Mrs. KILGRAS volunteered that she had been under psychiatric care for four years, part of which time was spent in a local hospital for mental treatment. Request-My name be used in no way or information I send made public, please.

I do not know if the following is of any value. But my conscious is bothering me. I ask only my name not be used. I want no reward, if the information helps in any way. To bring up the frightening incident in Illinois the night of April 11, I will write a detailed background.

A man I saw that night-in a white CADALLAC -looked like this picture, except he had on dark colored glases. The hair line looked the same, and the facial contours.

Background detailed:

My son-in-law, Dorsie Fox, was killed in a car accident Dec. 23 at Pontiac, Michigan. My da ughter, Doris, was injured. I had returned from the Presnell Hospital (Kennett, Missouri) but was still sick in bed (Asian Flu). And was unable to go to Michigan.

As my health and strength improved, I was selected the delegate to attend the Missouri East Seventh Annula Conference of the Woman's Society of Christian Service in Jeffenson City Missouri on March 22-23. I went there in a car with fairness.

From there, Saturday late afternoon, I took the Transletway bus, changing in St. ouis, to Hammond, Ind. arriving there about 2:35 a.m. (Our Jeff City bus was late as it had to wait on the bus from Memphis, Tenn. to Kansa s City, Mo. because of the snow in the south.) My son-in-law and daughter, Translet and Mrs. Gerald Gentry, met me in Hammond.

(On Monday we went to the World Flower and Garden Shor at the International Ampitheatre in Chicago. I saw the barred store windows and wondered why they had the folding iron bars across them. I also saw the sooty buildings etq.)

On Tuesday we went by car to Fontiac, Michigan. Later I visited friends and relatives in-Flint(Sat.Mar. 27). I lert Pontiac, Mich. after visiting my daughter Doris April 4, by bus, via Detroit, arriving in Hammond, Indiana 6:30 p.m. (their time. My other daughter, Mollie, met me. When we arrived at their house, Gerald said: Martin Luther King has been critically wounded in Memphis, Tenn. At 7P.m. the TV announced he was dead from assasination. (Memphis is about 100 miles se of my home in Dunklin County (Bootheel) Southeast Missouri and about ten miles sw of Kennett, the county seat.)

I watched the memphis march on Tv. And from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. the funeral as narrated by Walter Cronkite and others looting....

(I am white, but not responsible for the color of my skin. As King said, it is the character that counts, mnot the color of the skin.

T hursday April 11 Hammond School was fismissed at noon as Scott, a school board member, had died. At fifteen minutes to one o'clock in the afternoon we left by car for my home.

I then knew nothing of the white Mustang--- as we did not have the car radio on, and had been too busy in the morning to listen to news. So I do not know if it had then been broadcast.

Our trip was uneventful until dark, on a highway in Illinois before reaching Cairo where we crossed the Mississippi a 37.


We were on a two lane lonely stretch, I think going southwest I lose directions when away from home. I was sitting on the right side of the rear seat. To the right of me I could see tree tops below me, looked like a drop from the roadbed. To the left were No cars were in sight for a long distance.

THEN A CAR BEHIND showed brightly glaring lights, blinding our driver, who slowed almost to a stop as he could not see. The car pulled slowly around us, looking at us. The one man care occupant wore dark glasses, shading his face, his hairline countour noticable. He then pulled in front of us and slowed down We followed for some distance, then our driver pulled around him, as he watched us. He was on my side now! and I had a clear view of him. Theclipping photo-add dark glasses-is how he He was driving a white CADILLAC. After we looked.

passed, were ahead, again he pulled up fast behind us, the blinding lights, again our driver let the cap pass. He drove showly alongside as, so our driver slowed still slower, almost stopping. We were tense at least I was. All were quiet. I could see downward, and feared we would be pushed off the road

In front again, he slowed. We went slower, almost stopping for some miles. By then we were uneasy. I think I saw a road marker, but not sure, read 37. Wiles rabther on another car in view. The dark glassed driver flashed his bright lights on this car also, slowly passed it, then slowed, repeated as with us.

When we reached a place where we saw a lighted building our redriver made a loop drove to a "Pecan Candy Shop" and parked outside. The other car turned right-to what looked like a lighted garage. When we could no longer see the Cadilhac we went on. We did not get out at the Yandy Shop.



We crossed the Mississippi at Cario, then stopped a t a Truck Stop near Charleston, I think it was, to eat supper. It was eight p. m. on thirrxxxxxxx. their clock.

With company over the week-end I did not have time to read the paper. Then, I saw this picture. I feel I should write, though doubt there is any connection.

Dear Sir:

As yet you have not located the killer of Martin Luther King, jr. The following may have no relationship to it what-so-ever; on the other hand, it may be a one in a million clue.

I have a neighbor who formerly was a tile salesman, head-quarters, Alabama. While a salesman he travelled the U. S.. He is, in my opinion, an intense racist, has written frequently in the newspaper expressing his views, and his son in turn brought to another neighbor racist newspapers from Mississippi. When his son returned from service in Germany, he had praise for Hitler.

UPEN RETIREMENT

The neighbor evidentally began a floor-tile laying business two or three years ago, for a volks-type truck has frequently been at his house, cans debris indicate this, and very frequently, he receives packages via truck delivery. He leaves his home frequently and returns, frequently carrying packages into the house. I have heard the rumor that he obtained a rifle of special quality for his next door neighbor.

The man's son owns a white mustang Ford, and the last I knew, the son was working in Miami with an airline company.

As I said, typically a volks-type delivery truck comes to the house, and it has not been there for some time. In the two weeks beginning the Sundays of the 17th and the 24, there was an unusual flurry of activity around the house--accross the street. A passenger car volkswagon appeared with young man, wife, and child and the rear apparently loaded with clothes. The young lady showed her face, and she may be a relative. The young man however during the several days he was here did not "show himself." Too, as I recall he had been at the house before, he or someone his age,--and again had not shown himself. As I recall, the Volks passenger car reappeared for a second time with the family and again loaded with clothing around the 19-23 of March. Mr. Sikes advised that on April 4, 1968, he worked

Dear Mr. Johnson:

Following this note are the names and addresses of whites, subscribers to my publication whom I thought might bear checking out in the case of the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King.

If you don't mind a theory, you might consider the slaying in the same light as the bombing of the church in Birmingham in 1962, or '63. That was done for a purpose, to intimidate the Negroes bent on integrating the schools of Alabama that year, as a prolude to Gov. Wallace's standing in the schoolhouse door. Neither the church nor the children was the primary target, but the resolve of the Negroes.

There must have been many times when Dr. King could have been more, or as, convenien tly killed. I have no doubt that the burpose was achieved when the Negroes rioted after the assassination. The only question in my mind is who wanted the riots this time, the Wallace-ites, the leftwing, or even ambitious people in between.

In the event you think it was a "racist", or rightwing political killing, Montgomery, Mobile, and the small towns of Alabama might be a good place to look for Gault or Ray. Gault, by the way, rings a bell in my memory as a fairly common Alabama name. I have traveled and lived in Alabama the best part of the part 10 years. I know Mobile, Montgomery, Barbour County, Macon County and all the furrounding counties very well. Alabama probably has the highest per capita White Citizens Council membership in the country, people who would bomb a church, burn a school, kill one or several people to make their point.

The Tuskeg's names I am giving you I know to be white and in the main Council members, people who intended to get me, I have been told, had I continued publishing in Tuskeges, people who were almost equally guilty with that Segrest man who shot and killed Sammy Younge, Jr. in Tuskeges the year after I left and after he had taken up the cudgel -- with a lot less finesse, unfortunately after I left. The others I just think are white.

I also have a number of white liberal southerners, including the usual run of white leftwing southerners and a number of those on the Coast. I don't know whether I should list them or not. The left pretended to great devotion

to Dr. King and raised money for him and gave to him liberally; but when it comes to whatever it is they want, a shift of power to themselves, to change the system, etc., I wouldn't trust them behind the shadow of a broomstick. Dear Sir:

I hate to be thought a quack, but I cannot get a very disturbing similarity of events which might relate to the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. out of my mind, and so, at whatever risk, I am impelled to write you.

I publish the above-named Poll monthly and the Tribune, a little' magazine when I can; but I covered the funeral of Dr. King for a newspaper, The Post, published at 2973 Sacramento st., Berkeley, Calif. 94705, a Negro weekly. I also serve The Post at present as a consultant, or contributing editor, in its efforts to build up its editorial content.

I just returned last night from Berkeley and after being away almost all week, what with the funeral, have just caught up on the daily papers; and I was struck by the similarity of reported activities of the suspected killer and a fictional killer I created in an unpublished book, "The Ten Most Wanted White Mon". As the title would suggest, this man, who is sort of deranged by frustration over the continued humiliation of Negroes by the nonviolent movement and the continued violation of them by Deep South racists, picks out the ten racists from whose deaths he thinks the Negro would most benefit and goes out and kills them.

I published the first five chapters in the Tribune. I am a former weekly newspaper publisher for 19 years of the Los Angeles Tribune, and I began the Tribune out of frustration while living in Tuskegee, Ala. in 1964-65. I started the Tribune, as a 'little magazine', as the Tuskegee Tribune, a mimeographed newspaper, and a large number of whites of the town, who were described by knowledgable Negroes of the town as "members of the White Citizens Council" and Kluxer-types, subscribed.

I have as many subscribers among Alabamians whom I know or suppose to be white, as I do among Negroes — not that there are many of either.

and I left Tuskegee in February of 1965 and returned to Los Angeles.

I have continued to send the Tribune to my southern subscribers, including the whites, whenever I have brought it out.

Beginning with the 14th number in March of 1965, I serialized "The Ten Most Wanted White Men", and continued into the fifth chapter before I got a contract for the book from Houghton-Mifflin Co. Other than in the first chapter where my here, or anti-here, conceived his plan as a way out of his frustration and lists his intended victims, I didn't in the serialization give away his plans or modus operandi. However, the idea was there.

Also, the entire book of 36 grams has been read by Hougton Mifflin, which eventually decided not to publish it, on the grounds that the anti-hero was not believable, and by Globe Press, which rejected it, too. The first ten chapters were read, and rejected, last Summer by Harper & Row and have since been at Random House, along with the book's summary.

I hope you will not feel that I am suggesting that any of the readers of this book would be so insane as to assassinate Dr. King. However, the coincidence of your suspect apparently having abandoned a car in Atlanta, just walked away from it; belonging to the seaman's union in Mobile; renting the room in the rundown rooming house, and the actions of my anti-hero, or killer, is so striking that I hope it excuses this long and detailed letter. Perhaps it is my imagination, but the personality, the stride, etc., suggested by the newspaper stories suggest my Josiah Herron, who likes to think of himself as "the Bronze Bomber", a sort of avenger of Negroes.

There is further the fact that while I was in Atlanta, I heard many people in the crowd cutside the church and along the march say they feared, or had heard, that Rev. Abernathy, Stokely Carmichael, Congressman Adam Powell, and other Negro leaders were going to be "gotten". Some few people said they thought the killer might be standing on the sidewalk along the line of march.

I also heard that Negro extremists in Atlanta were planning to burn and blow up businesses, specifically Sears and others along Gordon Road, which is just above the Capitol Homes Housing Project where the car was parked in Atlanta. I lived from September 1 to Oct. 29, of 1965 in Atlanta and have a son in college there, though he is not an extremist or racist, and so have many leads there. I thought it notable that there was no mention of harming the housing project, even though many of the whites living there are openly hostile to Negroes passing there en route to shop on Gordon Road.

None of this may be of any value. However, I felt I had to relay it. Now that Mrs. King and Rev. Abernathy have resolved to continue the march to Washington, the same person or persons who were sufficiently exercised by distress as to kill Dr. King may attempt to harm them; and I felt that if I know anything which might remotely help solve the murder, I should relay it.
