he had some ideas he wanted to carry out. She added that WAGNER never told her what these plans were that he had for MAKTIN LUINER KING.

Page 3545 contains information from WITTE that Mr. MORRIS told her he had heard of a plot underfeet to do every with the President. Mr. WITTE, ELDISE WITTE's bushend, Mr. MORRIS, MARTIN LUTHER WING, and HUMPHREY. Mrs. WITTE said she did not know the above plot in a letter written by DANNY WAGNER. She described the plot as ridiculous and WAGNER, a psychopathic case, Mrs. WITTE said she did not furnish this information to law enforcement officers as she did not think WAGNER would carry through an anything as ridiculous as this. Mrs. WITTE thought WAGNER might have taken this method of retailation for being demied membership in the Kinn.

Mrs. WITE stated she did not introduce WAGNER to W. A. DAVIS at National States Eights Party to put WAGNER in touch with a gen dealer.

Page 3631 contains portion of testimony of RICHARD JOSEPH HAMMA on 2/15/66. HAMMA said Mrs. ELOISE WO 44-703

WITTE said "Mr. MAGNER to do some work for her. Mr. JOHNSON, if he meeded assessination, Mr. MAGNER could do it." Mrs. WITTE added, "Might now, we are interested in other people." WITTE said "MARTIE LUCIPER COOP" was one, asserting to MARMA. Above name described by MARMA as right wing expression for MARTIE LETHER KING.

GALF also ordered a 12" IF recording, The Invention of the Presidency.

GALT requested he be billed for the above items.

The above business reply postcard received by FCA bore no postmakk inasmuch as it was a pre-addressed business reply card sent to FCA's Marion, Chio, address.

The business reply card bearing the hand printing ERIC S. GALT, Lorain Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, would have been a card sent to an expired 1967 American Heritage subscriber, and would have consisted of two haves, namely the pre-addressed half that was returned to FCA, the other half bearing the name and address of the expired 1967 American Heritage Subscriber.

A check of FCA records disclosed GALT's name with not appear on 1967 American Maritage subscriber's list.

Mr. CARLSON made available the above mentioned American Heritage business reply postcard and stated it need not be returned.

7/15/68 AYRTEL DIRECTOR, FBI (44-38861) TO: SAC, MIAMI (44-1854) (P) FROM: SUBJECT: MURKIN WILLIAM SOMERSETT, formerly MM 607-R, who is no longer being contacted by the Miami Office and who is characterized as having furnished reliable information in the past, and in addition has furnished information which cannot be verified or corroborated, telephonically advised on 7/12/68 as follows: Since the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he has made trips to Atlanta, Ga. and Memphis, Tean. at the request and expense of the Florida State Attorney's Office and the Miami, Florida Police Department. He indicated the purpose of these trips was to try and develop information relative to the assassination of Doctor KING and other information relating to the National States Rights Party. He did not elaborate on his assignments nor did he indicate he had developed any unusual or pertinent information. He reportedly was in contact with witnesses involved in the KING case and based on information heard on the "street," it was said that the chauffeur of Doctor KING was suspected of "setting up Doctor KING for the assassination." SOMERSETT was unable to identify source of this information.
