Mr Taylor even wanted to know what was going to happen in Vietnam.

Senior Sergeant Downie said: "I don't know and there are a lot of important people about who would like an answer to that question too."

Senior Sergeant Downie added: "I don't think the call was just a rich whim as he finished up by saying he would have to go because the call was creating him a lot of money."

Policeman calls NZ again (S150)

America's phoning policeman was on the job again on Sunday night with another transpacific call to his Auckland counterparts for a discussion about New Zealand.

Patrolman Thomas Taylor, of Birmingham, Alabama, rang from Santa Barbara. California, where he is on holiday.
