#### FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

On July 28, 1968, at 7:15 p.m., WILLIE JAMES McGUIRE, who gave his residence as 2747 Central Parkway, Los Angeles, California, telephonically contacted the Birmingham Office and claimed that he had been standing on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel, close to victim, MARTIN LUTHER KING, at the time "shots" were fired, and claimed the "shots" were not fired from the rooming house on Main Street as claimed but from another building located "behind Goldstein Clothing Store". McGUIRE said he was calling the FBI after being convinced by some friends that he should make his information known to the These friends had directed him to Mr. ERNEST POOLE, operator of a Negro funeral home in Birmingham, who on behalf of McGUIRE, put McGUIRE in telephonic contact with the Birmingham Office. McGUIRE said he was a lease truck driver for Transcon Company, Los Angeles, and was leaving Birmingham at 9:00 p.m.

McGUIRE was contacted at the Poole Funeral Home, 1507 7th Avenue, North, and furnished the following information:

McGUIRE said he lived at 627 Alameda Street, Los Angeles, telephone 827-3581, with his wife and children. He is employed as a lease truck driver by Transcon Company and was presently enroute to Los Angeles. On "the day KING got shot in Memphis" (exact date unrecalled by McGUIRE), McGUIRE arrived in Memphis with a load, about 2:30 p.m., in his tractor-trailer, enroute to Los Angeles. He was accompanied by a helper, JAMES THOMPSON, 1237 Abilene Street, Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

McGUIRE parked the tractor-trailer near"3rd and Vance", near the Goodyear Tire Company and also near the "Queen Anne" Motel. He had to wait in Memphis to pick up some freight bills. Between 2:30 p.m. and about 5:45 p.m., he and THOMPSON, in the trailer, drank at least a pint of Seagram V.O. whiskey with at least three or four beers. (McGUIRE also advised that prior to contacting the

FBI on July 28, 1968, he had drunk "a couple of pints of whiskey." "I drink a couple of pints every day.") At 5:45 p.m., McGUIRE checked into Room 337 or 347, "on the second floor" of the Lorraine Motel, where he was supposed to meet his "ex-wife", EVELYN JOHNSON, who lives in the 400 block of South Arlene Street, Memphis. JOHNSON never kept the date. About 6:00 p.m., McGUIRE observed MARTIN LUTHER KING arrive at the motel in a black Cadillac, driven by a chauffeur and accompanied by a couple of other associates. KING walked up the stairs from the parking lot to the second floor balcony, where McGUIRE said hello. At the time McGUIRE was standing on the balcony looking out towards the parking lot, "just standing, looking, like Negroes do". KING said hello to McGUIRE, as he recognized McGUIRE. McGUIRE said, "I seen him all over the world he knew me." KING entered the room next door to the room occupied by McGUIRE and stayed in there for at least an hour, perhaps 90 minutes. At that time KING came out of this room, and McGUIRE was just leaving his room to go eat dinner. The chauffeur called up to KING to get a topcoat, as it was getting cool. KING walked back to his room and came out carrying a "brown beige topcoat over his left arm." "I'll never forget that topcoat." McGUIRE was looking toward KING, when he heard "two shots" come from his left. McGUIRE immediately looked to his left and saw the "flash" come from the second floor of a building located next to the Goodyear store, a distance of not more than 75 feet. McGUIRE did not see who fired the He then looked back and saw KING lying on the floor. About then a white man came up and put a sheet over KING.

McGUIRE then immediately left the motel and walked over to Main Street, near the "Goldstein store", where he observed a pistol on the street. About then a white policeman picked up the pistol and put it in his squad car.

From there McGUIRE went to the Queen Anne and drank until 3:00 a.m., when he went to his tractor-trailer parked nearby and went to sleep. At 8:00 a.m. the next day, he and THOMPSON left and drove back to Los Angeles. He stated he never returned to the Lorraine Motel and had not taken any personal effects with him when he went there originally to meet his "ex-wife".

McGUIRE said he was told several times after this by friends, whom he would not identify, that he would be in danger if he told what he knew, and that he had not told anyone what he knew and what he saw until his interview on July 28, 1968, by the FBI. After telling some Birmingham friends, they told him to contact Mr. ERNEST POOLE, who could give him the proper advice and put him in contact with the proper authorities.



DONALD JAMES NISSEN, FBI Number 607 320 A, was a parole violator in case in which Phoenix was origin. He had previously made telephonic contact with SA G. WAYNE MACK of the Phoenix Office and made arrangements to surrender himself to agent MACK at St. Louis on August 5, 1968.

On the morning of August 5, 1968, NISSEN called the St. Louis Office from the Municipal Airport at St. Louis stating he had just arrived by plane from Tampa, Florida, and desired to surrender to the FBI. He was subsequently taken in custody by SA CLETIS B. BIDEWELL and SA G. WAYNE MACK and upon interview furnished the following information:

NISSEN has remarried and his wife, who is pregnant, is living and working in Tampa, Florida. NISSEN has been working as a salesman for a book company which he declined to name and stated he has been doing very well financially. Until around the first of December NISSEN was living and working in the Atlanta, Georgia, area. Around the first or second of December, 1967, as he was leaving the Federal Building in Atlanta after having made his regular contact with his probation officer, he was hailed on the steps of the Federal Building by an individual, unknown to him. Thas person asked if he was DON NISSEN and when he replied in/the affirmative, this individual stated he had a message for/him from MAC. NISSEN understood MAC to be LEROY MC MENAMAN who had advised him while they were fellow inmates at Leavenworth Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, that \$100,000 had been offered by the White Knights of the Ku Mux Klan of Mississippi to be paid to anyone who would kill MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The person accosting NISSEN on the steps of the Aulanta Federal Building then stated that apparently somebody had done some talking and NISSEN assumed he made reference to information that he had furnished to the FBI in Sherman, Texas, in April, 1967. Before any more conversation transpired, the individual who had transported NISSEN to the Federal Building called to him from across the street and the unknown individual immediately walked away from him. It was NISSEN's assumption that this person thought the individual calling him might be an FBI agent or police officer and did not desire that his identity be learned.

NISSEN described the individual accosting him as a white male, age 30-35, 5'10", 165-170 pounds, blond hair, cut medium short, and slightly wavy. He stated he was extremely well dressed in obviously expensive clothes.

NISSEN went on to state the more he thought about this incident, the more alarmed he became and left the vicinity of Atlanta shortly thereafter and obtained other employment. The only other incident which served to arouse his suspicion were telephone calls made for him to his place of employment in which the individual calling declined to reveal his identity. NISSEN stated he considered relating above facts to his parole officer at Atlanta but resolved against it since he did not trust his parole officer too much and was afraid his parole might be revoked automatically. He also considered contacting the FBI Office in Atlanta but decided against this also. According to NISSEN he felt uncomfortable and worried in the Atlanta area in view of the information he had furnished in connection with the bounty on MARTIN LUTHER KING and the fact that the Ku Klum Klan was reportedly strong in that area. He stated it was his understanding that the Deputy United States Marshal, name unknown to him, who went to work about the time he started reporting to his parole officer at Atlanta was supposed to be a member of the Ku Klux Klan.

With reference to information furnished him by LEROY MC MENAMAN while at Leavenworth Penitentiary, NISSEN stated that in one conversation, MC MENAMAN told him that if after his arrival at Atlanta, he could find out MARTIN LUTRE. HING's travel route and itinerary, he could earn \$100,000 for himself.

On 8/8/68, JOHN QUINTON MOSLEY! on furbugh from Cummins Prison, was interviewed by SA CHESTER M. MC MILLAN and SA JOHN M/ MOORE at the Pine Bluff, Arkansas resident agency. / He advised that at Cummins he had met HUBERT WAGES, a prisoner who had revealed in conversation that he was a professional burglar, and that he had associated in the past with brothers by the name of JERRY and JAMES RAY who got into trouble in Missouri, due to some money orders. These names were mentioned as MOSLEY spoke of a friend by the name of BOBBY RAY. WAGES frequently mentioned that he was going to kill Dr. KING when released from prison. WAGES was released from Cummins on 7/26/67. In late November or early December, 1967, WAGES sent a letter to an inmate at Cummins in which he enclosed a photograph of himself with another individual identified only as a cousin.

MOSLEY, based on observation of photographs of JAMES EARL RAY appearing in newspapers, advised the alleged cousin of WAGES to be JAMES EARL RAY.

MOSLEY, a white male, 49 years of age, has been arrested numerous times on drunk charges. He has served in Michigan Prison on perjury charges for lying on a witness stand, and is serving 6 years sentence at Cummins for "hot checks". He expects to be released in approximately 2½ months. He claims that he has been attempting for a number of months to obtain a lawyer, only for the purpose of furnishing the above information, and that JOYCE was the only attorney he was able to contact.

LR 157-1215 He advised that the last known address for WAGES was 319 West Shelby Drive, Memphis, Tennessee, which is believed to be the address of a son of WAGES. WAGES appears to be identical with HUBERT ELLIS WAGES, Memphis file #87-355, who in 1946 was a member of a burglar's gang composed of 25 or 30 individuals.
