On April 13, 1088, Surgeant BERNARD F. WELLY, Monicide Squad, Metropolitan Police Department, telephonically advised SA JAMES J. N.C. CLOSKEY that JAMES K. BROWN, a cab driver, was in his elfice and had some information concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTKER KING.

JALES K. BROWN, 4811 Quarles Street, N.E., Apartment 1, telephone 397-2910, furnished the following information to SA MC CLOSKEY on April 13, 1968.

He drives Tamicab Number 264 for the Yellow Cab Company and normally drives between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 or 2 a.m. He stated that he did not know if the following information is significant; however, after reading the local newspapers and noting that a suspect in the Dr. KING assassination was in the Unrobent Parines, he decided he should relate his experience.

On Thursday evening, April 11, 1956, at about 6:30 p.m., he picked up throe fares at the Greyhound Bus Sepot. Two of the passencers care learn makes and the third was a white male. After delivering the two lears males to their destination, he proceeded to the 1:10 block of 20rd Street, S.I., as requested by the thite male, who was described as follows:

Other than the fact that this individual had a very firm chin, he was unable to recall any other physical characteristics. He assumed this individual was a fireman; however, when the passenger departed from the cab, he emplained that he was in the Marchant Marines and had just flunked out of school and was returning home. This individual was attired in a new summer khaki uniform similar to the type worn by the Army and members of the fire department. His collar was open and he wors no tie or hat. He also wore a black waist-length jacket. He carried one brown suitcase and a soft back brown notebook. He said this individual appeared to be very relaxed and he does not recall him having any accent or brogue.

BROWN said this individual was apparently familiar with the area, as he attempted to direct BROWN to his residence on several occasions. He did not give a particular address, but BROWN recalls that he stopped near a post marked, 1818 23rd Street, S.E. The passenger, after leaving the cab, walked towards a group of apartments on the side of the street where the address post marked 1818 is located. He did not observe this individual in any particular systemant cullding, but recalls that there are three or four buildings in that location.

On June 4, 1968, there was received at the Buffalo, New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, a letter, dated May 31, 1968 from TAYLOR CALDWELL, 34 Audley End, Buffalo (26), New York, the contents of which will be set forth below.

TAYLOR CALDWELL is a world famous novelist, whose true name is Mrs. JANET T. C. REBACK. She is referred to from time to time in news articles as an outspoken foe of Communism. She is known as and admits to be an inveterate letter writer. She has frequently engaged in literary battles with persons who opposed her private and public statements. Close associates have described her imagination as vivid, and many of her statements as tending toward exaggeration.

On one occasion, Miss CALDWELL wrote an article which appeared in the October, 1960, issue of "The American Mercury," in which she alleged that an unnamed, American-born distinguished professor, in one of the large universities, was a Communist. When an attempt was made by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to arrange an interview

with Miss CallWELL concerning this story, her husband, MARCUS RABACK, a former official of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service, and who acheduled appointments for Miss CallWELL, stated It would serve no purpose for the Federal Bureau of Investigation to Interview Miss CALDWELL regarding the article in "The American Mercury" because the unnamed professor was non-existent, a figment of Miss CALDWELL's imagination and a hypothetical situation employed by Miss CALDWELL to prevoke public opinion.

On another occasion in September, 1964 when Miss CALDWELL was being Interviewed by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the presence of her husband concerning an occurrence she had brought to the attention of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Miss CALDWELL's husband flatly stated that the true circumstances of the occurrence were completely different from the version given by Miss CALDWELL, after which the latter materially modified her earlier statement.

The above mentioned letter received from Miss CALDWELL on June 4, 1968, reads as follows:

"As I am always wary of giving you any information which even vaguely sounds 'kooky' to me, I now deeply regret that I aid not

inform you of something which my terrified Negro businessman friend in New York wrote me last October. It still disturbed me, however - though it sounded very improbable - that I incorporated it as a sort of warning in my article in the Buffalo Evening News concerning events of 1968, earlier this year, which you may have read, yourself. ESP had nothing to do with that!

"He wrote me, if I remember accurately - as I immediately destroy his letters at his urgent request - that a meeting was held in New York the latter part of last September, in which plans were laid to 'throw the country into chaos and revolution. It was suggested that a prominent Negro leader be assassinated, or at least badily injured, in early 1968, tas a start to revolution. 1 He said that New York lawyer and novelist, about whom I have written you before, discussed this at length, and then remarked the matter would be given considerable thought - later. My friend was not invited 'later,' for some reason or other which alarmed him. But he was able to gether together a few facts last October and write me about them. He did not give me the source of his information

"The man finally chosen was a white man, between the ages of 25 and 30, named Robert W---, some simple name such as Watson or Watkins or Wellock or Wilkins, from the vicinity of New Jersey, a crack shot, of fair complexion, light eyes either very light brown or blue-gray, medium brown hair, gong thin face, very agile - and a 'Marxist.' My friends say you have had a dossier on him for several years in either New Jersey or New York. He followed Martin Luther King for several months before the assassination, which was scheduled for early March, not April, but the opportunity did not arise. 'They' wanted a larger city than Memphis, especially Washington. had thought of Carmichael or Brown, then settled on King. It was remarked that they had 'failed' with Mr. Kennedy, because they had thought to start nationwide riots against 'right wing extremists,' and a general bloodbath, and nothing happened. 'Only Oswald got caught, 'they remarked, which led my friend to believe that others were implicated, too, in the Marxist assassination. Apparently 'they' don't believe in the Warren Commission Report, either, for good and sufficient reasons.

"Now he writes that 'something much worse' is 'going to happen soon.' He doesn't know what it is, because he is being included less and less in 'conferences,' and is very frightened. He had asked me to write you last October about the planned assassination, and I did not, and he now wonders 'if I can trust you.'

"He writes that a woman will be the focuspoint of the 'much worse,' and almost immediately,
but does not know who the woman is. She is a
Negro, however. He also writes that the man you
are looking for is working either in New Jersey or
'just outside of New York,' and is or was in the
Army and received a 'discharge without prejudice,'
whatever that means, though not an honorable discharge. I thought they were the same. At any rate,
he is often in New York at 'conferences.' Then
it was decided to send him to Washington with the
'Poor People," and is probably there now. (By the
way, he had accomplices in Memphis.)

"He never liked Martin Luther King, my friend wrote last September, but reproaches me that if I had written you in October you might have prevented him from being murdered.

"This new information is also vague, but it may serve some purpose, though I don't see how. But remembering that letter of last October I thought it only right to let you know now. My friend also says that Mr. Johnson and Mr. Humphrey 'had better not' show themselves too openly in Washington, or be too available, in the very near future, but what threatens them he does not know. He just overheard 'hints."

"He fears, now, that he is suspected, so if you do any investigation on this information, don't try to find him or question him. He has a family. I know I will do all I can to protect him.

"P.S. My poor husband now lies at the point of death in the hospital - where he has been since March, 1967 - after he was attacked in our house by two of Earl Warren's pampered thugs. He is completely shattered in body and mind. He was a most brilliant man, and he has now become a confused, wandering, disoriented old shadow, and is unable even to feed himself or even to sit up, and is attended constantly

by private nurses. I brought a specialist from New York to see him recently, a Dr. Donald Louria; he told me frankly that my husband's destruction of mind and body had led to his present dying condition. If I knew who the thugs were I'd kill them, myself, so that some 'role' or lari Warren's would not set them free again to murder over and over.

N.B. By the way, the internal Revenue Service Center at Indover, Mass., has been opening letters addressed to me from all over the country, and then stamping the envelope: ICpened by miscake. If thought they were genuine imiscakes, and threw away all letters but one - and you may see it if you wish. For instance, how could a letter addressed to me by a far from Syracuse N.Y., find its way to andover, Mass. That was the one I kept. I can't imagine what the recease are up to, but I have long had reason to suspect them, as files in your office will thow.

in June 4, 1968, a selephone call was made to Miss CALDWELL by a Special agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, requesting an interview with her for any additional decails she might be able to furnish in connection with the consents of the above letter.

Miss CALDVELL stated she is extremely busy and upset, that her husband is at the brink of death in the hospital, that she is in the midst of preparing two speeches for delivery in California later this month, and that she would have no time for a personal interview for at least two weeks or perhaps longer. She stated all the facts known to her are set forth in her letter. She pointed out that under no circumstances would she disclose the identity of the friend who had supplied her with the information set forth in the letter. She said she no longer has any of his letters because in keeping with a promise made to him, she burns them immediately after reading them.

When asked for the name of the New York lawyer she mentions in the second paragraph of her letter, Miss CALDNEGL reputed that this lawyer's name is WILLIAM RUNSTLER, adding she had previously advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation that FUNSTLER in her opinion is a Communist.

Miss CALFWELL was then asked if she could furnish any data on the source of her information which would aid in evaluating the reliability of this source. She then replied she has never met this source, but that he is a person who started writing to her about five years ago after reading one of her books. He has

described himself in his letters as a Negro businessman who owns a business in Harlam. He has written to Miss CALDWELL from four or five different addresses, which she states indicated to her that he has had to move around for fear of his life. She has written back to him on several occasions, and two or three of her letters were returned to her marked "Unknown at this address," but most of her letters were delivered. On several occasions when she knew she was going to be in New York City, she wrote to her friend requesting that he come to see her at her hotel, but he never came. She recalled that one address he had given her was somewhere on West 114th Street.

Miss CALDWELL added she believes her friend is a member of the John Birch Society, because he has made reference frequently to articles she has written for the publication of this society entitled "American Opinion." She added that when this man first started writing to her, the letters were merely friendly and pleasant, expressing admiration of her writing and dealing with general political observations of World War I and World War II. However, commencing in the Fail of 1967, he began writing about his knowledge of the assassination plot of a prominent Negro leader, ultimately designated as Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

She said her first reaction was that his statements along this line sounded "kooky" so she ignored them, except for the fact that in a newspaper article she wrote in October, 1967, which was not published until February, 1968, and in which she made a predication of major events to occur in 1968, she did predict the assassination of a prominent Negro leader, being influenced in this predication by what her friend had written to her.

Miss CALDWELL was then asked whether she would suggest to her friend that he contact the Federal Bureau of Investigation in New York City. She replied she knows he would not do so, because he had written to her in the past that about four years ago he had contacted the Federal Bareau of Investigation to furnish information that 'an PBT under-cover agent in an organization" was under suspicion. However, according to the friend, the Federal Sureau of Investigation wanted more and more information, so he broke off contact with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The friend also disimed that shortly after contacting one Federal Bureau of Investigation, he had begun to receive anonymous threatening latters, making him realize that his contacts with the Pederal Bureau of Investigation han been observed. Miss CAIDWELL stated that based on the letters received from her friend, she believes him to be a very intelligent man, but who is now completely terrified by the plot of which he is aware and also apparently by the fear that

he himself is under suspicion, as indicated by a comment in one of his letters that he was not even invited to "Resurrection City" and cannot understand why, unless it is because he is no longer trusted.

Miss CALLWELD stated at one point in the conversation that she had just received another letter from her friend 'yesterday," but when questioned about the contents, completely ignored the questions and then reverted to a statement that the last letter from her friend arrived a new days before her own letter to the Federal Bursau of Investigation.

Miss tallWELL then proceeded to state that because of her husband's confinement, everything at her residence is in a state of chaos and that she is simply going out of the mind. She said that previously her husband has taken sare of all her business affairs, that the is killing herself going back and forth to the hospital, that she has had to give up her whole career to take care of her husband, and that "all this is too much for me." She said she herself is under constant medical care and does not know why she has "to put up with all of this mess."

Miss CALDWELL continued by stating her husband's critical condition and the resultant "messing up" of her own life is all the fault of "Warren of the Supreme Court who let all those criminals loose," and made it possible for them to viciously attack her husband and rob their house.

in this connection, it is noted that according to articles which appeared in the local press, two armed men has broken into Miss CALDWELL's residence on March 20, 1967 when she, her nusbend, and their housekeeper were all present, had demanded lewelry, and beaten and attempted to smother Miss & LDWELL, but then had fled empty-handed.

On March 27, 1967, Miss CalbWELL had written a letter to the Federa: Bureau of investigation in which she rotated the circumstances of the above break-in, and in which the stated that the man who had seized her husband at the time of the break-in had forced him down on the states with a gun at his back, but "made no effort to cinerwise hurt by husband." Miss CALDWELL in the letter said she believed the objective of the break-in had not been robbery, but an attempt to kill her because of her anti-Communist activity.

These communications have been itemized so Bureau itself can better evaluate Miss CALDWELL and information furnished by her.

The above communications and a review of Buffalo Office files reflect that TAYLOR CALDWELL (whose true name is Mrs. JANET T. C. REBACK) is a world famous novelist, that she is an inveterate letter writer, possessed of a vivid imagination, and is inclined to intermingle fact with fiction indiscriminately; that she is prone to carry on literary battles through the mails and in publications

with various and sundry persons throughout the world; and that she has a proclivity for furnishing information to other government agencies in addition to the FBI.

The information set forth in the LHM is being furnished to the Bureau and interested Offices, principally because of the serious nature of the charges, Miss CALDWELL's prominent position, and the possibility that she may at some future time claim she furnished pertinent information to the FBI, which received no attention.

Buffalo is making no local dissemination of the LHM, and whether or not any dissemination should be made at Washington, D.C., is being left to the discretion of the Bureau.

No action, other than possible dissemination at the Seat of Government to Secret Service because of intimation of threats of harm to President JOHNSON and Vice President HUMPHREY included in the material furnished by Miss CALDWELL, is recommended, on the basis that prior experience with Miss CALDWELL reflects she is unreliable and possibly demented. It would appear that a person in her position would place the welfare of the U.S. above an alleged loyalty to a correspondent, whom she has never met, and that she would disclose the identity of her correspondent so he could be located and questioned if he does, in fact, exist and if he did in fact send her the information she claims to have received.

It is pointed out that in the telephonic interview conducted with Miss CALDWELL by SA THADDEUS J. SZYMANSKI on 6/4/68, it was suggested to her that in the future she send any letters received from her friend to the FBI, deleting his signature if she feels so obligated, but so the FBI would have his exact wording for purposes of evaluation. She first replied this would be a violation of her promise to destroy her friend's letters. She then stated possibly she could Xerox the letters, and send the Xerox copies to the FBI, and then destroy the originals, which would mean she was homoring her promise. Finally, she stated that doing this would bother her conscience, and that anyway she felt her friend would not write anymore because he sounded

so terrified in his last letter. Miss CALDWELL's responses throughout the telephonic interview of 6/4/68 emphasized her unwillingness to be interviewed in person concerning this matter, and reflected a desire on her part to go into great detail on extraneous matters rather than on the alleged plots.

It is acknowledged by the Buffalo Office that there is considerable detail in the LHM dealing with Miss CALDWELL herself and prior FBI experiences with her. It is felt this data is essential to an appropriate evaluation of the serious charges contained in her letter should the Bureau feel compelled to disseminate the LHM.

Unless advised to the contrary by the Bureau, the Buffalo Office will make no further effort to personally interview Miss CALDWELL re instant matters, and will simply acknowledge receipt of any further data from her in this matter without incorporating the information into LHMs for the Bureau.

Miss CALDWELL immediately referred to a letter she had recently mailed to the Buffalo Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation predicting "that something terrible was going to happen," to the fact that on June 4, 1968, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had telephonically discussed this letter with her, and she stated she now wished to furnish additional developments.

She said that on the afternoon of June 4, 1968, shortly after discussing her letter with a Special Agent of

the Federal Bureau of Investigation, she had gone outside to plant some flowers in front of her home. While so engaged, she noticed a young man on a motor bike ride by in the street in front of her home several times. Finally, this young man stopped directly in front of her home and commenced speaking with her. She states she was surprised to see on close observation that this young man was a Negro, whereas when she had seen him from a slight distance, he appeared to be Caucasian.

According to Miss CALDWELL, the first thing this young Negro said to her was, "Do you know DONALD JACKSON?"

Miss CALDWELL said she replied, "I know him well." (Miss CALDWELL explained at this point that she knows a Negro in Buffalo named DONALD JACKSON, who is head of the Donald Jackson Foundation, the purpose of which is to raise money to provide educational scholarships for meritorious and needy Negro students. She stated that she has given financial and other assistance to DONALD JACKSON, and immediately assumed that this is the DONALD JACKSON the young man was inquiring about.)

Miss CALDWELL said she replied, "You mean about the Negro woman?"

The young man allegedly said, "No! No! You've got that mixed up."

Miss CALDWELL allegedly replied, "I told the FBI."

Miss CALDWELL stated that almost immediately thereafter, the young Negro drove away on his motor bike, the entire conversation having lasted about one or two minutes. She conjectured he is a student because strapped on the back seat of his motor bike had been two or three text books.

Miss CALDWELL then made reference to the recent assassination in Los Angeles of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and proceeded to speculate that perhaps this was the "terrible thing about to happen" that her Negro friend from New York City had written to her about, and which information she in turn had forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. She acknowledged that in her letter to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, she had described the incident about to occur as involving an unknown Negro woman, but now wondered whether she may possibly have misinterpreted the Negro businessman's letter. She speculated that perhaps what the Negro businessman had been trying to tell her was that a Negro woman was to be involved in the incident in some way, but not necessarily as the victim.

Miss CALDWELL concluded by stating she felt Senator KENNEDY's death was more than just a mere coincidence, that she is "not a believer in coincidence," and that there must definitely be some connection between the information she had previously received and Senator KENNEDY's death.

Attention is directed to the fact that Miss CALDWELL in her telephone call of June 6, 1968, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, stated that her conversation with the unidentified young Negro occurred while

she was planting flowers in front of her home on the afternoon of June 4, 1968, and that she also stated she had gone outside to plant these flowers shortly following a telephone conversation with a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, on June 4, 1968.

It is noted that a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation did, in fact, have a telephone conversation with Miss CALDWELL from about 4:35 P. M. to 4:50 P. M., on June 4, 1968. During an earlier telephone call to the CALDWELL residence on June 4, 1968, the Special Agent was told by a housekeeper, who answered the telephone, that Miss CALDWELL was asleep, that it is Miss CALDWELL's practice to work through the night and sleep during the day, and that Miss CALDWELL would be available to answer the telephone at about 4:30 P. M.

When the Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation did telephonically contact Miss CALDWELL at about 4:35 P. M., on June 4, 1968, he requested a personal interview with Miss CALDWELL concerning a letter which had been received from her earlier that day. Miss CALDWELL replied she was not available for interview then because she was hurrying to get ready to visit her husband, who is in the hospital on the brink of death, and that because of her busy schedule, she would have no time for a personal interview for at least two weeks or perhaps longer.

Buffalo is making no local dissemination of instant LHM, and whether or not any dissemination should be made at SOG is being left to discretion of the Bureau.

The information set forth in instant LHM is being furnished to the Bureau and interested offices principally because of the serious nature of the alleged information furnished and Miss CALDWELL's prominent position as a world-famous novelist, although previous experience with Miss CALDWELL demonstrates she has a penchant for intermingling fact and fiction indiscriminately, and has, in the past, published an article bearing on the internal security of the United States representing it to be factual whereas it was completely fictional.

Miss CALDWELL is now attempting to twist information recently furnished by her as evidencing advance information concerning the death of Senator KENNEDY, despite available facts as set forth in referenced LHM definitely indicating otherwise.

Specific attention is directed to the fact as set forth in instant LHM that when SA THADDEUS J. SZYMANSKI telephoned Miss CALDWELL on June 4, 1968, she said she was unavailable for interview because she was hurrying to go to the hospital to see her husband who was on the brink of death. On June 6, 1968, she told SA SZYMANSKI that after talking with him on June 4, 1968, she had gone out to the front of her home to plant flowers.

Because of Miss CALDWELL's known unreliability, no action is recommended on the information being furnished by her, other than possible dissemination by the Bureau of this information because it is very possible Miss CALDWELL may proceed to furnish the same information to other governmental agencies, or may proceed to publish the information she has furnished.

ANDERSON was admitted to the Psychiatric Ward of the hospital on April 5, 1968 and discharged April 13, 1968. His doctor was OSWALD TODD, Psychiatrist. She advised that GERALD HIRSHMAN was admitted March 22, 1968 and discharged April 6, 1968.

She advised that ANDERSON was a white male, age
41, born address of 2405 Kenton Place, Hillcrest Heights, Maryland, and was married to BERNICE ANDERSON.

On April 17, 1968, Dr. OSWALD TODD, Psychiatrist, Morris Cafritz Memorial Hospital, 1310 Southern Avenue, S. E., was advised of the purpose of the interview. He advised, upon viewing Wanted Flyer Number 442 of ERIC STARVO GALT, that this was definitely not the same person as CARROLL T. ANDERSON or GERALD HIRSHMAN, who were both patients of his. He described HIRSHMAN as a leacherous S. O. B., and was a real psycho, who prefabricated stories for his own benefit. He stated that he knew HIRSHMAN was the person who must have said ANDERSON looked like GALT.

On April 13, 1968, GIRARD HIRSHMAN, advised SA WILLIAM R. MCCARTHY, that the artists sketch of the killer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which appeared in "The Washington Post", a Washington, D. C., newspaper, on April 13, 1968, closely resembled an individual in Ward 4-East of Cafritz Hospital. According to HIRSHMAN, who was also a patient in this ward (psychiatric), this person, whose last name he recalled as ANDERSON, had arrived at the hospital about three days after the death of Dr. KING.

HIRSHMAN stated he did not have an address in Washington, D. C., but was staying with friends at 13th and H Streets, Northeast, telephone LI3-8420.

JAMES TROY GOOCH, Jr. was contacted at the District of Columbia jail and consented to be interviewed after acknowledging the contents of the Waiver of Rights form, which he refused to sign.

He stated that he had arrived in Washington, D. C. from Richmond, Virginia, via Greyhound Bus, at approximately twelve noon on April 4, 1968. He stated that the bus fare was \$3.80, and that upon his arrival in Washington, D. C., he shipped his two suitcases back to his parents home at 5210 Crest Drive, Kansas City, Kansas. He stated that he had lunch near the terminal and then started drinking before looking for a job. He stated that he got drunk and then was arrested by the Metropolitan Police Department, but refused to discuss the reasons for his arrest.

He admitted having a .38 caliber snub nose revolver and forty-five rounds of ammunition in his possession. He denied knowing the gun was stolen, stating that he purchased it from a bum on Madison Street, in Chicago, in February, 1968. He stated that he purchased the gun for his personal protection, as he travels a good deal, and paid \$25.00 for it. He stated that he has never been in Denver, Colorado, and was working for Manpower, Incorporated, Cleveland, Chio, in October, 1967.

He stated that he has never known anyone by the name of JAMES EARL RAY or ERIC STARBO GALT, and denied any complicity in the marder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that he has never been in Memphis, Birmingham, or Atlanta. He stated that he had worked approximately three to four weeks in Richmond for Employers Overlead Company.

Re telephone call from Memphis night club to SA DON C. BIRDWELL 6/8/68 based on phone call from Supervisor PETERSON at Bureau same evening.

This investigation was based on the phone call from the Bureau to the Memphis Division on the evening of 6/7-8/68 in which it was learned that an individual who identified himself as R. W. TROTTER. Telephone No. 343-2129. Cunningham, Tennessee, telephoned the Pentagon in Washington, D. C., earlier that evening and reportedly said he was the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He also said he was acquainted with the Sheriff PLUMMER of Montgomery County, Tennessee, and that he knew the girl in the polka dot dress who was observed at the scene of the shooting of Senator KENNEDY in Los Angeles.

On 6/8/68 Sheriff JOEL PLUMMER and Deputies
BOBBY STANLEY and BOBBY HEATON, Montgomery County SO,
advised that ROBERT WADE TROTTER resident of Rural Route 1,
Cumningham, Tenn., is a local painter who has in the past
served a prison sentence but the charge was unknown to them.
According to the Montgomery County SO records, TROTTER was
arrested 5/3/67 and again on 7/17/67 for assault and battery.
He was described in the records as follows:

Deputies STANLEY and HEATON advised that TROTTER has on approximately 6 occasions in recent months provided information to them reportedly regarding the sale of illegal drugs and the location of illegal whiskey stills in Montgomery County. Full investigations based on the complaints of TROTTER have proven the information supplied by TROTTER in each instance was inaccurate and unreliable.

Sheriff PLUMMER and the two abovementioned deputies all consider TROTTER completely unreliable, untrustworthy and an alcoholic.

Deputies STANLEY and HEATON accompanied the writer to TROTTER's residence on 6/8/68, at which time an attempt was made to interview him regarding the phone call made to Washington earlier that morning which resulted in an immediate denial by TROTTER. TROTTER indicated in the interview that he was a supporter of GEORGE WALLACE for President and claimed that if WALLACE is elected, he, TROTTER, will be a "big man."

When further efforts were made to interview TROTTER regarding the phone call made by a person using his name and telephone number to Washington, D. C., TROTTER again denied making the phone call and denied that he had any information concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING or the murder of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. He refused to be interviewed further and ordered the interviewing Agent and Deputies off his property, stating that if they wished to return to his property they had better here in their possession a warrant for the arrest of him.

In view of the attitude of TROTTER, the interview was concluded.

Deputy HEATON ascertained from Mrs. ELLIOTT, a Long-Distance Operator with the Bell Telephone Company in Clarksville, that a man who identified himself as R. W. TROTTER, Telephone No. 342-2129, Cunningham, Tenn., placed a Long-Distance telephone call to Governor GEORGE WALLACE at Montgomery, Alabama, at 12:48 a.m., 6/8/68, but the Office of the Governor refused the call. This same person at 12:52 a.m., telephoned the Pentagon, Washington, D. C., and talked for 8 minutes and 6 seconds, after which he hung up the phone. At 1:05 a.m., the same individual came back on the line and said he was cut off on his phone call to Washington. The connection was again made by the operator

and this individual again talked to the Pentagon for a total of 15 additional minutes. The number he telephoned in Washington was Area Code 202, No. 545-6700.

Mrs. KLLIOTT advised Deputy HEATON that she was sitting next to the operator who handled the calls from TROTTER and it was their opinion that the individual calling was intoxicated. They could hear a woman's voice in the background who apparently was trying to keep this person from making the telephone call.

Inasmuch as Sheriff PLUMMER and his Deputies have provided information indicating that TROTTER is completely untrustworthy and in view of TROTTER's attitude when he was interviewed and further in view of the fact that it appears that TROTTER has no information pertinent to either the MURKIN or ROBERT KENNEDY murder, it is suggested that no further action be taken concerning investigation of TROTTER, or any information he might claim to have.
