

Mr. BARGER advised that he was watching the march that occurred in Memphis on 4/8/68 on TV station KRNT, Des Moines, Iowa, on the evening of 4/8/68 and added that between 10:20 p.m. and 10:25 p.m. while they were showing a picture of the march he believes he saw a man in the march who strongly resembled the artist's conception of the murderer which was done by BILL HERRING of the "Commercial Appeal," which sketch also appeared in Iowa papers.

He added that this man came into the picture from left to right and was wearing a dark overcoat and was chewing gum vigorously. He added that this was at a point where the march had stopped just about the time Mrs. KING entered the march.

Pursuant to a telephone call to the Memphis Office from ROBERT PITMAN GENTRY. Smyrna, Tenn., on the afternoon of 4/6/68, he was contacted by the writer and SA ROBERT F. BRUNNER at Smyrna on 4/6/68. It is noted that he appeared slightly intoxicated at the time.

He advised that he had information as to the possible maken identity of the UNSUB in this case and that, if the FBI would pay him \$100,000, he would make the information available. He further advised that he would have to have protection for himself and his family as he would be jeppardizing himself with the Ku Klux Klan by furnishing the information. He was informed that the FBI did not make a practive of offering rewards but that he could possibly be compensated, depending upon the value of the information which he furnished. He requested that he be given a written guarantee for a certain amount of money before furnishing any information. He was informed that this would not be done. After further discussion he agreed to furnish information without any promises or guarantees for of reward but stated, "You know my reputation", and that if he didn't receive some money should his information prove of value, he would "get even". He declined to elaborate on what he meant by this remark.

After requesting that, under no circumstances, should his identity be disclosed, GENTRY furnished the following information:

Approximately $4\frac{1}{2}$ years ago, while a member of the Ku Klux Klan, he became associated with <u>WILLIAM ROSE.</u> A Klansman from Greenville, Miss. ROSE, white, male, age 27-30, $5^{\circ}11^{\circ}-6^{\circ}0^{\circ}$, 165-170 lbd., with "strawberry" blond hair, worked as a machinist in Greenville. On several occasions ROSE mentioned that he would like to kill Dr. KING and on one accasion during 1964 mentioned going to Jacksonville, Fla., where KING was at the time, to shoot him. However, ROSE didn't have the appropriate weapon at the time and couldn't do it.

He advised that, on 4/5/68, he had seen a drawing of the UNSUB in a newspaper, and, when he saw the drawing, he recognized it as strongly resembling ROSE. During his acquaintance with ROSE, ROSE had also been associated with a Klansman from Greenville name.

WILLAND. He could not recall WILLAND's first name and could not recall whether he had ever actually seen WILLAND but he did recall the name.

He advised that he had no information that ROSE had actually done the shooting other than that ROSE resembles the drawing he saw and that he believed ROSE capable of committing the shooting.

It is noted that GENTRY is a former member of the Ku Klux Klan and was a subject of ME File 157-648 which involved a bombing in Jacksonville, Fla. GENTRY, along with several other subjects, were was tried in USDC, Jacksonville, in 1964 and acquitted. Since that time he has appeared before the U.S. Senate Committee investigating Klan activity. In addition, he has been considered a local suspect in connection with several shootings and bombings in the Smyrna, Tenn. area which occurred during labor disputes involving Teamsters Union Local 327, Nashville, Tenn. Wheneverket involving Teamsters Union Local 327, Nashville, Tenn. Wheneverket inxinexperior the Indianapolis Division and was considered a potential racial informant by that Division. In contacts with GENTRY in the past by the Memphis Division he has proved uncooperative and indicated that he felt the FBI was harrassing him.

At the conclusion of the interview GENTRY reinerated that he would not testidy regarding ROSE and that he did not wish his identity to be revealed.

The question is are we going to be ruled by mob violence, pressure groups, and cheap politics or by the decent, respectable citizenry of the Republic.

INTERNAL COMMUNISM — Finds favor in liberal government through terror, bombings of schools and churches, beatings, lawlessness, and by crying police brutality and discrimination. PURGE — Communists and liberals purge their opposition by calling them extremist, bigot, isolationist, horse and buggy days, insanity inference, brotherhood, and constantly harping that the people demand more services from the government.

UNITY - Take note that the liberal, communist, socialist, and internationalist speak for the same programs whether in Washington or in Moscow. Read your daily newspaper and observe their unity of thought.

LIBERAL - The liberal is a first cousin to the communist. Communists and liberals theorize that government must become big and the people must be taught to depend upon government.

The liberal policy not only includes aid to communism, but includes construction of industry in communist countries. Under liberal leadership we are doing both.

Liberals say there are two kinds of communism. If so, it shows itself in two forms — Federal Aid and Foreign Aid.

ADMINISTRATION - Convenism and the present administration in Washington appeal to be lust in man. They want people to seek something free without individual consideration for consequence. Our nation and our national way of life stand in jeopardy. What does the Administration propose? They propose more of the medicine that has made America sick unto death. All Americans should be as sick of the medicine men.

Too many people in America have forgotten to remember to think thoroughly.

Russia and communism must be dropped from our dole system. FREE — Notice how everything has become free to the communist, adulteress, lazy, and the masquerader at the expense of the productive worker and tax payer.

TAXATION — We are working hard to make more money to pay more taxes, so our government can sell to and extend credit to Russia, so Russia can enslave more people. Do you think God will hold us guiltless? I do not think God will hold us guiltless. TRADE — Why trade with communist countries? Russia wants trade with us because they manufacture goods using slave labor and can ship goods into the United States to sell at prices much lower than we can manufacture and sell the same goods at our high labor cost.

Look-how this gap widens when our labor union chiefs demand more and more for less and less. We lower tariffs, too!

Foreign aid coupled with foreign trade allows for the disappearance of our gold reserves.

VOTING — The voting privilege is not free. Our forefathers paid with their lives, fortunes, and sacrifices for the privilege to vote. Voting requirements that include the poll tax are fair.

Voting is a heritage not to be taken lightly and should be exercised unselfishly with full awareness given to the best interest of our country in preference to personal motives.

DISCRIMINATION - Let one negro cry discrimination and the Army is alerted and sent immediately. The administration is trigger happy against its own people, but scared to death of the enemy. SENSES - There are five senses. We shall consider only two; these are hearing and feeling.

I hear Russia rattle their bombs——I feel the Administration shake. I feel them shake through disarmament negotiations, Cuban inspections, missile removals, hot lines, treaties, and another conference.

COLD WAR - We disarm while the enemy arms. We pull troops out while they send troops in. We give; they receive. We train enemy pilots; they shoot ours.

There is no such thing as a cold war. The coldest spot of the cold war is in Washington, It is the Administration that has frozen and these men are very cold.

What has happened to the value of every American life? We should weep and fight rather than fright and compromise.

**Allow me one word of caution, please -- we had better put our military back into the hands of the military first and away from

Ann Anderson (conceal per request), 318 Forest Park Drive, West Memphis phoned the Memphis Office and advised as follows:

One Chuck Bradford, whom she knows is a likely suspect in the murder because he is anti-negro, irrational, and is violence prone. He has been arrested in Memphis for attempted rape, and for transporting drugs. He was recently charged in West Memphis with attempted rape.

Chuck Bradford comes from Steele, Missouri, although she believes he is living in the Memphis area now, because she saw him recently. He is described as white, male, 26 years old, 5'10" tall, 145 lbs, wears padded soil coats to make him appear larger, and carries a pistol in the glove compartment of his car. He takes drugs, some type of "hop up pills," and when he takes these drugs in combination with his regular diabetes medicine he does some crazy things.

The last time she saw him, which was a number of months ago he had a red car. However, she recently saw a white mustang parked in front of 900 Avalon, West Memphis, where Chuck Bradford visits numerous friends from Steele, Missouri.

She doesn't know Churck Bradford's current residence address, and she believes his first name is Charles.

He recalled that there was a lone male in the car, the driver.

On 4/10/68 Mrs. HOWARD (LILLIAN) GHOLSON, 1094 Wrenwood, Memphis, Tenn., telephone number 327-7922, telephonically advised that on 4/4/68 she and her husband departed Memphis for their cottage in Arkansas at approximately 6:00 p.m. She added that at about 6:30 to 6:45 p.m. they were on Highway 64 between Crawfordsville, Ark., and Norvell, Ark., traveling in their 1963 white Chevrolet station wagon.

She added that at this time she and her husband observed a red and white airplane, single wing, which appeared to have accommodations for about four passengers, descend on Highway 64 as though he was going to land on the highway. She added that he actually was only two or three feet off the ground when the pilot took the plane up again. She added that she and her husband at first thought he was in trouble and was going to land on the highway, but instead he turned around and again came back, flying extremely low, and then ascended again and took off in the direction of Norvell, Ark. She added that neither she nor her husband can further identify this plane, but later when they heard that the police suspected the murderer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING got away in a white car they began to wonder whether or not the pilot of this plane was an accomplice of the murderer and mistakenly took their white vehicle for the getaway car. She added that she was passing this on for whatever it was worth as she and her husband feel that possibly this was how the murderer got away, by having a plane meet him. She added that that is the only reason she and her husband can think of as why this plane acted as it did unless it was some law enforcement officer who was just checking them out because they were in a white car.

ASSASSINATION OF MARTIN LUTHER

KING, JR.

4/4/68;

Charlotte teletype to Memphis and Knoxville 4A/68.

At 10:35 p.m., 4/4/68, JAMES M. UNDERHILL placed from Charlotte a long distance telephone call to JIM WEST at telephone 487-9453, Shelby, N. C. The telephone was answered by a person sounding like an elderly white male, who stated JIM WEST was not there. After some delay, he identified himself as LEM PATTERSON, and conversation continued with him. After a short period, he turned the telephone over to another person who identified himself as HERMAN PATTERSON, son of LEM PATTERSON. During further conversation, the younger PATTERSON was asked his middle name and he stated it was EUGENE.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON sounded obviously intoxicated and during the conversation mentioned he had been taking some "pills" that day. It was extremely difficult to get any kind of coherent story from him and he at first denied any knowledge of JIM WEST and then later said that WEST had been there earlier that evening and had been drinking heavily and had left to go get some more to drink.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON stated he had been in Shelby all that day but did not give any clear account of his activities. Later during his rambling conversation, he said he had been in Knoxville, Tenn., up until a week or so earlier and had returned to Shelby when the family wired him money. Still later he said he had left Shelby on the morning of 4/4/68

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and had gone to Nashville and Knoxville, Tenn., returning to Shelby about 9:00 p.m. At various times during the conversation he said he had gone to Nashville by hitching a ride with a truck driver and also said he had traveled by plane to Nashville and Knoxville.

Further during the conversation, which was not coherent, he stated he had that morning drawn his pay from Howell Stroup of the Cherryville Nursery, for grading work he had done. He said he had taken this money which amounted to about \$12, to make the trip on.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was asked where he had been in Tennessee and he would only say he had been at a poolroom in Knoxville and claimed he did not know the name of it or its location or the name of the operator.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON denied any knowledge of any telephone call having been made to the FBI from that telephone on that date by anyone. At several points during the conversation, he denied any knowledge of a JIM WEST.

It is pointed out there is no commercial air service at Shelby, the nearest commercial airport being at Charlotte, approximately 40 miles away.

HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and LEM PATTERSON stated the above telephone was located at the residence of LEM PATTERSON, 627 S. DeKalb St., Shelby.

SAS FRANCIS X. BRADSHAW and JAMES M. UNDERHILL conducted the following investigation on 4/5/68:

Detective HOWARD SMITH, Shelby PD, stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is the son of LEM PATTERSON, who lives at 627 S. DeKalb. LEM PATTERSON has operated a grocery store at that location for a number of years but recently suffered a stroke and has great difficulty in talking or getting around. Another son operates Patterson's Cleaners at the rear of the same location. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is a notorious town drunk and has been for years. Detective SMITH knows that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been away for some time up until

a couple of weeks ago and reportedly had been in Tennessee. He had no knowledge that he had been away from Shelby within the last several days. He knew that within the last few days HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been doing some landscape grading work at the location of a new branch bank on DeKalb St. in Shelby, for HOWELL STROUP, Cherryville Nurseries. He had not seen HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON on 4/4/68. Detective SMITH further stated that PATTERSON, for years, has followed the pattern of working as little as possible and only until he can get enough to buy something to drink, and thereafter he will get drunk and usually wind up being arrested. He commented it would be impossible for HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON to have gone as far as Knoxville, Tenn., and back in the same day, because in his opinion as soon as he got to the firstplace he could buy liquor, he would buy it and get drunk and that would be as far as he would go.

Detective SMITH stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON has had about 30 arrests since 1950, at the Shelby PD alone, mostly for drunk, and some for cursing, fighting and petty larceny. He was locally arrested on 3/30/68 for drunk, at which time he gave his address as 627 S. DeKalb. From Mrs. MARTIN, Clerk of Recorders Court, Detective SMITH determined that PATTERSON had appeared in Court in Shelby on Tuesday, 4/2/68, and was sentenced to serve 20 days or pay costs of court. Further, he had come to Mrs. MARTIN's office on the early morning of 4/4/68 with part of the money for the costs of court and fine and left saying he would try to get the rest of the money. He returned about noon and paid the entire amount.

Detective SMITH stated that PATTERSON has on numerous occasions in the past called the PD with false reports. One time, a year or so ago, he called the PD without giving any name and said there was a drunk at a particular service station. This was late at night, and when officers responded, they found PATTERSON in an automobile, obviously waiting for them, and when the officers approached the automobile, he produced a gun and stuck it right in the stomach of one of the officers. The officer managed to get the gun away from him and placed him under arrest, after which it was determined this was only a toy gun, though it very definitely resembled a real gun. At that time, PATTERSON admitted he had been the

one who had made the call and indicated it had just been to see what the officers would do. In addition, within the last week, PATTERSON had telephoned the PD and said there was going to be a riot but he did not give any details or where it would take place. He had not given his name but his voice had been recognized and the call had been disregarded. On another recent occasion, he had telephoned the PD giving some false name which was not recalled, and said there wwas going to be a bomb placed at some unrecalled location and made the comment, "You'll find out where when it happens." Detective SMITH had been the one answering the telephone and he recognized the voice of PATTERSON and called him by his first name, after which PATTERSON gave his own full name and cursed the officer for recognizing his voice. No arrest action had been taken as a result of this incident.

Detective SMITH stated he had no knowledge of any JIM WEST in Shelby except for an attorney JAMES A. WEST, and definitely he was not any associate of PATTERSON and would not be hanging around drinking with him.

Detective SMITH stated in his opinion if a telephone call from a person claiming to be JIM WEST had been made to the FBI accusing HERMAN PATTERSON of being involved in something, the call had probably been made by HERMAN PATTERSON himself. He stated the only reason he could suggest for these activities on the part of PATTERSON was a desire to attract attention or to possibly play tricks on the police.

Mrs. JAMES T. WEST, 604 LeGrand St., Shelby, stated her husband is not related in any way to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or his family. She stated she knows of another family named WEST in Shelby and has no knowledge or reason to believe that they are in any way related to the PATTERSONs or have any association with them.

On 4/5/68, WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife MAE were interviewed at their residence located at the rear of 627 S. DeKalb St. Mr. PATTERSON is the brother of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and is the operator of Patterson's Cleaners. He expressed himself as completely disgusted with HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON, saying he is a notorious and constant drunk and has as little to do with him as possible. However, since he

stays with the father at their house at the same location, he does see him constantly. Both WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been in Knoxville and other unknown locations in Tennessee for several weeks up until about three weeks ago. At that time he contacted the family and his father sent him money to come home on. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had worked for a few days doing grading work for Cherryville Nurseries, but got drunk over the weekend of 3/30/68. He received a fine in court on 4/2/68but was not required to pay it on that particular date. continued that on the morning of 4/4/68 HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had said he was going to Cherryville to collect his pay in order to pay off his fine. Sometime after noon, he came back to that neighborhood and said he had paid his fine. At that time he was drinking and continued to be very drunk and Mr. and Mrs. PATTERSON stated they had seen him at least three times between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on 4/4/68. that time he had been in their house since Mrs. PATTERSON had gotten him to come in and lie down just to get him off the streets.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had called over from the house of their father at the time the news came over the radio or television about the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and HERMAN EUGENE had commented in his drunken fashion that he was elated over this occurrence.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated he knows of a JAMES WEST in Shelby but there is no WEST who is related to his family or to the family of the wife of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON. In addition, he has no knowledge of any JIM WEST being an associate of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or of ever being in or around the house of their father, LEM PATTERSON.

On 4/5/68, HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was located at the home of a neighbor near his father's house. At that time he appeared sober. He stated that he had been at various places in and around Knoxville, Tenn., up until about a month ago, when the family sent him money and he came home. For

about two weeks he has been working for HOWELL STROUP doing grading work, but has not worked in the last few days. He was arrested over the past weekend in Shelby for being drunk and on 4/4/68 he went down to the Clerk of Court's Office to pay his fine. He found he did not have enough money and he hitched a ride with an unknown Negro truck driver to Cherryville to collect his pay. He said he went there once before 9:00 a.m. and again about noon. He collected his pay of something under \$20 and returned to Shelby and paid his fine, paying it sometime around noon.

He continued that after that he went out and got drunk and spent most of the afternoon and evening in and around his father's house. He recalled that he had been at one time on 4/4/68 at the service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS in Shelby, and that at one time on that date he had ridden in a cab driven by ADAM HUNT.

patterson stated he had no knowledge of a JIM WEST but said he believed he had heard that name in the last day or two, and possibly it was the name of the Negro truck driver who had given him a ride to Cherryville. He denied any knowledge of a telephone call having been made to the FBI in Knoxville. He added that when he gets drunk he does not remember what happens. He did remember having talked to agent UNDERHILL on the telephone on the night of 4/4/68. PATTERSON was strongly warned against making any false calls to the FBI on police agencies.

He acknowledged that he was identical with the HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON who had, in 9/67, together with another individual, stolen a taxi cab in Charlotte and driven it to Clover, S. C. In that case, Federal prosecution was declined and PATTERSON, on 9/7/67, was sentenced in local court in Charlotte to serve 90 days.

On 4/5/68, Cab Driver ADAM HUNT, Shelby, stated he had hauled HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON as a passenger from somewhere in downtown Shelby to a service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS on the edge of Shelby, this being somewhere around noon. He stated he did not recall having seen him later on that date. PATTERSON had apparently started drinking at the time he hauled him.

No further investigation as to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is being conducted by Charlotte.

On 4/11/68, Mrs. V. F. JAMES, 4360 Walnut Drive, Memphis, Tennessee, telephone 396-9985, telephonically contacted the Memphis Office and advised she formerly resided in Little Rock, Ark.

She stated that while residing at Little Rock Ark., she had a neighbor by the name of CHARLES JACKSON who lived at 2725 Broadway, Little Rock, Arkansas. This JACKSON had a son, name not known, who was a deserter from the military being sought by the FBI approximately one war ago.

She stated the description of the Unsub in captioned case is very similar to that of CHARLES JACKSON. She further advised that CHARLES JACKSON has a brother, name unknown, who runs a used car lot in Malvern, Ark., which is located approximately 40 miles southwest of Little Rock. She added that CHARLES frequently drove cars from this used car lot and at one time he had a white Mustang.

She added that CHARLES JACKSON once told her and her husband, who is a heart patient, that he was a sharpshooter while he was in the military service.

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
